# Walbro jobs staying in **Cass City**

Walbro Engine Management officials Thursday announced completion of the sale of the company from TI Automotive by an affiliate of Sun Capital

The good news locally is that Walbro Engine Management jobs in Cass City are staying in Cass City, at least for now

This ownership change is very positive news for Walbro Engine Management's customers, suppliers and employees," said Tony Martin, chief

executive officer, Walbro Engine Management.
"Sun Capital's ownership will enhance Walbro Engine Management's ability to grow its business," Martin added. "Our goal remains to create significant value and benefit for our customers and suppliers by continuing to add to our product portfolio and enhancing our technical capabilities.

"It's basically good news for us," agreed Dave McNaughton, general manager of Walbro Engine Management in Cass City, which employs about 300 people. "We're not planning to change anything. Because Sun (Capital

Partners) bought us doesn't change anything."

McNaughton said the sale has resulted in a "small lay-off" in Cass City, although he wasn't sure how many employees were affected.

"Traditionally the TI plant in Caro and Walbro in Cass City had worked under a single contract under UAW. Basically, we had one contract covering employees at both plants," McNaughton said. "As part of the sale agreement, it was necessary to create 2 separate contracts and eliminate employee transfer rights between the plants.

As a result, McNaughton explained, officials representing both companies and the union agreed to allow employees at the Caro and Cass City plants to make a final choice of where they wanted to work. "And there was some movement. More people wanted to work for Walbro in Cass City than in Caro," he said, adding contract provisions governing seniority forced some existing Cass City workers from their jobs. "But total employment (numbers) did not change.

The sale of TI Automotive's Industrial Group, composed of Walbro Engine Management, Bundy Refrigeration and VARI-FORM, was announced in mid-February. The group accounted for 15 percent of TI Automotive's sales and employs some 5,000 people.

Sun Capital Partners Inc. is a leading private investment firm focused on

leveraged buyouts, equity, debt and other investments in market-leading companies. Sun Capital affiliates have invested in and managed more than 140 companies worldwide with combined sales topping \$33 billion since Sun Capital's inception in 1995. # Police arrest 10 on drug charges

have been stepping up their battle in the war against drugs. Sheriff Kent D. Tibbits said Thursday that the recent arrests of 10 suspects, including a pair of Ubly residents, proves the effort is continuing to yield re-

Tibbits, who noted the arrests took place over the past 2 weeks, said his office has been working closely with Huron County Prosecutor Mark J. Gaertner since December 2005 with a concentration on putting a dent in

drug trafficking in the county. "As a result, Gaertner has issued 26 felony and misdemeanor warrants for 12 men and 7 women, all from Huron County," Tibbits added.

According to Gaertner, the warrants cover a variety of drug charges, including delivery and possession of cocaine, heroin, morphine, Methadone and marijuana, as well as Vicodin, Xanax and other prescription drugs. Some of the suspects also face charges of conspiracy and maintaining a drug house.

Among the suspects already arraigned in Huron County District Court are: Luke Kitchen, 22, of Sebewaing; Scot Wright, 39, of Elkton; Allison Miller, 25, of Port Austin; Nancy Spencer, 42, of Ubly; Joseph Spencer, 28, of Ubly; Julie Wilson, 45, of Bad Axe; Kimberly McIvor. 35, of Sebewaing; and Robert McCracken, 44, of Pigeor

### Council okays updated parks plan The Cass City Village Council ap-

proved an updated 5-year parks and recréation master plan following a public hearing Thursday night.

The updated plan, a year in the making, covers a variety of planned improvements from this year through 2011 and outlines a funding "wish list"

topping more than \$5 million. Village officials last year hired Spicer Group Inc. to revise and update the plan with an eye to the future. Thursday's action followed the Cass City Planning Commission's approval

a month ago Village officials say the document is intended to serve as a guide in the planning for future park and recreational opportunities, services and implementation. Population shifts, new development and changing attitudes towards leisure have added additional pressures to the community's existing parks and recreation system, increasing the need for both short- and long-range plan-

Many of the recommendations, such as maintenance issues, aesthetic and landscaping enhancements, and pedestrian safety improvements, can be implemented fairly easily and at a relatively low cost. Other recommendations such as land acquisition, facility expansions and construction will require additional study and involve residents in order to address specific

According to Cass City Village Manager Peter Cristiano, an updated parks and recreation plan is a pre-requisite to applying for state grant funding through the Michigan Department of Natural Resources

A key component of the plan. Cristiano noted, is that it focuses on parks and recreation facilities and opportunities Cass City offers not

only to its 2,643 residents, but also to those living in outlying areas, for a combined service base of more than 19,000 people living in 13 townships within the Cass City School District boundaries

Most of Cass City's recreational facilities are located in Cass City Recreation Park, which totals more than 82 acres. They include a pool, playground areas, basketball and tennis courts, softball/baseball and soccer fields, sand volleyball courts, football field and track, a sledding hill, and pavilions.

