Warrants sought for Ubly pair

Sanilac County Sheriff's deputies are seeking arrest warrants for a pair of Ubly area residents for allegedly dumping dozens of tires in roadside ditches.

The suspects' names were not released pending their arraignment in Sanilac County District Court.

Investigators said citizens' tips and assistance from the Huron County Sheriff's Department and Ubly Police Department led police to the suspects Thursday.

The investigation began 3 days earlier when Sanilac deputies received a complaint that someone had dumped a large number of tires in several locations along road ditches in Wheatland, Minden and Delaware townships.

Witnesses reported they saw an early 1980s Ford pickup truck, powder blue in color with a white stripe, pulling a utility trailer loaded with tires, and that the pickup was Please turn to back page.

Council okays curb assessment

Cass City officials Monday paved the way for completion of improvements to Scotty McCullough Drive this summer.

The village Council, during a brief monthly meeting, approved a special assessment district for curb and gutter construction, which is slated to get underway this week.

Paving of the street is scheduled to be completed in

The assessment district, approved following a brief publage to spread the cost of the curb and gutter among affected property owners, which include the Thumb Dialysis Center (\$1,300.64), Charles Nemeth (\$1,661.72) and Robert Bliss (\$1,661.72)

The assessment is based on an estimated cost, including a portion of engineering costs, of \$11.19 per foot for Nemeth and Bliss, and \$14.78 per foot for the dialysis center.

Property owners will have up to 5 years to pay their percent per year, although no interest will be charged if full payment is made within 90 days of the assessment.

In other business, the council approved the village's 1999 millage rates, which remain the same as in 1998 at: 12.4625 mills for general operations, 3.5 mills for streets and 2.5 mills for debt retirement.

The levy, applied to this year's combined taxable property value \$51,239,886, is expected to pared to the 1999 village budget, tax revenue should exceed budgeted expenses by \$855.53.

Also Monday, the council: *Heard from resident Dan Mellendorf, who voiced concern over another resident's installation of a fence onto what he described as the wrong property line.

Village Manager Jane Downing said she believes the fence in question was installed properly based on ex-

Committee to iron out new school bus policy

A group of interested parents in the Cass City School District attended the regular meeting of the Cass City School Board Monday to air concerns about rules for riding school busses and the presentation of violent films to students in classes.

It was the second month in a row that the board was quizzed on proposed riding regulations presented by bus director Bob Kozan. Discussion between the board and the spectators cleared the air and defined the issues, but no solutions have yet emerged.

A committee was formed to iron out bus riding policy. What the committee faces is developing a policy that will accommodate students who need to change buses for a day or more at the request of parents and yet not overload

Rules also need to be established, superintendent Ken Micklash said, to define what may be carried on buses.

To come to grips with these issues a committee was formed. It includes 3 board members, Dave Knight, Jim Turner and Randy Severance. Kris Milligan from the teaching staff and Karen Nicol will also serve. It is expected that the group will report a plan at the next board meeting in June.

Ray and Bonnie Ferris showed portions of a film depicting Romeo and Juliet in today's society where the characters use guns instead of swords. The film was shown in a literature class and notes were sent to parents to give them an opportunity to have their children excused from seeing the film.

After viewing the film the Ferrises had their daughter excused. While the film was shown she was required to read the play and then answer questions about it.

The parents felt that making the student do busy work was not appropriate unless everyone who saw the film also had written tests about it. Better to have her doing her home work, Bonnie Ferris told the board.

The suggestion of the teaching staff is that following board policy the parents should talk with the teacher involved, then the administration and finally the school board.

Micklash said that he would review the procedure the school followed in the past and present suggestions at the next board meeting.

"Plans are being made by the county to revamp the county park and possibly add up to 150 camp sites, electric and water/sewer hookups. It is unclear at this time if there will be an opportunity to have any more benefits at this park," she explained. "But ABATE Region 7 is proud to have kept it open to the public since it was in danger of closing a few years ago, and help make improvements every year since by donating a portion of the proceeds to the parks board specifically for Evergreen Park.

