School officials: half-million in cuts a must by next year

Auditors for the Cass City Schools gave the district a financial thumbs-up Monday night, saying school officials increased their general fund balance by nearly \$570,000 to \$950,000 during the 2007-08 school year.

School officials tempered that news, however, with some sobering financial realities of their own: either the district cuts at least a half-million dollars in expenses over the next several months or face deficit-spending status again at the end of the 2009-10 school year.

Gary Anderson of Anderson, Tuckey, Bernhardt & Doran, P.C., the Cass City Schools' auditing firm, reported on the 2007-08 audit, saying the district's accounting system and finances are in good shape, in spite of some troubling figures.

For example, he pointed out, property tax revenue, which makes up just 8 percent of the school system's income, increased by about \$9,000 last year, while state aid, which covers some 86 percent of the district's revenue, dipped by more than \$600,000 due to the loss of 85 students.

Overall, Anderson reported, general fund revenues totaled \$10.9 million, \$450,000 less than the year before, and expenditures came in at roughly \$10 million, \$590,000 less than in 2006-07.

Cass City's fund balance of \$950,000 at the end of June represents about 9 percent of the general fund balance, he said, noting experts recommend a minimum 15 percent fund balance.

Meeting that goal isn't likely anytime soon, according to school Supt. Ron Wilson, who told the board Monday that school officials will spend

\$500,000 of the fund equity this year, much of it in the form of salaries and benefits following the hiring of a middle school social worker, a kindergarten teacher and a first grade teacher. In addition, he added, the district is paying the salary and benefits for a teacher who remains on administrative leave.

Add to that the loss of more students this year - 33 so far at a cost of about \$241,000, and the ever-present chance that state officials may again reduce state aid, he continued.

Board Treasurer Danny Haag commented that the school is also losing out on savings from a proposed switch in health insurance package for teachers, but with negotiations stalled, the potential savings is dwindling by the month because the teachers continue to receive the pay and benefits provided for under their expired contract.

Wilson and members of the board's finance committee acknowledge that members of the community may be scratching their heads over the suggestion of more cuts, especially after they slashed a whopping \$1.6 million from the district's \$12 million budget 2 years ago during Wilson's first year at the helm.

The bottom line, Wilson said, is that state and federal revenues aren't even coming close to keeping up with expenses.

To put it into perspective, even if school officials completely froze spending this year and retained the current enrollment, the school would be facing a deficit of about \$34,000

Voters to pick new sheriff, drain chief

Cass City area residents will choose a new sheriff and drain commissioner in Tuscola County as well as help to decide a battle for the District 3 commissioner's seat in the Tuesday, Nov. 4, general election.

The retirement of Tuscola County Sheriff Tom Kern - the longest serving sheriff in the county - set the stage for next week's battle for his office. The candidates are sheriff's department veteran Leland Teschendorf, Republican, and Tim Adams, Democrat. Teschendorf has served as jail administrator for many years, while Adams is currently the Tuscola County District Court bailiff.

Another retirement, in the Tuscola County Drain Commissioner's Office, paved the way for a race between Republican Bob Mantey and Democrat Larry Farnum. Both hope to replace incumbent Drain Commissioner Sarah Pistro, who opted to end her tenure after 6 years of service to the county.

Running unopposed for county seats are incumbents county Clerk Margie White-Cormier, Republican, Treasurer Pat Donovan-Gray, Democrat, and Prosecutor Mark E. Reene, Republican. Also running unopposed is Republican Dan Grimshaw, who unseated incumbent Register of Deeds Ginnie McLaren in the August primary election.

COMMISSIONERS

The general election will usher in new leadership and representation of the Cass City area on the Tuscola County Board of Commissioners, with local attorney Amanda Roggenbuck, Republican, running unopposed for the seat that represents Elkland, Elmwood, Columbia, Akron, Gilford, Fairgrove and Wisner townships.

Roggenbuck, a Port Hope native, has been practicing law in Cass City since 2003. She specializes in estate planning, family law and abuse and

neglect cases. Currently the chairwoman of the Tuscola County Enterprise Facilitation Board, Roggenbuck and her husband, Brian Ritchey, have 3 children.

Her predecessor, lifelong Cass City area farmer Dave Milligan, withdrew his candidacy prior to the primary election. A former long-time Elkland Township supervisor, he served 2 terms on the county board.

In District 3, the county's soon-to-be former sheriff is challenging Republican incumbent Donald McLane for the right to represent the citizens of Dayton, Fremont, Novesta, Kingston, Koylton and Wells townships. The race marks the end of

Kern's 38-year tenure at the sheriff's department, including 20 years as sheriff. He is a Democrat.

In another commission race, incumbent Republican Thomas Bardwell faces a challenge from Warren Taylor, Democrat, in District 2, which represents Almer, Ellington, Indianfields and Juniata townships.

Running unopposed are incumbent Republican Roy Petzold, District 4 (Vassar, Millington and Watertown townships), and incumbent Republican Gerald C. Peterson, District 5 (Tuscola, Arbela and Denmark townships and the city of Vassar).

Races slated in Sanilac and Huron

Sanilac County voters will decide a race for drain commissioner, while residents in Huron County will choose a new sheriff in the Tuesday, Nov. 4, general election. Voters in both counties will also choose the winners in a host of county commission races.

SANILAC COUNTY

In Sanilac County, Marlette Democrat Cheryl Collins and Carsonville Republican Gregory Alexander are vying for the office of drain commissioner. Alexander defeated 2 other Republicans last August, while Collins ran unopposed in the primary.

The county will host few countywide races next week, although residents will confirm the election of a new chief law enforcement officer in new Sheriff Garry Biniecki, who is currently serving as undersheriff.

Biniecki, of Sandusky, emerged the winner in a 5-way Republican race in

the primary election last August. He also already named his undersheriff - Sgt. Brad A. Roff, 39, a Port Sanilac native who has served with the Sanilac County Sheriff's Department since 1994.

Running unopposed next week are county Clerk Linda I. Kozfay, Republican, Lexington; Surveyor John A. Millett, Republican, Carsonville; Treasurer Kathy Dorman, Republican, Snover; Prosecutor James V. Young, Republican, Carsonville; Register of Deeds Michele VanNorman, Republican, Deckerville; and Road Commissioner Harold L. Donaghy, Republican, Sandusky.

In the Cass City area, incumbent Republican John Merriman, Deckerville, faces a challenge from Democrat Joyce Wiley, Minden City, for his District One county commission seat. The district represents

Firefighters limit damage to Deford area house

It was a good save.

Elkland Township Fire Chief Ron Pawloski isn't always able to utter those words, but he was glad to Saturday morning, hours after his department, assisted by the Kingston Fire Department, quickly extinguished the flames that threatened a Deford home.

For a volunteer department like Elkland Township, which covers a large geographical area, distance — even the 7 miles or so fire fighters traveled Friday night — is often the biggest enemy.

However, Pawloski said his crew was able to quickly determine that the reported chimney fire at 5942 Bruce St., was electrical in nature, and they shut the blaze down as it traveled up through an east wall of the residence.