### Ubly police chief Kuhl wears many hats

Strangers to Ubly might guess Matthew Kuhl is a rookie police officer, given his youthful appearance, energy and enthusiasm for the job.

Granted, Kuhl is just 30, but he carries a great deal more responsibility in this town of some 820 people than any rookie.

He's the chief. And more

Kuhl, a Sebewaing native and 1995 USA High School graduate, was named Ubly police chief in March 2005. Before that, he had served as a full-time officer in Ubly since August 1998 after a brief stint working as a deputy with the Huron County Sheriff's Department.

After taking on the role of chief in

Ubly, Kuhl acknowledged he was the among the younger if not the youngest police chief in attendance at Thumb law enforcement meetings. He still is.

"I never really looked at it as an age; I looked at it as experience. I had worked here, I knew the people and I liked it here," he said. "It was pretty overwhelming, I guess, when they (Ubly Village officials) asked me (to be chief)," he said. "But when I accepted the job, I knew everything that was going to come with it.'

Kuhl, a newlywed — he married his wife, Heather, in December - earned an associate's degree in criminal justice at Kirtland Community College in St. Helen. He then returned home and spent a summer working for his

father, Larry, who owns a metal fabricating shop in Sebewaing, before enrolling in the Northeastern Police Academy in Saginaw in the fall of

He recalled the training was the fulfillment of a career goal he had set many years earlier.

Since kindergarten, through grade school, through high school," he said. "There was never any doubt. I just knew, it was in my heart. I really can't explain why. I didn't really have any family members in law enforcement, so it's nothing I was exposed to, to lead me that way. I guess I liked the discipline that came with it.

Folks who take their dogs everywhere will be happy to learn the Washington Legislature is considering a bill that would allow dogs in taverns. If it passes, we could expect other

states to try the same thing.

exclaimed. "What?! They gave me a chihuahua?!" the customer said.

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
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### Red Hawk **Talk**

Whether in a math, science, social : studies, English, or any other class at Cass City High School, it seems that there is one thing that no student likes - a test. Yes, taking a test seems to be one thing that most students agree is not fun. However, juniors throughout the state of Michigan are in the process of taking the Michigan Merit Exam.

The Michigan Merit Exam is a new test required for juniors throughout the state of Michigan. The test, known as the MME, is replacing the gold state standardized test, the MEAP test. There are several similarities between the tests, such as subject areas, however several distinct differences exist as well.

To find out what differences students would see on the test this year, It talked with Mrs. Cheryl Kilbourn, the Michigan Merit Exam coordinator for the Cass City School District. Mrs. Kilbourn told me that unlike the MEAP test, in which students would have an unlimited amount of time to complete the test, the Michigan Merit Exam will be timed. Students will not enjoy the luxury of working at their own pace, but will rather have to race the clock.

In addition to the change in testing stime regulations, there are also sev-Gral differences that students will see to the actual test material. Unlike the MEAP test, which evalu-

ated students in the areas of math, science, social studies and English, this year's students will be evaluated in other areas as well. The Michigan Merit Exam will break English into a section focused on grammar and usage, entitled English, and a section focused on reading and using context to understand a passage, entitled Reading. Students will also write

Turning on the news recently, I saw that a high school student had been shot at a Midland school. She had been confronted by her boyfriend who had grown furious, pulled a gun out of his backpack, and shot her 4 times, before turning the gun on him-

Another school tragedy has taken place, this time close to home. Near enough to send a jolt of fear through many of us. It also triggers questions such as "Am I really safe at school?". "Could a shooting take place at my school?", and "Is my school doing enough to prevent something like this from happening?'

When students were asked about this issue, there were differing opin-

Sophomore Eric Sabin said, "I do feel safe at school, but I do know that it could change and I might feel in danger in an instant." Senior Tristin Pennington added, "We have a small enough school that I know everyone personally, and I feel that everyone likes me.

But is that enough? Many students that shoot up schools do not always pick specific students to shoot. When a student has been belittled and alienated for so long, his anger can build up. A student like this going on a shooting rampage is probably going to shoot at anyone and everyone to express their anger.

While some of us feel safe around school, we have to be honest and ask ourselves, "Could a school shooting ever take place at our school?"

