out. "The biggest factor...is the grossly inadequate payments we are receiving from Medicaid and Medicare," Falatko said. "That is by far what is hurting us the most. The government programs — state and federal are not paying us anywhere near what it costs us to treat their beneficiaries."

In the hospital's most recent fiscal year, the Medicaid program paid Hills and Dales \$2.1 million less than it cost to treat those patients. Medicare, meanwhile, paid the hospital \$1.3 million less than it cost to treat Medicare patients.

DNRE: wolverine's death no mystery

death of Michigan's only known wolverine turned out to be no mystery at all. The animal died of natural causes, Department of Natural Resources and Environment (DNRE) officials announced last week.

A necropsy performed at the DNRE's Wildlife Diagnostic Laboratory, and microscopic examinations at Michigan State University, showed some heart degeneration and some liver congestion, but no sign of infection or trauma, according to officials, who said the wolverine was in fair body condition, with small deposits of fat. Metal and pesticide screenings were negative.

wolverine to survive beyond 5 to 7 years in the wild, but there have

been documented cases of them living for up to 13 years.

"The female wolverine, first dis-The mystery surrounding the covered by coyote hunters near Bad Axe Feb. 24, 2004, was approximately 9 years old," said DNRE pathologist Tom Cooley.

The wolverine was the first ever authenticated in Michigan. Cooley noted previous DNA analysis indicated the animal's genetic origin was from a vast area in Ontario and Manitoba.

The dead wolverine was found semi-submerged on the downstream side of a beaver dam by hikers Morgan Graham and Todd Rann in the Minden City State Game Area in mid-March. The wolverine was last known to be alive Feb. 17.

We applaud new smoke-free rules

Smokers accustomed to lighting up in their favorite bar or restaurant had better enjoy their last few puffs indoors over the next couple of weeks.

Michigan's Smoke-Free Air Law goes into effect *May 1, and we applaud the decision — not because* it will significantly reduce the number of smokers in the state, but because the law places the health of non-smokers, particularly children, above the socalled rights of smokers.

Gov. Jennifer Granholm signed the legislation that prohibits smoking in public places such as restaurants, bars, hotels, or any place that serves food or beverages. The Ron M. Davis Law, named after the late chief medical officer of the Department of Public Health, makes Michigan the 38th state to ban smoking in public places.

Not surprisingly, state and county health department officials are pleased with the new regulations.

And with good reason. Second-hand smoke is the third leading cause of preventable death in Michigan, resulting in an estimated 2,500 deaths annually. When smoking occurs in the workplace, *employees find they are exposed to cancer-causing* substances all day.

In addition, we know today that smoking results in a number of illnesses in adults, including heart disease, cancer, stroke, chronic lower respiratory illnesses and diabetes. Children and adolescents exposed to second-hand smoke can develop asthma, ear infections, colds and pneumonia. Our only real gripe with the new law is that it allows exemptions for the gaming floors at the 3 Detroit casinos (can you say lobbying dollars at work?), but the other casino bars and eateries must be smoke-free, including the casinos' restaurants and hotels. Michigan's 20 American-Indian casinos are not covered by state law. Cigar bars, tobacco specialty shops, home offices, commercial trucks and motor vehicles are also exempt.

Your husband might be right, but let's not be too hasty. The animal you describe could be a groundhog in a Lone Ranger costume. (It takes a trained biologist to distinguish one of these from a raccoon.)

Some biologists believe the raccoon is not a true species at all, but just a woodchuck looking for a party. From what I've seen of them, I tend to agree with this theory.

We can understand certain exemptions — cigar bars and tobacco specialty shops, for example but the others wreak of Michigan politicians once again playing favorites in honor of the almighty dollar in one way or another.

Individuals and business owners who violate the new law will be subject to penalties of \$100 for the first offense and \$500 for subsequent offenses.

But we hope penalties won't be the only motivation to adhere to smoke-free rules.

When it comes right down to it, no one has the right to expose others to second-hand smoke. That's just wrong, especially when we're talking about adults lighting up in a car with kids in the backseat, or across a booth in a restaurant.

