

Teachers ratify new agreement last week

Members of the Cass City Education Association (CCEA) Friday approved a proposed one-year contract, just 2 days after their previous 3-year pact expired. "The teachers have ratified the

agreement and then it will go to the (school) board on the 27th to be ratified," said Cass City School Supt. Ron Wilson

Jane Reif, local union chairman and a member of the CCEA bargaining team, confirmed the news, but declined to be specific about the vote. "It took a majority to pass it, and it

passed," Reif said. "The bargaining team felt this was

the best contract we were able to present to our members at this time, she added

The new agreement replaces a 3-year contract in which teachers received a 2.5-percent pay increase in each of the 3 years through 2006-07.

Friday's vote came about a week after school officials and union bargainers hammered out a contract during a marathon bargaining session that lasted more than 10 hours. Union officials had previously asked for a 3-year contract and raises of 3-percent each year - 1 1/2 percent at the beginning of each year and 1 1/2 percent at the end of each year. School officials, meanwhile, were offering a one-year agreement and asking for a true pay freeze, meaning teachers would not receive step pay hikes based on years of service or "column" increases for furthering their education.

In the end, both sides compromised, according to Wilson.

"Basically, it's a one-year deal with a zero-percent increase, but they (teachers) have their steps and columns," Wilson said, noting teachers advancing from steps one through 11 will receive a 5 1/2-percent pay in-

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Taylor gets 24 1/2 years

A Cass City man will spend the next 24 1/2 years of his life in prison for his role in a fake FBI drug raid in which he and another Tuscola County man terrorized a Lapeer County family and 2 friends, and shot 2 of the family's dogs last November. Lapeer Circuit Court Judge Michael Higgins handed down the sentence last week, calling David Taylor, 35, a "danger to society.

Higgins set Taylor's maximum prison time at 75 years. A Lapeer County jury convicted Taylor in June on 3 counts of armed robbery, 2 counts of torture, safe breaking, 2 counts of animal killing/torture, impersonating a peace officer, being a felon in possession of a firearm, larceny in a building, and possession of a firearm in the commission of a felony - a charge that added 2 years to Taylor's sentence. The jury deliberated for just 40 minutes before delivering their

In the buff **D**eputies arrest naked suspect chasing woman

Sanilac County Sheriff's Department officers arrested a Snover man Saturday morning after the man aln naked fter a 23-vear-old female jogger in Sanilac County's Delaware Township. The suspect, whose name was not released, was booked on charges of felony assault with intent to make sexual contact, and indecent exposure following the 11:20 a.m. incident near the intersection of Mills Road and M-25. The man was later released after posting bond and is scheduled to be formally arraigned on the charges Monday, Aug. 27, at 8:15 a.m. in Sanilac County District Court. According to Sanilac County Undersheriff Garry Biniecki, deputies James Leen and Shelly Park were dispatched to the scene after a caller reported a naked man chasing a female subject in the beach area, and that the suspect had left the area northbound in a black SUV. While en route to the scene, deputies Leen and Park located the vehicle,

Lapeer County Assistant Prosecutor Steve Beatty said the case marked the first successful prosecution of Michigan's new torture statute in Lapeer County.

Armed robbery and torture are both punishable by up to life in prison. Taylor faced an enhanced sentence because of his status as an habitual offender (3 or more prior felony convictions) stemming from past convictions on charges of first degree home invasion, larceny and delivery/manufacture of a controlled substance.

Taylor's former brother-in-law and accomplice, Dwayne Rocca, 38, of Fairgrove, faced similar charges and was convicted as well. He was recently sentenced to a minimum 22 1/2 years in prison for his role.

