Decision due soon End of round barn near?

There are just 5 buildings in Tuscola County that have been accepted for listing in the Michigan State Register of Historic Sites. In addition, one of them has been nominated for the National Register of buildings with historical interest.

The building is the "Round Barn" on Richie Road, a mile north of Gagetown, and it is in very real danger of demolition.

The barn and adjacent house sit on 80 acres sandwiched between 2 parcels of to make. The Round Barn is in very poor condition, as is the house. A new roof will be mandatory, a project that will cost thousands of dollars.

Besides being unique, the barn is huge. The main floor has 8,960 feet and stretches 104 feet door-to-door. What makes the structure unique, its octagonal design, also makes it hard to maintain. Bud Jarvis, district representative of the DNR, says because of its historical significance the building poses

Half-mill tax needed **Cass City asked to** consider bus service

The Cass City Village Council was asked to consider expanding bus service to Cass City by the Caro Transit Authority at its regular meeting Monday evening at the Municipal Build-

Speaking to the trustees was Jennifer Leitzel of Caro, who heads the Authority under the auspices of the Human Development Commission. She was accompanied by Dan Hutchinson, a member of the company's board of directors.

The bus service is partially subsidized by state and federal funds and is designed to provide door-to-door service to Caro residents and to other areas in Tuscola County that are willing to pay a special fee for it. Besides the subsidy, Caro residents pay a half-mill tax old, and 60 cents per trip for seniors 60 and over. There is service, when

buses are not in use in Caro, to other parts of the county at various charges for different zones. In Cass City a rider now pays \$12 to get a bus, with seniors and handicapped residents charged half that amount.

Tuscola County Register of Deeds won't receive \$1 per page copy fees from the county's 2 abstract companies if Huron County Circuit Court Judge Richard Knoblock follows the advice of a case expert he chose.

Valerie Martinek, a 14year veteran of Register of Deeds offices, submitted her opinion July 3 regarding the case, Tuscola County Ab-

the companies receive a set profit percentage.

The case stemmed from McLaren announcing in January the Register of Deeds office would begin charging Tuscola County's 2 abstract companies the state-approved \$1 per copied page. Other early payment options included charging Tuscola Abstract and Title Company Inc. and \$1 per page, the companies

charged for making copies. Paul Ransford, president of Tuscola County Abstract & Title Co., later filed suit against McLaren. The case was moved to Huron County after Tuscola Circuit Court Judge Patrick R. Joslyn stepped down from it. In her report, Martinek said

While no one in the DNR is saying what will happen after the property is acquired, it appears that chances are great that the barn will be moved or destroyed.







Change drug law

Free Gary Fannon. There, I finally wrote it. I may have it printed on a Tshirt. For being so slow to push for Fannon's release from life in prison, I deserve to have it tattooed on my nose.

It was more than 3 years ago that Fannon, then 18, was locked up forever on a minor drug conspiracy charge. Forever, until he dies, with absolutely no chance of parole. At age 18. Think about it, and think about the countless murderers, rapists and other worse criminals sentenced to revolving doors.

LAW GAVE JUDGE NO LEEWAY

In Fannon's case, the judge had no alternative. According to Michigan law --- the toughest anti-drug law in the United States — anyone convicted of having more than 650 grams (about 1 1/2 pounds) of cocaine or heroin must be sentenced to life. The judge may exercise no discretion, no matter how mitigating the circumstances.

Under those conditions, what's the sense in having a judge? A rubber stamp would do the job just as well.

A rubber stamp wouldn't be influenced by the fact that Fannon, just a kid, was sucked into a drug deal by an undercover police detective who later was fired from the Canton Township Police



A rubber stamp wouldn't be influenced by what Fannon said last month: "The money was thrown in my face, and I wanted it. We had never been rich. We never had a lot of money. My mother worked all of her

life." A rubber stamp wouldn't be influenced by the fact that the cocaine delivery was made to undercover agents by two other men while Fannon was in another city. Fannon got life because he'd been peripherally involved · in a couple of earlier meetings between the agents and the dealers.

A rubber stamp wouldn't be influenced by the fact that most observers, including many lawyers and judges, agree that the mandatory life sentence is no real deterrent to drug crimes. It persecutes the little crooks while the big wheels remain free and dealing. U.S. District Judge Avern Cohn, a Michigan appellate judge, five state trial judges and Macomb County Prosecutor Carl Marlinga have urged the House Judiciary Committee to amend the law to a more



He's seen more than 60 rabbit seasons, but bring up the next hunt in conversation and Stanley Morell is a kid again.

With a sparkle in his eye and an excitement and anticipation that defy his 72 years, the Cass City area resident is quick to say there's nothing like a good hunt and no better way to do it than with a good pair of dogs.

Morell ought to know; he's been breeding, raising and training purebred beagles for more than 50 years.

"It's a good sport, it's a clean sport and it's really a thrill to hear those dogs bark," he said. "I don't think there's anything better than to get out on a frosty winter morning and let the dogs loose."

The kennel at Morell's Hurds Corner Road home is alive with the excited barking of both experienced and inexperienced dogs anxious to chase a rabbit.

"Some I sell when they're 6 to 8 weeks old, and some I train out," he said, adding, "I generally keep about 4 for hunting.'

The Shabbona area native has sold as many as 100 pups in a year, but averages 50 to 60. "I probably train out a litter or 2-10 to 15 pups."

Aside from puppies and starter pups, which have undergone 4 months to a year of training, Morell also offers "finished" dogs-3 to 4-year-olds that are com-

pletely trained.