Junior Becca Troop commented, "Possibly, people can be pretty cruel and if someone was pushed far enough it could happen." Pennington agreed with her, saying, "It could hap-pen anywhere." Yet, freshman McKenzie Howell disagreed with both, "No, not really," was her response to the question.

Opinions vary on how safe each student feels at school and whether they think a shooting could ever take place at Kingston, but how do people feel about what schools are doing to prevent school shootings?

Both Becca Troop and Eric Sabin expressed little faith in our school security system. "I have seen that if someone wanted to, they could sneak various things in the school and get away with it, and that could mean danger for all," Sabin said. Troop added, "All we have are cam-

eras. Anybody could bring in a weapon in a book bag or a baggy

What could schools do to prevent these terrible tragedies? They could start by improving security; while some believe security guards and metal detectors are overreactions, they may be necessary.

Another thing to be taken into consideration is the number of angry stu-dents who walk the halls of every school. What is being done to reach out to them?

While a heightened school security system may be a solution to this problem, the root may be much deeper, lying within the hurt individuals starving for affection walking the halls of our school. What are we doing to help these individuals, or do

our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we are doing to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Recent testing results show that our system exceeds the standard or maximum contaminant level (MCL) for arsenic. The standard for arsenic is 10 parts per billion (ppb). The levels of arsenic in the Village of Cass City water were 17 ppb in Well #1, 21 ppb in Well #2 and 22 ppb in Well #3.

### What should I do?

You do not need to use an alternative (e.g. bottled) water supply. However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor.

### What does this mean?

This is not an immediate risk. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. However, some people who drink water containing arsenic in excess of the MCL over many years could experience skin damage or problems with their circulatory system, and may have an increased risk of

What happened? What is being done?

In 2001, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency lowered the arsenic standard from 50 ppb to 10 ppb and gave water supplies five (5) years to comply. As of the deadline of January 23, 2006, the level of arsenic in the Village of Cass City water is above the new standard and therefore a violation of the Michigan Safe Drinking Water Act, 1976 PA 399, as amended.

The Village of Cass City is currently constructing an arsenic treatment plant. It will be completed early summer 2007.

# Learning the ropes

## Josephs raise, train quarter horses

Bob and Cindy (Doerr) Joseph are probably best known around Cass City in their role as owners and operators of the Charmont restaurant and bowling Alley, but the couple also share another business venture of sorts.

That venture is actually a labor of love for the Josephs, who spend as much time as possible at their Huron Line Road property, training and working with quarter horses. They've also put a fair amount of time in over the past 2 years learning the ins and outs of showing quarter horses, with Cindy taking care of the grooming duties and Bob showing the couple's best horses across the state and beyond.

The Josephs are quick learners. They have won Grand Champion Yearling Halter honors 2 years in a row at Blue Water Pleasure Horse Association shows in the Thumb. This past year, they also took Grand Champion Amateur Yearling Halter, Grand Champion Open Yearling Halter, and Grand Champion Amateur Stallion honors at Michigan Quarter Horse Association competitions.

The Josephs have 7 horses of their own - 5 mares, a stallion and a gelding. The couple named their stallion "Tardee Kids Alibi". He's just 2 years old and shares the bloodlines of 3 of the most well-known quarter horses

in the country.
"What we do is we breed them and we show them. We want to raise and breed the halter horses," Bob Joseph said. He explained that showing halter horses involves walking with and leading the horse in front of judges who look for specific physical characteristics as well as how they stand. "They're (quarter horses) big and they're muscled, they need to have a

lot of size," he explained. "We had to learn the nuances of showing them," said Cindy, who noted the angle of the hand on a halter, for example, will determine how the horse will hold its head. It's also important that the animal's ears are

pointed forward. Preparing a horse for a show involves plenty of grooming — washing and brushing, according to Cindy, who said the process includes polishing hooves and using a special white spray paint on the white patches of a horse's legs to highlight the color. "It's like a fashion show." Bob joked.

The Josephs have been in the community for about a decade. Bob's a native of Pennsylvania whose introduction to horses came as a youngster when his sister raised and worked with horses. Cindy is a native of the Cass City area. In fact, her parents, Don and Shirley Doerr, raised their family on a farm just a quarter-mile east of the Joseph's farmhouse.

Raising quarter horses at their Lo-

d

cust Hill Farm is really more of a hobby for the Josephs right now, but it's also a business, one the couple would like to see expand as they continue to build their own horses' bloodlines and offer their stallion for breeding purposes to other horse owners. Bob said they've already begun to sell some horses.

The Josephs selected a breed with a rich history and tradition in this country — the American quarter horse is the first breed of horse native to the United States.