Michigan residents have the right to smoke. They just don't have the right to endanger the lives of others in the process.

A Millington man was charged with one count of fourth degree child abuse last week in Tuscola County after allegedly leaving his one-yearold daughter home alone at his residence for more than 3 hours.

Fourth degree child abuse is punishable by up to one year in jail.

The defendant, Cyle E. Blakeley, 18, was arraigned in Tuscola County District Court. He was released on a \$5,000 personal recognizance bond. "The conduct at issue occurred during the late evening hours of April 5 through the early morning of April 6," explained Tuscola County Prosecutor Mark E. Reene.

CCHS Academic Games members are gearing up for another year of competition. Academic Games is not quiz bowl. There are no buzzers, or jeopardy like clues. The entirety of the competition takes place on one day, within a few hours. It is no huge event; students arrive the morning of the competition at Saginaw Valley State University, begin competing within the hour and leave the building as soon as the results are announced. So what stirs up students to get involved every year?

First, you must know about the competition itself. Students from grades 9 to 12 are divided into 4 categories, English, math, science and technology. Each team consists of about 5 main players plus alternates. Here at CCHS Mr. Green is the science coach, Mr. Meck, the English coach, Mrs. Volz, the technology coach, and Mrs. Walsh, the math coach.

At go-time, the teams say good-bye to their fellow students and go into separate rooms where teams from other schools competing in the same subject await. Once in the room they first get a set of questions. These questions delve into the general knowledge of each subject. English competitors are asked about the novels, poems, plays, essays and short stories from their reading list, and math students must solve equations.

Once the time is up for these questions, the students are given a half time break where they can venture into the hallway where students share stories of how difficult -or easy- their questions were. After half time the students break off again, back into their rooms where they receive a prompt, which is more of a challenging question. Perhaps they must prove a theorem or write a couple essays, or even build something from nothing.

After this, all that is left is the awards. Everyone gathers in the music hall where places fourth through first receive medals. With the day over, students get back on the buses and go home.

Perhaps the reason why schools are able to fill teams for this one-day event is the bragging rights. Schools from all around the area are there. Schools such as Caro, Reese and Lakers, and this time beating them has nothing to do with athletic ability. (Unless, of course, the technology team has a prompt involving constructing a boat and paddling across the SVSU Olympic size pool.)

When a team from a certain school wins during the awards ceremony their fellow classmates go crazy with cheers. Cass City may have lost to Caro during the football and basketball seasons, but this is academia's chance to reclaim a sense of superiority.

Another reason could be that it is the students' time to show off in their academics validating their hours spent in study. No other time during the year is there an opportunity for one student to conquer another student by pure wit.

The reasons why students join Academic Games are surely many. Yet CCHS can be proud knowing that they are able to send teams each year that are prepared to bring home the gold.

Ford said the wolverine weighed roughly 30 pounds, more than 5 pounds heavier than the average female wolverine's weight.

The wolverine is a member of the weasel family and typically grows to a weight of about 25 pounds. It has a reputation for being ferocious enough to fight off bears and wolves.

Huron County officials are looking for residents to participate in their Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) collection Saturday, May 15. This is the only collection being offered in 2010.

Residents should plan ahead and collect their unwanted household hazardous waste (toxic/poisonous, flammable, caustic or chemically reactive materials, such as oil-based paint, drain cleaners, pool chemicals, pesticides and antifreeze) to bring them to the collection.

This program is offered to residents in Huron County to reduce the waste going into local landfills and the negative impact these products can have if mixed with the regular waste stream.

Residents are required to pre-register and be assigned an appointment time to participate in the program. No materials will be accepted without an appointment. All information is kept confidential.

Items that are not included in this collection are ammunition/explosives, biohazards (syringes), prescription medications, smoke detectors, latex paint, motor oils, asbestos and vehicle batteries.

Residents are encouraged to dispose of hazardous materials they have in their home through this program. Not only is it safer than keeping these poorly stored in a basement or garage, but also by getting rid of them properly, the homeowner can prevent a future incident when a dog or a small child may come in contact with these products.