His dogs aren't AKC registered, but are purebred, and they sell for an average of \$50 for a weaned puppy that's been immunized and wormed to \$150 for a finished dog.

PLENTY OF WORK

The difference between a puppy and an experienced dog is plenty of work on the part of the trainer, according to Morell. "The toughest part is to get

them to hunt and circle a rabbit," he said. "You take a puppy out here and he doesn't know a rabbit from that tree. There's a lot of hours, a lot of patience."

Like people, he added, "Some are smarter at younger ages and catch on, and some never catch on. You can't teach a dog to hunt-that's instinct; you teach them to mind and show them a rabbit." "You start them as early as

possible-3, 4 months old. You can't start them too young and you can't take them out too much," he continued.







# She supports the death penalty

Your neighbor says

For the past week, Americans have tuned in to scenes of police removing large vats of acid and dismembered bodies from Jeffrey L. Dahmer's Milwaukee apartment. The 31year-old has admitted to luring at least 11 men into his

apartment, on the premise of taking photographs of them, and then drugging and killing them. He also claimed cannibalism was involved.

Police officials are discovering to their horror that Dahmer's murder spree may have begun in the late 1970s. German officials are investigating his possible involvement with the unsolved murder and dismemberment of several women near the military base Dahmer was assigned to. The brutal episode has a familiarring to Michigan residents. It

was just this spring that 2 men were arrested for murdering a female teenager and refrigerating her head and other body parts. Defense attorneys could not convince the jury the suspect has an evil-twin identity, and was therefore not responsible for the slaying. Your neighbor, Irene Gladstone, said she would support

the death penalty for especially brutal convicted murderers. "If there was no doubt of any kind that they did it - yes, I think capital punishment might be a deterrent."

Gladstone added she thinks allowing an insanity plea under such circumstances is a "cop-out."

"They all must be insane to do such things, but I think the plea is more of a cop-out than reality."



# **Public Service Commission** probing power outages

An investigation by the Public Service Commission on power outages by a severe July 7 storm will center on safety precautions, procedures followed by Detroit Edison and Consumers Power to restore service, and how the outages were affected by construction and maintenance programs. An order issued by the PSC directed its staff to file a report on the utility responses by Aug. 30, and directed the utilities to address any issues raised in that report in a filing due by Sept. 13. "The storm and its after-

math were highly unusual. An investigation is needed to learn what happened to the utilities' systems and why, how they responded and whether any changes should be implemented to reduce the potential for deaths and massive power outages before we are faced with severe storms in the future," a statement by the 3 commissioners said.

The downed power lines led to the deaths of 4 persons and loss of electricity to some customers for over a week.

The commission said the investigation needs to deter-

#### mine what the utilities' procedures are for preventing electrical injuries, whether the procedures were followed and whether those procedures are adequate. The investigation would also study procedures to restore power, including how customers are able to notify the utilities of outages, how utilities informed their customers of plans to restore service, priorities followed, and equipment and personnel available, and how construction and maintenance programs affect

outages. Consumers Power spokesman Dan Bishop said the utility is conducting its own investigation, but believes its response was "very good in light of the devastation." "Four and a half days after the storm, 99.5 percent of the customers had power back on," he said. "We're looking at our entire storm response to see if there are

PSC in 1985. He said the utility has been spending more since March, 1990, when the rate expired.

Scott Simons, spokesman for Detroit Edison, said the damage "basically wasn't preventable," but said the utility is going forward with plans to install a computerized system to increase by 20 times the number of telephone calls that can be handled. That is intended to both improve the ability of customers to report damage and for the utility to commu-nicate with police and fire departments.

Ĥe said 683,599 customers, or a third of the power base, lost electricity in the storm.

#### **Community Colleges** Gain

Community colleges are becoming increasingly popular among adults returning to school because of their proximity and more affordable tuition compared to 4-year universities, according to a statewide survey for the State Board of

Education. The random telephone survey of 800 adults showed 47 percent of those surveyed preferred community colleges, compared to 46 percent in 1989, 41 percent in 1987 and 37 percent in 1984. The survey was said to have an error range of 3.5 percent.

Sixty-eight percent of those who prefer a community college said they like its proximity to their home, while 30 percent said it was less costly. Seventy-eight percent said community 1 to Jan. 1, 1992, during the college students get their

money's worth. Those surveyed said community colleges are the best place to go for job training or retraining, career planning and guidance, and skills

required by modern technology.

Community colleges were rated by 68 percent as excellent or good on meeting the educational needs of citizens in their area. Most, or 57 percent, of Michigan residents live in a community college district and pay taxes to support the college. Two-thirds said they are getting their money's worth for taxes they pay to the college.

#### Superintendent Search

The State Board of Education deferred final action on criteria for a new superintendent of public instruction, but budgeted \$40,000 for the search process that is planned to lead to appointment of the top education official by Dec. 18.

The process approved by the board did not alter a tentative schedule set last month that established Sept. 10 as the deadline for submitting applications. The budget for the search is

to cover advertisements placed in the New York Times, Washington Post, Chronicle of Higher Education and Education Week, travel expenses including that for candidates brought in for final interviews, and checking references.

The board will also write letters to education organizations, state boards and superintendents of all the states, and to superintendents of large school districts, and posters are to be circulated in the education community regarding the open position.

The superintendent's position became vacant when Don Bemis resigned under partisan pressure on June 26 after a 6-month leave of absence. Gary Hawks was designated as interim superintendent.