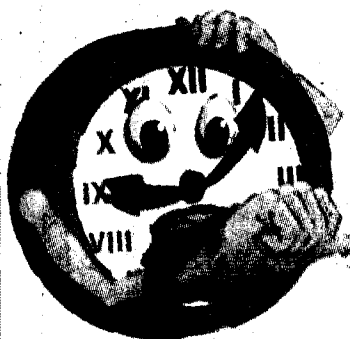
Fire fighters were dispatched to the residence, located one block west of Kingston Road, at about 7 p.m.

Leslie Dairy Farm honored by cooperative

Huron, Tuscola and Sanilac counties followed the statewide trend by posting substantial increases in the number of residents registered to vote. Statewide at the beginning of the year there were 7.14 million registered and in July the number increased to 7.24 million.

The 3-county numbers are: Huron County, 25,645, an increase of 425; Sanilac County, 30,968, an increase of 445, and Tuscola, 43,563, an increase of 580. Registration was made easy this year. It will take more effort to cast a ballot. It will be interesting to see if the newly registered will take the time to cast their ballots.

It was raining, raining hard at halftime of the football game at Owen-Gage. The ending of the game was a foregone conclusion as the Bulldogs trailed 52-6.

Seated at the edge of the field was a couple that have to be regarded as super, super fans. They had no rain gear and were huddled together under a blanket that covered their laps and patiently waited for the second half to start.

Fatal accidents claim 2 motorists

Traffic crashes claimed the lives of 2 motorists last week, Tuscola County Sheriff's deputies reported.

Undersheriff Jim Jashinske said Tony D. Blonde, 37, of Mayville, died early last Wednesday morning in a single-vehicle crash on Clifford Road, east of Hurds Corner Road in Dayton Township.

Blonde was driving a pickup truck westbound on Clifford Road when he failed to negotiate a curve and entered a ditch on the north side of the roadway. "He struck a driveway, going airborne and rolling over once," Jashinske said. "The driver was ejected from the pickup truck. He was not wearing a seatbelt."

Blonde was transported to Marlette Community Hospital, where he died from his injuries.

Investigators believe alcohol was a factor in the crash, which remains under investigation.

Also last Wednesday, deputies reported the death of Heidi Elaine Derks-Rehmann, 41, of Bay City, who was involved in a multiple-vehicle accident 2 days earlier in Tuscola Township. Derks-Rehmann had been transported from Covenant Hospital

in Saginaw to Spectrum Health Butterworth Campus Hospital in Grand Rapids to repair severe leg injuries she suffered in the accident.

According to reports, the accident occurred on M-15, east of Cottrell Road. Deputies said Derks-Rehmann was hurt when her vehicle was struck by another car driven by Lisa Wilnot, 45, of Mayville. Derks-Rehmann was trapped in her vehicle for nearly an hour before Vassar and Millington-Arbela fire fighters extricated her.

A preliminary investigation indicated Wilnot was westbound when her vehicle crossed the road centerline and struck 3 other vehicles, according to reports, which state she was distracted while trying to put something into her purse. She was also seriously injured and transported to Covenant.

The other drivers, Daniel Reinbold, 20, of Reese, and Angeline Zavala, 21, of Bay City, suffered minor injuries.

Jashinske said Tuscola County Medical Examiner Dr. Kanu Varani was scheduled to perform an autopsy Thursday to determine the cause of death. The crash remains under investigation.

Woodruff trial delayed by evaluation

The trial for a former Cass City man who led police on a foot chase and then carjacked a Cass City Police Department patrol unit with one officer still hanging on to the vehicle last December has been delayed again.

Brian J. Woodruff, 31, was scheduled to go to trial earlier this month, but the proceedings were adjourned

after his attorney requested an independent psychiatric evaluation of his client.

Chances are good the trial won't be rescheduled before the first of the year, according to Tuscola County Prosecutor Mark Reese, who said county taxpayers will be footing the bill - estimated at \$1,000 to \$2,500 - for Woodruff's independent exam because the defendant, currently being held in a state prison, has been deemed indigent and has a court-appointed attorney.

Woodruff stood mute to a host of felony charges last spring in Tuscola County Circuit Court, where he was formally arraigned following a mental competency examination conducted at the Michigan Center for Forensic Psychiatry in Ypsilanti.

That exam revealed Woodruff is both mentally competent and criminally responsible for his actions, according to Reese.

Woodruff faces several charges, including carjacking and armed robbery, both felonies punishable by up to life in prison.

He is also charged with unlawfully driving away an automobile, fleeing and eluding a police officer, 2 counts of assault with a dangerous weapon, 5 counts of assaulting a police officer, and malicious destruction of police property stemming from the Dec. 20 incident about 7 miles west of Cass City in Elmwood Township. He could also face enhanced penalties because he has been charged as an habitual offender (3 or more prior felony convictions).

Woodruff's clash with local law enforcement began after Cass City police officers Sgt. Roger Zelmer and Jake Dhyse were dispatched to the corner of Jacob and Hutchinson roads to assist Tuscola County Sheriff's Deputy Mike Pine in apprehending Woodruff, who was wanted for parole violations.

A short time later, Zelmer received word that Woodruff had gotten a ride with the driver of an SUV. The officer spotted the vehicle and attempted to catch up to it, but before he could, Dhyse stopped the SUV and recognized Woodruff, who then fled on foot. Dhyse gave chase, but Woodruff kept him at a distance by holding one arm under a coat as if he had a gun or other weapon. Dhyse drew his firearm, but did not fire, although Woodruff repeatedly threatened him.

The suspect managed to run towards Dhyse's patrol car with Dhyse right behind him. Woodruff dove in and put the vehicle in gear while Dhyse hung on for about 10 feet before freeing himself from the car. Zelmer, meanwhile, witnessed the struggle and gave chase in his own patrol car, and as he closed in, Woodruff slammed on his brakes, causing the vehicles to make contact. Woodruff attempted to run Zelmer off the road, and both drivers lost control, with Woodruff entering a ditch and Zelmer's patrol unit coming to rest in a field, where Woodruff was finally taken into custody.

Vandals' intent has changed



Ernie Harwell, Detroit icon, talked about his long life, saying that one of the perspectives of age is observing how it is today compared with similar activities experienced as he progresses into his 90s.

I thought about that when reading a story about problems experienced at North Farmington Public Schools.

The high school was evacuated twice because of bogus bomb threats. A week later another threat was scrawled on a bathroom wall of East Middle School and 2 days later the bathroom was vandalized.

School authorities cracked down and the doors of all bathrooms were locked except at lunch time when staff members monitor them.

An added feature of the crackdown is one that brings back an activity experienced as I rocket towards old(er) age. I can understand another story written in a metro daily that people between 45 to 85 years old define old age at 15 years later than their actual age.

But I digress. Back to the problem at North Farmington. In case a student needs to use the bathroom, he/she must obtain a pass from the office and be accompanied by a staff member. In the pre-historic times when I entered school, bathroom use during class time was allowed only after the students raised their hands and indicated by the number of fingers raised the proposed use of the facility.

