## Council ready to fix tennis courts

The Cass City tennis program, and all tennis enthusiasts, scored an ace Monday as the village council approved a motion to repair the 4 courts in the recreational park.

Fourteen people, including both village president candidates, Tom Herron and Carl Palmateer, attended the council's regular monthly meeting that also approved an annexation request, the 2007-08 Tuscola County Economic Development Corporation (EDC) allocation and a pair of contracts to benefit the community.

With the Michigan High School Athletic Association's sport schedule changes that begin this month, the council had to move quickly to have the courts ready for the fall tennis season. They did so by approving a contract with Complete Asphalt in the amount of \$15,900.

However, through village resident Richard Little's efforts, the driving force behind developing the Red Hawk program, the council's cost of the project will be in the \$4,000 range, the amount budgeted in 2007. Little has secured the remaining balance from the Rotary Club, Pinney Foundation and Gavel Club, which have pledged \$6,000, \$5,500 and \$1,000, respectively.

Also during the hour-long meeting, the council approved the EDC allocation request in the amount of \$8,200.

EDC Director Jim McLoskey addressed the council, explaining the allocation will allow the EDC to continue assisting with retail, service and manufacturing business start-ups, tax abatements, site locations, revolving loan fund loans and expansion projects, all helping to provide a better quality of life in Cass City. Among the businesses the EDC has helped develop locally recently are Millennium Industries, Gaffney's Home-town Kitchen and Midwest Tire.

Continuing in the area of village improvements, the council also approved 2 contracts to enhance the downtown area. Alexander Concrete

successfully bid \$9,550 to earn the contract to complete sidewalk and curb work at the 4 corners of Main and Seeger streets. These corners, according to the council, have unsafe conditions for pedestrians in the winter months because of ice accumulation.

Also in the downtown 4 corners area, Saginaw Asphalt was awarded the contract for milling and resurfacing Seeger Street from Church Street to Pine Street at a cost of \$27,775. The high traffic area has numerous cracks and is uneven in areas. The work, for

## Bird quarantine doesn't slow bidders at the fair

There was not a single bird presented to bidding crowds at the Tuscola County Fair's Small Livestock Auction last Thursday.

A quarantine was issued by the Michigan Department of Agriculture (MDA), Animal Industry Division early Thursday morning on all poultry housed on the fairgrounds.

The quarantine included all birds. "Turkeys, ducks, geese and chickens are all in the poultry family and were required to be in the quarantine. As of the time of Dr. Caston's inspection, ducks, geese and chickens appeared to be in proper health condition," said Tuscola County MSU Extension Director, Dr. Hal Hudson.

Several turkeys were sent home at the beginning of last week when early signs of illness were detected. By

Wednesday, all of the turkeys showed symptoms that included mucous discharge from the beak, swelling of the face, diarrhea, and lethargy.

Mike Caston, with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) was the attending veterinarian and drove from Clarkston, Mich. to observe the turkeys.

Samples were taken from the affected turkeys and shipped to the USDA laboratory located in Ames, Iowa. No other poultry has exhibited similar symptoms.

Fair officials were hoping for results prior to the close of the fair, but at this time, there have not been any updates.

Though the situation posed no threat to rabbits, which are of a different species than poultry, the animals were moved to the crops building.

Fair officials decided to begin by auctioning goats and rabbits rather than the birds until the USDA and veterinarian came to the fairgrounds to inspect the market turkeys. After an hour's delay, the children that raised the birds came into the exhibition ring without them.

Despite their absence, people that sat inside the Tuscola County Fairgrounds Livestock Pavilion continued to bid on the small livestock and every animal was bought.

"We're not able to have animals in the ring. We want bidders to recognize that they may or may not get the animal in the end," Hudson said.

Sandy Micho of Vassar has 5 children in the Thumb Area Kids & Critters 4-H club that raised roaster chickens and market turkeys, both of which were absent from the livestock pavilion on Thursday.

"They felt naked. They basically know they perform according to the

## Summer lunch program extended

The summer lunch program has been extended to meet community demands.

The free meals, which have been served in the Campbell Elementary School Cafeteria since early June, will continue until August 16, a week longer than originally scheduled.

Shari Bock, Cass City Schools Food Supervisor who is in charge of Cass City's Summer Lunch Program, said she serves between 40 and 60 free meals each day during the program's working hours 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday.

"For the first year we needed 20 (par-

ticipants) to break even. We were hoping for 35 and we are over that every day," Bock said.