Lapeer County Sheriff's Department detectives say Taylor and Rocca were behind the bizarre crime at a Lapeer Township home during the early morning hours of Nov. 27, when the pair,

posing as FBI agents, allegedly shot 2 of the family's pit bulls and then entered the home, using a stun gun against some of the residence's 5 occupants before fleeing with property and cash

Sheriff's deputies were dispatched to the private residence at about 4:53 a.m. to investigate a reported armed robbery. Deputies arrived to find a married couple, ages 25 and 19, their 2-year-old son, and 2 male friends, both aged 17, who also reside at the home

The homeowner told officers that he had let the dogs outside earlier that morning. He said the armed suspects were in the yard near the door and shot 2 of the dogs, one of which died. The suspects then entered the residence and used duct tape to secure the 3 males. The female, who was pregnant, and her son, were placed

YFC auction nets \$30,000

The sun shone on Saturday's annual Youth For Christ (YFC) Summer Benefit Auction and bidders plunked down plenty of cash, according to organizers, who deemed the sale one of the best in recent memory.

"It was fantastic. It really was. It (weather) was beautiful," said Heather Jensen, Caro and Reese YFC Campus Life director. "It went well. We had a lot of great

support and great donors. We had

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the best auction in recent history," Jensen added. "We expect we did net - between \$30,000 and \$31,000 which is about \$10,000 more than last year. So, we did great.

We had significantly more bidders - 50 percent more than last year. The highest bidder number that I saw was 160," Jensen continued. "And also, (Caro businessman) Gary Wills was just extremely generous and donated what he had left" after closing Golden Pheasant Gifts in Cass City, so there was significantly more merchandise because of his generosity. "It was all nice stuff and just an amazing boost to our sale this year.'

Jensen said a lack of consistency in the Campus Life director position for

the Cass City and Kingston areas may have contributed to poorerthan-expected auction sales in recent years. "We've had some turnovers in staffing, but Arin's been there for a year, and she's doing a great job,' she said of current Cass City-Kingston Campus Life Director Arin Shupe

Still, Jensen indicated YFC officials are grateful for the many area residents who turned out for this year's auction, especially in light of the economy.

Flint man gets 20 to 60 years in shooting last May

A Flint man charged in connection with the shooting of a Tuscola County resident last may was sentenced to 20 years to 60 years in prison last week in Tuscola County Circuit Court.

Chris A. Inman, 41, Flint, previously pleaded guilty to charges of assault with intent to murder, carrying a weapon with unlawful intent and possession of a firearm in the commission of a felony. He was also convicted of being an habitual offender (3 or more prior felony convictions). In addition to a lengthy prison term, Inman was ordered to pay court costs

and fines totaling \$540. The charges stemmed from an incident during the early morning hours of May 31 at a residence on Vassar Road near Arbela Road in Arbela Township

Tuscola County Sheriff's Department investigators said the shooting victim had gone to a nearby residence requesting help, and that the homeowner called police, saying the victim was bleeding from wounds to his face and neck.

No other details were released. Investigators say they haven't deter-mined a motive, although Inman and the victim reportedly had a disagree-ment prior to the incident.

have not been released. Prosecutors have said the victim survived but faces a long road to recovery.





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

Several appear in court

The following people appeared in Tuscola County Circuit Court last week on various criminal charges:

•Charity L. Stratton, 28. Mavville. was sentenced to 365 days in the county jail for her conviction on a charge of obtaining a controlled substance by fraud between Jan. 4, 2006, and Sept. 13, 2006 in Tuscola County. She was also ordered to pay court costs and fines totaling \$120.

Dustin A. McIntyre, 24, Vassar, was sentenced to 18 months to 15 years in prison for his pleas of guilty to interfering with electronic communications and assault and battery Jan. 29 in Denmark Township. He was also convicted of being an habitual offender (2 prior felony convictions) and probation violation

In addition to prison time, he was ordered to pay \$120 in costs and fines.

In addition to jail time, he was ordered to pay \$1,090 in costs and fines plus restitution of \$3,000. Michael J. Cuttle, 34, Deford, re-

ceived a one-year delayed sentence for his plea of no contest to interfering with electronic communications April 11 in Kingston Township.

He was ordered to pay costs and fines totaling \$1,400.

