Cutting \$525,000 focus of special school board meet

The process of trimming more than a half-million dollars from the Cass City Public Schools' 2010-11 budget will continue next week when the board of education will meet in special session to hear the recommendations of 3 ad hoc committees.

The meeting is scheduled for Monday, starting at 7:30 p.m. in the Cass City High School cafeteria.

The upcoming session was posted as a special meeting because there will be a quorum of board members present. However, it will actually be a board work session, according to school Supt. Ron Wilson.

The ad hoc committees, composed of school officials, board members and other citizens in the community, were appointed last fall in an effort to "explore creative, cost-saving ideas," Wilson said. He explained the groups were charged with recommending possible ways to tighten the district's financial belt in the areas of staffing, transportation and extracurricular activities, including athletics. The appointment of those committees was in line with the school board's updated goals for the coming year.

The goal, Wilson pointed out, is to eliminate roughly \$525,000 from the district's budget next year without having to further dip into fund equity, which is projected to total \$850,000 — about 5 1/2 percent of at the end of this school year, June 30. The \$525,000 figure is based on the state's current projection that it will reduce school funding next year by about \$432 per pupil.

"That's assuming we don't have any additional loss of students," He said the committees will each added Wilson, who estimated the Cass City Schools' enrollment has declined by some 450 pupils over the past 5 years.

Regardless, Wilson indicated it isn't likely school officials will be able to avoid additional staffing cuts next year, given the fact that the bulk of the district's budget goes to personnel expenses.

"It's going to be difficult to reduce a half-million dollars without impacting jobs," he said, the board may consider eliminating 5 or 6 jobs in the district, "and part of that would come in teaching just because of the continuing decline in enrollment.

That estimate doesn't even take into account 8 positions — 3 teaching jobs and 5 aide positions — that will year only by federal stimulus dollars.

The charges stem from allegations that Fritz had multiple sexual encounters in 2005-06 with a 14year-old who was attending Owen-Gage High School at the time.

Michigan State Police detectives are investigating the alleged sex crimes along with a possible missing infant allegedly fathered by the suspect with the victim. Prosecutors say they believe the victim buried the remains of the baby, but Fritz has denied having any knowledge of a child being born.

According to testimony entered into the record during a pre-preliminary examination, Fritz has admitted to having sex with the teen on multiple occasions. At the time, he was 22 years old.

Fritz is free on bond, which was set at \$50,000 (10 percent cash).

MSU Extension officials in Tuscola County say the Deford Dazzlers is an example of a bold goal 4-H officials have undertaken to engage one million new young people across the country in science, engineering and technology programs by the year 2013.

According to a study by Tufts University, youth who participate in 4-H are more likely to get better grades in school, seek out science classes, see themselves going to college, and contribute positively in their communities. In addition, 4-H youth have been shown to better resist peer pressure and are less likely to engage in risky behaviors. For the Hansens, organizing the new club has been a labor of love.

"My husband and I have always been — I guess the best way to put it is, we're science geeks," commented Patricia Hansen, a Deford native. "We just love science. We've always done really interesting hands-on science projects with our kids."

It can be difficult to feel generous during this time of year as residents are completing or at least thinking about taking care of filing their tax information by the April 15 deadline.

However, we encourage area residents who are able to make a charitable contribution to do just that while filling out their Michigan taxes, and to name the United Way of Tuscola County as the recipient.

Remembering the county's United Way on your tax return is simple, and you can rest assured your donation will return to this area in one form or another.

Here's how to donate: when completing the 2009 Michigan income tax form "#MI 4642", check box #11 — United Way Fund, and the contribution will be distributed by the Michigan Association of United Ways to the United Way agency serving the donor's zip code area.

This year's United Way campaign was kicked off last fall and will continue over the next few months. And while officials report they've nearly reached the 2009-10 mail-in campaign goal of \$10,000, their efforts in recent years have fallen short of expectations due to economic forces beyond their control.

According to Jim Heiser, director of operations for the United Way of Tuscola County, the area agency managed to collect just under \$60,000 during the 2008-09 campaign. Heiser indicated he was pleased with the result, given the tough times Michigan residents continue to face and likely will for some time.

"It just shows that when there's a need, the community steps up and makes it happen," Heiser said. "We've been very fortunate."

The young man grabbed a 200-pound sheep under the chin with one hand and with the other hand on the ewe's haunches rolled her into a sitting position. Then the shearer bent over the animal removing the fleece with long smooth strokes of the shears. I couldn't help but think, "that must be a nasty job.'