In the Pinconning school that I attended there weren't any bomb threats, but placing a powder in the heating system to stink up the entire building was a constant threat.

What's changed, it appears to me, is the intent of the vandals. For kids, leaving class for the bathroom was not to damage property, but to escape from the boredom of the classroom. Placing powder in the heating system was a way to "put one over" on the teachers.

Talking about schools then and

now, this caveat: My early experience is based on activities of a small school. When I attended Pinconning High School I was proud to be a member of the largest graduating class in its history with 40 members. Size does make a difference.

It didn't take much to grab attention and no one even whispered about blowing up the building, or more to the point, burning a bridge that spanned the Pinconning River.



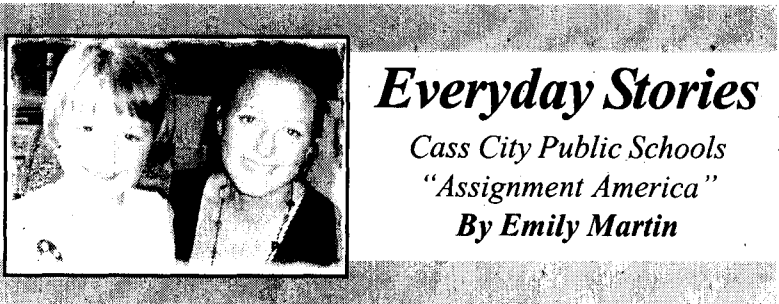

Saying goodbye

Emmerts closing the books on 22-year ministry at Novesta

Twenty-two years can seem like a lifetime.

Just ask Chuck Emmert, who along with his wife, Amy, and the couple's young children, Craig and Alison, made Cass City their home back in 1986, when Chuck was called to serve as pastor at the Novesta Church of Christ.

Since then, the Emmerts have grown to love the community, and faced a parent's worst nightmare - the loss of Alison to cancer 6 years ago last week. And, they've helped to build and expand the ministry at Novesta.

Today, the Emmerts are preparing to say goodbye to Cass City.

"We weren't searching for this. We weren't seeking this," Emmert commented Saturday of his decision to accept the job of senior pastor of the Duplaines Church of Christ in St. Johns, just north of Lansing.

In fact, Emmert all but ignored the church's efforts to convince him to move when they first contacted him a year ago. He recalled telling them that he wasn't really interested in moving, but they could call him back in a month if they wanted to.

At the time, Emmert recalled he was preparing to take on a new role at Novesta - that of serving as a "connector", assimilating people into the church and its missions. "I had wanted to phase out of the pulpit," he explained.

"The thing is, that was our plan, but when we looked back, it wasn't God's plan," he said. "We just said, if the Lord didn't want this to be, we want him to close the door."

"But that didn't happen. Officials with the church in St. Johns did call back a month later, and Emmert found himself wondering if God wasn't telling him that his days in the pulpit weren't going to be over just yet. Last June, he and Amy made the decision to accept the new position.

"Now, this church called us 8 years ago, so we did know about the church and we liked the church," Emmert said. "The catch was, Craig was going to be a junior (at Cass City High School) that year. No way. I just wouldn't have considered it then."

"This (decision) was timing and God's will," he added, "and we really do have peace about it."

However, preparing to move hasn't been easy.

Novesta was just Emmert's second full-time pastorate. He and Amy previously resided in Livonia, where Chuck served as associate minister at the Memorial Church of Christ for 11 years.

"I was at the point in the ministry at Livonia where I had worked with the kids 11 years and I was 30 and had kids of my own, and the idea of working with adults became exciting. My passion for working with youth had dwindled. It was time for a change," he said.

The couple moved to the Thumb with Craig, then 4, and Alison, then 1 1/2, in tow. Emmert is quick to note that Amy contributed not only to the ministry at Novesta with her vocal and other musical talents, but also in the Cass City School District, where she served as a teacher's aide, played piano at winter concerts and volunteered for Academic Track events.

The Emmerts embraced the community, and the community embraced them. That was no more apparent than when the family faced Alison's battle with cancer. It's a fight she lost at the age of 16.

"It's (memories of Alison) still right there. It's a daily thing," said Emmert, who passes his daughter's grave at the Novesta Township Cemetery each day as he arrives at the church.

"Leaving Cass City...I always felt like I had to give back to the community. So much was done for us by the community (after Alison was diagnosed with cancer). I tell people, I'll never be able to pay back Cass City and Novesta," he added. "And someone told me, you're not expected to pay it back."

Of course, the Emmerts have many good memories, too, including nights in the Cass City High School gym, where Craig was a standout basketball player during his high school years. Also a strong contributor to Cass City's cross country program, Craig's prowess on the court landed him at Milligan College in Tennessee after his graduation from high school in 2001.

After impressing the Milligan coaches for 4 years, Craig earned his degree in 2005 and went on to accept a job as a history teacher at Elizabethton High School, in the Johnson City area of Tennessee. But he still considers Cass City his home, according to his father.

The same is true for Chuck, who recalled many lasting memories over the years, including his role as treasurer of the "In His Name Fund", a financial resource for the needy, made possible by cash donations from several area churches. "The last 5 years have been very time consuming," he said. "We've written over 900 checks and probably (given away) \$20,000."

Emmert has also been a regular at the Wednesday morning prayer breakfasts held in town, and he's shared his love of the outdoors, particularly mushroom hunting and trout fishing, with others in the community by hosting an annual fishing retreat at his cabin in Traverse City. "That's going to continue - with 2 churches now," he said of the tradition, which each year has included some 50 residents from his church and the community.

Emmert is frequently seen pedaling his bicycle around the community. It's a hobby that led Emmert along with 2 other area residents - Gary Anderson and Dave Speirs - to complete a 189-mile trek, from Traverse City to Cass City, 4 years ago. In 1997, Emmert ran a 26-mile marathon at the high school track, raising \$5,000 for Great Lakes Christian College.

In recent days, Emmert has taken to bicycling each quadrant of Cass City, and he's found he knows someone on just about every block of the village. "That's what longevity does for you," he said, smiling.

As for the Novesta Church of Christ, Emmert says the future is bright. He's watched the congregation double in size during his tenure - growth he credits to the congregation itself - and he believes he has met his goal of helping to position the church for the next stage of growth.

With his last official day in the Cass City area pulpit (Sunday, Nov. 9) approaching fast, he and Amy are busy preparing for their move. And preparing to say goodbye.

"Cass City has been a great place to raise kids. We've been blessed to be here," Emmert said. "It's all about people. People are memories. A part of our heart will always be in Cass City."

