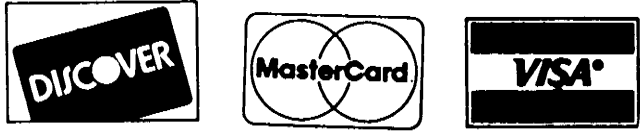

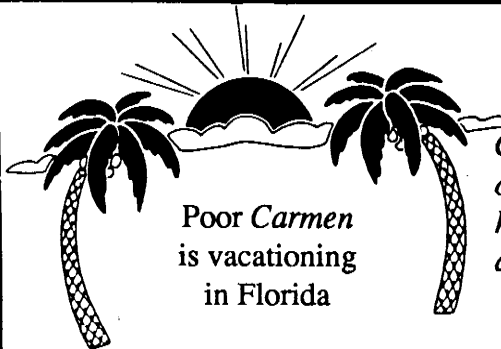

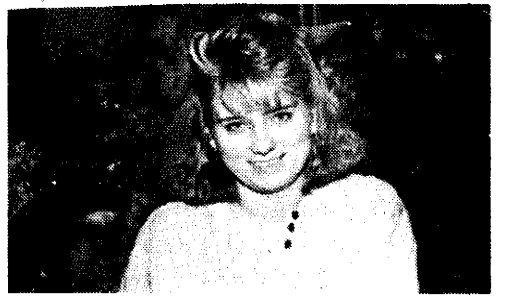

New Ubly studio a dream fulfilled

Some 14 months ago, Stan Rutkowski Jr. spoke of his hope to return to the Ubly area to open his own business after graduating from the Hallmark Institute of Photography in Turners Falls, Mass. He made the comment during an interview at Ubly's Sleeper Public Library, where he was hosting a display of photos in conjunction with his studies. The dream of returning home with his new skills has since been realized by the 21-year-old.

"I kind of always wanted to run my own business, and I like the area, so I decided to give it a try," Rutkowski said recently at his studio, located in the basement of his parents' Maurer Road home, about 4 miles northeast of Ubly. The 1985 Ubly High School graduate began setting up his business, which he named Clearly Photography, after graduating from the 10-month course at Hallmark Institute in June. By fall, he had everything ready, although he already had begun to accept jobs. "I was quite surprised with the response I got," he remarked, adding that being an "unknown," he didn't expect many calls at first. "The response has been good so far," he said. "It's not in droves, but it's steady."

Clutch free throw wins for Bulldogs

Unbelievable, inconceivable, but oh how sweet!

The Owen-Gage Bulldogs took an early lead Monday, held on, and captured a 43-42 opening district game win against North Huron on their home court.

Coach Dean Roller's cagers will now advance to the semi-finals on Wednesday when they'll meet Akron-Fairgrove. Tip off is scheduled for 8:30 p.m.

The contest was much stranger than the final score indicates.

Trailing by a basket, 40-38, North Huron's Terry Souva was fouled with 27 seconds remaining. He connected on the first of 2 free throws.

Bulldog senior Marc Reinhardt was fouled on Souva's missed opportunity, and calmly sank a pair of freebies giving the 'Dogs a 42-39 cushion.

Warrior Todd Rice answered Reinhardt's free throws with a 3-point shot from the left wing that knotted the score with only 10 seconds remaining.

Nick Pavlichek's desperation shot was wide of the mark, but Andre' Damm was whistled for a foul on the rebound with only one click on the clock.

That sent North Huron's Jarrett Pearson to the line whose shot rolled off the rim. Reinhardt was fouled on the rebound with no time remaining.

Reinhardt ended North Huron's season when he drilled the front of a one and one situation.

Owen-Gage, who lost to North Huron on Friday, traded identical beginnings.

On Friday the Bulldogs spotted the Warriors an 8-0 lead. On Monday it was the 'Dogs turn as they raced out in front 9-0.

The North Central Thumb League Warriors battled back and cut the Bulldogs' lead to 22-20 when Souva put in the final basket the first half.

Souva also gave his squad their first lead with 5 minutes gone in the third stanza, 29-28, on a short jumper from within the paint. The Warriors increased their lead to 34-31 at the end of 3 periods.

The biggest play of the game may have occurred in the final period when Pavlichek stood pat and took a charge on a hard driving Souva who stands 6'3". The play made a 5 point swing in the score when Brad Susalla hit his next 3 charity tosses.

Sophomore Mike Kady kept the Bulldogs in front in the first half as he poured in 12 points. Kady finished with 15 tallies to top the winners. Reinhardt followed with 14.

