## Cost-cutting continues

# Consolidation targets Deford Elementary

Say goodbye next year to the Deford school the way it operates today and say hello to the possibility of a new magnet school in its place.

The start of the demise of the building as part of the regular Cass City District system begins this fall when the kindergarten students move to Campbell Elementary School.

There were to be 17 students in kindergarten at Deford and Supt. Ken Micklash told the school board at a special meeting Thursday that there have already been 7 requests to transfer to Campbell.

These students can be placed at Campbell without overloading the classes. There were expected to be 67 kindergarten students spread among 4 sections at Campbell. The addition of 17 from Deford brings the total to 84 with a manageable 21 students per class.

This year the third grade was switched to Campbell and this fall the school will have just 33 students, 15 in the first grade and 18 in the second.

Micklash envisions the magnet school as one that will help middle-grade students with special learning problems in Huron, Sanilac and Tuscola counties. Although under the auspices of the Cass City District, the new school would be self-supporting, Micklash noted.

### Expense cuts

- One administrator-\$100,000
- 1 1/2 middle school teacher-\$100,000
- Third grade teacher-\$70,000
- Eliminate bus route-\$5,000 (amortized cost per year for bus)
- Bus driver-\$11,500
- Half time custodian-\$20,000
- Total-\$306,500.

The consolidation is part of a stringent cost-cutting plan made necessary by a falling student enrollment. Enrollment for 2001-2 was 1,597 students. The anticipated enrollment for 2002-3 is 1,541. The decrease of 56 students results in excess of \$350,000 in reduced state aid.

Micklash has cut staff and overhead to counter the loss in revenue. Helped by 5

teacher resignations, he was able to make cuts across the board without laying off any employees.

One of the resignations was by Martha Butcher, second grade teacher, who has 31 years on the job stretched over a career that started in Cass City in 1965. She will be replaced by Lori Brown.

Another long-time employee, Clayton Sawdon is retiring after 16 years as a

custodian and bus driver. The school will eliminate one bus run this year and the Deford custodial position will be part time, approximately 3 to 3 1/2 hours per day. The 33 students attending Deford will be assigned to other buses.

It is not expected to add more than 10 to 15 minutes on the bus for the students, Micklash noted.

## Board hires Fernald as assistant principal

Aaron Fernald, 31, was selected from among 33 applicants for the post of assistant principal and athletic director at Cass City by the school board at a special meeting of the board Thursday.

Fernald has served for a year as the Cass City boys' basketball coach while teaching at Unionville-Sebewaing Middle School.

In his new job as athletic director, he will retain his coaching duties. "We talked about that in committee", Supt. Ken Micklash said. His work as athletic director will be reviewed just as all coaches and teachers are reviewed. As assistant principal his job performance will be reviewed by high school principal Jon Good.

Fernald told the board he is looking for a home in Cass City and will move here as required for employment on the administration staff.

He will have a 2-year contract, with salary set for the first year at \$63,400.

Seven of the 33 applicants were interviewed. Besides Fernald they were: Kurt Dennis, Bad Axe basketball coach; Don Markel, wrestling coach; Linda Bailey, Cass City Middle School teacher; Chris Kidd, Davison

school teacher; Paul Bringard, Memphis school teacher, and Dave Hoard, Cass City teacher and veteran softball coach.

Before coaching at Cass City last year, Fernald spent 5 years as Unionville-Sebewaing junior varsity basketball coach. He also was an assistant coach at Saginaw Valley State University for 5 years and a year at the junior varsity level at Birch Run.

His wife, Kate, is a dental hygienist. The couple has a daughter, Lauren, two years old.

## Airplane crash claims one life

One man was killed and another was critically injured Saturday morning when their small 2-passenger plane crashed during take-off at the Tuscola Area Airport near Caro.

Tuscola County Sheriff's deputies reported the crash occurred at 10:30 a.m. as the plane took off, then veered off to the north side, striking a high safety berm.

"At this time it is unknown where the 2 occupants were flying," said Tuscola County Undersheriff Jim Jashinske, who reported the pilot was critically injured and unconscious. He was transported by MMR Ambulance to St. Mary's Medical Center in Saginaw. The pilot's passenger was taken by MMR to Caro Community Hospital where he died.

