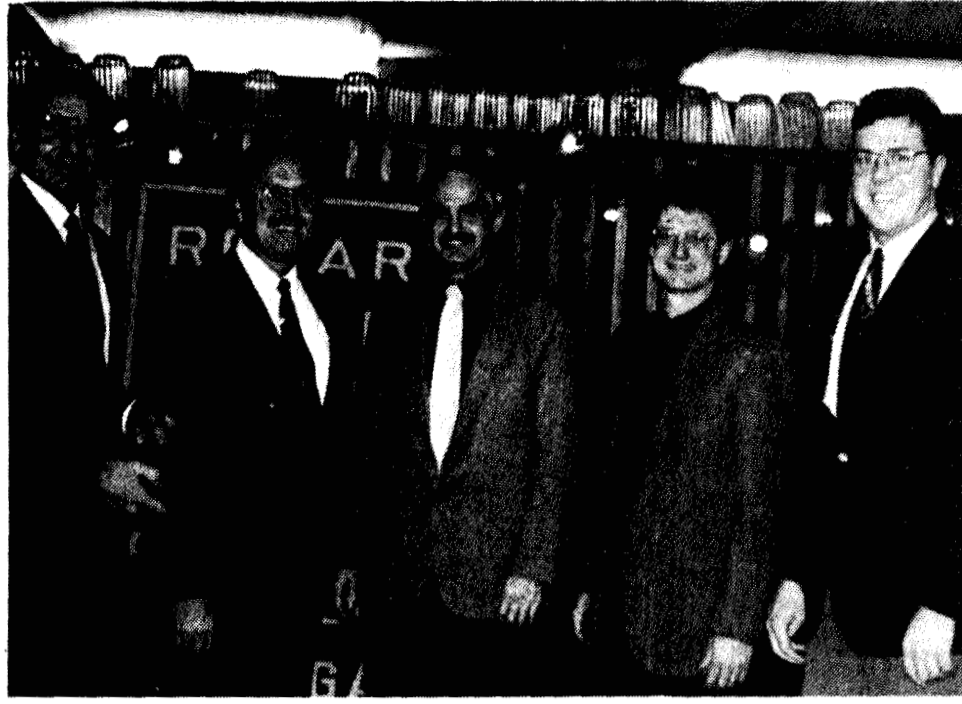

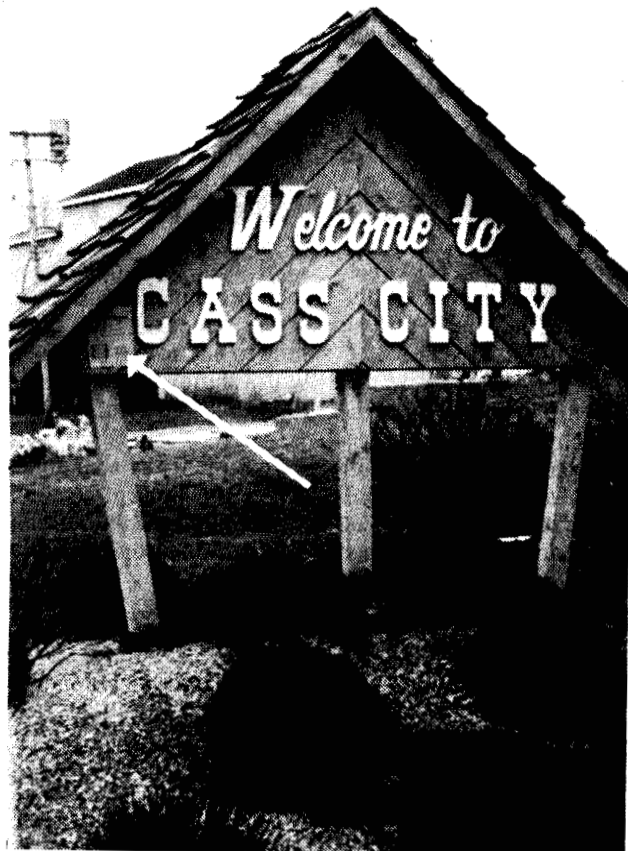

A jubilant Supt. Ken Micklash announced last week that Cass City will be part of a new 2-division Thumb C League, as the applications of the schools in the Blue Bay League together with those of Bay City All Saints and Crosswell-Lexington had been accepted by the league in a meeting held Wednesday, Dec. 2.

