### 5 YEARS AGO

The Elkland-Novesta United Way campaign netted donations well over this year's goal of \$16,500. For the fourth consecutive year, UPS employees achieved 100 percent participation in the fund drive. Their donation, \$5,200 of which came from employee contributions, was the single biggest donation to the local campaign.

The end of a glorious season arrived for the Cass City Red Hawks Friday in the district basketball finals at Frankenmuth, as a potent Frankenmuth Eagle team overpowered Cass City.

Selected to the Blue Bay League all-conference first team were Jodi Hillaker, Jenny Storm and Jodi Schember. Darcie Monroe and Stephanie Leitner received honorable mention.

Thumb area hunters taking part in this year's regular farm deer season appear to be taking a higher percentage of bucks compared to recent years. As of Thursday, the DNR Cass City Field Office had checked 185 deer since gun hunters took to the field Nov. 15. Last year, 107 bucks had been checked by the same date.

Telfarm is a farm business analysis and record-keeping system that has been assisting farm managers with their business decisions since 1928.

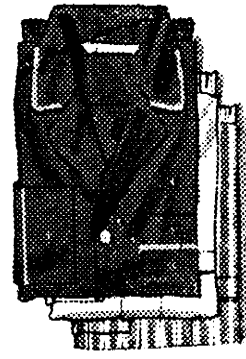

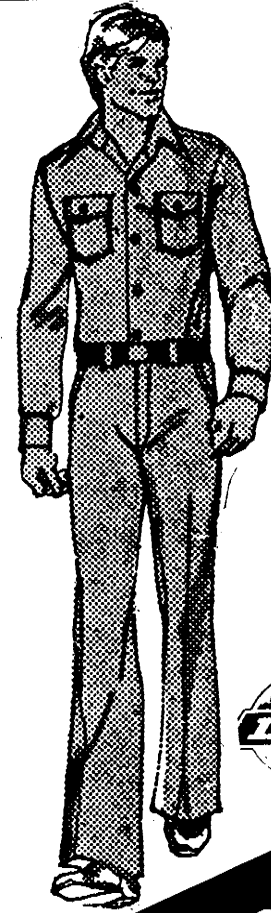

# Kingston falls to Glen Lake in semifinals

For the 2nd time in 3 years, the Kingston Cardinals' dream of playing for the Class DD state title was foiled by the Maple City Glen Lake Lakers.

Coach Bill Hollenbeck's Lakers ended the Cardinals' fantasy season with a 21-0 victory at Clare Saturday during the Class DD semifinals.

Kingston got off to a shaky start, but then regrouped to hold Glen Lake scoreless until the final quarter.

The Lakers' initial score wasn't without controversy. Senior sensation John McLaughlin was intercepted on the Cardinals' opening drive. Glen Lake's Jeff

Mikowski accounted for the game's maiden score with a one yard run after recovering his own fumble near the Kingston goal line.

Mikowski's fumble was originally recovered by a Kingston player who coughed it back to Glen Lake on the same play when he tried to advance the pigskin. Kingston argued that the fumble was recovered in the end zone that would have resulted in an automatic touchback.

Both schools had their share of miscues on the afternoon. Glen Lake committed 6 turnovers, but their defense proved worthy to all tests on all occasions.

Glen Lake held Kingston to just 147 yards of total offense. Kingston picked up 76 yards rushing, including 27 by McLaughlin on 9 totes, and 71 yards passing on 5 completions.

Kingston's defense also played well. The Cardinals held Glen Lake's high powered option offense to just over 100 yards rushing through the game's opening 3 quarters.

But with 11:24 left in the game, quarterback Brian Maurer raced 63 yards to pay dirt. Maurer's run for points after extended Glen Lake's advantage to 14-0.

Glen Lake put the game to

rest late in the final frame following McLaughlin's 2nd interception as Kingston was forced to go almost exclusively to an air attack.

Glen Lake marched from Kingston's 40 yard line to the goal line in just 2 plays, where they held a first and goal. The Kingston defense stuffed Glen Lake on its first 3 downs before Mikowski scored his 2nd marker from one yard out. Jason Wuelfel added the extra point kick.

Glen Lake rushed for 268 yards. Mikowski collected 105 yards on 21 carries, while sophomore Maurer chipped in 101 yards rushing and another 58 through the air on 6 of 9 passes.

# Bulldogs top Ubly, lose in finals to Kingston

As expected, the Kingston Cardinals captured the district crown Saturday at Akron with a 36-30 victory over the Owen-Gage Bulldogs.

The win advances the 22-1 Cardinals into the Class D regionals at Ubly, where they will meet Ashley tonight (Wednesday) in the regional finals.

The Bulldogs finish with a 12-10 mark.

As was the case during their 2 North Central Thumb League tilts, Owen-Gage battled the league champs for 4 quarters before bowing.

