O-G gearing up to go green

Owendale-Gagetown Area Schools will be installing a 35-foot wind turbine this summer.

The wind turbine will be an educational project for high school students and the community.

According to Matt Peters, the math teacher overseeing the project, the wind turbine is being funded by the Engineering Projects in Community Service (EPICS) high school program and the Convergence Education Foundation (CEF).

"I was new this past December, so the math teacher before me handed down this program to me and I think it's great," Peters said.

EPICS, founded by Purdue University, allows students to design the type of project they want to work on, Peters explained. He said this year's goal was to help the environment and decrease the school's energy use, while educating the community on ways to do the same.

"This project is sort of 2-fold," he said. "The wind turbine will introduce the community and public how to save money while using wind power. Also, the project is obviously good for the environment."

Peters said it was the students who choose to have a wind turbine built.

"I was pushing for solar panels, but it was the class who decided what we're going to do," he said.

With a class of 9 students, 3 of whom just graduated, the wind turbine meant a lot of studying and researching.

Steven Roemer, 18, was one of the recent graduates who worked on the project. He said that he is excited to see the wind turbine go up.

"It's pretty exciting. It seems like a long time ago when we first brain stormed ideas for what we were going to do," he said.

According to Roemer, the whole process was pretty intense.

"Initially, we didn't have a clue what we were going to do. But after a couple weeks of research, it came down to wind mills or solar panels. We picked wind mills. Huron County is the best place in the state to do it, so we figured why not? So we basically studied energy consumption, it was definitely a lot of mathematics," said the future Grace Bible College freshman.

Both Brion Dickens of Woodland Wind LLC and Bryan Chalou of B's Electric LLC have assisted in the project, according to Roemer. Dickens visited the class and talked about wind energy and Chalou will install the turbine.

CASS CITY HIGH SCHOOL has already undergone major construction since school got out. Council approves contract for trash pick-up

Cass City village residents can expect a modest increase on their next waste collection and disposal bill.

During a brief special meeting Monday the village council approved a 5-year contract with Richfield Equities, Flint, with options to extend the agreement for up to an additional 5 years.

Under the new contract, the cost per household pick-up is \$10.95, which includes recycling material collection. For the past year, the cost per household pick-up was \$10.65.

However, from June 2008 to February 2009 Richfield Equities was allowed to add a surcharge of \$1.65

Free summer lunch program now in third year in Cass City

Major renovation and equipment replacement projects have forced Cass City Public School officials to move their summer free lunch program from Campbell Elementary School to the middle school.

However, the program, now in its third year, will continue to operate as it has in the past.

The free lunches, offered to any child under the age of 19 years, kicked off Monday and will continue through Aug. 21, although the program will shut down during the week of June 24-July 4. Lunches are served from 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Shari Bock, food service director for the district, says the program is continuing to grow and now meets a need for dozens of students on a daily basis.

"The first year we averaged 40 to 50 (children) per day," Bock noted. "Last year we averaged 100 to 110, and the way the economy is going, I'm expecting this year's numbers to meet or exceed last year's."

The summer free lunch program is operated by the Cass City Public Schools' food service staff, "but the money for it - it's a federally-funded program," explained Bock, who said

the federal government reimburses the district on a per-meal basis.

"Each year they estimate a pre-payment for us. This year our pre-payment estimate is \$7,000," she continued, adding the up-front payment enables school officials to cover start-up costs without dipping into the general fund. The total reimbursement to the school is expected to total roughly \$10,000 this year.

According to Bock, the federal lunch program isn't a new concept.

"It's an old program. We were actually asked to look into it several years ago when Deford (Elementary) School was still open," she said. At the time, the percentage of students enrolled at the now-closed school who qualified for free or reduced lunches had reached 50 percent.

Barb Irrer will quilt for life. That is, she will put together a queen size quilt for Thumb National Bank in Cass City to be raffled off Sept. 13 as a fundraiser for Tuscola County Relay for Life.

In the past few years, Thumb National Bank has sponsored various fundraisers for Relay for Life, according to Cindy Kruse, vice-president and branch manager.

"For years we sold beanie babies, and those sold very well. We've also done bake sales, sold hotdogs, strawberry shortcake, and we have even made and sold cookbooks twice. But this year, we wanted to do something different. I knew Barb could quilt, and so I asked her if she would do it, and 2 days later, she already has material and some cutting done," she said.

Over the past few years, Thumb National Bank in Cass City, along with the other 4 branches located in Cassville, Bay City and Pigeon, has raised more than \$35,000 for Relay for Life.

"We hope this quilt will help us continue to raise money for the cause," Kruse said.