Bock, who was shocked by the high turnout, began the first week serving sack lunches that had the simplicity of a peanut and butter sandwich. "We now serve everything from burgers to pizza," Bock said. "We serve chicken patties, corn dogs, whatever we can come up with."

An estimated 50 children had "breakfast" for lunch on Wednesday- tater tots, sausage and French toast served with grape juice and their choice of white or chocolate milk.

Kelsey Peters, 8, said she comes to the cafeteria every day and enjoys the variety.

"We like the food and our parents spend lots of money during the school year to get us food - now we get it free."

Many children involved in Cass City's Summer Recreation Program come to the cafeteria at lunch time.

"I think it's been pretty well received, membership has been good," said Cass City Schools Superintendent Ron Wilson. "Membership in summer programs are up and they think that's because they're feeding those kids at lunch time."

Kate Stimpfel, 8, attends summer recreation activities with her 2 siblings, and eats at Campbell an aver-

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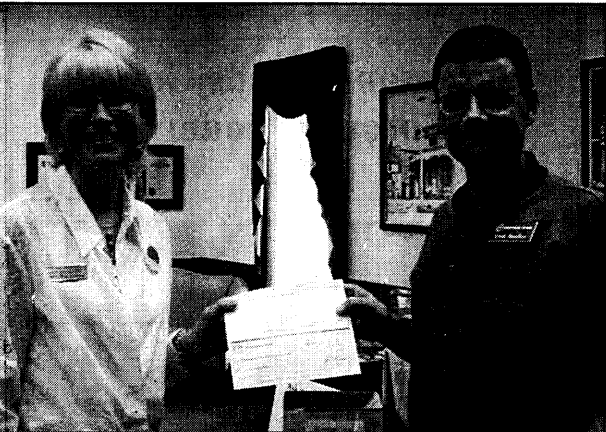

Michigan may ban smoking in public places

Do you think there should be a ban on smoking in public places in Michigan?

A proposal was approved in Lansing last week that would ban smoking in Michigan bars, restaurants and workplaces.

The House Commerce Committee, on a 12-4 vote July 24, sent a bill to the full House that would prohibit public smoking except at cigar bars and smoking shops. It's the furthest that any like anti-smoking measure has advanced in Michigan.

Thirty-one states have at least some kind of restriction on workplace smoking. Ohio banned smoking in public places in May; a smoking prohibition is scheduled to begin in January in Illinois.

Mike Sines, owner of Gilligan's, is currently in the process of making the restaurant portion of his business smoke free, but plans to continue to allow customers to smoke inside the bar. He believes that restricting the freedoms of the customer will inevitably harm business.

"It doesn't really bother me one way or another, I just believe that the government tells us enough what to do," Sines said. "They tell me when I can serve alcohol and now they tell me that customers can't smoke."

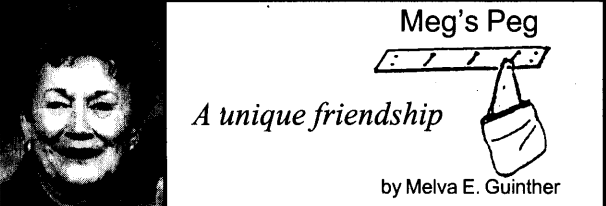
About 1 in 4 Michigan adults smoke. The state's annual health care costs attributable to smoking exceed \$2.5 billion.

Sines, 45, is a non-smoker.

I'm reluctantly deleting a lot of files from the inbox on my computer. It's necessary because they're clogging up the system, making it hard to retrieve anything quickly.

I say reluctantly, because most of them are from my email buddy, Fred MacKay, who died a couple months ago.

It was an unusual friendship, since I don't recall ever meeting him face to face. I didn't even know what he looked like until his funeral. Nevertheless, in some ways he seemed closer than many of my visible friends. When I met his family at the funeral home, I felt like I already knew them.

What mattered to Fred came through clearly in the items he sent to his "bunch", as he referred to the names on his email network.

He obviously loved God, his family, the USA and those who defend her, especially the Army. There was no question he was a military man.

Some of his emails offered practical advice, such as that scrubbing the lint filter in your dryer occasionally with soapy water and a brush will make it run more efficiently and last longer.

There were prayer requests shared back and forth, some fantastic photographs, and a lot of humorous stories, many of which appeared in this column.

At the funeral home I met a woman who had been the subject of prayers from people all over the world as the result of Fred's email network.

You can see why I'm struggling with the deletion. I know there will be no more communications from Fred in this life.