If all the teams that applied accept the invitation, Cass City will be in a league consisting of Lakers, Bad Axe, All Saints, Crosswell-Lexington and Marlette.

The present C league members will continue to compete in the other division. Teams there will be USA, Harbor Beach, Uby, Sandusky, Deckerville, Reese and Mayville.

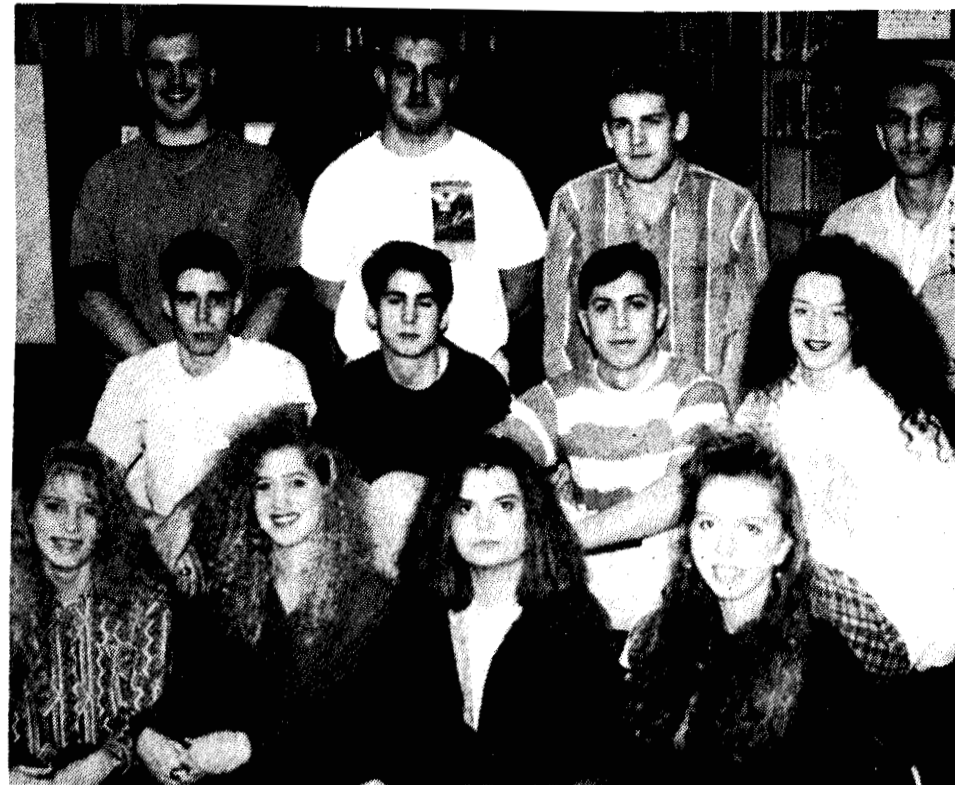
All the members of the former Blue Bay League will be happy to join the new league, as a 4-team league wasn't very successful and there was danger of Marlette dropping out, leaving no league at all.

One close observer said that it's thought that Crosswell-Lexington is sure to accept the

invitation, but there was uncertainty about All Saints. He said that All Saints had also been accepted by another league and it could vote to decline the invitation.

Regardless, the vote by the C league places Cass City in a much more secure position than it found itself in previously.

Scheduling details will be discussed at the next regular meeting of the league and the new league will begin operation in the 1994-95 year.

Signs require permit numbers

Michigan Department of Transportation officials have attached red violation notices to a handful of outdoor signs in the Cass City area, including a pair of signs welcoming motorists to the village.

