Over the course of years it's become clear to me that there are 3 essential substances that no home should be without. If you have a ready supply of these you're likely to be able to get yourself out of any jam, at least temporarily.

All you really need is duct tape, white vinegar and WD40.

We should put football coaching issue to rest

The turmoil surrounding a "changing of the guard", so to speak, in the Cass City High School varsity football program has finally settled down.

Now, we're hoping that everyone - parents and other supporters, along with student athletes - can get back to the business of preparing for another season next fall without any more drama.

As has been reported on the pages of this newspaper in recent weeks, 10-year varsity Coach Scott Cuthrell was dismissed from the program last fall, and school officials subsequently appointed a 7-member panel to consider candidates to replace him in an effort to take the program "to the next level".

From an initial list of 10 applicants, the committee interviewed 3 finalists, including Cuthrell, and, on a split vote, recommended retaining Cuthrell. Some members of the panel then pushed to have the committee disbanded and start the process all over again, a recommendation that school Supt. Ron Wilson rejected, and rightly so.

However, members of the Cass City Board of Education rejected the committee's recommendation, with a majority of trustees refusing to sign his contract.

In our opinion, school officials should never have appointed a committee to select a new coach. After all, the district pays an athletic director to hire coaches. It's a process that has worked well in the past and, hopefully, will be followed in the future.

We believe the administration had good intentions by wanting to include community input in the decision, but the experiment clearly failed, especially when Cuthrell Don't believe President was allowed to interview for the position after being dis-

I am writing this in frustration to an insurance claim that I have with UPS

When one pays the fee for insurance and the article is damaged in transit, shouldn't the mover of the article, UPS, pay the claim? I guess not!

I guess it is like so many other situations in our society today; if you are big enough, or wealthy enough, you can do just about anything you want, and walk away without paying the consequences.

I was hunting with a guide by Silver City, New Mexico. I took an animal and had the taxidermy work done there by the guide. I have done this in the past; it solves problems going through customs and airport security. When the item arrived in Owendale, it had been damaged.

Vassar official embezzlement

A city of Vassar official was formalcharges last week in Tuscola County Circuit Court.

"Following a detailed and lengthy investigation, Nicole Lee Licavoli was charged by the office of the County Tuscola Prosecuting Attorney in a 21-count complaint with the offenses of embezzlement public official," said Prosecutor Mark E. Reene, who noted the offense is a felony punishable by up to 10 years in prison.

Reene said the offenses alleged took place between July 2008 and December 2009, when Licavoli was employed as Vassar's deputy clerk.

"An audit conducted by the city revealed numerous discrepancies involving payments for sewer/water bills, which are the focus of the case," Reene said. "Ms. Licavoli's employment has been terminated by the city.'

During her arraignment, the court set a personal recognizance bond of \$25,000 for Licavoli, whose next appearance will be a preliminary examination slated for Monday at 8:30 a.m.

In approximately 10 days the winter Olympics start, and around the school students are beginning to talk about which events they will or won't watch.

Day 3 will include a boat ride through the Tortuguero canals, where the group will see howler monkeys, toucans and caimans as they travel through Tortuguero National Park.

The next day they will transfer to the Sarapiqui Region, located between Braulio Carrillo and Tortuguero national parks at the foot of the Cordillera Central mountain range. Guides will also take the students on a tour of the Sarapiqui Canopy, which features unique trails, suspension foot bridges and zip lines that unveil one of the planet's most fascinating ecological systems from a unique perspective — the tops of the trees.