•Melony M. Davis, 21, North Branch, received a one-year delayed sentence for her pleas of no contest to 2 counts of writing a no account check totaling \$165.32 and \$115.58 Nov. 22 in Mayville.

She was ordered to pay \$1,100 in costs and fines plus restitution of \$330.90.

 Samuel R. Dicks, 54, Cass City, was sentenced to 12 months probation for his pleas of no contest to malicious destruction of police/fire department property and domestic violence Feb. 22 in Ellington Township.

He was also ordered to pay costs and fines totaling \$780 plus \$200 in

attorneys fees. •Laurence L. Alexander, 35, Vassar, was sentenced to 90 days in jail for

his plea of guilty to possession of marijuana, subsequent offense, Feb.

8 in Arbela Township. He was also convicted of being an habitual offender (one prior felony conviction). Alexander was ordered to pay \$820 in costs and fines plus \$100 in attor-

neys fees. •Yvonne D. Ganaway, 42, Saginaw, received a one-year delayed sentence for her pleas of no contest to altering or forging a license plate and driving without insurance Jan. 5 in Vassar.

She was ordered to pay costs and fines totaling \$500 plus \$200 in attorneys fees

•William Michael-Leonard O'Brien, 24, Vassar, was sentenced to 270 days in jail (90 days deferred), with work release, and 60 months probation for his plea of no contest to second degree home invasion Jan. 3 in Ellington Township.

He was also ordered to earn his high school diploma, complete 50 hours of community service and pay \$1,320 in costs and fines

•Ryan J. Warren, 21, Caro, was sentenced to 365 days in jail and 36 months probation for his pleas of guilty to 2 counts of breaking and entering a building with intent to commit larceny March 10-12 in Caro. He was also convicted of being an habitual offender (one prior felony conviction)

Warren was ordered to pay costs and fines totaling \$240. Restitution is to be determined.

 Alexander N. O'Bee, 29, Sandusky, was sentenced to 90 days in jail, with work release and worksite privileges, for his plea of guilty to writing a no account check for \$108.24 Feb. 24 in Kingston.



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Kranz nearing goal of earning the Eagle rank with completion of project

Area residents may know Adam sranz as a young man who has been involved in just about every music Ensemble available at Cass City High chool, or as one of few local stu-ents to be selected for admission to the prestigious Interlochen Arts Academy.

But Kranz' accomplishments don't end there.

The 17-year-old Cass City resident, who is just days away from his first classes of his senior year at Interlochen, recently completed a project required to earn the Eagle -Boy Scouting's highest rank.

The son of Debra and Jim Kranz Kranz has spent the past several months securing, cleaning and preparing a special deposit box for used American flags that are no longer flown due to their age or damaged condition. The box, which provides an easy and convenient opportunity to properly dispose of flags, was dedi-cated last week next to the Cass City VFW Annex Building.

"It was my mom's idea," said Kranz. who noted he and his family had considered presenting a special program on the American flag, but opted instead to provide the community with a flag depository. "The Eagle project is intended as a

rmanent benefit to the community, Kranz explained, noting members of ass City VFW Post 3644 have igreed to collect and burn the flags

during special ceremonies in the fu-

The Eagle project requires scouts to demonstrate leadership through organization, and Kranz proved he was up to the task. But he also had plenty of help, starting with UPS, which donated one of its deposit

"It was pretty dirty when we got it. It was all covered with stickers," recalled Kranz, who enlisted his fellow members in Troop 594 to help pre-pare the box. "And then I spraypainted it, and I took it up to Matt (Bock), who is a former scout and who works at TotalCom," which donated the lettering and decals. Kranz, who spent several months on

the project, got involved in the Boy Scouts 12 years ago.

"As far as I can remember, I guess it was my dad who thought it would be a good thing for me to do," he recalled. "And I've had a lot of good times, met a lot of cool people."