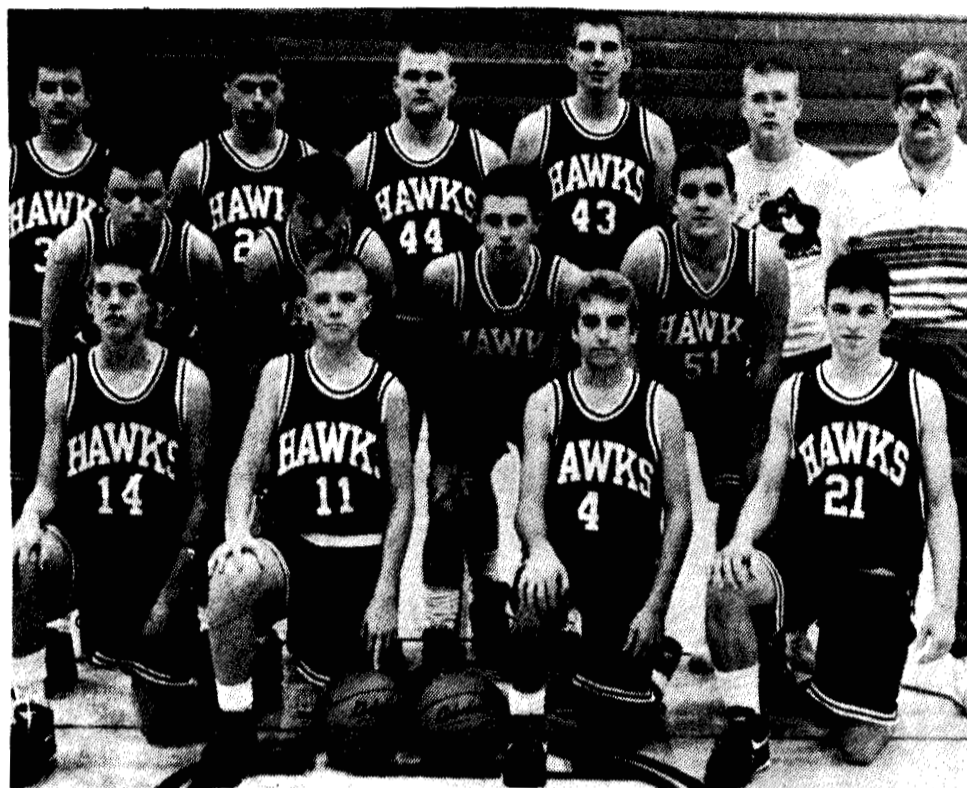
The signs are located just west and east of the village. A state transportation official said the violations are minor and were issued in conjunction with the department's annual sign inventory.

He said the Cass City signs

have permits, but the owners failed to display their permit numbers on the signs as required by law. The permit numbers must be a minimum of 4 inches high and must be displayed on the lower corner of the sign nearest the road.

Failure to comply with the law will result in proceedings leading to condemnation of signs in violation.

Correcting the problem is easy, according to the officials, who said it's a matter of simply attaching the permit numbers and contacting MDOT at (517) 754-7443.

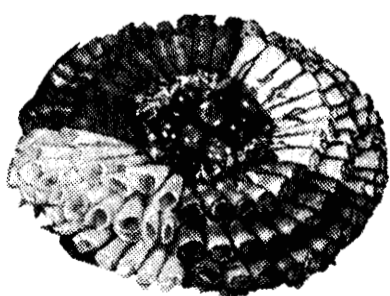

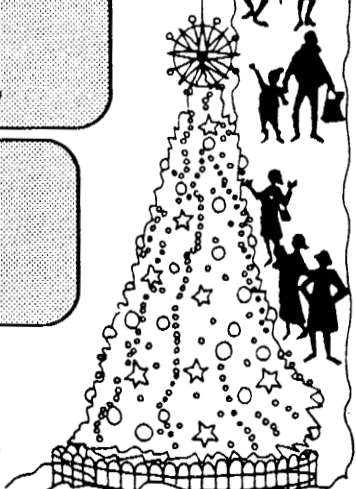

The good news for the Cass City Red Hawk wrestling team is Coach Don Markel, starting his sixth year at the helm, will be able to fill every weight class. That's not always possible in class C schools, he explained.