This unique friendship developed over a period of years. It began when he wrote a letter concerning something I'd written in the Chronicle.

Although he hadn't lived in Cass City since childhood, he still subscribed to the local paper and kept up with hometown happenings and people. I was acquainted with his mother and an older brother, both of whom are deceased.

We could always tell when Fred was on vacation, because the inbox was a lot lighter. And when he returned there might be 25 or more messages from him in one day.

When I learned from his brother that he was terminally ill, he was on my daily prayer list.

The Internet can be abused, but it can also build friendships that would not otherwise exist. We miss you, Fred.

In his memory, here's one of the stories he sent:

The 80-year-old woman's doctor had retired, and his replacement asked her to bring a list of all the medicines she'd been taking.

As he looked through them his eyes grew wide as he realized she had a prescription for birth control pills.

"Mrs. Smith, do you realize these are birth control pills?"

"Yes, they help me sleep at night."

"Mrs. Smith, I assure you there's nothing in these that could possibly help you sleep at night."

The old lady reached over and patted the young doctor's knee. "I know, Dear, but every morning I grind one up and mix it in my 16-year-old granddaughter's orange juice. Believe me, it helps me sleep at night!"

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

It resulted in a storm of protests from anglers who maintained that there was plenty of pike and other wanted game fish in the Cass and the project was dropped.

I thought about this controversy when I read the recent story and examined the picture of Jeremy Hulbert holding a 43-inch northern pike he caught in the Cass.

We will never know how the fishing would be today if the poisoning program carried through, but it's evident that at least the fishermen who claimed there were still big fish in the river knew what they were talking about.

# Cass City to get first taste of new farmers' market

Cass City will get the first taste of its very own farmers' market this week.

Open to the public in Cass City's Rotary Park, fresh fruits and vegetables, baked goods and antiques will be on sale from 4-7 p.m.

The first market is the starting point of what will be a weekly occurrence, continuing through the final week of October.

"As long as people are participating, we'll do it," said one of the event's coordinators, Richard Little. "I think there are people waiting for it to open."

Farmers' markets, which are a traditional way of selling local-name agricultural and homemade products, are popular weekly attractions in Caro, Bad Axe and Caseville.

Little developed the idea for a Cass City Farmers' Market during July of last year. His idea was presented too late in the year to get the project started.

The Village Council approved the weekly marketplace in May and it has since been a matter of waiting for the produce to grow.

Little said the goal is not to compete with local businesses, but to add something that isn't already in the village. "We need something to happen here," he said. "Other towns are starting things, why shouldn't we? It will draw people into town and it's a way to get fresh vegetables at a reasonable price homegrown."

Originally, it was planned that the market would coincide with Cass City's concert series "Music in the Park," which happens every Wednesday night in Cass City's Rotary Park. Confusion in scheduling required event coordinators to select Friday as the alternate day.

Currently, 5 vendors are scheduled to sell goods. Those interested in selling items of their own in the local marketplace can fill out an application at City Hall free of charge.

Women have boosted Rotary



It was about 12 years go that the first woman was inducted into the Cass City Rotary Club. It would be nice to report that it was a spontaneous effort by broad-minded members, but it wasn't.

Rotary International was spurred to change its membership rules to abide by equal opportunity laws decided in court.

At first there was a little discomfort by certain members, but generally most members didn't regard women in the club as earth shaking, just different.

The majority was wrong there. It's probably a stretch to say that Cass City Rotary would have folded without the women members. It's certainly true that it would be a mere shell of what it is today without them. Since the gates opened, 14 women have entered and occupied all of the significant offices in the club.

For the first time in history a women was elected a director of Rotary International and some of her thoughts are revealing. Catherine Noyer-Riven is a gynecologist with a private practice. She says it is absolutely necessary for Rotary to continue to win its fight against polio. Today, she says,

there are about 2,000 cases a year and in 1985 there were 1,000 cases a day.

Eliminating the ravages of polio is certainly laudable, but I always thought it was a patchwork procedure. Saving thousands in a world where overpopulation is a major factor is like paving a road that goes nowhere.

I never could imagine a way that Rotary could address this problem or others that threaten life on this planet.

Noyer-Riven sponsors a way that could at least put a small dent in the over-population problem. She says "Poverty is not only material; it can be intellectual...Fighting illiteracy (among women) is one of my main priorities. Once women are literate, they will be able to control the number of children they have, and their lives will completely change."

If she can push this agenda in Rotary Clubs throughout the world, the results would be harder to measure than the eradication of polio, but for our decedents it would be much more meaningful.