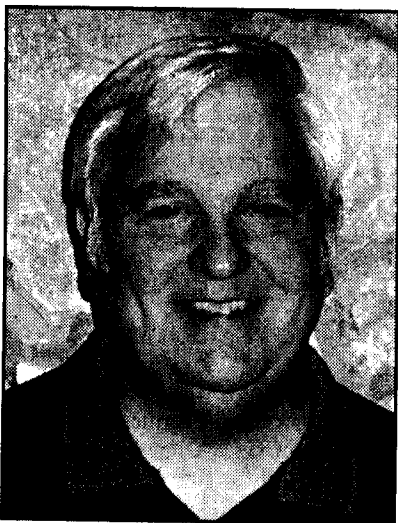

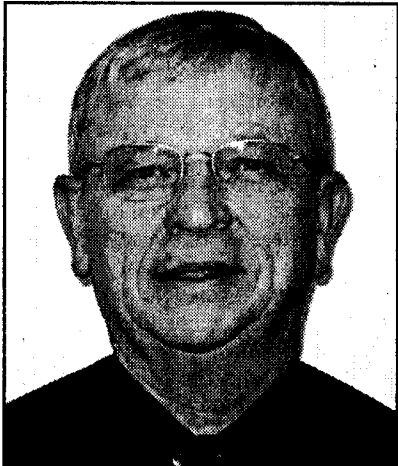

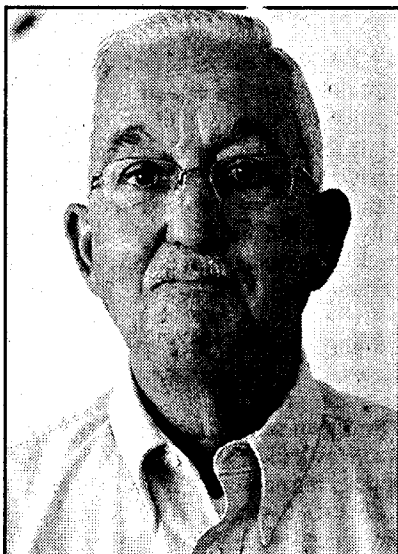

The 84th District represents residents in Tuscola and Huron counties.

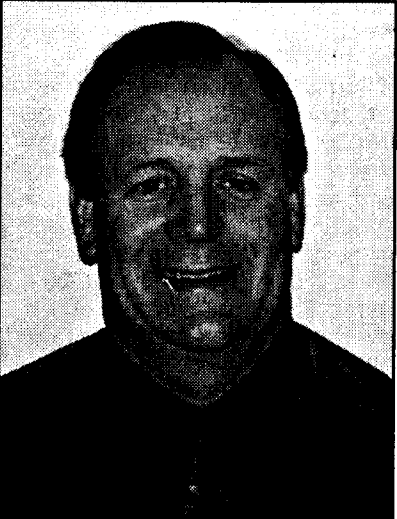

Firefighters limit damage in home fire

"They thought it was a chimney fire, but after further investigation, there was an outlet behind the fireplace — a woodburner is what it was — and it looked like it started in or around the outlet and then went up the wall from there," Pawloski said.

The chief noted the teenage son of the occupant, Roger Austin, was home at the time, but he was not hurt. Austin is insured, and the damage was relatively minimal. "They could probably live there. In fact, they were putting up plywood boards where we tore down the wall to get in," Pawloski said, adding fire fighters remained at the scene for about 2 hours. "The house was saved, but it did withstand...approximately \$15,000 in damage — building and contents.

"It was a good save. We saved the house. There was minimal damage," Pawloski said.

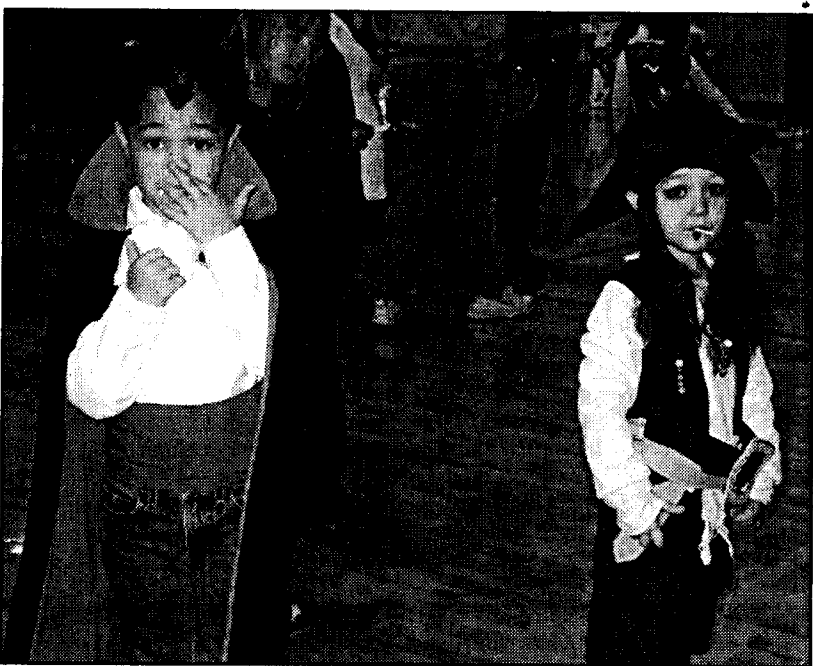
Although the call didn't stem from a chimney fire, Pawloski is encouraging residents to approach this heating season with extreme caution and care.

"Inspect woodburners, clean chimneys, make sure everything is up to snuff before the cold weather sets in," he said.

"I've got a feeling this winter's going to be bad," Pawloski confided. "With the fuel prices and the economy, people are going to be looking for 'alternative' energy sources. 'It's going to be scary.'"

Proposals focus on research, pot use

Thumb area voters will join their counterparts across Michigan in deciding a pair of statewide proposals involving medical marijuana use and stem cell research in the Tuesday, Nov. 4, general election.

Proposal 08-1 is a legislative initiative that would permit the use and cultivation of marijuana for specified medical conditions.

The proposal would:

• Permit physician-approved use of marijuana by registered patients with debilitating medical conditions, including cancer, glaucoma, HIV, AIDS, hepatitis C, MS and other conditions as approved by the Michigan Department of Community Health.

• Permit registered individuals to grow limited amounts of marijuana for qualifying patients in an enclosed, locked facility.

• Require the department of community health to establish an identification card system for patients qualified to use marijuana and individuals qualified to grow marijuana, and

• Permit registered and unregistered patients and primary caregivers to assert medical reasons for using marijuana as a defense against any prosecution involving marijuana.

The second proposal, labeled Proposal 08-2, would amend the state constitution to address human embryo and human embryonic stem cell research in Michigan.

The amendment would expand use of human embryos for any research permitted under federal law subject to the following limits - that the embryos are created for fertility treatment purposes, are not suitable for implantation or are in excess of clinical needs, would be discarded unless used for research, and were donated by the person seeking fertility treatment.

The proposal also prohibits stem cells from being taken from human embryos more than 14 days after cell division begins; prohibits any person from selling or purchasing human embryos for stem cell research; and prohibits state and local laws that prevent, restrict or discourage stem cell research, future therapies and cures.