I have shorn sheep myself, but I tried to allot plenty of time for shearing and two days for recovery. This man was doing one every couple of minutes!

He was a big strapping boy from Wyoming, who I later learned was attending a nearby college. He had been shearing for several years and obviously knew his business.

Still, I think we all understand what a smelly and thankless task shearing sheep must be. It's not like being a people-barber where folks sit in the chair, and say "thanks" on their way out.

When you shear sheep you have to drag them in, throw them down; and then they "bah" in your face and wet on your boot on the way out. It's a nasty job.

The only reason I can see for anyone to take up the shearing profession is the promise of hard cash. And if you want to make money you have to be good at it.

So it seemed obvious to me that a strong, intelligent young man such as this was shearing sheep to help pay college expenses. He was probably studying to be a veterinarian, or possibly a pharmacist. So I asked him what he was majoring in, and he said he was studying to be a farrier.

Now, I think you understand what we are up against here. This is a big, intelligent young man who is attending community college to prepare himself for a profession so he can quit shearing sheep. And he is studying to be a horse-shoer!

I would just like to ask, if you have never shorn sheep, have you ever shod horses?

If you think sheep are a thankless lot, just consider the satisfaction one can receive from holding up a horse. That's what a farrier does you know - he stands under a horse with one hoof on his knee, and the horse leans on him in order to rest the other three legs.

When the horse gets tired of leaning, he jumps around a little to see if the farrier has good footing. All of this time the owner stands by and talks. No matter how fast the shoer pounds he can still hear the owner talking.

When the farrier has nailed shoes on all four hooves, the horse simply snickers and walks off as bowlegged as he ever was. Then the owner blames the farrier for not using some special shoes that would make the old nag walk straight.

At least when you shear sheep you don't get flak from the owner. All the sheep man wants is the wool off those sheep, and he doesn't care how you get it.

So I think we can see the situation I'm describing here as a glaring example of the major problem with higher education in this country. Here we have a young man who is shearing sheep to make enough money to go to college and become a horseshoer.

Certainly it's time for concerned parents to ask, "When will our colleges find a way to teach these kids some common sense?"

So, why consider a donation?

It's simple: Cass City area residents benefit from the United Way via a variety of funded services and activities provided by groups such as the Lake Huron Area Council - Boy Scouts of America, Mitten Bay Girl Scout Council and Rawson Memorial District Library.

The list of groups that benefit from the county United Way is impressive — American Association of University Women, the American Red Cross, Cass City Literacy Council, the Human Development Commission's (HDC) Foster Grandparent Program, HDC Generations Enrichment Program, the Thumb Area Assault Crisis Center, Tuscola County MSU Extension 4-H programs, youth activity scholarships, etc.

If that isn't enough, United Way volunteers along with some helpers at Erla's Food Center distributed more than 60 baskets of food to those in need during the holiday season, a gift made possible through a \$5,000 grant from Bank of America. Money left over from the project was then donated to food banks in the county.

The point is, United Way of Tuscola County officials are involved because they understand the importance of community service and are willing to do their part for no more than the satisfaction of helping out their neighbors.

The least the rest of us can do is send them a few dollars that will ultimately return to the community and, directly or indirectly, make life just a little bit better for everyone.

It's still not too late to vaccinate

When people get vaccinated, they help their community by preventing the spread of the flu virus. If enough Americans get vaccinated, it could lessen the impact or even prevent a third wave of H1N1 flu.

The Tuscola County Health Department is reporting that less than 20 percent of Tuscola County residents have been vaccinated against the H1N1 virus. There is still time to be vaccinated and there is no shortage of vaccine.

"Influenza is unpredictable and we do not know the likelihood of a future wave for the H1N1 virus," said Dr. Greg Holzman, chief medical executive of Michigan Department of Community Health. "We do know that vaccination is the single best way to protect against influenza."

Although H1N1 activity has decreased, Holzman warned that there are still 4 months of flu season remaining. "People can still get sick from this flu so it's not too late to get vaccinated," he said.

While the seasonal flu is often most serious for older adults, H1N1 has affected many children, younger adults and middle-aged adults. Although vaccination is the best way to prevent H1N1, Holzman said people need to take other precautions as well such as practicing good cough etiquette, washing their hands frequently and staying at home if they are sick.

The 2009 H1N1 influenza vaccine is now available to all Michigan residents.

