

Online by spring Arsenic treatment plant on track

The walls and roof are up and work ers are busy completing the interior of Cass City's arsenic treatment plant/ department of public works (DPW) facility. Officials say the plant should be online by spring.

A key piece of equipment - the large tank in which the actual treatment process will take place - arrived last week from South Dakota and workers, using a computerized, million dollar crane, set the 52,000-pound tank in place.

"That's the major component. That's upwards of a half-million dol-

lars," Cass City Village Manager Pe ter Cristiano said of the 34-foot by 10-foot tank, which has a flow capacity of 765 gallons of water per minute. Cristiano explained that the tank. installed inside the 12,000-squarefoot facility, is basically a "giant filter". Once the plant is up and running, water from the village's 3 wells will be pumped into the tank, filtered to remove arsenic, and then returned to the water distribution system. Linda Zmarthie, lead engineer on the

project and a professional engineer with Spicer Group, the village's engi-

ncering firm, explained the process saying once water is inside the tank. oxidation takes place of the arsenic, changing it to a different form that can bind onto the iron that is in the water.

The new chemical formed from arsenic joining iron creates a larger molecule that can easily be filtered out as water moves through the filter, she said.

There are 3 layers to the horizontal pressure filter, according to Zmarthie.

B and E suspect pleads

One of 2 suspects in a string of residential burglaries in Cass City last winter appeared in Tuscola County Circuit Court last week on several charges

Justin D. Sturm, 4351 Rescue Rd., pleaded guilty to 2 counts of second degree home invasion between Feb. 3 and March 16. Court records state the charges stem from burglaries of homes at 4615 Oak St. and 6617 Huron St.

Sturm's record includes convictions of second degree home invasion and larceny in a building last May in Tuscola County Circuit Court, and convictions of first and second de-gree home invasion and breaking and entering last fall in Huron County Circuit Court.

Sturm is currently serving a prison term of 7 to 20 years for first degree home invasion. "He got some major time with all of these home invasions that were committed. He'll be doing at least the 7 years," Reene said. Sturm's co-defendant, Amber N. Burns, 18, also of Cass City, was arrested on a 6-count felony warrant last November. She faces the same charges as Sturm. Burns has waived her arraignments in both district and circuit court and is currently awaiting a pre-trial hearing next month. Cass City Police Chief Craig Haynes said the pair's crime spree was solved through a cooperative effort between his department and troopers from the Michigan State Police post in Bad "All these complaints started in early February," Haynes said. He explained that the suspects in most instances would knock on a door and. if no one appeared to be home, they would enter the residence. "The ma jority of the homes were left unlocked, but not all," he said

No passport, no spring break?

Kingston Post Office officials are reminding area students and their parents about new passport requirements which, if ignored, will put an early end to spring break outings this

year. "The requirements have changed for travel outside of the USA as of Jan. 23," explained Kingston Postmaster Mike R. Godard Sr. "All persons traveling by air between the United States and Canada, Mexico, Central and South America, the Caribbean and Bernuda will be required to present a valid passport, Air NEXUS card, a U.S. Coast Guard Merchant Mariner Document, or an Alien Registration Card (Form I-551) if applicable."

The Kingston Post Office is an authorized passport agent in the Thumb area and can process passport applications Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Anyone interested is asked to call (989) 683-2710 to make an appointment.

Godard said every applicant must have a certified copy of their birth certificate, previously issued pass-port or Certificate of Naturalization; passport photos; a driver's license or state issued ID; the passport ap-plication fee of \$67 (check or money order); and an execution fee of \$30 (cash, check or credit card).

All applicants, including children, must appear at the time of processing. Passport applicants for those under the age of 14 years must be signed by both parents, who must also be present.





Students at Cass City Public Schools will see an increased school day. The district has added minutes to each school day, and has cut the number of days of school for students. Campbell Elementary School will now begin at 7:56 a.m. and dismiss at 3:22 p.m. Additionally, Cass City Middle School will begin at 8:15 a.m. and dismiss at 3:21 p.m. Finally, Cass City High School will start its day at 8:20 a.m. and continue until 3:25 p.m.