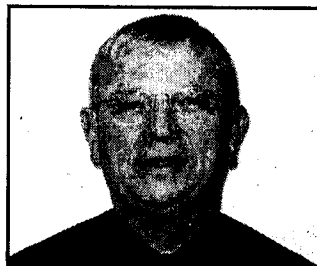

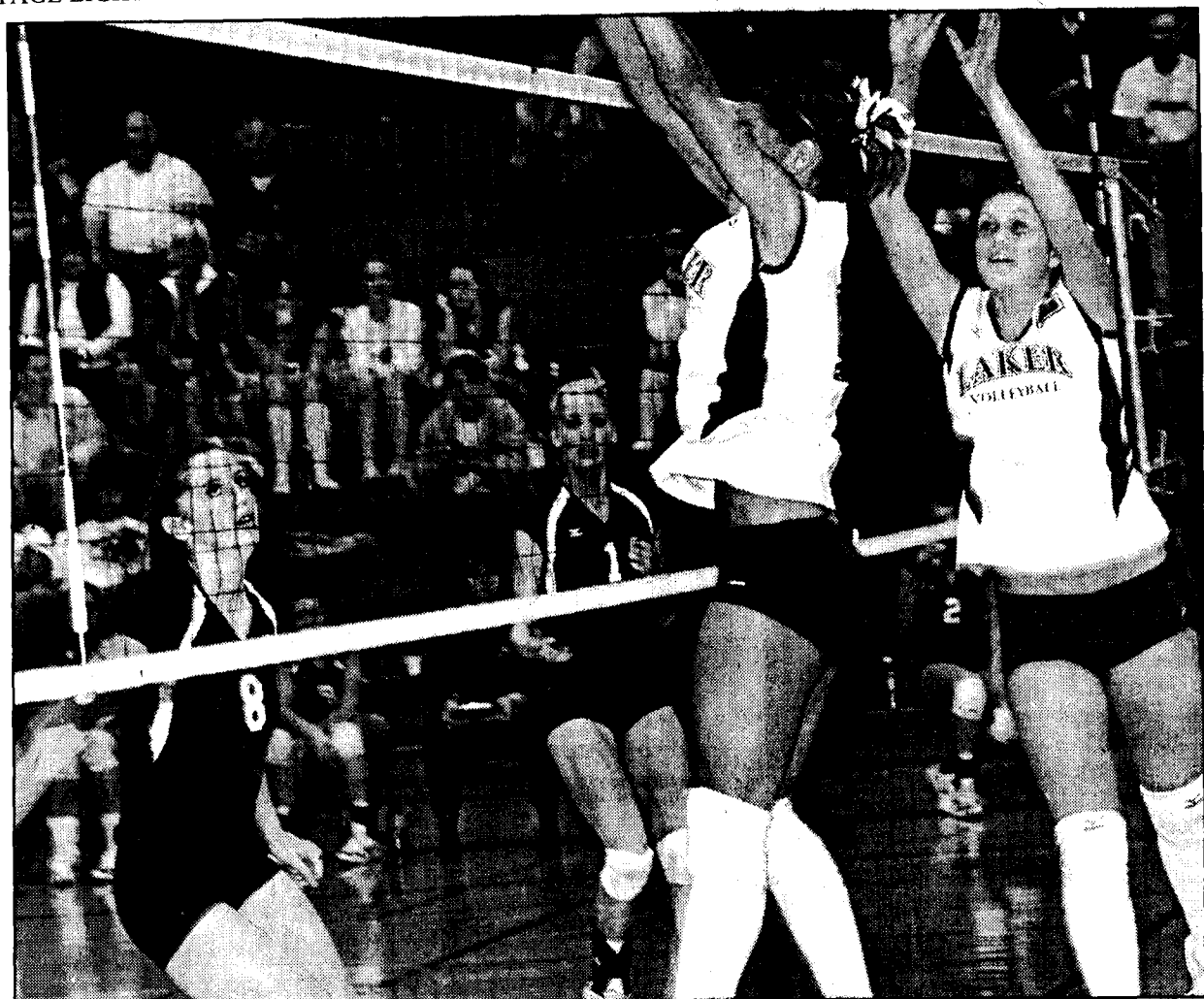

Utility companies warn of phone scams

DTE Energy and its Detroit Edison and MichCon subsidiaries are warning customers to watch out for telephone scams that are being used to obtain personal information about the utilities' customers.

"DTE Energy has warned customers in the past about con artists who pose as utility workers in order to gain access to homes and personal property," said Michael Lynch, DTE Energy's director of corporate security. "Now we're starting to see some new scams that utilize sophisticated telephone systems to fraudulently obtain personal information from our customers."

In a recent telephone scheme, some Detroit area residents received recorded phone messages, purportedly from DTE Energy, saying their utility bill was overdue and their electric service would be disconnected. When the residents called the toll-free "800" number provided on the message, they were prompted to enter their name, address and social security number. The callers were then informed that they had received the phone call in error, and that everything was fine.

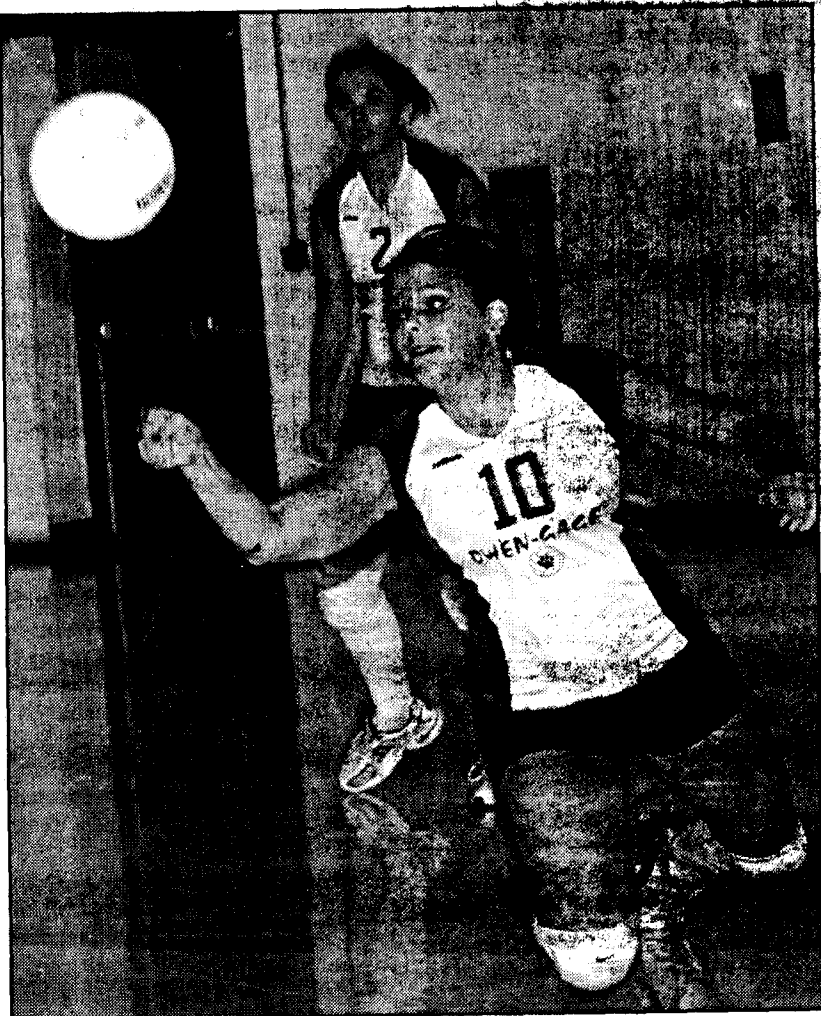
"This particular automated telephone system was very professional sounding, and even included various menu options to help callers address the alleged billing problem," Lynch said. "We were able to work with authorities to shut down this phone number, but we wouldn't be surprised to see a similar scam turn up again."