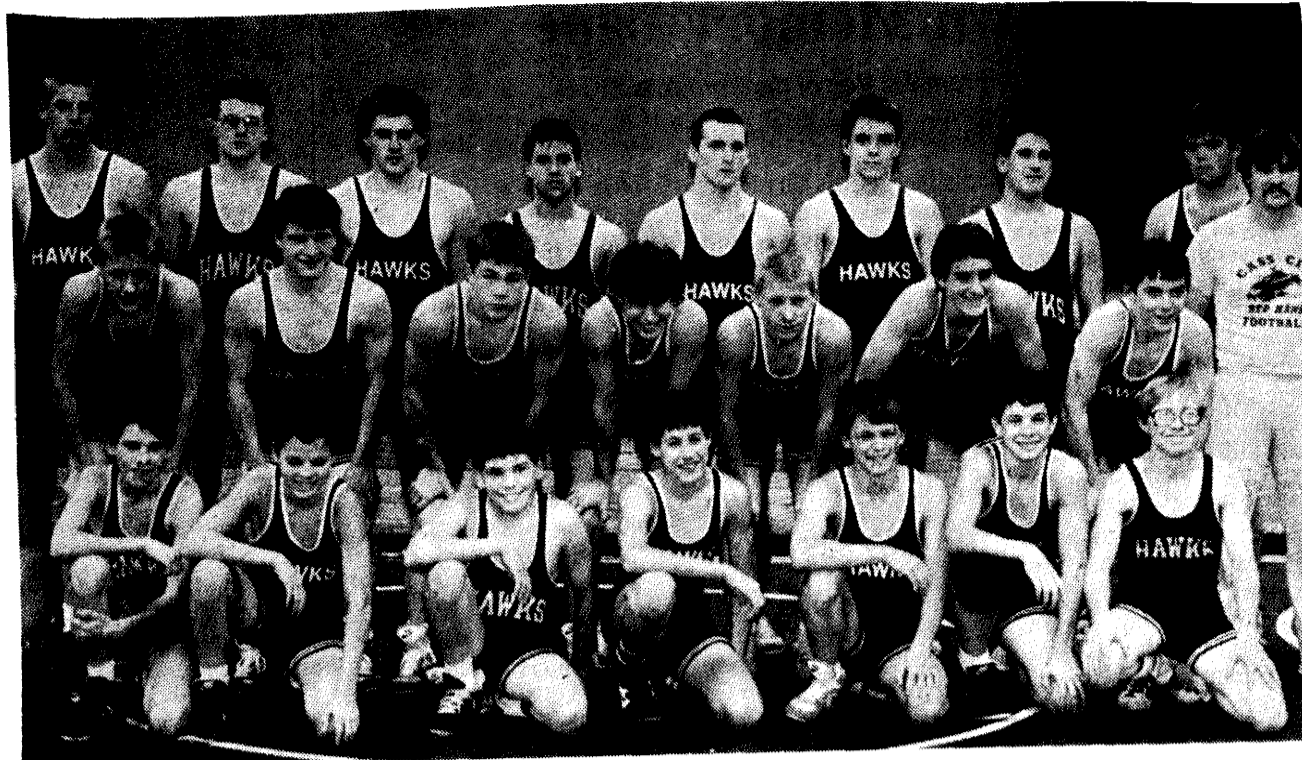
The bad news is that several outstanding wrestlers from last year's squad, that was 2-1 in the Blue Bay League and 12-4 overall, will not be returning.

Filling the shoes of these grapplers promises to be a major problem, Markel says. Among the players lost are Delbert Mathewson, state qualifier; Pete Matson, Shawn Sherman, Greg Woodruff and Ron Woodward.

Markel figures that the strength of the team will be in the middle weights. Bob Davis, a sophomore was 26-17 as a freshman. Junior Matt Hoppe is scheduled for the 130 pound class but figures he can qualify for 125 pound class. Last year he was 23-7.

Senior Domonick Vargo, 145 pounds, looks like a state qualifier. Ed Nizzola, a junior, 152 pounds, and Tom Davis, junior, 160 pounds, are coming off outstanding seasons. Captain Dan Muska, senior, 171 pounds, will earn points for the team, and Jeremy Hubbard, junior, 275 pounds, is expected to excel this season.

Markel sees Marlette as the team to beat in the league this season, followed by Cass City, Sandusky, Bad Axe and Mayville. The team kicks off the season Saturday morning at the Capac Invitational.

The regular meeting of the Cass City Village Council was held Nov. 30, 1992, at 7:00 p.m. All Trustees were present with the exception of Trustee Helwig.

As advertised, bids on a 1979 Ford pickup truck were opened. Three bids were received, with a high bid of \$478.00 from Jon Wilhelmi of Cass City. A motion was made by Trustee Tuttle and supported by Trustee Karr to accept the high bid of \$478.00. Motion carried 6 years, 0 nays.