Kranz confided there were times when he considered dropping out of scouting, but those thoughts faded as he began to consider earning the Eagle rank, and he began inching nearer to that goal. "Dad's been telling me for years, if I became an Eagle Scout, I'll have an edge up in everything I do," he said. Along the way, Kranz has benefited

from the experience and knowledge of what he described as several influential adults in his life, including former long-time Scoutmaster Brian Mallory, and current Scoutmaster Jim

Baker "It's just a fun time - camping out and being with a lot of cool kids," he said of scouting. "You get leader-

ship opportunities; you learn how to follow and give orders to people." Earning scouting's highest rank takes a great deal of dedication, but it puts Kranz in some impressive company - Eagle Scout alumni include Apollo Astronaut James A. Lovell Jr., former Senator Sam Nunn, business man H. Ross Perot, Secretary of Defense Donald Rumsfeld, and former president and Michigan native Gerald R. Ford.

To become an Eagle Scout, a scout must fulfill a set list of requirements in the areas of leadership, service and outdoor skills. Although many options are available to demonstrate proficiency in those areas, a number of specific skills are required to advance through the ranks - Tender-foot, Second Class, First Class, Star, Life and Eagle.

Scouts must pass tests that are organized by requirements and merit badges, which signify mastery of specific skills and also help the boys focus on activities of personal inter-

Of the 120 badges available, a Boy Scout must earn a minimum 21 to qualify for Eagle Scout. Of those, 12 are required, including first aid, citizenship in the community, communications, environmental science, personal fitness, camping and family life. Kranz said the Eagle rank, for him personally, "is just a culmination of everything. I'm ready to move on to Interlochen

Kranz has prepared for the next stage of his life in a number of ways. He has studied music for several years and plays some 50 percussion instruments. At Cass City High School, he was a member of the concert, jazz and marching bands. He hopes to someday make a career out of performing.

According to Jim Kranz, the Boy Scouts have been a good experience for his son in a number of ways, including encouraging him to take on the commitment required to reach for the Eagle rank

"It has brought him out of himself a little bit," he said. "He's made some good friendships, and I think it's encouraging him to do some things he wouldn't have done otherwise. He's matured to the point where he's ready to go" to Interlochen.

"It's (scouting) given him a chance to work with other adults, and I think that's one of the things I liked the most," Jim Kranz added. "It helps kids to deal with adults other than their teachers and their parents, and I think that's important.



House passes drain provisions

The House of Representatives recently passed provisions authored by Congressman Dale E. Kildee (D-MI) that would authorize the Army Corps of Engineers to rehabilitate Flint's Hamilton Dam and improve drainage of the Cass River in Tuscola County.

The provisions were passed in the House-Senate Conference Report of the Water Resources Development Act of 2007.

The provisions would pave the way for federal funds to be appropriated for Kildee's initiatives. This marks the first time that the federal government would authorize either project. Kildee has submitted formal requests to the House Appropriations Committee to fund both projects.

"Drivers should be cautious and look for indications that children are in the area," said Jack Peet, AAA Michigan community safety services manager. "Specifically, they can look for AAA School Safety Patrol members near elementary and middle schools. They are easy to spot with their fluorescent green Sam Brownstyle belt, and they are their to guide

and protect their classmates against traffic hazards."

The AAA School Safety Patrol program has been praised by safety and education groups for reducing injuries and deaths among 5- to 14-yearolds - the age group most at risk for pedestrian injury. More than 550,000 children serve as AAA Safety Patrollers in the U.S.

"We also hope more children than ever are walking to school this year, Peet added. "Walking or riding a bike is healthier for the kids, for the environment - and statistically, it's safer than riding in a car."

Nationwide, more than 16 percent of elementary school-age children are considered overweight, and Michigan's numbers are even higher in some categories.

Some additional safety tips for drivers include:

* Slow down near schools and in residential areas.

Look for bicycles and playgrounds that indicate children could be in the area.

Scan ahead between parked cars and other objects for signs children could dart into the road.

Practice extra caution in bad weather.

* Always stop for school buses when the overhead red lights are flashing (this applies to drivers on both sides of the road, unless a barrier divides the highway).