While DTE Energy does contact customers by phone for billing and marketing purposes, Lynch said the company never uses computerized telephone calls to obtain personal information from customers.

"Identity theft is a growing problem, and there are con artists out there who are always looking for new ways to victimize innocent people," Lynch said. "We want customers to know

that if they receive a phone call claiming to be from Detroit Edison or MichCon, and they want to verify the authenticity of the call, they should contact DTE Energy at (313) 477-4747."

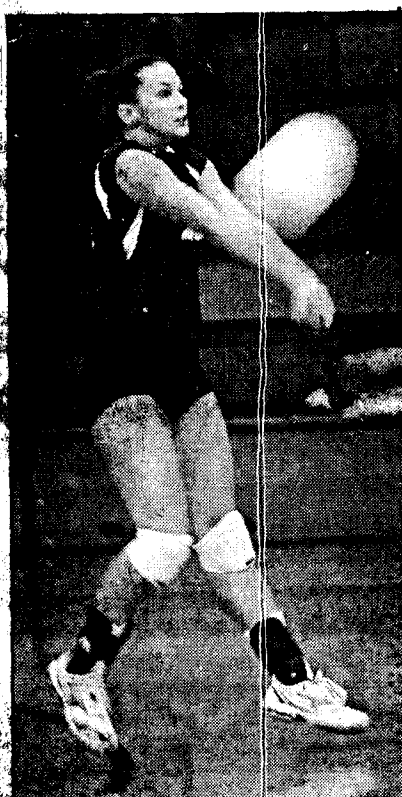
have run this year," Howard said. Adding, "It's nice to see this happening with districts approaching."

"The boys' squad has been in contention for a regional championship for the past 5 years and it finally paid off," Coach Amy Cuthrell said.

In the girls' field, Cass City just missed pulling off a Red Hawk sweep on the afternoon as they finished runner-up to Caro, 47-73. The complete team standings also had Vassar with 91, Essexville-Garber, 102, Bad Axe 108, Frankenmuth, 133, Reese, 166, Montrose, 215, Otisville, 223 and Birch Run 291.

Hawks were paced by a pair of top 10 finishers. Senior Jennica Richards placed 3rd with a time of 20:41, while freshman Ashley Potts recorded the 7th best time on the day among the ladies at 20:58.

Coach Cuthrell also had senior Brittany Loomis (12th place) hand in a time of 21:09, while freshman Jessa Prieskorn (13th place) was clocked in 21:13. Freshman Haley Wynn (48th place) added a time of 24:15 for the runners-up.

Cass City drops final gridiron test to Almont

Cass City closed out its 2008 gridiron season on a sour note Friday, bowing to playoff-bound host

Almont 42-21 in non-conference play. After 5 straight wins in their campaign, the Red Hawks finished at 5-4 on the year, squandering a golden opportunity to return to the Division 5 title chase after a one year absence. With the win, the Raiders improve to 7-2 overall.

Messing led the Red Hawk ground attack with 113 yards on 19 carries, while Newton added 106 yards on 20 totes.

Closing out their Red Hawk careers at Almont were seniors Gage Hardesty, Michael Howard, Josh Inbody, J.C. Knight, Tony Middaugh, Kevin Merchant, Cody Nye, Adam Osentoski, Steven Schotter, Tyler Tomlinson, Clark Walsh, Austin Babich, Varney, Messing and Newton.

"We have quite a few senior veterans on both squads so they know what they will be up against this weekend," she said. "Lukas was an all-state runner last year, so I'm eager to see him compete in this arena again."

If the Red Hawk boys' team hopes to finish in the top 10 at the Michigan International Speedway course, seniors Dewey Mabe and Ty Burk will play a major role. Mabe placed 5th at the Bad Axe regional with a time of 17:33, while Burk, with a time of 17:51, placed 6th.

"Dewey and Ty are conditioned to compete and do well in their final race," Cuthrell said.

Alex Varney and Clark Walsh completed the list of point winners for the champions Saturday. Varney completed the 5K run in 18:37 to place 17th and Walsh added a 21st place finish with his time of 18:47.

School officials: cuts a must next year

by the end of the next school year. The options, Wilson said, are to begin making cuts - to the tune of \$500,000 to \$600,000 - now or next year. "Certainly, that's not an appealing thought, but it's something I think we're going to have to look at as we move ahead," he added. Wilson did not propose specific cuts, but asked the finance committee to continue looking at ways to reduce spending and begin thinking about specific line items.

DWILESSON

Cass City High School students will be the first in Michigan to safely experience the virtual - and sobering - effects of drinking and then getting behind the wheel of a car, thanks to a specialized DWI (driving under the influence) simulator project slated for Nov. 21. Staff member Shari Bock reported the P.E.E.R.S. (Professionals Encouraging Educational Reform Statewide) organization will be setting up and operating the simulator, which incorporates virtual technology into a real automobile. The cost is \$2,500, but the Pinney Foundation didn't hesitate to cover the entire tab, she pointed out. During the project, Bock explained, students will have the opportunity to sit inside the car and experience the effects - reaction time and judgment on the road - of having ingested varying amounts of alcohol. The state-of-the-art car, which is locked into place and doesn't actually move - reacts based on programmed information such as number of drinks and the driver's sex and body type. At the end, the simulator displays blood alcohol level and every "infraction" committed while drinking and driving.

Selling a vehicle? Be careful

Selling a car through the classifieds or from your front yard are simple ways of disposing of an unwanted vehicle. But Secretary of State Terri Lynn Land reminds residents that handling the deal incorrectly could end with regrets, no sale or even lawsuits. "Buyers and sellers should work together to avoid headaches down the road," Land said. "Buyers need to make sure the vehicle title is valid and free of liens. Sellers want to know they're no longer liable for the vehicle. All parties can ensure a smooth transaction by understanding their rights and responsibilities under the law."

Land recommends that both the seller and buyer in private vehicle sales go together to a Secretary of State office within 15 days of the sale to have the seller's title transferred into the purchaser's name. That way, each party knows the title transfer has been done properly to avoid possible future legal problems. Michigan law makes owners responsible for any property damage or injuries caused by their vehicles, so ensuring the transfer happens correctly should be a priority for the seller.