The planned improvements rest on hopes that state officials will approve a \$610,000 grant application.

If that happens, the park. located on M-53, would be transformed into a modern camping facility. Subsequently, park officials would not be able to close the park for the annual ABATE fund raiser.

"We're going to miss it if we can't have it next year," commented Swalwell, who indicated ABATE members will wait and see what hap-

Regardless of the future, Swalwell lauded county officials for allowing ABATE to take over the park for a weekend each summer. The county took a chance, she said, and ABATE members have worked hard to earn officials' trust by running a trouble-free event, and by striving to leave the park with little, if any, sign that a weekend party had just been held there - no small task considering attendance has averaged some 700 people in recent years.

Of course, the county has benefited by the bikers' efforts, which have generated a combined estimated \$12,400 for the park over the past 5 years.

Okay, its admitted that I am a gun-control hard liner, but the Michigan legislature's attempt to liberalize gun control law is simply incredu-

One standard refrain from the anti gun control is that guns don't kill people, people kill people. Tell me how that 13-year-old in a Georgia school could have seriously wounded 6 schoolmates with any knife, club or what have you or committed that massacre in Colorado any way but with a gun.

The recent school shootings in Georgia has at least temporarily stalled the loosening of gun laws in the Michigan senate, but it could be just a temporary reprieve.

Our representative Mike Green has endorsed the liberal gun law legislation, saying it's just the way he feels.




Farewell

Driving costs increase slightly

The cost of driving a car in 1999 will be 47 cents-permile on average, .9 of a centper-mile higher than last year, according to AAA Michigan. This is the smallest increase since 1994, when driving costs rose by

The auto club's annual "Your Driving Costs" study reports motorists driving

The increase is mainly due to higher ownership costs Sullivan is the daughter of such as insurance, depreciation, license and registration.

Operating costs - - gas and oil, maintenance and tires - decreased .1 if a cent to 10.6 cents per mile as a result of lower prices at the gas pump. This marks the second straight year that operating costs have dropped.

AAA Michigan's cost estimates are based on computations made by Runzheimer International of Rochester, Wis., a management consulting firm specializing in transportation, travel and living

The auto club's cost figures are based on a composite national average of 3 domestically built 1999 cars - - a subcompact Chevrolet Cavalier LS, a mid-size Ford Taurus SE and a full-size Mercury Grand Marquis GS.

These similarly equipped vehicles include air conditioning, automatic transmission, power steering, AM/ FM stereo, dual air bags, antilock brakes, cruise control, tilt steering wheel, tinted glass and a rear-widow defogger. The costs are based on a 4-year/60,000 miles ownership period.

The study also included driving costs for sport-utility vehicles and minivans. AAA Michigan says the cost to drive a 1999 Chevrolet Blazer is 53.8 cents per mile, up .5 of a cent from last year and 6.8 cents more than the composite average for passenger cars. The driving costs for a Dodge Caravan SE are 48.8 cents per mile, unchanged from last year and 1.8 cents more than for passenger cars.

Driving costs in the study are reflective of personal driving and are significantly different from costs typically used to determine reimbursement for business-related use of a personal vehicle.

The information on the Chevrolet Blazer and Dodge Caravan is not used to determine the composite national average, but is included in the report to help buyers estimate driving costs for these

Alpacas tops with Maurers

They came from the highlands of Peru, from the high Andean Plateau and the mountains of South American. These animals traveled across land and ocean to come to America.

They're Alpacas, and they're here to stay. For Mary Maurer, life-long resident of the Thumb area, nothing

could be better. Mary and Ben Maurer, owners of Maurer Alpacas, 1-mile South of Ubly on M-19, bought their first 2 alpacas in 1997. Since then, the couple has not only watched their animals and their business grow to 13 animals, but they have also felt their hearts grow as well for these beautiful creatures.

Curious and gentle, the alpacas were a cherished treasure of the ancient Inca civilization. They played a central part in the Incan culture. The fine cashmere-like fleece produced by the alpaca was once reserved for only Incan royalty. The alpaca, along with its cousin, the llama, provided food, fuel, clothing and transpor-

Domesticated for some 6,000 years, the alpaca had only recently been introduced into the United States, beginning in 1984.

