Mart. Board Chrysler-Plymouth became Cass City Chrysler.

The village of Cass City purchased the former Chemical Bank building and moved to the main corner of town at Main and Seeger Street.

The Downtown Development Association was active with plans for future development of the business community.

ASPHALT PLANT

A proposal to set up an asphalt processing plant near a gravel pit located on an 83-acre parcel just west of Cass City remained alive in 1996, although there was little news to report.

In March, Triple T Farms filed suit in U.S. District Court, naming Elkland Township as the defendant in a case seeking consent to operate the asphalt plant, as well as a judgement of \$300,000 plus costs, interest and attorneys fees.

The court action followed months of controversy surrounding the proposed asphalt plant.

Several zoning and special permit requests, all accompanied by protests from nearby property owners, have been denied by township officials over a period of about 6 years.

The federal law suit remains active, although no court dates have been set.

SPORTS

It was mostly an uneventful year on the sports front. Most notable was Chad

Tate's performance in the Michigan High School Athletic Association's state golf tourney.

Tate finished second in the class C championship, just a stroke away from the title.

Other Cass City High School teams failed to bring home a championship, but fans were heartened by the improvement shown by the football team.

GENEROSITY

The Cass City community annually generates a host of stories that prove area residents are quick to support a good cause with more than lip service.

Examples in 1996 included:
 •Students and staff at Owen-Gage High School didn't hesitate to respond when a nearby apartment complex caught fire in Oc-

tober.
 The school immediately opened its doors to dozens of people left homeless by the blaze. Students and staff, who were recently recognized by Red Cross officials, organized clothing drives and delivered hot coffee to fire fighters.

•Likewise, residents didn't hesitate to offer a helping hand to Sue Baker, a Cass City woman who recently underwent a bone marrow transplant. Fund raisers organized by Baker's fellow employees at Tendercare were well attended, and the local United Way chipped in \$500, providing some help with travel and other expenses related to her treatment.

•Many people have no idea how much work is involved in the local Toys for Tots drive, but program Coordinator Sue Werschky of Cass

City does. For years she has organized the annual campaign as well as related activities and recruited volunteers. In the process, the local effort has provided very merry Christmases to countless area families, including about 110 this year.

•In what has become a tradition, the community exceeded the expectations of local United Way officials this year, coming through with contributions totalling \$43,000, a whopping \$18,000 over the goal of \$25,000.

•The community has been generous, too, to the renovation project at Rawson Memorial Library, which is progressing nicely. Library officials recently reported all but about \$72,000 of the \$650,000 needed has been raised.

Werschky said the work typically begins in February with fund raising.

"It's really busy starting right around the first of November," she explained. "It takes about 3 days (of work) a week then, and in December, it's like a full-time job, every day."

The numbers have since leveled off, but the need is still very much there. Children from more than 100 families enjoyed a merry Christmas this year, thanks to

the local effort.

However, the going was rough at times. Werschky said she could have used a dozen volunteers on the nights set aside to pack toys. However, "Some days we had only 5 people there to help, and we had a mountain of toys."

Although recruiting enough volunteer help has become a problem, Werschky is quick to credit the efforts of a handful of dedicated people who, year in and year out, "give until they're exhausted."

"The problem is," she concluded, "there just isn't enough of us."

