







# Pair suffer minor injuries in 2 of week's automobile accidents

Two accidents Saturday sent two persons to Hills and Dales General Hospital, both of whom were treated and released.

At 2:20 a.m., according to the Tuscola County Sheriff's Department, John R. McKenney, 18, of 286 Crawford Road, Deford, was southbound on Cemetery Road, north of Severance Road.

While passing a car, he lost control of his vehicle. It went off the west side of the road, touched one tree and

then ran into another head-on.

McKenney was ticketed on a charge of careless driving.

At 11:50 p.m., according to deputies, David M. Wright, 35, of 6217 Lakeside Drive, Cass City, was southbound on Doerr Road and failed to make the turn where the road ends at Elmwood Road.

The right side of his vehicle hit the "road ends" sign.

Three persons were treated and released from Caro Community Hospital

following a 3:32 p.m. accident Tuesday, March 16.

They were the driver of one of the vehicles involved, Johnny M. Avalos, 26, of 6597 Gage Street, Gagetown, and his two passengers, Terry L. Avalos, 21, and Joel Avalos, 19, both of Pigeon.

Deputies reported their vehicle was headed north-east on M-81 and collided with a car that was eastbound on Deckerville Road which didn't yield at the intersection.

The driver of the other

car, Joyce E. Henry, 33, of Caro, was ticketed on a charge of failure to yield right of way. She suffered possible injuries, but didn't need hospital treatment.

## Up salaries for officers at Lamotte

Lamotte Township electors at their annual meeting Tuesday approved pay increases for township officers.

They also approved putting a millage proposal on the ballot for purchase of fire department equipment.

The pay increases are as follows (previous annual pay in parentheses): Supervisor, \$1,600 (\$1,400), plus \$3,150 for assessing (\$1,800); clerk and treasurer, \$2,200 each (\$2,000); deputy clerk and treasurer, \$450 each (\$420), and trustees, \$475 (\$420) plus \$7 per meeting (no change).

The township board recommended the large increase in pay for Supervisor Jack Gillig for his assessing duties. Clerk Wayne Adam explained, because it felt it would cost at least that much if it had to hire someone to do the work, plus it takes a lot of time.

Township officials last received a pay increase in 1980.

To be placed on the Aug. 3 primary ballot will be a request for a half mill for four years for eventual purchase of a new pumper truck and equipment for the township fire department.

The department auxiliary conducts bingo games now, Adam explained, to raise money for the same purpose, so the board expects it will be asked some day to match the money to buy the equipment.

The budget presented for the fiscal year that starts April 1 anticipates general fund revenue of \$68,154 and expenditures in the same amount.

Of that, \$19,000 is budgeted for roads (brining, patching, mowing, etc.); \$6,000 for the township hall (most of which will probably be spent for installing a tile floor or insulating the fire hall portion); \$4,045 for drains, and \$3,000 for the fire department.

Of the \$5,293 expected in federal revenue sharing funds, separate from the general fund budget, slightly less than half is budgeted for roads and a similar amount for the fire department, with

the rest for recreation.

Township board meetings will remain the third Tuesday of each month at 8 p.m.

About 25 persons attended the afternoon annual meeting, including board members.