For Maurer, who left the road commission after 23years, alpaca ranching was the perfect opportunity.

"I wanted to find something that I could do from home, use my skills and make the same money as I did working outside the home," she said. "That's what led me to the alpacas after a long

Maurer added, "I traded in nylons, suits and dresses for casual clothes and jeans."

Born and raised on a farm near Ubly, Maurer knew she loved animals and she knew how to care for them. The alpacas fit the criteria she was looking for.

"I enjoy the business part of it- putting out flyers on the breeding of our males and answering inquiries on ba-

Her husband, Ben, plant manager at Gemini Plastics in Ubly, also helps care for the alpacas, which Mary Maurer said is a very simple

"He helps with monthly toe nail trimming, shots and sheering whenever it's needed to be done," she said.

EXPENSIVE ANIMALS

But, according to Maurer, these beautiful animals are worth every penny-and that means quite a bit! Females can be sold for a price ranging between \$12,500 to \$40,000, depending on the animal. Although males don't sell for the same price as females, they do go for \$7,500 to \$25,000, also depending on the animal.

Price depends on a number of factors, including sex, the color of the animal, age and quantity and quality of the

The animals are sheered in

the spring. Approximately 5 pounds of wool are sheered from each animal per year. and with going prices for fleece at \$2 to \$3 per ounce, Maurer said the sale of the fleece alone pays for the animals food for the entire year.

"The fleece is warmer, lighter and stronger than sheep's wool," Maurer said.

But the business aspect of the industry, which is currently based on the sale of breeding stock, isn't the only benefit of owning and raising alpacas. Maurer can vouch for that. Although it only takes a matter of minutes to feed the animals on her 4-acre ranch, she's with them for hours.

"And I like the fact that they're in a small area where I can keep track of them," she added, referring to the five separate pastures encompassing 2 1/2 acres.

She also enjoys their curious nature. These curious creatures don't miss a beatlarge dog crossed the Maurers' yard at quite a distance from the alpacas, they saw it-and they let everyone else know too.

Sounding a warning alarm. these alpacas call attention to anything that shouldn't be there, including a dog. With their low, repetitive cry, resembling a honking horn from a child's bicycle, these alpacas tell the Maurers when something isn't right.

Each have large, dark eyes, and they like to stare. Their tranquilizing eyes tempt an individual to stay with them, so it's no wonder Maurer loves to spend so much time with the animals. The Maurers have even had a few trees removed from their back yard.

"The trees blocked the view of the animals from the dining room," she said.


Maurer has also had the chance to visit other alpaca breeders in Michigan, as well

or a dog for that matter. As a as Ohio, and participates in the annual October Michigan AlpacaFest in Armada. where she has severed as Fleece Chairperson for the

past two years. "This year, I'll have my own fleece entered so I won't judge," she said. "The reason I'd helped out was to learn how fleeces were judged and the pros and cons

of particular fleece.' Maurer is also a member of the Alpaca Owners and Association Breeders (AOBA).

Maurer previously focused on building her herd and now with 13 animals, 8 of which are female, she said it is time to open the market. For the first time, Maurer will offer 4 young offspring for sale this year. And with 8 females, each able to reproduce 1 offspring a year, Maurer has great hope that her business and her hobby will continue successfully for decades to come.

MAURER enjoys spending hours with her alpacas, although it takes only a short time to feed them. They eat a grassy-hay mix that includes 25 percent alfalfa. They also enjoy pellets, pasture grass, and minerals. With 3 stomachs, they utilize their food efficiently.



Association of Conservation District's annual meeting in December.



The state House of Representatives last week approved bipartisan legislation, sponsored by Rep. Mike Green, which reforms Michigan's concealed weapon laws and makes it easier for law-abiding citizens to defend themselves and their families.

"This is a victory for decent, honest citizens across the state," said Green, R-Mayville. "Michigan families will be safer."

House Bill 4530 is part of a multi-bill package that addresses the concerns of law enforcement agencies as well as gun-rights advocates.