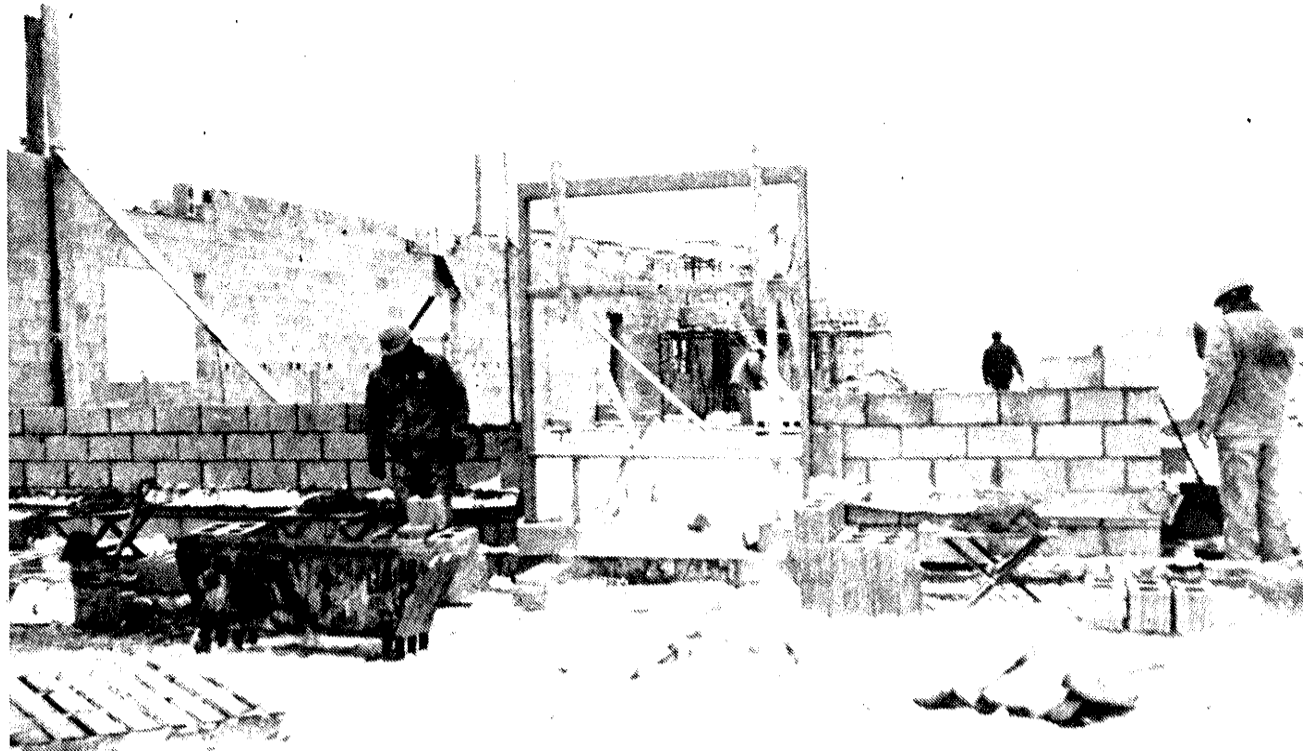

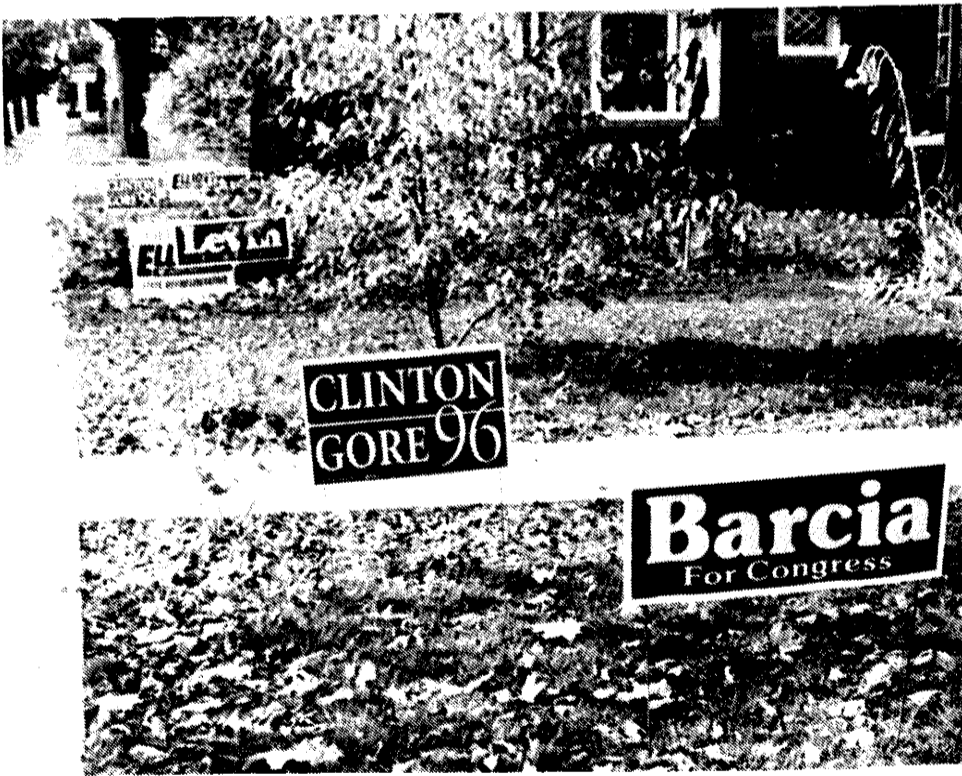

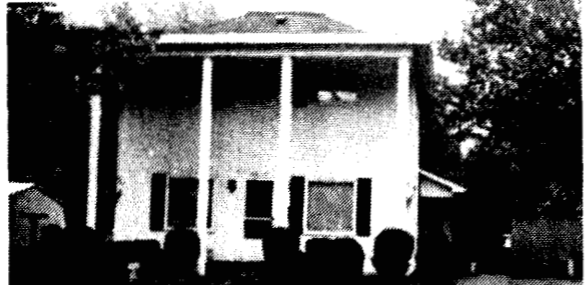
