5 killed in car crash

The Labor Day holiday weekend proved deadly in Tuscola County, where 5 people died in a single-vehicle traffic crash early Saturday morning in the

Tuscola County Sheriff's deputies identified the victims as Sandra L. Chance, 38, of Marlette (the driver); Brian J. Shelton, 30, of Troy; Jeremy Smith, 36, of North Branch; Gean R. Jones, 46, of Marlette; and Jason C. Shelton, 35, of Kingston.

Deputies were dispatched Kingston Road, south Centerline Road in Koylton Township at about 2:22 a.m.

"A northbound Ford Mustang failed to negotiate a curve and left the roadway, colliding with a tree and overturning, coming to rest on its top," Tuscola County Undersheriff Glen Skrent reported. "The vehicle was occupied by 5 subjects, all of whom were pronounced deceased at the scene.

"The crash is still under investigation by the sheriff's office accident reconstructionist team and detectives, and it has not been determined if alcohol or speed are factors in the crash," Skrent said.

Marlette EMS personnel, Cass City MMR personnel, and the Kingston and Burlington fire departments assisted deputies at the scene.

Pastor's compassion for the pain of others rooted in experience

The Rev. Pam Barnett knows what it means to hurt.

Not just physical pain, but emotional pain as well. Instead of wallowing in the trials she's faced in her life, however, Barnett has incorporated the lessons she's learned into a ministry that offers her parishioners a compassionate, listening ear; words of encouragement; and a passion for studying the Bible and teaching its lessons.

Barnett, a native of northern Georgia with 14 years in the ministry, recently began her duties as pastor of the Shabbona United Methodist Church.

Although she's only been on the job since early July, Barnett is obviously comfortable in her role, and she isn't a bit shy about talking when it comes to her love of being a pastor, and of her interest in help-

ing others who have been challenged

by tragedy.

Barnett is an expert in that arena. She knows what it's like to lose a child — her first 2 pregnancies ended without being able to cradle a baby in her arms. She also knows the pain of having to say goodbye to a lifelong partner in her husband, who died 2 years ago, on the couple's 37th wedding anniversary, from complications of diabetes.

"He was a good man, a sweet man. We miss him very much, but we know where he is," she said.

And, Barnett understands, all too well, some of the worst physical pain a human being can endure.

Barnett came to Shabbona after serving as pastor at the West Goodland United Methodist Church in Imlay City for 10 years. She previously served as pastor of a 2church charge — Avoca and Ruby in St. Clair County for a year, and at

Village set to go green with project

Cass City Village officials are gearing up to seek bids for a \$90,000 project designed to enable them to 'go green", and best of all, the federal government is paying the tab.

The local project will involve installation of solar panels at the village municipal building, located at the corner of Main and Seeger streets, to save on electricity costs.

Officials with the Michigan Department of Energy, Labor and Economic Growth (DELEG) late last year announced they were awarding \$17.4 million in grants to 125 cities, villages, townships and counties throughout the state to support local energy efficiency projects.

The state Energy, Efficiency and Conservation Block (EECBG) are being funded through American Recovery Reinvestment Act of 2009.

Coaches should lead by example

Americans throughout the nation celebrated Labor Day Monday traveling to family gatherings, picnics, barbecues, and similar events. Since 1882, Labor Day has served as an opportunity to reflect on what your job has done for you and your family.

In Michigan, this year's holiday was accompanied with hard economic times and an adjusted unemployment rate of over 13 percent. In fact, Michigan's percentage of unemployed workers would be much worse if you consider the number of part-time workers and those who are under employed.

While we feel awful that many hard working people have lost their livelihood through no fault of their own (Cass City Schools custodial workers come to mind), we wonder why Roger E. Bearss II, Millington High School principal and varsity football coach, still has his.

For folks who don't know, Bearss was arrested in July and charged with operating a vehicle while intoxicated. Allegedly, the 45-year-old coach was driving the wrong way on a one-way street and had a blood/alcohol level of over twice the legal limit.

Now, it is true we don't know nor have ever met Bearss. He's probably an outstanding individual. We will concede that anybody with his job title is certainly highly educated, most likely with an advanced degree. You don't become a high school principal without having plenty on the ball.

But, when you are called on to lead our children, you must hold yourself to a higher standard and Bearss failed his high school Alma Mater in that respect.

Respect? How can members of the Cardinals' football meeting: "Thank-you". team be asked to set an example for their student body when their coach failed terribly in doing the same?

If this was Bearss' first brush with the law on a booze related offense, maybe school officials could take other actions than letting him go. However, Benzie County court records show he pleaded guilty to operating a vehicle while intoxicated back in 2003.

That is not acceptable in our book, especially when his salary is partly paid for with tax dollars.