If a joint visit isn't possible, then the seller must keep a record of the sale. The record may be a photocopy of both sides of the assigned title or a document that includes the name, address, driver's license number, and signature of the buyer, and also the vehicle's year, make, vehicle identification number, purchase price, and date of sale. The sale record must be kept for at least 18 months. All owners listed on the front of the title must sign off before it can be transferred. Additionally, the seller should fill out the odometer statement and check whether the vehicle's mileage is accurate or if it exceeds mechanical limits. If a lien against the vehicle is noted, the seller should get sign off from the lienholder or include a lien termination statement.

When giving a vehicle to a charity, donors should keep a record of the transaction just as if they sold the vehicle. As a general rule, the charity must have the vehicle's title put in its name unless it holds a used-vehicle dealer license.

At the office, the buyer will be charged \$15 for the transfer plus a 6 percent use tax calculated from the purchase price or fair retail value. A \$15 late fee is charged if the transfer is processed more than 15 days after the sale.

While not all students will be able to personally experience the simulator, Bock said, it will be a great experience for all of them because P.E.E.R.S. provides a monitor system that allows everyone to watch and follow each student's turn behind the wheel.

IN OTHER BUSINESS

In other business during the monthly meeting, the board:

*Accepted with regret the resignation of veteran physical education instructor Betsy Dillon after nearly 30 years of service to the district. Dillon is leaving at the end of this month to accept her new position as regional health education coordinator for the Tuscola Intermediate School District.

*Approved the hiring of Marnie Hacker to fill the newly created teaching position for a fourth section of kindergarten, approved by the board last month.

*Heard a brief report from staff member Linda Bailey regarding on-going efforts by the teaching staff to assess students' academic performance and maintain a proactive approach in assisting students who fall behind by intervening and helping them to meet proficiency standards.

The approach is working, according to Bailey, who cited student performance improvements among middle school students. In reading (fluency), for example, last year's seventh grade was 53 percent above the benchmark and now, as eighth graders, the same students are 66 percent above the benchmark. Bailey noted similar achievements by students in comprehension and math.

*Formed an ad hoc committee composed of board member Jim Veneziano, Randy Severance and Doug Lautner to review all school policies and compare them with those of neighboring districts to determine if revisions are needed or if there are areas of concern not currently addressed by an existing policy. Wilson has suggested paying a consulting firm \$3,000 to handle the task, but Trustee Michelle Biddinger suggested that the board conduct the review itself given the talk about making additional cuts in school spending.

*Approved the sale of a used sprinkler/pump previously used to water the football field.

*Adopted a resolution to establish an account number at Thumb Na-

tional Bank where wires or PayPal deposits can be directed when district assets are sold via the Internet.

*Met in executive session to discuss teacher contract negotiations.

Council designates program coordinator

During the regular monthly meeting Monday of the Cass City Village Council, officials authorized Village Manager Peter Cristiano as the designated coordinator for the Federal Surplus Assistance Program.

The Federal Surplus Assistance Program allows municipalities to purchase at reduced cost, and sometimes no cost, surplus items from the state and federal government.

Cristiano said from time to time special deals could be found on trucks, heavy equipment or almost anything that will help maximize services and leverage tax dollars for village residents.

While formally approving Cristiano as the authorized coordinator for accepting federal surplus property, the council will have the final say before purchasing any assets.

"To buy anything I'd have to come back to the council for approval," Cristiano said.

In other news during the brief 25-minute gathering, Cristiano reported that work on the collapsed Church Street storm sewer is nearing completion.

A 400' section, according to Cristiano, was entirely rebuilt, and additionally, a concrete floor was put in place finishing 60' beyond Seeger Street that should correct the water flooding problems at Church and Seeger Street.

Cristiano also reported that Ceramic Systems, Inc., 6201 Church Street, is making progress on their building, formerly known as the Nestle's building. A new DTE power plant is being put in place and the east end of the property is showing great improvement.

"Their plan is to have all the buildings enclosed and new roofs prior to winter. Congratulations to Eldor and

Ivan Herrmann for making an old eyesore into an eight-cow wedding," Cristiano said.

Cristiano concluded his manager's report citing many projects remain a work in progress including securing grants for an artist center to be located at 6544 Main Street, and roadwork related to the Dairy Farmers of America proposal at Doerr Road, M-81 and Division Street.

In routine business, the council also:

*Received and filed minutes from Oct. 14, 2008 meetings of the Downtown Development Authority and Economic Development Corporation.

*Reviewed and approved the minutes of the village council's regular meeting on Sept. 29th and a special meeting on Oct. 13, 2008.

*Accepted the financial statements ending Sept. 30, 2008 with a cash balance of \$1,702,295.

*Approved bills, which can be viewed at the village office, as presented.

State recognizes Tuscola Health Department effort

Concluding 5 years of work on the state strategic plan for tobacco prevention, Tobacco-Free Michigan (TFM) and the Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH) Tobacco Section recently recognized local contributions toward achievement of the plan.

The 5-year strategic plan for 2003-2008 correlates with the Healthy People 2010 Objectives laid out by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and is endorsed by the American Cancer Society, Great Lakes Division, the American Heart Association, Greater Midwest Affiliate, the American Lung Association of Michigan, MDCH, the Michigan Public Health Institute, TFM, and nearly 100 other state and local public health agencies and organizations.

"The progress made in the past 5 years in reducing the death and disease caused by tobacco use and secondhand smoke in Michigan is significant and laudable," stated Jim Harrington, chair of TFM. "The contributions of Tuscola County Health Department toward this success are recognized as a key part of the overall work throughout our state."

Statewide, some noteworthy accomplishments include determination of culturally appropriate methods of treating tobacco dependence, increasing numbers of counties and cities with smoke-free worksite policies, smoke-free campuses in 90 percent of Michigan's hospitals, smoke-free policies in 27 Michigan Housing Commissions, expansion of the MDCH Quitline, increasing numbers of smoke-free schools, colleges and universities, and an 18 percent reduction in illegal sales of tobacco products to Michigan youth.

Gretchen Tenbusch, Tuscola County Health Department health officer commented, "Tuscola County Health Department has made great strides in tobacco prevention, which is evident in our community, and demonstrated by the recognition from TFM and MDCH." Progress in Tuscola County includes several smoke-free schools, restaurants, businesses, parks and apartments, she noted.

"Although we have made great progress, much work remains. Tobacco use is the number one cause of preventable death in our state, and exposure to secondhand smoke claims the lives of over 2,000 Michigan residents each year. As a state, we should strongly commit to investing in tobacco prevention programming so that we can make further

progress over the next 5 years," said Russell Bush, M.D., medical director.

"We have a wonderful chance this year to make Michigan a smoke-free state through a bill that is currently in the Michigan House of Representatives. This is a great opportunity to improve the health of our communities."

Still time to get an absentee ballot

Secretary of State Terri Lynn Land reminds voters of the absentee ballot option in the upcoming November election.

"The absentee ballot option gives those who qualify the opportunity to participate in the election and to vote the ballot at their convenience," Land said. "You still have time to get an absentee ballot for the November election if you qualify, but the deadline is fast approaching. Simply contact your local clerk for more information."