# Candidates blast veto

Troubled by Gov. John Engler's recent veto of some \$1 billion in revenue sharing, 4 Thumb area candidates for the Michigan House of Representatives banded together at a press conference in Caro last Wednesday to blast the governor's decision and call upon their opponents to support the sweeping movement to override the veto.

Local governments rely on revenue sharing payments to cover costs related to public safety, health care, road repairs and other necessary services.

The candidates also voiced concern over the veto of more than \$7 million in fire protection grants - money used to fund fire departments across the state.

"I'm extremely concerned about what this veto will do to local police and sheriff's departments across the state," said Tuscola County Sheriff Tom Kern, who is running in the 84th District, which includes Huron and Tuscola counties.

"I find it irresponsible that Tom Meyer and the legislators have not spoken up already. As a local law enforcement officer, I'm deeply disturbed by these cuts, especially in this time of heightened homeland security."

"The action taken by the governor is outrageous," said

Colin Rumsey, 43, a small business owner from Jeddo who is running in the 81st District, which includes St. Clair County.

"My opponent, Lauren Hager, and Senate Majority Leader Dan DeGrow from Port Huron should have the political clout to get a vote on overriding this catastrophic veto," Rumsey added. "It's time to see if they stand on the same side of St. Clair County families or their political loyalties to the governor."

"This veto is going to hurt real people," said Eric Knuth, a North Branch attorney who is running in the 82nd District, which includes Lapeer County. "I would encourage the Legislature to work together and find a bipartisan solution to do the right thing - restore this critical funding to Lapeer County."

"Will Stephen Ehardt stand up for the families in Sanilac County," asked Ed Schultz,

a St. Clair County Commissioner from Lake Port who is running in the 83rd District, which includes Sanilac County and a part of eastern

St. Clair County. "Or will he march to the beat of the political bosses' drums yet again allowing millions of dollars to be ripped from the budgets of cities and towns in Sanilac County?"

According to the Michigan Association of Counties, the 5 counties in the 4 candidates' districts will lose a combined \$8,038,028. Combine the cities and townships within these counties and the total adds up to a whopping \$17.9.

All 4 candidates agreed Engler's veto, if allowed to stand, will have devastating effects on the Thumb area.

"This veto will mean the communities may have to make a choice between new equipment for the fire department or fixing a sewer system or a road," Kern said.

"Communities shouldn't be forced to choose between these basic necessities."

"This is just a matter of priorities, values and common sense. Hurting communities for political gain is no way to do business."

Schultz agreed. "It's time that a message was sent that playing politics will no longer be tolerated in Michigan. It's time to put people ahead of politics in Michigan," he said.

"This is money that Michigan communities depend on heavily," Knuth said. "To lose it now would be disastrous. Common sense should dictate that police and fire protection is not the place to start (cutting)."

"Slashing funding to local police and fire departments seems like a strange way to protect Michigan families," Rumsey added. "This funding needs to be restored, and quickly."

## Down under

### Hoyt back from dream competition

Two days after she returned from her once in a lifetime trip to Australia, Liz Hoyt is battling jet lag, readjusting to the time change and recalling highlights of her 11 days down under.

She was a part of a group of top racers from across the country competing in the cross-country division of the fifth annual Parkroyal Down Under International Games.

It was not only a chance to compete against some of the best distance runners, it was also an opportunity to see Australia at bargain rates. The trip cost \$3,100 and all except \$100 was raised by benefits and support of various groups.

Oddly enough, 2 incidents in the forefront of her memory didn't occur in Australia. The first was in Los Angeles at the airport.

It was shortly after the killing spree at the facility and security was extra tight. Someone left a bag with a bottle exposed in the middle of the floor and the airport was cleared, Hoyt explained. We hustled over to "Encounter", a fancy restaurant, but when we saw dinners at \$20 a plate, we left. We enjoyed pizza on the steps of the restaurant and milled around for 6 hours before we returned to the airport. Then we stood in line for an hour and a half to clear customs to get on the plane. It was a false alarm; the bottle was half full of vodka.

