## Straw shredder blamed in \$75,000 structure fire

A raging fire fanned by gusty east winds leveled a large barn and milk house at the Harland Lounsbury farm Monday, causing an estimated \$75,000 in damage.

Fire fighters from 6 area departments responded to the 2:30 p.m. alarm, combining efforts over the next 6 hours to extinguish the

The barn, located about a mile and a half west of Cass City at 5612 W. Cass City Rd., was fully engulfed when Elkland Township fire fighters, the first department to respond, arrived. Chief Dick Root said there was no chance of saving the struc-

Root said the blaze was ignited by a spark from a straw shredder, located at the east end of the barn.

According to Lounsbury's wife, newspapers were being chopped for livestock bedding—an experiment Lounsbury started a month ago-when the fire started. An employee who was operating the machine noticed the papers getting warm, she said, adding he went to get more newspapers in a nearby area and when he returned, everything was in flames.

The wind got into the east end and the flames spread quickly, Root said. Fortunately, Lounsbury was able to get his dairy cattle out of the structure with the exception of a pair of calves.

Aside from the barn and milk house, a hay chopper, Oliver Tractor, 1977 Chevrolet pick-up truck and quite a bit" of hay and straw stored in the barn were all ost, and one silo was badly damaged, according to the fire chief, who noted Lounsbury is insured.

## Cost set at \$28,000

## Okay 5% non-union pay hike

Board Monday night accepted the recommendations of the salary committee and authorized a raise of personnel at the school for the 1991-92 school year. The raise will cost district taxpayers about \$28,000 in added wages.

Allan Hartwick, one of the members of the committee that reviewed the salaries, said that salaries paid in 12 surrounding districts were reviewed for comparison purposes. Supt. Ken Micklash said that an analysis of these salary schedules reveals that the new wages will place Cass City somewhere in the middle range among area districts.

In addition to setting the salaries, the board heard a complaint from Richard Powell after his son was suspended from school for 8 days following a fracas in the school cafeteria.

Powell's son, Jeff, was suspended for punching another boy in the nose following an argument. According to Powell, and confirmed by Principal Russ Biefer, his son and another youth, not identified, were taunting each other when the youth touched his son on the

face. Several minutes later, Powell seated across from

The Cass City School the youth reached over and punched him in the nose.

Biefer was called and ordered Powell to clean up the mess in the cafeteria. He 5 percent for all non-union started to do so and was later given a pair of gloves because there were blood spots and a small puddle on the floor. Cleaning up blood without gloves is against the school regulations. The boy's father told the board that he was in contact with the health department and wanted to see what action the board would take.

In the discussion it was revealed that Biefer had informed Richard Powell that if he came in the next morning the suspension would be lifted. He refused.

Powell asked the board to rescind the 6 points his son was awarded for fighting because the other boy involved received none.

Discussion by the board revealed that one of the key points was that the youth hit his opponent with a closed fist. That's simply not allowed, the school principal said, while pushing, shoving, pinching and similar activities are handled with warnings.

Biefer said that Jeff Powell's record was good before the fight and that he had only a few tardys on his record this year.





## **Ghost tickets**





The news about Detroit, as reported in other cities, isn't all bad. Last week, a headline in the Lansing State Journal blared: "Ghostwriters are hanging around those Detroit meters again."

Hey, that's nothing compared to an indicted police chief, a cheating congresswoman and a mayor running scared from war terrorists. It's almost comforting to see Detroit's image stained by nothing more alarming than a lousy little parking ticket scam.

Lansing area readers couldn't have been too surprised. Last April, another State Journal headline said: 'Stubborn Portland (Michigan) couple beat Detroit's ghost-car' ticket." That report concerned a couple who sent our Municipal Parking Department photocopies of gas receipts prov-ing their vehicle was in the state of Wyoming when the department said it was illegally parked in Detroit. Our bureaucratic bozos rejected the evidence and insisted a \$30 fine be paid to avoid a court battle and possible loss of driver's license. The bozos relented only after the couple brandished the name of the Detroit columnist who first put Detroit's ghost tick-

ets on the map.

Under last week's headline, after naming 2 more Lansing area residents ticketed by Detroit for illegally parking where they never parked, State Journal columnist John Schneider wrote: "....it's kind of an ongoing situation comedy - Phantom Cars of the Motor City. Ten or 15 times a year I hear from Lansing area people baffled by no-

tices of parking violations supposedly committed in Detroit on days when they were nowhere near Detroit.' But so what? As a loyal Detroit resident, I'm almost proud of the part I've played in insinuating to out-oftowners that they have noth-

ing to fear from Detroit except unfair parking tickets. That sounds like favorable chamber-of-commercetype advertising when contrasted to the national publicity recently generated for Detroit by former Chief William Hart, Congress-Barbara-Rose woman Collins and Mayor Coleman Young.

Young's contribution is perhaps the most astonishing. The mayor is forever cursing the news media, national and local, for trampling on Detroit's image. But, soon after the Persian Gulf War began, Young made Detroit the only city in the United States to seek National Guard protection

against war terrorists. Gov. John Engler quickly rejected the incredibly premature request, but not before Young undoubtedly-scared away some potential tourists, residents and business.