Irrer, assistant vice president at the bank, started on the quilt June 5 and

hopes to have it done by July 1.

"If I wanted, I could really get the whole thing done in a weekend. When Cindy asked me to do this, I didn't think it was a big deal. I really enjoy quilting and I'm glad to contribute," Irrer said. "Quilting is such a passion for me. It is an addictive hobby."

According to Kruse, the bank will keep photos of the quilt in the lobby so people can watch its progress.

"We also plan on e-mailing the pictures to our other branches so people there can purchase tickets too," she said. "Raffle tickets are \$5 each and will be available at all 5 Thumb National Bank locations. People don't have to be present at the Relay for Life to win the quilt."

The quilt will be made using a "Just Can't Cut It" pattern, according to Irrer.

"I think the design is really simple and easy. It uses 6 different kinds of fabrics and is made up of a lot of different squares. I'm using a lot of brown because it is a neutral color that goes well with a lot of things," she said. "If we have extra fabric, I'll even make a couple throw pillows to go with it."

For Irrer, deciding on what fabrics to use was a difficult task.

"I went into Sisters in Quilting in Marlette and there is just so much to

choose from. Sometimes I think it's really neat to see the types of combinations people come up with," she said.

Irrer said she has cross stitched since she was in high school, but has only quilted for about a year now.

"I started taking quilting lessons about a year ago. We meet every Tuesday and it really is a comforting hobby," she said. "A friend's husband passed away and quilting really has helped her out a lot."

A lot of the bank's customers like to bring in their quilts to show off their work, according to Kruse.

"We are like a family here and everyone has lost someone they know to cancer. So it really is nice when people just like to come in and show us what they do and then support our causes. And quilting is such a cool thing. They make good gifts and people can treasure them forever," she said.

Similarly, Irrer said she believes what she is doing is for a good cause. "Quilting is a way to express yourself and if I can help out while doing it, then great," she said.

The bank hopes to sell at least 200 tickets for the quilt. Later in the summer, Thumb National Bank will also be selling luminaries for Relay for Life at \$10 each.

Tuscola Co. has 2 cases of swine flu

Tuscola County Health Department officials, who are continuing to monitor cases of the Novel influenza A (H1N1), or "swine flu", say 2 cases have been confirmed in Tuscola County.

"The 2 cases are recovering and are not hospitalized," said Ann Hepfer, R.N., Tuscola County Health Department.

"The symptoms of swine are similar to the symptoms of regular seasonal flu and include fever, cough, sore throat, body aches, headache, chills and fatigue," Hepfer noted, adding anyone who develops those symptoms should see their physician.

"There is no vaccine available right now to protect against swine flu, but we are hopeful that there will be a vaccine (in) the fall," she said.

Analyze your energy use

DTE Energy's free online program, MyEnergy Analyzer, helps customers evaluate their energy use and offers customized recommendations on how they can lower their energy bills. MyEnergy Analyzer is available at my.dteenergy.com.

Air conditioning

Set the air conditioner's thermostat at the highest comfortable setting. When leaving home for more than five hours, raise the thermostat five to 10 degrees. Raising the thermostat just a couple degrees can cut cooling costs by as much as five percent.

Regular maintenance is important to operating air conditioners efficiently. Check filters at least once a month. Dirty filters cause air conditioners to work harder and use more energy. Many filters can be removed, washed and dried, and reinstalled. Check the owner's manual or contact the manufacturer for more information.

Keep air conditioning units free of obstructions, inside and out, so air can flow freely. Outdoor units should be free of bushes, and leaf and grass debris. Indoors, move furniture and

draperies to prevent blocking window units, vents and air returns.

Position window air conditioners on the shaded side of the house, away from direct sunlight. Window units generally are not designed to cool more than one room. Close the doors leading to uncooled parts of the house for more efficient cooling.

In homes with central air conditioning, leave room doors and air registers open so the system can operate effectively.

Fans

Make sure ceiling fan blades rotate clockwise in the summer months to draw cooler air up from the floor.

A window fan in an apartment or one-story home should be put in a window on the warmest side of the structure; in a two-story home, put it in an upstairs window. Fans draw cooler air inside during the night and circulate air during the day. Make sure draperies are secured away from the fan for better air circulation and safety.

Prevent heat build-up in the attic by opening attic vents and making sure any lower vents are not blocked. A cooler attic benefits the living area below. An exhaust fan or whole-house fan mounted in the attic will pull hot air out of the attic and living areas and draw cooler air in.

Ubly motorist hurt in one-vehicle crash

Sanilac County Sheriff's deputies say a medical condition caused an Ubly area motorist to leave Ubly Road and hit a front porch early last week.