The second came on the next to last day of the trip. My mother phoned and told me that my friend, auto crash victim Tyler

Harp, was recovering and I screamed so loudly my roommates wondered what was the matter, she smiled.

Sandwiched between sightseeing tours Hoyt competed in 2 races, the International, over 5-K and the All American, under 4-K. She was 8th in the 5-K and 20th in the 4-K.

Michigan sent the largest delegation to the races. There were 3 boys and 7 girls with 2 sets of parents to keep an eye on things. The group did just fine, finishing second in the games behind a group sponsored by a cigarette lighter manufacturer with top athletes from several countries. It was a very busy 11-days. The team ran every day despite a full schedule of must-see tourist attractions.

Among those attractions were viewing the world-famous opera house in Sydney and a visit to the Great Barrier Reef at Cairns. Yes, I snorkeled. Hoyt said, for the first time in my life. I was frightened and was afraid I would ruin equipment on the rocks. It turned out great, I loved it.

### NO MARIJUANA

Most states in Australia have legalized marijuana and its use is increasing, but Hoyt said that she never saw or heard of anyone using it. The drinking age down under is 18 and one athlete not in her group ordered a drink legally, the only one that she saw drinking.

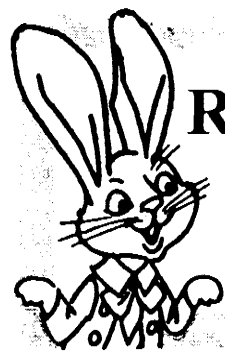

We were seated by a lady that was marked as Amish because of the bonnet she wore. About half of the waitresses were also Amish, judging by the bonnets. Ours was not Amish-no bonnet.

The service was very good. One of those small (homemade?) loaves of bread was brought with the menu. With it came 2 kinds of spreads that were the best part of the dining experience.

It was homemade apple-butter and peanut butter-honey mix, not found in most restaurants. Definitely different. Definitely good.

The rest of the meal, for us, not so great. My chuck roast beef dinner was very well done and came in shredded strips. It was salty. So was Esther's ham steak. The meal included coffee, milk, potato and salad.

The cost was \$21.48, plus tip. Give it a 5 on the 1-10 scale.

## Several appear in court

A pre-sentence investigation was ordered and bond was continued at \$5,000. Sentencing is to be scheduled.

•Adam L. Miller, 24, Caro, pleaded guilty to operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of liquor, third offense, July 1 in Caro.

A pre-sentence investigation was ordered and bond was continued at \$7,500. Sentencing is to be scheduled.

A pre-trial hearing was ordered scheduled and bond was continued at \$8,000.

A pre-sentence investigation was ordered and bond was continued at \$5,000. Sentencing is to be scheduled.

The rude awakening came when we started the shopping spree at 5:30 p.m. There were just 2 stores that were open, all the other stores closed at 5 p.m.

That was it. Every store in town, and there must be hundreds of them, was closed tight until Monday morning. It never occurred to me that a tourist-supported community would close on the days that are traditionally the busiest of the week. Imagine not being able to buy a chicken dinner in Frankenmuth or take a boat ride to Mackinac Island. Inconceivable.

On reflection, I should not have been surprised. Shipshewana's attraction is the crafts and specialty items made by the Amish and the Mennonites.

It's basically their community and their religious convictions are paramount in their lives. We may not approve of their life style that requires using horses, teaching their children in their own schools and other practices now considered quaint. Considering that, giving up

the sure profit that would be generated by working on Sunday is a given and for them not much of a sacrifice.

With thousands of visitors streaming into town on a regular basis and with no competition on Sunday, Shipshewana would appear to be an easy target for the fast food chains.

Not so. There isn't one in town. Possibly because most tourists are looking for home-made Amish cooking and it has to be hard for the year-around residents to dash into town on a horse for a burger. For me, the trip wasn't a complete washout. Cruising the farm countryside and the smaller Indiana towns was where the action was, for me anyway.

It was a lesson learned. Would it put the quietest on future spur-of-the-moment trips?

A few readers remember the old mangle irons. Mother called hers the "automatic iron," but there was nothing automatic about it.

This iron had a big, round drum that rotated against a concave to press the clothes. Mother sat in front of it, feeding pants into the machine, much like one would feed a wringer-washer.