Legislation protects families of veterans

A plan by State Rep. Terry Brown (D-Pigeon) to protect the families of Michigan service members killed while serving in Iraq and Afghanistan was passed by the House Military and Veterans Affairs and Homeland Security Committee last week and now heads to the full House for a

vote. "Charlie's Bill" requires employers to provide a brief period of paid bereavement leave for a spouse, parent or child of a service member killed on active duty.

"Nothing we can do will bring back the honorable soldiers, Marines and airmen who died because they chose to fight for our freedom," said Brown, who is vice chair of the committee. What we can do is support their families and make sure they don't have to worry about going without a paycheck during the first days after their loss. Protecting our military families by giving them time to grieve is one of the few ways we can show our gratitude for their enormous sacrifice to our country."

Brown sponsored the legislation in honor of Army Sgt. Charles "Charlie" Drier of Tuscola County, who was killed during combat in Iraq in May 2005. He was 28. Drier's mother, Mary Drier of Unionville, testified before the committee last month about the need for Brown's legislation. The bill requires employers to grant paid be-reavement leave of up to 10 days or 80 hours. It also prohibits an employer from firing or punishing any employee who requests or takes the leave.

Brown pointed out that military fami-lics must deal with making funeral arrangements that are much more complicated and time consuming than in standard situations

"Grieving families often must wait days just to learn when their loved one will be returned to them, because of security and other issues related to the war zone," Brown said. "We need to support our military families so they can grieve, care for their families and make arrangements to lay these heroes to rest. As Americans, we must go beyond waving flags - we must give our military families real support in their time of need.'



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

Research group is seeking those with Aten/Auten name

A global-wide project focused on the 400-year history of a common surname has discovered a large presence of the name in the local commu-

Earlier this year, while browsing online articles of the Cass City Chronicle, amateur researchers in a 100-year-old genealogy project noticed several mentions of the Aten and Auten name among Cass City residents

"I think it (Cass City) was one of the migration patterns, not just for Atens, but for other families as well," said Karen Hillman, one of the key researchers from Pennsylvania who has been instrumental in furthering development of the project.

Participants in the Aten/Auten Project are interested in furthering the project by making contact with as many people with the surnames as possible to unearth details that are either unknown or have been lost with time.

"We'd like to get as much information from these families as we can, so that we can fit them into existing family lines or identify answers to some of our existing questions," said Dorothy Armitage, another prominent family tree researcher. "We have an obligation to save as much historical material as we can about our pioneer past. Encouraging people in our communities to research and keep information about their family past is a

very big part of saving history. The research group is interested in

finding males who might consider participating in the DNA section of he project, a simple cheek swab, that is free of cost. "A DNA sample from a member of

one of these families could, when compared against the DNA samples already in our Aten collection, help us to find their 'line' and could help to move our knowledge forward, Armitage said.

The origins of the family have been traced to New Amsterdam at the beginning of European settlement in 'the New World,' through the American Revolution, the Civil War, and the Great Migration West, Hillman explained. It is one of the original pio neer names to appear in North America.

'There were 4 original sons from the New Amsterdam days. Each had multiple sons and daughters who had multiple sons, and so on and so on. I would guess that on my own small system I have 'documented' 200 families back through 400 years," said Nancy Vose, who more recently be-came involved with the project after she was contacted by researchers and collaborates with the group from Vancouver, Canada.

Research began in the late 1800s. but the family tree did not significantly grow until recent years, with the advent of computers- email and genealogy programs.

Family reunions have brought people together and the project has grown, including people across the United States, Canada, France and the Netherlands.

Though 'Auten' is the most common spelling of the name, the Dutch name originated as 'Aten' and there have been varying spellings for the 300 odd years the family has been living in North America.

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

Retail food prices up this year


Retail food prices at the supermar ket increased slightly in the second quarter of 2007, according to the latest American Farm Bureau Federation (AFBF) Marketbasket Survey. The informal survey shows the total cost of 16 basic grocery items in the second quarter of 2007 was \$42.95, up about 4 percent or \$1.61 from the first quarter of 2007. Of the 16 items surveyed, 14 in-

creased, one decreased and one stayed the same in average price com-pared to the 2007 first-quarter survey. Compared to one year ago, the overall cost for the marketbasket items showed an increase of about 8 percent.