The driver, 77-year-old Michael Hall, suffered minor injuries and was transported by Sanilac Ambulance to McKenzie Memorial Hospital for treatment.

Lt. Robert Willis said the accident was reported June 8 at about 2:25 p.m. The investigation revealed Hall had been southbound on Ubly Road near Urban Road in Moore Township when he left the roadway.

Both the Marlette Township Fire Department and Sanilac EMS assisted deputies at the scene, Willis said.

Beach closings on the rise



It's hard to produce a column that has relevancy to readers of my age group and also to the rest of the readers. The trouble that I have is that current events also recall similar problems that occurred generations earlier.

That was the first reaction to the headline in Friday's Bay City Times "2 beaches first to close". One was Wenona Beach, Bay City, and the other South Linwood Beach. They were closed briefly because of E. coli and were open again as this was written.

While the condition of our Great Lakes is important and of interest to all Michigianians, previously the condition of the beaches was an effective barrier to excessive use. Before anyone heard about E. coli, home for me through 1940 was Pinconning. We often slipped out to the bay, but not to go swimming. The beach was loaded with weeds until you got past the large sandbar. When we wanted to swim near home we headed for Brissette Beach, about a dozen miles from Pinconning. We went there because of the sugar sand beach not available elsewhere in the area. Few went to Wenona Beach to swim. It was headquarters for a popular nightclub and a small carnival.

That's all changed today, of course. The bulging population has been a problem for landowners and I wouldn't be surprised if the beach was not the pristine way that it once was. It's just a guess because the easy access we enjoyed became privately owned and not available for general use.

The number of days that Michigan beaches have been closed or closed by contamination has increased by 60 percent, from 124 to 198 days.

Beaches may be closed when water samples exceed 300 colonies of E. coli per 100 milliliters.

The testing is a step in the right direction, but there's plenty of work left to do. Cleaning the Great Lakes and tributaries has to be a priority and that includes keeping the giant carp out by beefing up a barrier canal. We don't

want one to jump into our boat and smash it.

These comments are general reactions to some of the problems we face and they are likely to grow along with the population, despite our best efforts.

The years gone by

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The back forty

I got a kick out of a newspaper story about the minimalist lifestyle. The news feature describes "minimalists" as people who reject extraneous objects and clutter. They keep things simple and try to minimize the amount of "stuff" in their homes.

The first example mentioned is a man and wife who live in a 4,200 square-foot home that is nearly void of furniture. These folks decided to keep their house as open and simple as possible by minimizing the furniture.

Their little girl runs from room to room without crashing into anything. She could probably ride a bicycle through there if she wanted to.

This makes perfect sense to me. If I had a house that big, I couldn't afford any furniture, either.

Apparently the minimalist philosophy isn't about size or cost. It's more about how many things you have. If these folks had 2 little houses, that would be extravagant.

I was attracted to this story because I've always considered myself a minimalist type of person. I have very little stuff in my house or my life.

Nearly everything I have is totally necessary and justifiable. All of the "stuff" around here belongs to my wife.

The story's second example is two men who share a Victorian home in Chicago. We'll call them Frank and Jim.

The house seems very uncluttered, but Frank says he has to work hard to keep the piles down. Still, the story's author says she wouldn't have noticed the small stack of magazines and cat

alogs on the floor in the study if Frank hadn't pointed them out.

(I'll bet you anything Jim put them there.)

The third example is a man and wife who operate an architecture and design business. These folks are expecting a baby this fall, so their home has "the feeling of movement and beginnings."

That's kind of scary it seems to me. Anytime my house gets the feeling of movement, I'll be looking for an insurance policy.

The owner of the design business is quoted as saying, "I tend to think that physical minimalism that tends to do with design or environment could be different than a lifestyle or a meta-physical process."

"I think you can have a very elaborate or encumbered life in the sense of the things that you do or the kinds of involvement you have socially, intellectually, and still be in an environment that provides a relief from that kind of elaboration." (Boy, he said a mouthful there, didn't he?)

I'm reminded of a man in Texas who responded to a letter his son brought home from school. The letter was written by the school's superintendent and contained a lot of educational jargon and high-sounding phrases describing what was being accomplished.

The boy's father felt compelled to write back. "I have 2 college degrees and speak three languages," he wrote.

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Michigan's Quit Line is back up and running

The Michigan Tobacco Quit Line phones are back in service after they were mostly shut down for nearly 3 months due to a high volume of calls and limited funding.

Michiganians who want to take advantage of the program and stop smoking or quit using other tobacco products can call the service at 1-800-QUIT-NOW (784-8669), which is available 24-hours-a-day, 7-days-a-week.