The Minutes of the regular September meeting were approved as presented.

The October Financial Statement was reviewed.

A motion was made by

Trustee Weaver and supported by Trustee Tuttle that the bills be approved as presented. Motion carried 6 years, 0 nays.

Approval has been received for state funding through the Region 7A Thumb Task Force for extension of Division Street east to Cemetery Road. Estimated cost is \$130,000; 75% State and 25% Local, with local funds covering engineering costs.

A motion was made by Trustee Karr and supported by Trustee Weaver to designate Robert J. Wellington as Project Engineer for the Division Street Project. Motion carried 6 years, 0 nays.

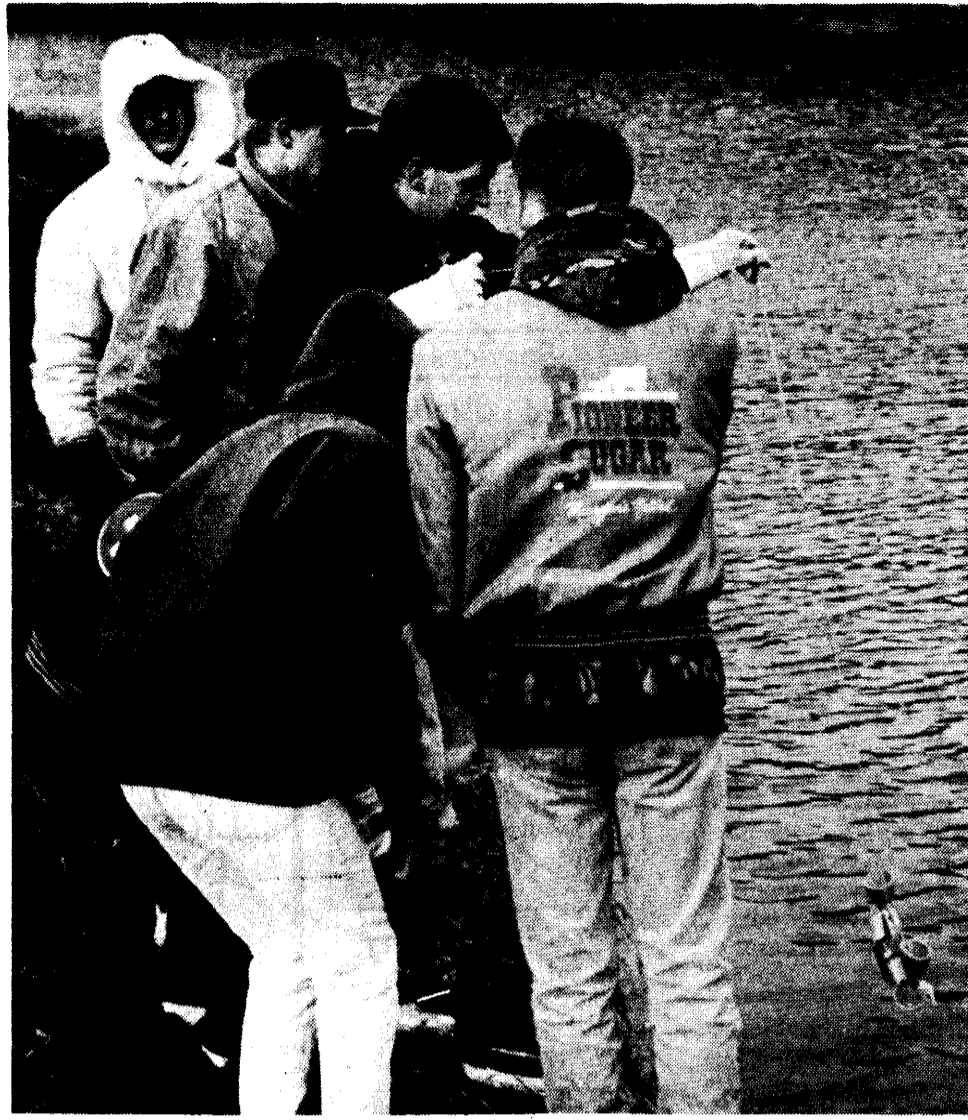

Cass River testing underway Kingston class taking part in Saginaw Bay initiative

A group of Kingston High School students are doing their part in a project designed to improve water quality within the Saginaw Bay Watershed. Mary Ann Safranek's Environmental Studies class, composed of 26 juniors and seniors, last week collected and began testing the first in a series of water samples from the Cass River. The samples were taken at Chippewa Landing in Caro, the Cardone Roadside Park on M-46 and Evergreen Township Park. Students are testing the water's pH as well as measuring levels of oxygen, nitrates, phosphates and fecal coliform, according to Safranek. The project is one of several funded through the