High for the losers were juniors Rice and Souva who netted 15 and 13, respectively.

It was a game for the first 8 minutes and after that it was simply a case of how high the score was going to be against the outmanned Rockets.

Reese used a tight zone defense in the opening period and was successful with it until the Hawks found the range. Jeff Dillon and Jeff Krol loosened the defense with set shots from outside and Paul Tuckey hit a jumper and 2 close-in shots to get the offense in motion. Reese countered with balance scoring and some nice feeds by 5-5 sophomore Justin Moore. The quick moving guard did everything but shoot the ball, passing up good shots all night after penetrating into the paint area.

The Hawks 2 leading scorers took over in the second quarter. Mike Randall, strangely quiet in the first 8 minutes, hit 4 buckets and Tuckey hit short jumpers and drives for 12 points.

With 2 minutes gone in the second quarter it was all over. The Hawks ripped in 7 unanswered points to lead 24-10 and that was just a start. With 4 minutes gone the score was 30-12 and Coach Ron Nurnberger started to use his bench.

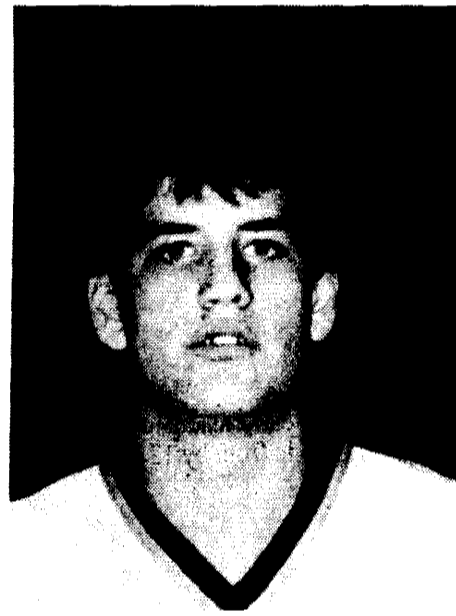

Randall did an effective job on Dave Petro, 6-3 pivot man for the Rockets.

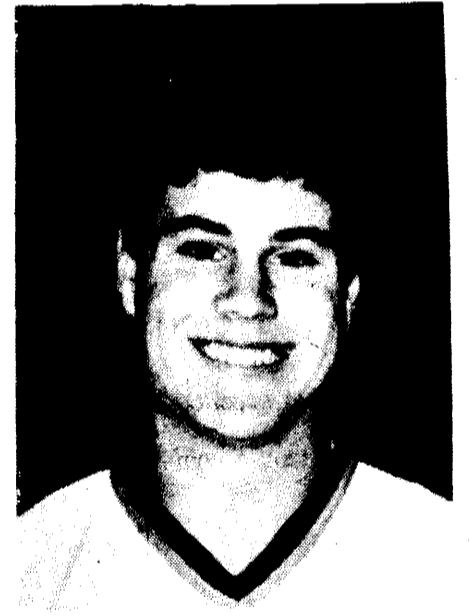
Nurnberger started yanking players in the first minute of the final quarter and with 4 minutes left players moved up from the junior varsity played the remainder of the game.

Change makes giving easier for taxpayers

Children's Trust Fund officials recently announced a change on the 1988 state income tax return which, it is hoped, will increase the amount of money contributed to fight child abuse.

In the past 6 years that the voluntary contribution check-off for the Children's Trust Fund for the Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect has appeared on State of Michigan tax returns, only those taxpayers receiving a refund were allowed to donate by reducing the amount of their refund.

But a change on the 1988 return allows, for the first time, both taxpayers receiv-

ing a refund and those who owe tax to contribute. Taxpayers can contribute \$5 or any other amount by simply checking off the CTF box on their state income tax form.

"The Children's Trust Fund was established in 1982 as a permanent source of funding for local programs throughout the state that work to prevent child abuse and neglect," said David C. Mills, executive director of the trust fund. "It is an independent, nonprofit organization that has made significant progress in preventing child abuse and neglect by helping more than 100,000 Michigan children and families."

 a death in the immediate family was jumped from one to 3 days at school expense. Teachers will also be granted 2 personal business days.

Nesting with big birds: When snowy owls fly south for the winter, they head for places that remind them of the empty open tundra back home. Apparently, a big-city airport fills the bill, because more snowy owls congregate at Boston's Logan airport than any other spot in Massachusetts. According to International Wildlife magazine more than 100 of the birds have been identified and tagged since the early 1980's. The airport grounds offer the birds an ample diet of rodents and small birds and the owls provide a valuable service by keeping flocks of birds off the runways.