The drum was operated by a foot pedal. Each time the concave was pressed against the clothes, a big cloud of steam would belch toward the ceiling. Talk about power; using a mangle iron for wash day was like taking a road-roller to a cookie bake.

There were five boys in our

family, and Mother was dedicated to keeping all of our clothes clean. Wash day often looked like an explosion at a Levi's factory.

The automatic iron would press any type of clothes, but Mother only used it for overalls. If you put a tan shirt through this iron, it came out looking like a brown grocery bag.

Jeans rolled from the automatic iron like paper from a typewriter. These pants were brittle. You had to bend them

over a chair or slam them in a door a few times to loosen them up so you could crawl in.

Styles change, I guess. Clean, well-pressed clothes were a lot more important in those days than they are now.

I'll tell you one thing, though. Those loose, cotton pants kids are wearing these days wouldn't have lasted two weeks at our house. Mother's automatic iron would have eaten them alive.

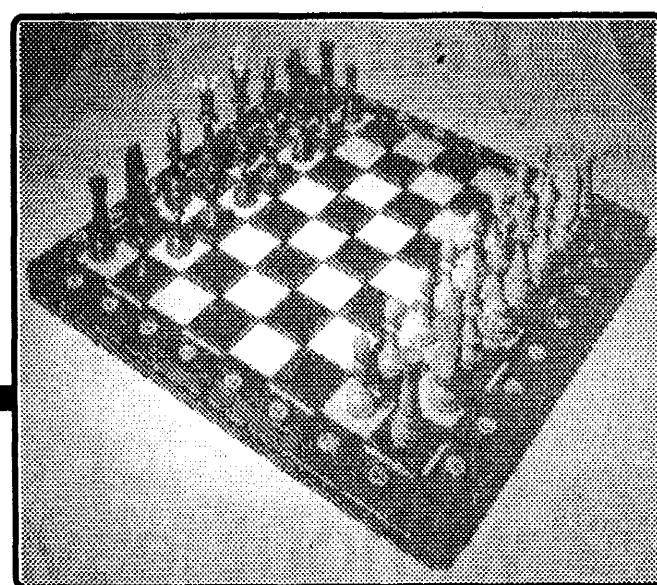

"By 6 - by the time it started - we had really good participation," she said. "I don't know the number, but the cars were lined up on both sides of Seeger Street and in the parking lot."