"We are glad to have the quit line back in operation earlier than expected," said Dr. Greg Holzman, chief medical executive for the Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH). "The incredible amount of calls before the quit line shut down shows us the importance of the service. We know at least 70 percent of smokers want to quit, and the Michigan Tobacco Quit Line is here to help."

Most of the quit-line services shut down in mid-March after an unprecedented amount of callers - more than 65,000 in 5 days and 92,000 in March - flooded the lines when nicotine replacement products, including nicotine patches, gum and lozenges were offered free of charge to callers.

The high number of callers caused a budget constraint, forcing the quit line to serve only Medicaid beneficiaries. The quit line was to resume in October, however, the line opened earlier after funding became available for the program. The nicotine replacement products currently are not offered to callers.

When Michigan residents enroll with the quit line, they will receive a personal coach who will assist them in setting a quit date and making an individualized quit plan. The personal coach also will provide on-going support with up to 5 telephone coaching sessions around the caller's quit date, allowing the caller to gain confidence and retain motivation throughout the process of quitting.

The Michigan Tobacco Quit Line has received tens of thousands of calls since it was launched in October 2003. The quit line offers both English and Spanish-speaking counselors as well as interpretive services for a wide variety of languages.



Thumb Thimbles Guild alive, well in Kingston

Needles, thread and the Thumb Thimbles Quilt Guild — that’s what you’ll find on the first Thursday of every month at the United Methodist Church in Kingston.

Faye Stoll, president of the guild, said it has been around for about 22 years.

“I started quilting 40 years ago. One day I opened a quilt shop called Grainery Quilt Works in ‘84 and ran it for 5 years. I was so busy with the business stuff that I was just so busy, I couldn’t do what I wanted to do,” she said. “I had so many customers at the shop, I decided to start the guild. At the time we had 16 members from all over the Thumb area. One time we had up to 42 members.”

Now, the guild has 19 members and meets once a month at the church in Kingston.

“We have a show-and-tell and offer each other advice on our quilts,” Stoll said.

According to Rhonda Benjamin, a member of the guild for a little over 10 years, the group is a “learning guild”.

“We each have a specific pattern to do each month. It allows us to come out of our comfort zones and try something we haven’t done before,” she said.

A learning guild is when a bunch of the members get together to encourage each other, Stoll explained.

“We are a learning group. We are not like a lot of guilds that do charity quilts. A lot of our ladies keep their

quilts or go on to sell them or give them away, but our guild is not involved with any charity,” she said.

For Benjamin, being in the guild helps hone her quilting skills.

“We are all at different levels, but we help each other out. We usually don’t sew at our meetings, we have show-and-tells and talk about what we are doing. If we have any concerns, this is where we bring them up and everyone else tries to help with their ideas and suggestions,” she said.

Similarly, Stoll said she believes the guild is beneficial for all of its members.

“The more quilts they see, the more they do and the better they get,” she said.

The Thumb Thimbles Quilt Guild is an open group accepting more members.

“We have yearly dues of \$20 from all our members. We give money to the church for letting us use their space and then we use the money to pay for the postage of our newsletters that we send out a week before our meeting,” Stoll said.

According to Benjamin, each month the ladies have a different block to do.

“We have a different block to do. We all do the same one and each month someone wins a quilt,” she said.

For example, for the month of June, each member had to do a “Crows Nest”, Benjamin explained.

“We all have to use the same designs and the same 2 main colors and then we can add our own personal fabrics,” she said.

Benjamin said she plans to remain in the guild. She said all the members

have a connection.

“We all are here together for our quilting, it is what brings us together. Plus, this is my thing and I enjoy it,” she said.

Stoll said her favorite part of quilting is picking and choosing the different fabrics.

“Sometimes a quilt will only use 2 different fabrics, other times it could have 100 different fabrics,” she noted.

According to Stoll, each lady uses a sewing technique of her own choice.

“I have some members who use a sewing machine and others who will piece by hand. It used to be frowned upon for those who would use the sewing machine, but now there are so many international quilt organizations that give big cash prizes to machine made quilts,” she explained.


Along with monthly projects, the guild has special events at some of its monthly meetings.

In April, the guild has a “Bed Turning.” According to Benjamin, this is where the quilts are draped over a bed and someone narrates about the pattern and then ladies will carry the quilt around the room. The guild also has a picnic potluck meeting in August.

“It’s just nice to have a group for when we all have a problem. We can go to each other for advice on our quilts,” Stoll said.

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

However, she noted, school officials didn't feel they could get enough students from other areas of the district to take advantage of the program in Deford due to transportation issues.