It may well be that Noyer-Riven will be making as big a splash internationally as the 14 women Rotarians have in the Cass City Club.

I wish her well.

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# State to give township land

Indianfields Township officials joined State Rep. Terry Brown (D-Pigeon) at the Capitol Thursday for a ceremonial signing of his legislation that gives the township 117 acres of vacant state land that it has been trying to acquire for almost 2 decades.

"This law clears the way for the people of Indianfields Township to proceed with their plans to expand educational and recreational opportunities at the park," Brown said. "The land transfer opens up more access to the Cass River for kayaking, canoeing and fishing, as well as more room for nature trails. The expanded park will enhance residents' quality of life and attract outdoor enthusiasts who will spend money at local businesses."

Brown's legislation almost triples the park in size, from 65 acres to 182 acres. The state will transfer the land to the township in exchange for \$1.

Greg Barrons, the township's superintendent of buildings and grounds, has been trying to overcome various obstacles for almost 20 years in his quest to expand the park by adding the vacant land. Barrons said he is grateful to Brown, who took office in January, and his legislative assistant Larry Watterworth for bringing the land transfer to fruition after so many years.

"Terry and his staff really pushed this legislation to the forefront in the past couple of months to get it through," Barrons said. He said plans for the park include building a barrier-free trail to increase access for people with disabilities, expanding outdoor classrooms to help local schools reach their science benchmarks, and possibly adding mountain bike trails.

Barrons said mounted divisions from sheriff's departments around the state plan to use the site for training in the spring.

Brown praised Barrons for never giving up on his dream of transferring the state land to the township.

"Part of what makes our area special is having people like Greg - people who take the initiative to make their communities better," Brown said. "No one is more dedicated to respecting the land and preserving it for future generations, which are values we hold dear in the Thumb. I look forward to the township developing this park into another jewel that we can show off to the rest of the state."

Barrons and his wife, Teri, and their son Joseph came to the Capitol to join Brown in watching Gov. Jennifer M. Granholm sign the land-transfer bill. Indianfields Township Supervisor Ray Rendon also attended the

ceremony.

Teri Barrons said she was impressed that the governor took the time to talk with Joseph about the process that a bill goes through and to give him a copy of the legislation after she signed it.

"He said he felt like royalty," she said with a laugh.

## FLY-IN scheduled Sunday

The Caro-area Kiwanis Club, along with the Tuscola Area Airport, will host its third annual FLY-IN Sunday, Aug. 5.

This is a rain or shine event and admission is free. Last years' event was a huge success with some 2,000 spectators and many pilots who flew in from all over the state.

This year looks to be even better with may different types of aircraft displays, including a corporate jet, a war bird, helicopters, and possibly a C130 Cargo plane fly-by to kick off the event.

There will be lots to do regardless of the weather. Plane rides will be available for \$15. There will be a remote-controlled (RC) plane display, crop dusting and skydiving exhibitions.

On the ground, there will be children's games, crafts, a dunk tank with local "celebrities" to dunk, and a helicopter candy drop. The Caro Fire Department will be back this year with their ladder truck letting people get an aerial view of the festivities. Members of the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) from the Saginaw Valley Area will be bringing some surprises as well.

Door prizes will be awarded every 15 minutes. There will be a silent auction with many wonderful items available. Raffle tickets for a 50/50 drawing may be purchased prior to the FLY-IN, which will be having activities Sunday from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.

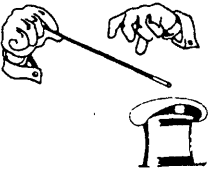

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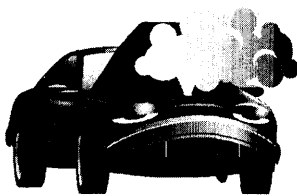

# Barton's nimble fingers help comfort young ER patients

Thanks to a local woman and her helpers, many children find their visit to the Caro Community Hospital (CCH) emergency room just a little bit easier to "bear".

"When patients come to the Caro Community Hospital emergency room, they are stressed, to say the least. When those patients are children, they can be downright terrified. So it really helps when there's a little friend for them to hang onto, and that's where Cass City's Mary Barton comes in," said Dale J. Perz, marketing consultant for the Caro hospital.