"They find a way to beat us," said Coach Dean Roller. "In the 4th quarter they have

a go to player and we have 5 girls who don't want the ball."

Stepping up for Kingston down the wire were seniors Devin Kelley and Megan Roland.

Kelley and Roland, who sat out much of the first half plagued with foul trouble, tallied 10 of the Cardinals' final 13 markers to preserve the win.

Both teams came out tight in the opening frame, where Owen-Gage grabbed a 5-3 lead on a pair of charity tosses by senior Amanda Salcido.

With Kelley and Roland on the bench, Kingston got a

huge boost from junior Dana Zyrowski in the 2nd stanza. Zyrowski tossed in 7 of her game high 14 markers to help stake Kingston to a 16-15 advantage at the break.

Although Kingston Coach Jim Green had his Cardinals holding the ball at the end of the opening 2 frames, it was the Bulldog offense that was on hold to open the 2nd half.

"We just couldn't do anything on offense," said Roller. "Attribute that to Kingston's defense. Their quickness hurt us."

The Cardinals limited Owen-Gage to just 2 field goals by senior Kate Powers to gain a 23-19 margin head-

ing into the final period.

Owen-Gage opened the final period with a 5-1 run to knot the game at 24-all but Kingston responded with an 8-2 run of their own to capture their 2nd consecutive district crown.

On the evening, Kingston converted 16 of 25 foul shots, including 4 of 6 in the final minute to preserve the win.

Besides Zyrowski, Powers finished with a dozen in her final game in a Bulldog uniform as the game's only other double digit performer. Salcido added 9 for the losers.

Kate (Powers) did a good job defensively inside," credited Roller.

Ubly closed the gap to 33-29 on Creguer's 15' jumper, but a timely 3-point play from Powers with 1:50 remaining in the period extended Owen-Gage to a 36-29 margin. Ubly's Rachel Morell's free throw ended the scoring in the quarter.

Smith took control of the contest in the final period, scoring 7 straight points for the winners during a 9-2 spurt.

When Wyrick collected her 5th foul at the 2:48 mark, Ubly's chances of any comeback were laid to rest. Wyrick finished with a team best 17 tallies.

Owen-Gage advanced into the district final with a 59-40 win Thursday over the Ubly Bearcats.

Junior Tonya Smith proved to be the difference, as she tossed in a game high 21 points that included 11 in the final period.

Senior Krissy Wyrick kept the Bearcats close throughout the initial half with timely shots behind the 3-point arc. Wyrick collected 3 treys in the half that kept Ubly within 3 at the break, where they trailed 28-25.

Owen-Gage got a huge lift from Melissa Vargo in the early going as she collected 10 points by the halfway point.

"Vargo had some big points in the first half," said Roller, who will look for Vargo to carry much of the load next year along with classmate Smith.

Owen-Gage extended its margin to 36-30 heading into the final frame as the Bulldog defense held Ubly to solo baskets by Wyrick and Sara Creguer in the 3rd stanza.

### MSU tech school offers alternative ag training



Students interested in hands-on careers in agriculture can get good jobs without 4 years of study.

Michigan State University's Institute of Agricultural Technology (IAT), founded more than 100 years ago, is a 2-year program that continues to prepare its graduates for good paying jobs.

Cliff Jump, IAT director, says the program is an appealing alternative for students interested in agriculture who know what they want out of their education.

The IAT consists of 10 areas of study ranging from livestock and horse management to crop production and turfgrass management. The majority of students enrolled must complete 48 credit hours to receive an associate's certificate. This usually takes only 3 or 4 semesters.

Jump says that 99 percent of the students enrolled in the program have already worked in the industry and have a good idea that is what they want to pursue as a career. Approximately two-thirds of the nearly 400 students will return to their family farm operations.

"Job opportunities are great for those who are open to relocation, but about 90 percent of the graduates choose to stay in Michigan," Jump says.

"The dairy management program is designed to give students practical training in the dairy industry. Most come from family farms and want to take some technical knowledge back home with them," says Joe Domecq, dairy management program director.

Domecq points out that the many dairy farms and agribusinesses in the state offer many excellent job opportunities for students who don't have a farm to return to.

Many students enroll in the IAT right after high school.

but Jump says students often enroll because they are seeking a career change or an additional degree.

"The students in the turfgrass program average 27 years of age and are usually looking for a second degree," he says.

John Shelle, director of the horse management program, says the program enables his students to have all the opportunities of a technical institution at a university location.

"The beauty of the tech program is that it provides a good education with hands-on experience and technical training in a university environment where there is a lot of educational opportunity through use of facilities and resources," he says.

A 4-year horse management program trains students for work in areas such as feed and pharmaceutical industries. The 2-year tech program is designed for students who desire to work with animals on a daily basis. This skills-oriented program often trains students to work with the animals as trainers or stable managers.