"And then Campbell hit that (50-percent mark) 3 years ago and we were asked to look at it again."

The program offers students a well-balanced meal, as school officials must follow the same nutrition guidelines as during the regular school

year. The menu varies, featuring items such as chicken sandwiches, hotdogs, pizza and cheeseburgers along with fresh fruits and vegetables and milk.

These days, more and more students are taking advantage of the meals, a trend that doesn't surprise Bock, given the increasing number of families that are struggling with job losses and other economic challenges.

"When I started 9 years ago, we were 32 percent (of students eligible for free or reduced meals) district-wide, and now we're 52 percent district-wide, so it's growing quickly," she said. "And most of that increase has been in the last 2 or 3 years."

The goal of the free summer lunch program, Bock said, is "just to feed the hungry children - to make sure kids are fed during the summer. To do our best to make sure Cass City kids aren't going hungry."

"That's what our hope is, and judging by the kids that are coming in, we are helping them," she added. "It also introduces them to the cafeteria and the staff, and then we get to see their smiling faces during the (school) year."

With average wind speed, the wind turbine should be able to produce about 16 kilowatt hours of electricity per day.

"Although the money that the district will save from the wind turbine will be beneficial, we are really doing this for educational purposes," Peters said.

He noted that Delta College plans to start offering degree options in wind turbine maintenance.

"I really believe this career is going to be the next big thing. In the next 10 years, I think this will hopefully take off and it will be nice to have exposed these students to the wind turbine now," he said.

Once it is put up, the wind turbine will be able to be taken down for inspection.

"This will give students a chance to get a first-hand look at this exciting technology," he said. "Instead of reading about it, they will be able to see one right in their back yard, and I think that's pretty cool."

Peters said next year he isn't sure what the school will do.

"I'd like to see us put up solar panels," he said. "Solar panels are like what you see on calculators that use the sunshine to run. They convert sunlight into energy, except these solar panels would be much larger, on a much bigger scale."

Elkton-Pigeon-Bay Port Schools is the only other K-12 school district in the Thumb to have a wind turbine project. Other K-12 districts in Huron County are participating in their own EPICS projects.

because of the price spike in the cost of fuel, bringing the cost per household to \$12.30.

Under the newly negotiated contract, the benchmark price of fuel is set at \$2.75 per gallon. Currently, Richfield Equities is paying \$2.26 a gallon for its diesel fuel. Therefore, before any consideration of added costs, diesel fuel must rise from \$2.26 to \$3.25 per gallon.

Council member Jenny Zawilinski said that for the past 5 years the village's experience with Richfield Equities has been excellent. "We believe that it is in the village's best interest to continue receiving services from Richfield."

The new 5-year contract begins this month and continues until May 31, 2014.

Turning to other matters, the council also approved a bid from Marlette Roofing to replace the roof on the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) Control Building and approved a resolution authorizing Village Manager Peter Cristiano and Village Clerk Nanette Walsh to sign a 5-year contract with the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT).

Zawilinski reported that the roofs on buildings at the wastewater treatment plant are now over 27 years old. A new roof was installed on the Digester Building in 2007 and bids for a new roof on the Control Building were open on June 10.

Four bids were received ranging from Marlette Roofing's low of \$16,400 to a high of \$21,749. Marlette Roofing will supply a full 15-year warranty on the replacement roof.

WWTP Supt. Rick Mohr, in a report to the council, wrote that, "We have had some experience with Marlette Roofing in the past. They put the roof on the small addition we had built over the bar screen room in 2006. They did a good job on that project. I am therefore recommending that Marlette Roofing be awarded the contract to re-roof the Control Building."

MDOT CONTRACT

Under the new agreement with MDOT, which runs from Oct. 1, 2009 to Sept. 30, 2014, village employees will maintain M-81 running through the village limits. As in years past, this will allow repair work to be performed in a timely manner versus the MDOT schedule.

The current MDOT contract with the village for maintenance work done on M-81 is \$18,000 per year. The amount authorized for repairs under the new contract is not to exceed \$25,000 yearly.

FIREWORK DISPLAY

On the recommendation of council member Jim Heiser, the council approved the fireworks display permit for Schramke Fire Equipment, Saginaw, for July 3 and 4, 2009.

Heiser said that Schramke Fire

Equipment has met the requirements for the approval of the permit. The display will be held in the same area as previous years for Cass City's Fourth of July Festival.

In other business, the council approved to pay bills as presented and approved the financial statements showing a cash balance of \$1,083,408 before holding a "Committee of the Whole" gathering when the Tuscola Area Airport Authority allocation, tax abatements and cityhood discussions were aired.