Saginaw Bay National Watershed Initiative. DNR Director Roland Harmes described the initiative as "a unique opportunity for federal, state and local government and citizens to work together to develop, strengthen and expand coordination efforts to enhance the restoration and protection of the Saginaw Bay Watershed." Safranek agreed the project is a unique opportunity for her students. "This is the first time we've done something where we know the data we're collecting will be used in a bigger study," she said. "It's relevant." The Kingston students' efforts are being funded by a \$500 DNR grant, with another \$500 worth of testing equipment coming from Saginaw Valley State University. Safranek said her class will collect and test samples 2 more times during the

school year, then compile and report all 3 sets of results in the spring. Kingston High School was one of 28 recipients of DNR grants, totaling more than \$525,000, awarded in conjunction with the Saginaw Bay initiative. The grants will fund a number of projects throughout the Saginaw Watershed Valley, including efforts focusing on evaluation of land use practices and local zoning, intensive monitoring of Saginaw Bay to determine the impact of zebra mussels, and construction of model on-farm pesticide storage structures as examples of effective and practical pesticide storage. The funding was made available through a \$1.6 million EPA grant awarded to the DNR when the EPA funded the Saginaw Bay Watershed as the first project under the National Watershed Initiative Program in July.

Ohio man killed in accident Sunday

An Ohio man was killed in a 2-vehicle accident Sunday afternoon in Denmark Township. Tuscola County Sheriff's deputies identified the victim as William K. Nielsen, 32, of Medina, Ohio.

According to reports, Milford E. Skogstad, 29, Flint, was southbound on Bradford Road at about 5:30 p.m. when he disregarded a stop sign, pulled into the M-46 intersection and was struck by Nielsen's eastbound pickup. After impact, the Skogstad vehicle struck a guard rail and a passenger, William H. Poullion II, 32, also of Flint, was thrown from the car. Nielsen's pickup traveled eastbound, struck the guard rail and went over the structure, rolling over several times. Nielsen, who was thrown from the vehicle, was dead at the scene, reports state. Skogstad was transported to St. Mary's Medical Center, Saginaw, and Poullion was taken to St. Luke's Hospital, Saginaw. Both men were listed in critical condition. Skogstad was the only occupant wearing a seat belt, according to deputies, who noted the crash remains under investigation. Deputies were assisted at the scene by Vassar and Reese police, the Richville Fire Department and by Vassar and Frankenmuth Ambulance personnel.

YOU CAN TREAT BEDWETTING

For about 25 years, medicines have been used for treating bedwetting and they have been quite effective. The most common mistake is rushing into treatment. There is no need to treat early; it is better to wait until the child is a little older and more mature. Failures are very disappointing to both the parents and child. The first step in treatment is reassurance that the child is normal and that bedwetting is not a serious problem. Rewards for being dry are helpful, but being dry should be reward enough along with parental praise for successes. It is always harmful to scold or humiliate the child for failures. Alarm devices are available and are one of the first choices. They require the child to be old enough to work the device and motivated enough to use it. If so, they are quite effective. Studies in Denmark have shown that some children have low levels of an antidiuretic hormone which helps concentrate the urine during sleep. These children can be treated with a medicine called DDAVP which has recently become available as a nasal spray. Limiting fluids in the evening may be of some value. Often it seems to make little difference, though. Medicines have been far more effective. Tricyclics have been used for many years and more recently oxybutynin has become available and this appears to be a little stronger. Either medicine can be used for several months, allowing the child to be dry and build up confidence. After this it can usually be tapered off. If occasional accidents continue, the medicines can be restarted. This is one of a series of articles brought to you in the interest of better health by