"For the past 6 years, Mary has been making the little stuffed bears that are given to children in ER," Perz explained. "Believe it or not, she has now made 1,240 of the cuddly creatures - she knows the number exactly. "At age 86, Mary shows no signs of slowing down in this work, nor in her other tasks of cooking, baking, housecleaning and volunteering," he added. "A long-time member of the CCH Auxiliary, Mary used to do just the sewing on the bears. Now, she does the stuffing and final assembly as well. She has occasional helpers who, along with herself, procure stuffing and a wide variety of materials, all

of which result in unique and unusual creations."

The bears have become so popular, Perz noted, that one was spotted recently by one of Barton's daughters in Florida. "It turns out the family had been in Michigan and had found it necessary to visit the Caro Community Hospital emergency room," he said.

Barton is the consummate grandmother and learned the art of sewing, knitting and crocheting as a young girl in school.

"Well, I raised 8 kids, so I made a lot of shorts and skirts and dresses and pillowcases," said the grandmother of 25, great-grandmother of 39 and great-great-grandmother of 6. "I love to bake. I bake early in the morning - don't heat up the house. And I can tomatoes. I canned 200 quarts last year."

Barton's energy and schedule defy her years, and working as a hospital auxiliary volunteer is an integral part of her life. She also volunteers her skills for other groups, including the Cass City Literacy Council - Barton sews and donates cloth book bags to that organization.

"If you don't (stay active), you get depressed, and you can get depressed in one afternoon if you let yourself go, and I can't do that," she

said.

Barton recalled it was her daughter's membership in the auxiliary that sparked her interest in making and donating little cloth bears to the hospital.

"My daughter always belonged to the auxiliary in Caro. She was making bears, and I said, 'well, give me a pattern', and that was 10 years ago," she said.

"A half a yard (of material) will make 5 bears if you cut it just right, and I make 5 or 10 a month. I never have to buy materials - I have friends who bring over boxes of it and buy it at garage sales," she said.

"I do like to sew. I get up in the morning and make one bear, and then I make bags for the literacy council," added Barton, who confided that she does tire. "I run out of gas around noon. So I sit down and watch the news and sew. I've got to be doing something all the time."

Barton has little trouble finding plenty to do. Aside from baking and canning, she walks every morning and always seems to have a few of her children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren or great-great-grandchildren around.

"I'm never alone," she said. "I can never get enough kids around me."

rules. We can only perform and learn from these experiences," she said.

Hudson said all poultry passed MDA inspection; each was checked appropriately and tagged upon their registration at the fairgrounds.

"I have worked with fairs in Michigan for 20 years in 3 different counties and this is the first time I've ever seen a quarantine," he said.

Auctioneer Dave Osentoski said the auction still went smoothly, even after its bumpy beginning. He said he was actually impressed by participation considering the current state of Michigan's economy.

"It takes a few minutes to get them warmed up," Osentoski said. "I think it (the auction) was as good, if not better, than last year."

age of 2 to 3 times a week. "The food's better than it is at home," Stimpfel explained.

This year is the first time such a summer program has existed in Cass City. In April, the Cass City Public Schools' School Lunch Program saw participant numbers increase, with more than 50 percent of Campbell Elementary and nearly half of Cass City Middle School taking advantage of the meals.

Those eligible to receive the free meals include children 19 years of age and under, or persons up to 26 that are enrolled in an educational program for the mentally or physically disabled that is recognized by the state or local public educational agency.

The age range of participants have included mothers that have come in with their children as young as one year old up to high school aged adolescents.

"We're not allowed to feed the parents, that doesn't fall under the regulations. They sometimes join kids for lunch and can hang out for an hour and then can go out to the playground. We're covering the 0 to 19 age that we're targeting," she said.

The Summer Lunch Program is funded by the federal government and is no cost to Cass City Public Schools. "We're real fortunate to have it and it's nice to recoup some federal dollars back into our community," Wilson said.

Mulligan, who noted food vendors will be open from 11 a.m. through 9 p.m. Friday, emphasized some other special events planned for this year's celebration.

The first is a free child car seat safety check cooperatively sponsored by the village's 4 insurance companies - Copeland & Gomowicz, Farm Bureau, Knight Insurance and the Thumb Insurance Group from 2 to 5 p.m.

"If someone comes in and gets checked and their (car seat) isn't safe, they will get a new car seat free," said Mulligan, who noted the checks will also provide parents with advice on how to properly install and use child car seats.

Thumb National Bank, meanwhile, is sponsoring the free distribution of 100 child ID kits that incorporate DNA and finger-printing technology also from 2 to 5 p.m. "This kit is one of the best kits on the market," Mulligan said.