The breed evolved when the bloodlines of horses brought to the New World were mixed, according to the American Quarter Horse Association. Foundation American quarter horse stock originated from Arab, Turk and Barb breeds. Selected stallions and mares were crossed with horses brought to Colonial America from England and Ireland in the early 1600s. The combination resulted in a compact, heavily muscled horse that evolved to fill the colonists' passion for short-distance racing.

As pioneers moved westward, so did the American quarter horse. During the 1800s, vast cattle ranches began to stretch across the plains. Known for its cow sense (the ability to outmaneuver cattle) and calm disposition, the American quarter horse was ideally suited for the challenge

Today, heavy muscling and sprinter's speed remain characteristic traits, but the breed has been specialized to excel at particular events. Competing in every discipline imaginable from traditional rodeo events to the refined English classes of dressage and show jumping has made the quarter horse one of the most versatile breeds in the world.

"They're a very versatile breed, and they're smart," Cindy agreed.

"That's what they're known for their intelligence. And, of course, as companions," Bob added. He pointed to his gelding and, referring to the animal as a foundation quarter horse, said, "I have one and he's the smartest horse I've ever had.

The Josephs have taken a comprehensive approach to breeding and raising their quarter horses by utilizing the knowledge and expertise of a veterinarian who specializes in horses, as well as other professionals in the field. They include Rick and Julie Leek, who own and operate a large breeding farm in the Dryden area, Carmen Longuski, owner of Holbrook Tack in Cass City and a skilled horse trainer who has helped the Josephs with training and made recommendations regarding their horses' nutrition needs; and Roman Mast, another Cass City area resident and professional ferrier who sees to the horses' hoof health.

recorded a near fall in the final period to escape with a 3-2 victory. Sieradzki finishes with a 50-9 mark in his final Red Hawk season.

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

# **Ubly chief versatile**

Kuhl serves as the village of Ubly's zoning administrator. He's also a certified salvage vehicle inspector, law enforcement firearms instructor and, in the local school district, the TEAM (Teaching, Educating and Mentoring) instructor.

"I definitely wear a lot of hats here," Kuhl acknowleged, smiling. "During the summer, the zoning does take up a lot of time because everybody's building. As far as enforcement, every police officer has to enforce the zoning laws, so having an inside knowledge of that helps me both ways."

Much of the job involves inspecting and issuing site permits for everything from sigus and fences to sheds, garages and home additions. The site permits are required before a property owner can apply for a building permit with the county.

Kuhl said his training as zoning administrator has been a learn-as-you-go proposition. "It was basically me picking up a zoning book," he added. "And, to be honest, after 2 years, 1'm probably still just scratching the surface as far as knowledge."

As the village's top law enforcement officer, Kuhl agreed community policing is a different approach compared to working in a large city. In Ubly, he oversees a staff of one full-time officer and 4 part-time officers. Together, they are responsible for keeping law and order not only in the village of Ubly, but also throughout Bingham Township.

"It definitely helps, growing up in a small town. I grew up knowing the police officers in Sebewaing," he said. "You definitely handle things differently in a small town — you have a general sense of when you talk to someone of what's going on. But the thing with a small village — any small village — is we handle the same complaints as a big city, just not" as often. As far as serving as a police officer in a town where he knows many of the residents, Kuhl said, "I wouldn't say it's too hard, because any police officer does what he has to do, plain and simple. When it comes down to it, we're expected to

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less of who it is.

"I like the work," Kuhl added. "Every day, I come to work, it's something different. It's definitely not boring."

Kuhl, who previously lived in Ubly for about 5 years, indicated he's very comfortable working in the community, in part because of his own upringing on the other side of the Thumb. And, he's gotten involved, spending 4 years as the Ubly High School girls' junior varsity basketball coach, which fit in perfectly with his love of sports — he played basketball in high school and still enjoys a game here and there. He'll also tell you the summer months find him on the golf course as often as he can

Kuhl figures he has the best of both worlds — a satisfying career and the knowledge that he has a "second" hometown that he can call his own.

"I really like the people here. The people here are good people," he said. "It's how I feel about Sebewaing. It's really a hometown away from Sebewaing."



partment detectives along with the sheriff's drug officer. "Having an officer dedicated to drug investigations and related matters makes all the difference," he said. "The dealers are looking over their shoulder and wondering if we are on to them."

Tibbits said the recent drug-related arrests of Robert Gonzales, Anthony Spencer and Mike Weiderhold Jr. are also part 'of the investigation Gaertner indicated he will be authorizing additional arrest warrants.

Tibbits lauded the cooperation among several county law enforcement agencies, including the Sebewaing, Elkton, Port Austin and

Fairhaven Township police departments. "All the police agencies have been working together and that gives us an added punch," he said.

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
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