## LOAN WASN'T A **SMART MOVE**

Running a close second in the astonishment race is Collins, who has publicly claimed to be smart enough to belong to Mensa, the exclusive international club for extraordinarily intelligent people. But Collins, a veteran campaigner for local, state and national offices, claimed she wasn't smart enough to know she was doing anything wrong when, during her recent congressional campaign, she called a \$75,000 bank loan a personal loan and welcomed co-signers plainly prohibited by campaign regulations. Mensa said long ago it never heard of Collins, but now a lot of non-Detroiters have, and are

probably not eager to move into her district.

As for Hart, accused of stealing \$1.3 million, much national publicity has resulted from the charge that some stolen police cash was used to pay the rent for a California home occupied by one of his daughters and her family. Not as widely known is the fact that another Hart daughter lives in a Detroit co-op apartment whose owner of record is reportedly Hart. I wouldn't mention it except I live in the


same apartment building. According to Lansing columnist Schneider, the executive director of the Detroit Parking Violation Bureau, Ronald Ruffin, denied a ticket scam. Ruffin blamed ghost tickets on administrative mistakes, such as poor penmanship, or Lansing cars being driven to Detroit without the owners' knowl-

"I feel strongly about the integrity of this department. I'm not going to roll over on this issue," Ruffin said.

Ruffin shouldn't roll, he should brag. Compared to Hart, Collins and Young, ghost tickets give Detroit a good name.



## Land values inching up

County, sparked by rebounding agricultural land sales, continue to inch upwards, according to preliminary 1991 equalization figures presented to county

commissioners Thursday. Equalization Director Ed Karr presented recommended 1991 values for agricultural, residential and timber cutover land.

Projections in all 3 classifications are based on studies of land sales over the past 2

Based on those sales, the equalization department is recommending agricultural land be increased by 11.35 percent. The 1991 true cash value of the land is set at \$449,009,446, compared to \$403,241,776 in 1990.

Land values in Tuscola crease in agland values in all but 3 of the county's 23 townships (Arbela, Wells and Vassar). The adjustments range from -8.77 percent in Wells Township to an increase of 22.63 percent in Akron Township.

This is the third consecutive year ag land values have shown an increase following a 3-year period during which values plummeted some 60 percent.

The prices have been coming up, Karr acknowledged. adding, "We think the sales we're seeing now have probably peaked."

The true cash value of all residential land, meanwhile, is set at \$636,990,735, an increase of 5.97 percent, or \$35,862,856 over 1990.

A new study conducted for timber cutover propertybrush land with no improvements or buildings, and usually no tillable acres-also revealed an increase. The true cash value of that land classification is set at \$11,776,099, an increase of 1,091,267, or 10.22 percent, over 1990.

Overall, the recommended figures set the true cash value of all land in the county at \$1,321,026,986. increase \$82,721,793, or 6.68 percent, over 1990.

Karr pointed out, however, that the tentative figures don't take into account improvements, such as buildings and tile, or new construction. The final numbers also may be affected by new property appraisals conducted in a few townships, including Elkland, he said.

Last year, new construction added some \$9.6 million to land value totals, but Karr said he doesn't think the total will be that high this year due to a slowdown in construction and a depressed economy.

The recommended equalization figures have been sent to township supervisors, who will make adjustments on individual assessation of each property, as required by state law, is supposed to be equal to 50 percent of the true cash

Individual property owners who disagree with their assessments can appeal to their township boards of review, which meet in

March. When the review boards are finished, their figures go back to the county officials, who can accept each township's figures or make changes. Counties must adopt their final equalization reports in April.

From there, the reports go to the State Tax Commission, which can impose a countywide factor if it feels a county's valuation is too low or too high.

## Housing for retired couples boosts building in Cass City

City's retirement-age population helped boost new construction in the village last year.

It's a trend village officials predict will continue in the 90s, bolstering new construction during an economically weak period that is expected to be marked by a downturn in new commercial and industrial building.

New construction in Cass City last year totaled nearly \$1.136 million, translating into almost \$9,200 in additional property tax revenue.

A breakdown of the total shows the bulk of construction took place at Northwood Lake Condominiums, where 8 buildings (16 units) were built during the year at a combined value of \$650,000. A clubhouse constructed at the complex added another \$75,000 in new 1990 construction.

A chart listing all 1990 building categories and the value of each accompanies this story.

It's been a good year if we go back over the past 5 years," village Manager Lou S. LaPonsie said, noting the 1990 figure represents a decrease in building compared to 1989, 1988 and 1987, but represents an increase over 1985 and 1986.

One new home was built in 1990 (\$70,000), 2 in 1989 (\$148,000), 13 in 1988 (\$827,000), 6 in 1987 (\$370,000), 10 in 1986 (\$638,000) and one in 1985 (\$60,000).

LaPonsie pointed out that construction in 1990 was more residential in nature, particularly in terms of housing for retirees.

With the economy the way it is now, he said, there isn't likely going to be a boon in commercial and industrial building soon.

"Right now we're not seeing it for this year," he added. "I think what we're going to see is that the residential is going to carry us as