As a registered voter, you may obtain an absentee ballot if you are:

- age 60 or older
- physically unable to attend the polls without the assistance of another
- expecting to be out of town on election day
- in jail awaiting arraignment or trial
- unable to attend the polls due to religious reasons
- appointed to work as an election inspector in a precinct outside of your precinct of residence.

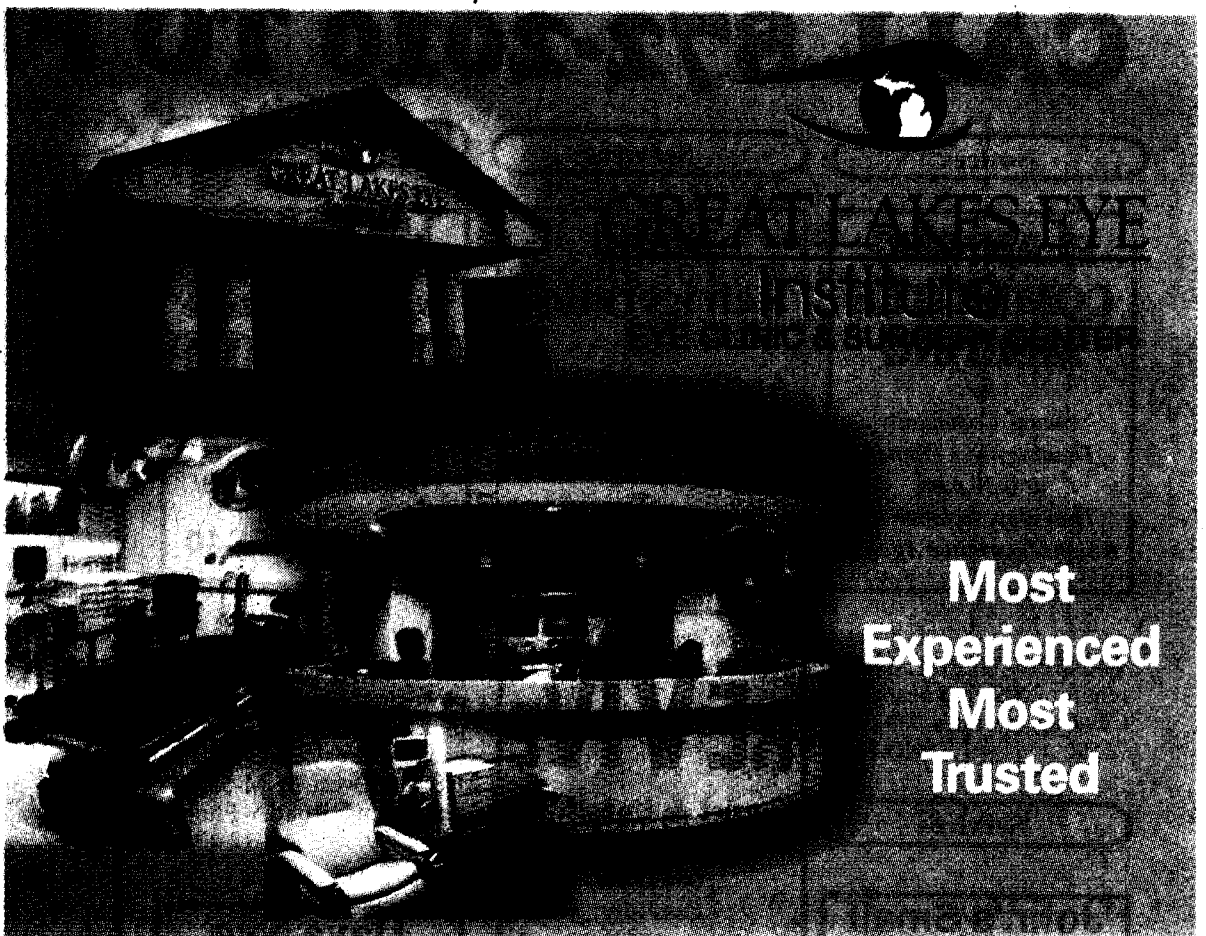
Voters who wish to receive their absentee ballot by mail have until 2 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 1 to submit their absentee ballot application to their city or township clerk. Voters must include their name, address and the qualifying reason for requesting the ballot. An absentee ballot application is available at any local clerk's office or online at www.Michigan.gov/vote. A request can also be submitted in a simple letter or on a postcard.

Registered voters may also visit their city or township clerk's office for an absentee ballot through 4 p.m. Monday, Nov. 3. Those who request a ballot in person on Nov. 3 must vote the ballot while in the clerk's office. Absentee ballots must be returned to the clerk's office by hand or by mail by 8 p.m. on election day. Emergency absentee ballots are available under certain conditions through 4 p.m. on election day.

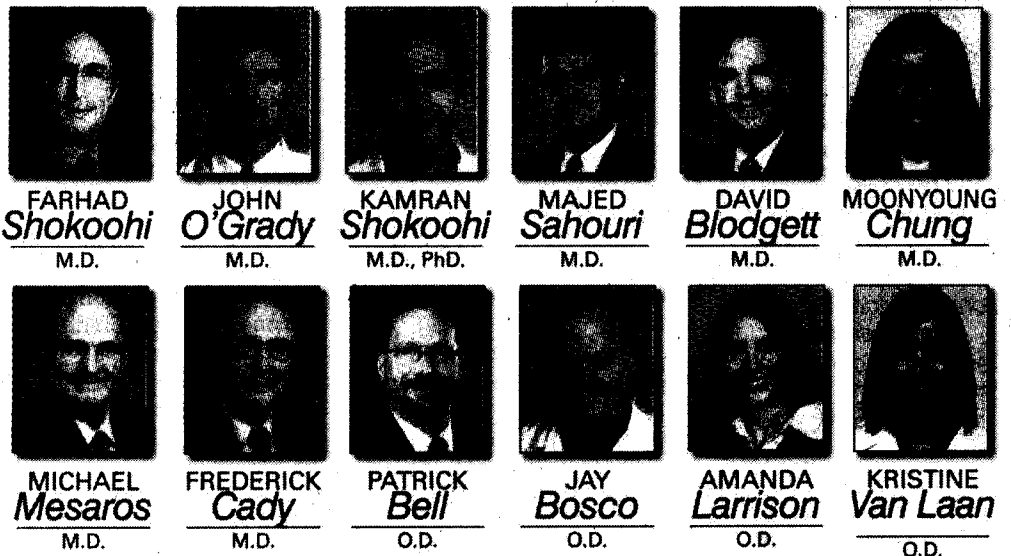
Voters should note that if they have registered to vote by mail or via a voter registration drive and have never voted in Michigan, they are not eligible to vote by absentee ballot in their first election. They must vote in person at their precinct instead. However, this restriction does not apply to voters who are age 60 or older, disabled or overseas.

Absentee voters should remember to sign the return envelope. If a voter receives assistance in preparing the ballot, the signature of the person providing the assistance must also be on the return envelope. Signed absentee ballots can only be returned to a clerk's office by the voter, a family member or person residing in the voter's household, a mail carrier or election official.