The Tuscola County Health Department has free vaccine available to all ages. If the clinic dates below do not work for you, call (989) 673-8114 (ext. 110 or 102) to make other arrangements:

The Hansens have 4 children ranging in age from 9 to 18. "When we were checking into 4-H for our kids, they (county MSU Extension officials) found out Mark has quite a bit of science background," said Hansen, who added her husband agreed to serve as the Tuscola County 4-H superintendent of Youth Sciences and Technology.

Hansen noted she and her husband both earned their college degrees at Spring Arbor University, with Mark majoring in both computer science and mathematics. The couple also pursued their interest in science by taking courses in that area. Today, Mark Hansen is employed as a senior engineer for Hewlett Packard.

After agreeing to serve as leaders of the Deford Dazzlers, the Hansens completed a comprehensive application and training process through MSU Extension, and their request to establish the new club was approved in September.

Unlike traditional 4-H club leaders, the Hansens emphasize projects that involve exploration of chemistry, physics, woodworking, metal working, electronics, geology, astronomy and model rocketry.

"Our thrust is very scientific. It is a different focus," Hansen acknowledged, adding the club's 10 or 12 members have already been enjoying some interesting projects, including building LED flashlights and building model rockets.

Last October, the club hosted a "Biofuel Blast" activity at the Deford Community Church. The event, organized in conjunction with last year's 4-H National Youth Science Experiment, was open to all county youth and taught them how cellulose and sugars in plants corn, switchgrass, sorghum and algae — can be converted into fuel, and how alternative energies can be

used in their own communities. In all, about 20 young people attended the event.

before making a contribution, and be aware of red flags. For example, some charities imitate the name and style of a well-known organization in an effort to confuse people. Also, when clicking on the link to "donate", look at the organizations URL in the browser window. Exercise caution if the domain name is hidden, is not familiar to you or is not the same as the one stated in the text of the link.

•Watch out for excessive pressure for on-the-spot donations. Be wary of any request to send a "runner" to pick up your contribution.

•Do not give your credit card number or other personal information to a telephone solicitor or in response to an email solicitation. Ask the caller or sender to provide you with written information on the charity's programs and finances.

•Do not hesitate to ask for written information that describes the charity's program(s) and finances, such as the organization's latest annual report and financial statements

•Be wary of charities that are reluctant to answer reasonable questions about their operations, finances and programs. Ask how much of your gift will be used for the activity described in the appeal, and how much will go towards other programs as well as administrative and fundraising costs.

Residents can obtain additional advice on giving, as well as access reports on national charities, by visiting the website, www.give.org.

Anyone who believes they may have been the victim of a charitable "scam" should report the suspected crime by calling Tuscola County Central Dispatch at (989) 673-8738.

"Always err on the side of caution," Teschendorf said. "Legitimate charities will be understanding and patient when attempting to solicit funds. It has become very difficult to recover money from fraudulent activities since most operate from off-shore locations, and it is not possible to prosecute them even if they are located."

The doctor may also recommend 2 flu vaccines - seasonal and 2009 H1N1.

Finding of No Significant Impact

The reasons for such decision not to prepare an EIS are as follows:

Minor construction activity causing no significant short or long term impact.

An Environmental Review Record respecting the proposed project has been made by the above-named Village of Cass City which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why an EIS is not required. This Environmental Review Record is on file at the above address and is available for public examination and copying upon request at the Municipal Building between the hours of 8:30 and 4:30. No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted prior to the request for release of federal funds.

Public Comments on Finding

All interested agencies, groups, and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the Village of Cass City to the Office of the Undersigned on or before February 26, 2010. All such comments so received will be considered and the Village of Cass City will not request the release of federal funds or take any administrative action on the proposed project prior to the date specified in the preceding sentence.

Release of Funds

The Village of Cass City will undertake the project described above with Community Development Block Grant funds from the State of Michigan under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. The Village of Cass City is certifying to the State of Michigan that the Village of Cass City and Peter Cristiano in his official capacity as Village Manager consent to accept the jurisdiction of the federal courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to environmental reviews, decision-making, and action; and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of the certification is that upon its approval the Village of Cass City may use the Block Grant funds and the state will have satisfied its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969.

Objections to State Release of Funds

The State of Michigan will accept an objection to its approval only if it is on one of the following bases: (a) that the certification was not in fact executed by the certifying officer or other officer of applicant approved by the State of Michigan; or (b) that applicant's environmental review record for the project indicated omission of a required decision finding or step applicable to the project in the environmental review process. Objections must be prepared and submitted to the State of Michigan, MEDC, 300 North Washington Square, Lansing, Michigan 48913.

Objections to the release of funds on bases other than those stated above will not be considered by the state. No objection received after February 26, 2010, will be considered by the state.