Finally, the Cass City Lions Club is sponsoring a free eye screening booth for children from 2 to 5 p.m.

Combined, the variety and number of events offered this year are a present from local businesses to the area residents that support them, Mulligan said.

"I just think it's a really good way to promote community spirit," she added. "It's a nice way to give something back and for everybody to be able to enjoy it, no matter what."

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# Sorenson spreads gospel in Europe

Christianity was a connection that spoke louder than a language barrier during Justin Sorenson's 8-month missionary venture to Central Germany.

"You have this bond there, just a cultural difference. You might have a little different idea on things, but when it comes down to it, that doesn't change what your faith is built upon," he said.

The 21-year-old Sorenson traveled to Zegan, Germany last September and returned to his hometown, Cass City in May after graduating with a degree in theology from his Bible college, Calvary Chapel.

Originally attending the school in Murrieta, Calif., Sorenson decided to complete his studies overseas at one of his school's many extension campuses.

The majority of his time was dedicated to studying and participating in outreach trips in the surrounding area.

Sorenson and 49 other classmates were divided into separate groups and sent to various locations in Eastern Europe to perform street evangelism, a practice of publicly preaching the Christian gospel to spread knowledge of and participation in the religion. During his 2 semesters overseas, Sorenson spent time in Croatia and Albania.

In Croatia, he took weeklong residence in a villa that was so tiny and packed with other people that he would sleep wherever he could find room.

The missionaries played music to attract listeners and scheduled meeting times with locals at nearby cafes and coffee shops to talk about life and religion.

"We'd play music on the streets and

people would come and then we'd start talking to them if they spoke English. We had Serbians with us and they spoke Croatian, too."

While in Albania, Sorenson spent more time meeting with other Christians, building up one another as a fellowship. Things were very different than Croatia because of the culture of the country, which identified itself as Muslim. A friend from Albania, whose family was Christian, has a mother that still referred to herself as a Muslim despite her longtime change in spiritual beliefs.

"Albanians are really patriotic," Sorenson explained. "It's just one of those things, if you're Albanian, you call yourself a Muslim. It's interesting to see that side of things," he said.

As part of his work with his college's church, Sorenson went out into the community in Zegan to do more street evangelism. He said he would always end up talking to "gutter punk kids" about their views on the world and life.

A few times, groups of the kids would accompany the Christian missionaries to church.

"You just go up there and just hang out with the people and just see where they're at in life," he explained. "If they're searching, just try to help them out. We're not trying to cram anything down people's throats."

In addition to having done missionary work in Germany and nearby his California campus, Justin has also done street evangelism work in Mexico, London, Netherlands, France, Belgium, Greece, Slovenia and Austria.

When he wasn't spending his time studying or performing in street out-

reaches, Sorenson would have a rare chance to travel and see the sights of Eastern Europe, usually visiting the nearby surrounding cities, such as Cologne.

"Weekends in Germany, there was this thing called the Weekend Pass and you could go if you had 5 people all pitch in 6 euro for the 30. It takes you anywhere in Germany but it goes slow. If you just want to get away for the weekend, you can't go too far," he said.

Justin spent a month and a half in Berlin, a friend and himself stayed with a pastor in his one room apartment. He was grateful for the chance to stay in the large city for the opportunities to become more involved within the culture and the people.

While abroad, a German foreign exchange student from Southern Germany stayed in his Cass City home.

"It wasn't even planned to be like that, it just happened," he explained. "I got to meet her family while I was in Germany and they came back home with me. They were here for 2 weeks."

He has hopes of using his theology degree to pursue more missionary work and may return to Europe as early as this fall.

both contracts, is to be completed by Aug. 31, 2007.

The council hired Nelson Tank Engineering, in the amount of \$5,300, for consulting services to review bids and supervise the work for sandblasting and painting the interior of the equalization basin at the wastewater treatment plant (WWTP). The 380,000-gallon tank is 27 years old and officials have recommended that the inside surface be brought to bare metal and painted with a moisture-cured polyurethane. The council, which will receive sealed bids for the project, is expected to cost in the neighborhood of \$50,000.

The council will also request sealed bids for a new roof for the digester building at the WWTP. The current roof is 25 year old and the estimated cost for the project is \$18,000.

Turning to the annexation request, property owned by Herron on Linda Lane, located in Elkland Township and contiguous with village land, was annexed to the village. Herron has stated that he will record easements for sewer and water lines already in place. These easements will begin at the corner of Beechwood Drive and follow Linda Lane north on the property.