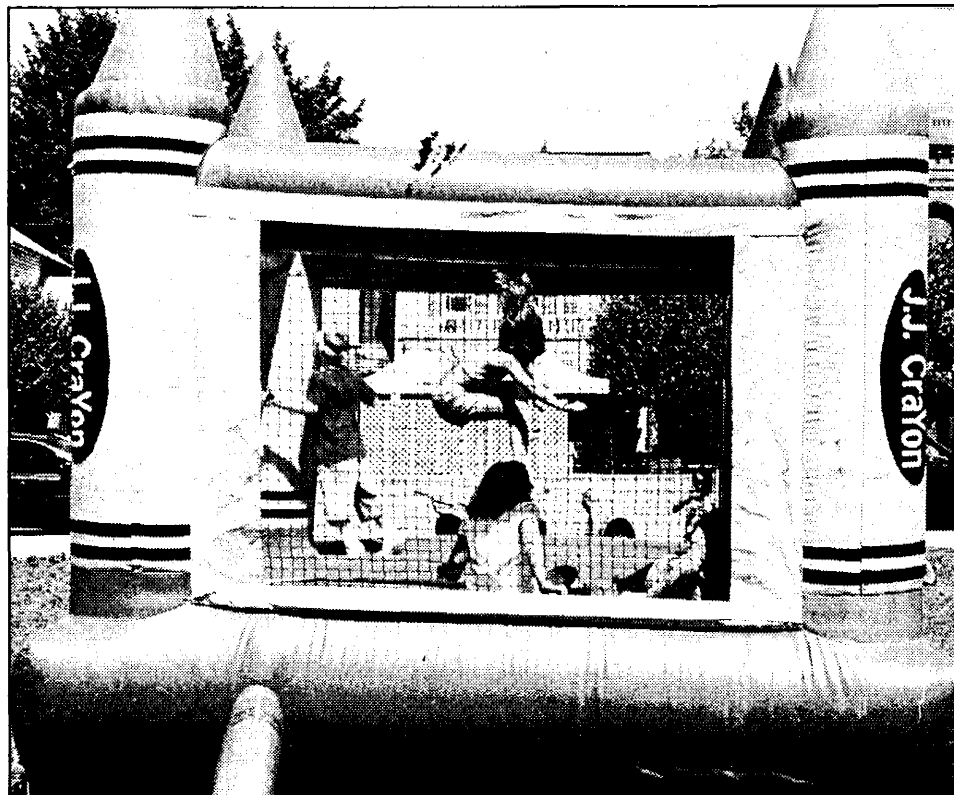

## Letters to the editor

### Funding at risk for local roads

The Michigan Legislature is considering legislation to cut local road funds when they meet on Aug. 13. Because of the state's budget crisis, the governor wants to take local road funds and use them to support state departments, namely the department of treasury and the department of state. Ironically, these cuts are in House Bill 5651, the 2002-2003 transportation budget bill.

When the gas tax was increased in 1997, Michigan Taxpayers were told that their gas taxes would only be used to repair and maintain state and local roads. Instead, it's being used to support state bureaucracies and bureaucrats. The MTF barely has enough money to fund the road systems of the state and with "raids" such as this, less money will be available.

If House Bill 5651 is passed, the Sanilac County Road Commission will lose approximately \$180,614 of road funds next year. This amount of money could be used to pave 4 or 5 miles of roadway; reconstruct 5 or 6 miles of local road; clean out many miles of ditches to provide better road drainage; provide money for snow removal in the winter season; replace equipment; and the list goes on and on.

My point, hopefully, is very clear; the budget at the road

commission cannot afford cuts in this amount without making cuts in the operation of the road commission. And most importantly, the motorist public should not be expected to receive less service to the road system which they use daily.

This road commission as well as the other 82 in the state cannot do our job and serve our county residents if these cuts are allowed to happen.

We are asking the citizens of Sanilac County to call or write their state legislators and urge them to vote "NO" on the House Bill 5651 Conference Report. Let them know that they should pass a transportation budget that does not take local road funds to pay for state bureaucracies. We need a transportation budget that does not use local road funds to balance the state's budget.

Thank you for any support you may lend in this matter. Our roads and our citizens certainly deserve better than the "raid" created with House Bill 5651.

# Down Memory Lane

From the files of the Chronicle

## 5 YEARS AGO

Cass City UPS drivers arrived for work Monday morning wearing casual clothing - not the familiar brown uniforms they normally wear - following the start of a nationwide strike by the Atlanta-based company. The walkout by Teamsters members was announced after Sunday's strike deadline passed at midnight without a contract agreement.

The gas tax hike motorists are paying at the pump seems to be paying off. Jim Miklovic, finance director of the Tuscola County Road Commission, said that while the increase in the gas tax went into effect Friday, it is too early to speculate how much money the Tuscola County Road Commission will receive for county roads, or where that money will be used in road repairs.

The Michigan Supreme Court ruled Thursday that the state must reimburse schools about \$211 million for underfunding special education services. The ruling could mean some additional revenue for the Cass City School District, although a specific amount hasn't been determined.

## 10 YEARS AGO

Cass City residents who want to get rid of an old refrigerator or air conditioner will now have to pay to have the refrigerator removed from such appliances before the village's waste hauler will pick them up.

The Cass City Village Council recently approved a local firm's application for an Industrial Facilities Exemption certificate, and appointed 8 people to the village's newly formed Downtown Development Authority board. The Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate application, submitted by General Cable Company, was approved following a brief public hearing.

We had 500 acres in the area under option from 12 owners, Weaver said, but were forced to let them expire this week because we don't have the available money.

Forty-six years under the same ownership ended at Fort's Store with the announcement this week of the impending sale of the store to Mr. and Mrs. Phillip Retherford. Mrs. Fort and her late husband, Alfred, started the store in the lobby of the theatre. Customers had to go through our store to get into the movie, Mrs. Fort recalled.