Only 25 students are allowed per year, so many are turned down for admission. Any growth in the program depends on availability of faculty members, university funding and facilities to support it.

The landscape and nursery program prepares students for careers in areas such as landscape design and construction, greenhouse maintenance and garden center management. Director Bob Schutzki says that both students enrolling in the program for a change in career and others just out of high school find it appealing.

"Students find the program a viable option in postsecondary education. Upon completion of the 16-month program, they are able to focus and enter the industry right out of school," he says.

Jump says that the program is currently using interactive television (ITV) to give students who don't have the

option to attend the university an opportunity to take the courses that they want or need.

"Currently, a basic soils class has 19 students enrolled right here on campus, and 15 students in Grand Rapids and 19 students in Traverse City who are learning via ITV," Jump says.

Four more courses will be taught next spring through ITV, he notes.

Though the program has some drawbacks, such as high tuition and competition from community colleges, Jump says that the results far outweigh them.

"It is the greatest opportunity for a young man or woman to get self-confidence when starting out," he says. "It is one of the best investments that they can make for their future."

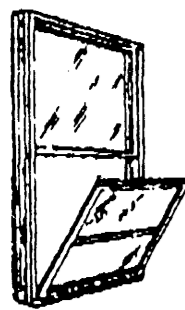

# Road vote recount set

A Sanilac County woman believes there may have been an error in counting the votes cast earlier this month for and against a proposed county-wide 2-mill road millage, and she's willing to pay to find out for certain. Sanilac County Clerk Linda I. Kozfkay last week announced the county's board of canvassers will conduct a recount of the vote held during the Nov. 5 general election.

County voters were asked to approve 2 mills for 5 years for primary roads and major and local streets.

The measure passed by just 11 votes, 8,172-8,161, paving the way for some \$1.2 million in funding for primary roads and \$362,000 for major and local streets.

However, Bridgehampton Township resident Dixie

Ladd last week filed a petition requesting a recount.

In the petition, Ladd cites the close vote in light of more than 17,000 ballots cast, according to Kozfkay, who said Ladd also stated a previous road millage was defeated by voters in April 1995, and she alleges use of new electronic ballot counting equipment might have resulted in an error.

Kozfkay indicated she doesn't believe there were any problems with the new optical scan ballot counting equipment, saying the county's back-up equipment never left her office. "The system worked fine."

Still, she explained, election law provides for a recount on a proposal if a county resident files a petition alleging an error and/or fraud.

Ladd did just that, and she

is paying the \$300 cost (\$10 per precinct) for the recount. Kozfkay said.

The recount, expected to take about 3 days, will begin

Monday at 8:30 a.m. in the board of commissioners chambers, located in the county courthouse in Sandusky.

# Warrant sought for Cass City woman

Cass City police are seeking an arrest warrant charging a live-in health care worker with allegedly bilking her employer out of more than \$21,000.

Cass City police reports state charges of forgery and uttering and publishing will be sought against Lucinda K. Moody, 24, Cass City.

Police said the investigation began when the victim's daughter reported that her mother's signature had been

forged on several personal checks written between January 1996 and October 1996.

Police interviewed Moody and said she signed a confession stating she had forged the victim's name on a number of checks made out to credit card companies and other businesses. The combined checks, which totaled \$21,013.10, included payments for book orders and a computer.

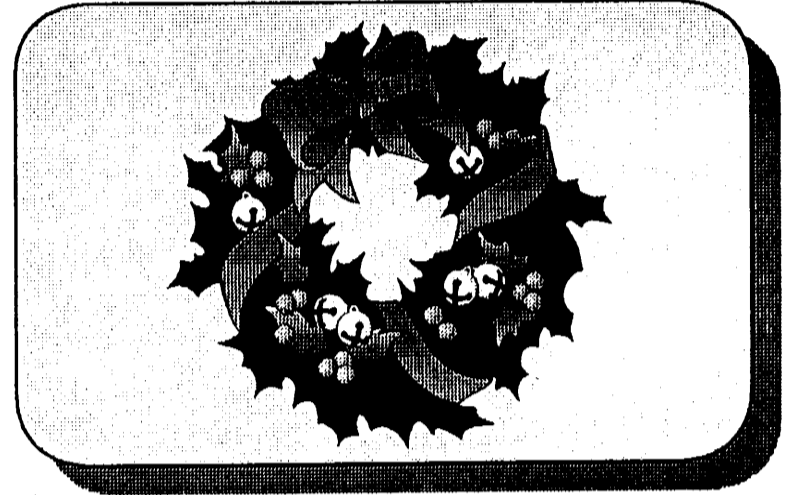



# Kingston High School expansion on track

An expansion project designed to give Kingston High School students more elbow room, warmer classrooms and state-of-the-art technology is on track.