The change in start and stop times will save the district money, as school will not have to run as many days. Due to the new start and end times of school, the high school has also

adopted a new period schedule. The schedule is as follows: first hour 8:20-9:13, second hour 9:17-10:10, third hour 10:14-11:07, A lunch 11:07-11:37, fourth hour for students with A lunch 11:41-12:34, fourth hour for students with B lunch 11:11-12:04. B lunch 12:04-12:34, fifth hour 12:38-1:31, sixth hour 1:35-2:28, and seventh hour 2:32-3:25.

The added time also means that students will get a few more days off from school. In addition to having yesterday and Monday off, students will also see a few more additional days of vacation this year. In addition to the days that were already scheduled as vacation, students throughout the district will now have Monday, Feb. 12 off. Also good news for students eager to get out of school is that school will now end on Tuesday, June 5.

There was also another change that was put into affect before this latest batch of changes. Non-junior students at Cass City High School will also have March 14 and 15 off. This is due to the new state standardized test, the Michigan Merit Exam. This will only affect freshmen, sophomores and seniors at the high school. All other schools and grade levels will still have school on these days. This change was made to accom-

modate the new state testing requirements and provide the best environ-ment possible for students who will be testing. Certainly, the new semester has

brought many new classes for stu-dents and many other changes, but it seems that most students are excited. After all, the start of the second semester symbolizes that the year is more than half over. In fact, it won't be long before students are counting down to spring break and





TOWNSHIP OF GREENLEAF BLIGHT ORDINANCE Ordinance No. 2007-01

An ordinance to protect the public health, safety and general welfare by eliminating blight within Greenleaf Township; to define and prohibit blight; and to provide penalties for violation hereof.

THE TOWNSHIP OF GREENLEAF ORDAINS:

<u>ARTICLE 1</u> Blight Defined and Prohibited

<u>Section 1.1.</u> It is hereby determined that the uses of land described in this Article constitute blight which, if allowed to exist, will result in unsafe, unsanitary and undesirable conditions.

<u>Section 1.2.</u> No person shall maintain or permit to be maintained any of the following types of blight upon any premises owned, rented, or occupied by such person:

(a) The outdoor storage of any junk motor vehicle. The term "junk motor vehicle" shall include any motor vehicle which is not currently licensed, and which has been inoperable for any reason for a period in excess of thirty (30) days.

(b) The storage or accumulation of garbage of any kind, except domestic refuse originating on the premises and stored in a sanitary manner for a period not to exceed fourteen (14) days. The term "garbage" shall include food waste matter and discarded food containers, as well as any other household refuse.

(c) The outdoor storage or accumulation of junk. The term "junk" shall include machinery parts, tires, containers, motor vehicle parts, tin cans, unused appliances, metal remnants, cast-off materials, inoperable farm machinery, discarded building materials, and any other inoperable or discarded machinery or materials. This section shall not apply to farm machinery in which is located on a bonafide operating farm, provided the farm machinery is used for farming operations.

(d) The dumping or landfilling of any junk, garbage, or junk motor vehicles. The term


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"dumping or landfilling" shall include burying or otherwise disposing of items on property not licensed as a landfill pursuant to the Michigan Solid Waste Management Act.

Section 1.3. This Ordinance shall not apply to junkyards, salvage yards, or equipment and

Ordinance. Such junkyards, salvage yards, and equipment and motor vehicle facilities shall also fully comply with the Greenleaf Township Junkyard, Salvage Yard, and Equipment/ Motor Vehicle Facility Ordinance.