'Consumers have no doubt noticed their food dollar stretched a little tighter lately," said AFBF economist Jim Sartwelle. "As energy costs have increased, it has become more expensive to process, package, and transport food items for retail sale. In addition, soaring demand overseas for U.S. dairy and meat products has reduced quantities available at home, resulting in retail price increases at the grocery store." Regular whole milk showed the larg-


est quarter-to-quarter price increase, up 34 cents to \$3.46 per gallon. Sir-loin tip roast increased 27 cents to \$3.99 per pound; pork chops in-creased 22 cents to \$3.63 per pound; ground chuck increased 20 cents per pound to \$2.85.

Other items that increased in price whole fryers, up 17 cents to \$1.28 per pound; apples, up 15 cents to \$1.45 per pound; vegetable oil and bread, both up 9 cents to \$2.66 for a 32-ounce bottle and \$1.58 for a 20-ounce loaf respectively; mayonnaise, up 8 cents to \$3.43 for a 32-ounce jar; and regular eggs, up 5 cents to \$1.56 per dozen Volunteer shoppers recorded nominal price increases for: cheddar cheese, up 3 cents to \$3.72 per pound; flour, up 2 cents to \$1.92 for a 5-pound bag; toasted oat cereal and corn oil, up one cent each to \$2.86 for a 10ounce box and \$2.78 for a 32-ounce bottle, respectively. Russet potatoes dropped 12 cents to \$2.34 for a 5-pound bag. Bacon stayed the same at \$3.44 per pound. As retail grocery prices have gradually increased, the share of the average food dollar that America's farm families receive has dropped over

"In the mid-1970s, farmers received about one-third of consumer retail food expenditures on average. That figure has decreased steadily over time and is now just 22 percent, according to Agriculture Department statistics," Sartwelle said.





Union bargainers, representing about 74 teachers, agreed to continue with a calendar that adds 20 minutes to each school day, allowing school officials to eliminate 13 days from the school calendar, and the union also agreed to health insurance concessions that will save the district about \$24,000, according to Wilson. He said they also agreed to allow school officials to lay off teachers, should the district's finances dictate another round of cuts, with a 15-day notice rather than having to wait until a se-

"There were also some minor language adjustments (in the contract), but nothing huge," Wilson added. The superintendent said the proposed teachers contract will cost the district an additional \$50,000 to \$60,000 over what school officials

paid in 2006-07. 'I was pleased overall," Wilson said. "I wasn't pleased (with the new contract) and neither were they, but they saw the need to put this to bed financially. Now we can focus on why we exist, and that's educating the kids It was a good resolution and I think it was good for Cass City.


"It was a tough time to negotiate we didn't have anything to give them," added Wilson, who noted school officials are more than 48 days into the new fiscal year and still don't know what the state will be providing in per-pupil revenue in the coming year. The Cass City Schools, like many

other districts in the area, has struggled in recent years. School officials have slashed expenses by \$1.6 million, including 2 dozen teaching positions over the past 18 months, and are projecting a loss of 50 students in the 2007-08 school vear



in a separate room.

Prosecutors say Taylor and Rocca knew the homeowners, and that the men used a stun gun on 2 of the 3 males to obtain information on the whereabouts of money and other items

The suspects were in the home for a few hours and left with stereo equipment, a Playstation, clothing and an undisclosed amount of cash.

Two days later, investigators developed information that Taylor and Rocca were the suspects.

Taylor was arrested in the afternoon at a residence in Lapeer after 2 of the 3 victims sought him out and beat him. He was hospitalized briefly for treatment of a collapsed lung before his arraignment.

Rocca was arrested the same day at his residence in Fairgrove by deputies and officers from the Lapeer and Tuscola County sheriff's departments and Fairgrove police.