"The building itself is on schedule," school Supt. George Goodchild said last week, noting workers have been busy laying the foundations for new classrooms and a new technology lab.

Pavers were expected to complete work on a parking lot in front of the school any

day. Unfortunately, a planned driveway leading to the elementary school won't be blacktopped until spring, Goodchild said, adding, however, "We may go ahead and use the drive when the ground freezes."

The lane was planned in an effort to avoid having school buses use the M-46 and Ross Street intersection, which presents a safety risk.

Goodchild said the building project should be completed by the end of next summer, before the start of the 1997-

98 school year. Construction began in October, about 6 months after voters approved a \$1.97 million bond issue to fund the work.

The bond issue will cover the cost of building 8 new classrooms. Plans also call for the addition of a computer lab as well as the technology lab that will expose students to technologies such as computer aided design (CAD), laser controls, aerodynamics, robotics and water purification systems. The expansion totals 13,000

square feet and will involve construction of 960-square-foot classrooms.

In addition, the bond issue is enabling school officials to repair a 26-year-old gymnasium roof, and install a new central boiler system that will provide room-to-room heat control.

Heat has been provided by several roof top furnace units that heat various zones of the school. But the equipment, which came with the school when it was built in 1970, has failed miserably in recent years.

## Chemical announces dividends

Alan W. Ott, chairman of Chemical Financial Corporation, announced that the corporation declared the regular fourth quarter 1996 cash dividend, as well as a 5-percent stock dividend.

# Ross recalls 1944 toy auction

Friday, the day after Thanksgiving, is traditionally one of the busiest shopping days of the year, and as any parent knows, the selection of toys out there is endless.

But there was a time when toys were plenty scarce during the Christmas season. Bernard Ross remembers that time well. He also recalls a local service club's effort to fill that void and, at the same time, raise money for the Cass City Community Hospital Fund.

The year was 1944, and although the end of World War II wasn't far away, American manufacturing efforts remained concentrated on the war effort.

"There was a shortage of everything during World War II," Ross recalled. "They didn't make cars, they didn't make anything."

At the time, Ross was a member of the Cass City Gavel Club, which was formed with the goals of improving members' speaking skills, as well as to improve their community.

During the club's first fall meeting in 1944, it was decided to make toys to be auctioned off for the benefit of the hospital fund, according to Ross, a Cass City native and retired businessman.

"Cass City had 2 good hospitals at the time," he said. "For Cass City to grow and improve, a new, modern, larger hospital was needed."

So, a committee was formed to lay the groundwork for the project. "First, we had to decide what we were going to make, then we had to design it and make a pattern for the parts," Ross said.

**EXPERIENCE**

Then-village Superintendent Bud Burt, drug store owner Warren Wood and electrician Ed Baker "had experience in wood work design and construction of wood toys and furniture," Ross added. "They also had the necessary tools to cut the parts for each toy."

Crews were formed and assigned various tasks, such as cutting out parts, sanding and painting. Before long, some volunteers who weren't club members pitched in to help. "We had a regular assembly line," Ross said, noting the club members worked in second floor rooms at what are now the Osetoski and Healthmart buildings in town.

"We assigned people work (according) to their talents. I didn't have any talent, so they put me on sanding," Ross joked. I became an expert at sanding each part for the toys.

He recalled Jim Gross was in charge of painting, and with a shortage of paint, the color of each toy was determined by what color was available at the time. Gross was nicknamed "one coat

Gross" after decided to use one heavy coat of paint on the toys, rather than 2 coats.

When the dust cleared, the club had produced 300 toys, including doll cradles and beds, rocking horses, sleds and pull toys.

**WELL MADE**

"These weren't frivolous toys," Ross pointed out, referring to the solid construction of each item. "My grandchildren are using them now."

Ross explained he purchased a doll bed and cradle for his daughter, and a sled for his son. "I'm sure they'll (toys) go 2 more generations."

He recalled the toy auction was well received. "Bidding was fast and very good because some felt it was a donation to the hospital fund, and a very good toy."

According to an article published in the Dec. 22, 1944, edition of the Chronicle, total receipts and contributions totaled \$2,214.22 — \$2,048 after expenses.

"A free dance was held in connection with the auction of the toys," the article states. "Gunsell's orchestra fur-

nished the music and Lorn Brown, Howard Loomis and Jim Milligan served as callers. Dancing continued until the early morning hours and a 'good time was had by all.' The attendance was estimated between 300 and 400 people."

Ross indicated the attendance wasn't a big surprise. "You didn't have a television

and you didn't run to Saginaw for a play," he said. "It was a social event for the community."

The amount raised during the auction wouldn't be a lot of money by today's standards, he concluded, "but multiply \$2,000 by the percent of inflation from 1944-1996 (and it was) a huge success."