<u>ARTICLE II</u> Penalties and Enforcement

<u>Section 2.1.</u> Any person, firm, or corporation, or anyone acting on behalf of said person, firm or corporation, who shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof be subject to a fine of not more than Five Hundred and no/100 (\$500.00) Dollars and court costs, or by imprisonment in the County Jail for a period of not to exceed ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Each day such violation continues shall be deemed a separate offense. The imposition of any sentence shall not exempt the offender from compliance with the requirements of this Ordinance.

<u>Section 2.2.</u> As an alternative to criminal proceedings under section 2.1, the Township may seek injunctive relief through Circuit Court to abate the violation and clean up the property.

Section 2.3. Any violation of this Ordinance shall constitute a public nuisance.

<u>Section 2.4.</u> Any person found responsible for blight shall eliminate such blight and shall be liable for the cost of elimination of the blight. If such blight is not eliminated by the responsible party, the Township may cause such blight to be eliminated and bill the cost to the responsible party. The cost of such blight elimination, if it is not voluntarily paid for by the responsible party, shall be assessed against the property on the next tax roll.

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

Pet group reflects on accomplishments since forming in '01

Since forming in September 2001, the local animal rescue group known as the Cass River Pet FriendZ has enjoyed many accomplishments which, they say are due largely to public support.

According to Patricia Trisch, spokesperson for the organization, the monthly vet bill for the group averages \$2,000, including medications, heartworm tests for the dogs, feline leukemia tests for the cats, flea treat-

ments, spaying and neutering. In February 2004, a special "Spay Day" offer was extended by a local veterinarian and 30 cats were altered for lower income families in Tuscola County for \$20 to \$30 each.

The low cost rabies clinics began in 2004 and were held in Caro," Trisch said. "In 2005, clinics were set up in Mayville, Kingston, Akron, Caro and Vassar with a total of 368 dogs being vaccinated. In 2006, the group witnessed 472 dogs come through the canine shot clinic held in Caro. The Cass River Pet FriendZ is currently organizing the next clinic to be held

this coming month." In 2005 the Tuscola County Community Foundation granted the rescue group \$2,500 and that was used to alter 77 pets for free for low income people along with having the dogs tested for heartworm and cats tested for feline leukemia prior to surgery. Trisch launched the "Older Cats for Older People Program" in 2005. This program places older cats into qualifying households with no adoption fee and maintains any medical financial responsibility for those pets including free cat sitting should a medical emergency arise for the caregiver with no one else being able to care for the cat. Six cats over 7 years of age, that may not have had any other

chance for homes, are currently be-ing cared for under this program. Last year several doghouses were built as a project and offered free to

more than 2,000 animals and helped hundreds of county residents get their pets altered or helped them financially with medical emergencies In the past year alone, 271 people have been given financial assistance to get their pets altered.

The Pet FriendZ could not have done all of this without the public's financial support," Trisch said. "It also could not have been accomplished without the cooperation of local businesses who allow donation canisters to be on their counters and the wonderful veterinarians who work with this group by reducing their costs."

Since documentation began in September 2001, 1,212 dogs/puppies have passed through the dog foster home operated by group Vice President Sandy Bassett. The primary cat foster home became active in February 2003 and is operated by Trisch. Since she began fostering, Trisch states 770 cats and kittens have come through. This number of cats is not including any taken in at the 3 foster homes that assist Trisch, or the other local cat rescue operated by Sue Jando. This past year 337 cats/kittens passed through the Trisch household, with 48 kittens being transferred to the Mt. Clemens area under a special program.

"The public has been very generous in their support of the Pet FriendZ annual fundraisers such as the car show, which this past year was the 4th annual, and the yearly Santa pictures. This past year the car show helped raise \$680 and the Santa pictures \$560," Trisch said.

"The Cass River Pet FriendZ want everyone to know that they appreciate all that people do to help and if it weren't for their support in whatever manner, that they would not be able to continue to do what they are doing to help the animals in Tuscola County," she added. TENNIS CLUB

Turning to other matters, the board granted resident Richard Little's request to form a high school tennis club.