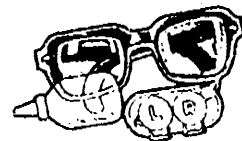

## Barcia leads effort against partial-birth abortion

U.S. Congressman Jim Barcia (D-Bay City) successfully led the effort to pass H.R. 4965, the Partial Birth Abortion Ban Act of 2002.

As the lead Democratic sponsor along with Republican Congressman Steve Chabot, the bill was introduced June 19. H.R. 4965 passed by a vote of 274 to 151, with 65 Democrats supporting the bill.

H.R. 4965 bans partial-birth abortions, which are performed in the second and third trimesters. H.R. 4965 also imposes fines and a maximum of 2 years imprisonment for any person who administers a partial-birth abortion.

"As the Democratic co-chair of the bipartisan Pro-Life Caucus and a strong pro-life advocate, I was pleased to once again bring this legislation to the floor," Barcia said.

"Partial-birth abortions are most often performed in the second and third trimester and there is no doubt that the partial-birth abortion procedure inflicts terrible pain upon the baby being killed."

The American Medical Association concluded that partial-birth abortion is not an acceptable medical practice. "Although some consider partial-birth abortions 'routine' medical procedures, this could not be further from the truth. Partial-birth abortions are neither routine, legitimate or necessary."

The prospects for making the Partial-Birth Abortion Ban Act the law of the land have improved greatly. Congress passed legislation to ban the procedure in the 104th, 105th and 106th Congresses. While President Clinton vetoed the legislation twice, President Bush has indicated that he will sign a ban into law.

"Although I am a Pro-Life Democrat, I am grateful that we now have a Pro-Life president who will sign this critical piece of legislation into law. The president's support will abrogate the need for a two-thirds vote in the Senate - which has proven impossible to attain," said Barcia.

## Meyer vows to support override of Engler veto

Local governments won't have to wait for the November election to learn their financial fate under legislation being developed by state Rep. Tom Meyer and other House members to override the governor's veto of revenue sharing dollars in the 2003 state budget.

"I have been talking with my colleagues about ways to return the revenue sharing funds to our local communities and one possibility is reinstating that funding now, rather than waiting for several months," Meyer, R-Bad Axe, said last week.

Meyer on Friday joined with Lt. Gov. Dick Posthumus and other state officials during a press conference in Lansing to show support for an override.

"I will vote on Aug. 13 to override the governor's recent budget veto and help Thumb officials," Meyer said. "House lawmakers are taking the steps to help our local governments provide essential services to area residents."

"It is not right to let the communities in Huron and Tuscola counties grapple

with the loss of state aid they have come to rely on for serving residents."

Gov. John Engler recently vetoed \$1.1 billion from the budget, including \$845 million in state payments to local governments.

The reductions came in response to ballot proposals that could redirect the state's use of tobacco settlement money, require treatment for criminals convicted of drug-related offenses, and mandate binding arbitration for state employees. If approved, the proposals could cost an estimated \$1 billion.

"If there was money enough for all the projects and programs out there, budgeting would be a very simple job.

The reality is that currently, Michigan has limited financial resources and special interests are trying to pull that money in too many directions," Meyer said.

"Residents need to help make sure our leaders have the flexibility to determine spending plans in the best

interests for the future of the state by defeating these proposals. If we reinstate the revenue sharing and the proposals pass, it will be great

news for local government budgets, but we will be back to finding more than \$1 billion in reductions somewhere else."

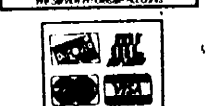

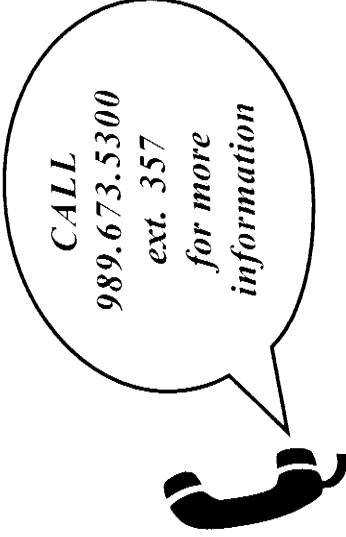