"We'd like to start playing league tennis March 12 - this year," Little told the board, adding the club will be formed at no cost to the district. Two individuals have already volunteered to serve as coaches, and fundraising events will be held to purchase needed equipment. It's hoped that parents and other volunteers will provide transportation to and from competitions, he said.

Little told the board that a telephone survey revealed 17 students are interested in playing tennis, which he called a lifelong sport young people can enjoy well beyond their high school years.

The village already has tennis courts, and while Little acknowledged they are in need of repair, he assured the local club would compete at "away" events only until those re-pairs are completed. In the meantime, he said, students could use the courts for the purpose of practice. Little said the club will be joining

the ranks of a sport already enjoyed by students in several Thumb districts, including Harbor Beach, Sandusky, Lakers and Caro.

Cass City Athletic Director Aaron Fernald offered his blessing for the idea. It may be difficult to schedule league matches this late in the year, he said, but it's likely the local club can schedule some competitions this spring

IN OTHER BUSINESS

In other business during the 90minute regular meeting, the board: Discussed an on-going problem with student lunch accounts being overdrawn. To-date, the debt totals about \$4,500 school-wide, according to Wilson. Shari Bock, cafeteria supervisor,

asked the board for direction in dealing with the problem.

Discussed plans to update the district's fee schedule for rental of school facilities. Wilson said the ex-isting fees are "well below" that charged by neighboring districts. He will return to the board with specific recommendations.

Test home for radon

With holiday festivities now behind us, the Department of Environmental Quality and the Department of Community Health are reminding homeowners that January is National Radon Action Month and to start the year off right by testing their home , for radon,

"The good news is that once a problem is identified, elevated radon levels can be reduced," said DEO Director Steven E. Chester. "I have had my home tested, and I am urging homeowners to take the same initia-

Radon is a naturally occurring radioactive gas that emanates from the soil and seeps into homes through openings in the foundation floor or walls. It is believed to be the second leading cause of lung cancer in the United States and the leading cause among non-smokers and may result in more than 600 new lung cancer cases in Michigan each year

"You can't see or smell radon, but we know that only smoking causes more lung cancer deaths annually in our country," said DCH Director Janet Olszewski. "We encourage everyone to have their home tested regularly for radon, as it is the only way to know for sure if you and your family are at risk."

Michigan survey data projects more than one in 8 Michigan homes could have a radon problem, and elevated radon levels have been found in every county. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Web site rates each county in the United States as a low, moderate, or high potential county. Since radon levels in Michi-gan tend to be spotty, the DEQ recommends testing to all Michigan residents regardless of their county's EPA rating.

Test kits are available from local health departments all across the state. The kits generally cost less than \$15 and include postage to mail the testing device to a laboratory where it will be analyzed and the results re-

ported back to the user. Kits can also be found at hardware stores and other retail outlets; however, not all retail kits include postage and analysis, so citizens are urged to carefully read the packaging before making their purchase.

Radon tests should be done in the lowest livable level of the home during the cooler months of the year, when windows and doors are normally kept closed. If the test indicates an elevated radon level, more testing should be done to confirm the problem and appropriate actions taken to reduce the levels when needed. Additionally, prospective homebuilders and buyers may want to consider using radon-resistant new construction when building their new home.


Construction of the plant was the result of a new federal mandate by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency reducing the acceptable level of arsenic in public drinking water supplies in an effort to reduce what agency officials described as longterm health effects of exposure to ar-

The EPA ordered the new acceptable level set at 10 parts per billion. down from 50 parts per billion. The level of arsenic in Cass City has been about 16 parts per billion.

The village's new plant is being constructed with funding from a 40-year, \$1.858 million loan from the U.S. Rural Development Agency that will be paid back in annual installments of about \$97,000.

Cristiano noted that the arsenic treatment system itself cost about \$1.5 million, with the remaining loan amount going to refinance the village's third and newest well Refinancing, he said, enabled village officials to incorporate new quarters for the local department of public works into the facility at a cost of roughly \$200.000