Being a good coach isn't based solely on wins and losses. Millington schools have a chance to prove that to their students in their handling of Bearss.

Bearss, too, can use the conquering of his demons (if he's able) to teach Millington students that there are consequences for your actions. Losing the privilege of coaching our youth should be one of them.

We wish him the best of luck battling his alcohol troubles.

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Health department confirms another rabid bat in county

officials last week confirmed that another bat collected from the rabies.

The person exposed to the bat is being treated for rabies exposure.

Bats are an important part of the ecosystem, with some species eating significant numbers of residential pests such as insects and agricultural pests such as beetles and moths. Bats are also a protected species in Michigan, but it's estimated some 40,000 people each year receive rabies post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP), many of these following exposure to bats.

"Some of these treatments can be avoided if the bat can be collected and tested for rabies. If the animal tests negative for rabies, no prophylactic rabies treatment is necessary," said Ann Hepfer, R.N., nursing administrator at the Tuscola County Health Department.

"In many of the human rabies cases caused by a bat-strain of the virus, there was no known history of a bite from a bat. For that reason, bats represent a special concern," Hepfer attention.

Tuscola County Health Department noted. "Bats have very small teeth, and a bat's bite may not be felt.

"Any direct contact with a bat reprabies. Other situations that might qualify as exposure include finding a bat in the room with a sleeping person, a child, or someone who is mencontinued. "If you think you may have been exposed to rabies from a bat, please do not let the bat go. In these instances, you should safely collect the bat until the need for rabies testing has been evaluated. Wearing leather gloves, place a coffee can or box over the bat, then use a piece of cardboard with holes punched in it to slide under the can or box, taping this cover firmly to the container.'

Hepfer offered the following recommendations:

•Never handle unfamiliar wild or domestic animals, even if they appear friendly.

•Wash any wound caused by an animal thoroughly with soap and water and seek immediate medical

•Test all wild or stray animals that may have exposed humans or other animals for rabies. If the animal Mayville area has tested positive for resents a potential exposure to must be destroyed, do not destroy the animal's head; rabies testing is done on the animal's brain tissue and must

be intact for adequate testing. •Prevent bats from entering homes tally disabled or intoxicated," she and other buildings where they might come in contact with humans

> •Keep vaccinations current for all dogs, cats and ferrets. In addition, keep your cats and ferrets inside and your dogs under direct supervision.

> •Consult your veterinarian about vaccinations for horses and other

> •Call animal control to remove stray animals from your neighborhood, and call nuisance animal control to deal with wildlife.

Lead Safety for Renovation, Repair and Painting (RRP)

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has recently enacted new regulations affecting contractors performing renovation work in residential dwellings or child-occupied facilities built before 1978.

This regulation is called "Lead Safety for Renovation, Repair and Painting"

Beginning in April 2010, any renovation work (including painting) done for compensation, which disturbs painted surfaces in residential dwellings or child-occupied facilities built before 1978, must be performed by an EPA certified company, using persons trained in lead-safe work practices. Each job is required to have a Certified Renovator on-site to perform specific responsibilities.

To become a Certified Renovator, a person must attend an 8-hour EPA approved training course.

Capac United Methodist Church for a year. It was there she made the decision to enter the ministry.

"My husband was a minister for 30 years, but I didn't get the call until I was attending the Capac United Methodist Church," she said.

"I struggled with it. I was raised Baptist, and the idea of a woman being in the ministry was new. I had to really search the scripture," recalled Barnett, who consulted with then-senior pastor at Capac, the Rev. Hal Phillips.

"They wanted me to apply to be hired on staff as an associate pastor," she continued, noting one deadline passed with her taking no action, so the church extended the deadline in hopes that she would agree to serve as an associate pastor. "I really felt God's call, so I surrendered to it."

Barnett said the church leadership encouraged her largely because they had seen her passion for teaching. She had taught Sunday school and

Wednesday night services. "I was teaching as much as I could because I loved it," she said. "I had actually already (earned) an associate's degree in theology because I loved to teach the Bible.'

Barnett, who is currently pursuing a bachelor's degree in theology, also has an Associate of Science in Nursing Degree. She used that training to work as a hospice nurse for 3 to 4 years while she was still living in Georgia.

Today, Barnett is the mother of 3, including daughter Karen, 29, who lives at home and is active at the Shabbona church. She also has 2 sons; Jonathan, 27, of Lynchburg, Va., who is preparing to be a pilot in the U.S. Army, and Benjamin, 26, who is now in his fourth year in the U.S. Navy, serving as a petty officer aboard an aircraft carrier in the Pacific Ocean.

As a pastor, Barnett indicated sharing lessons learned from the Bible is know what it is to hurt. still her first love.

"I (also) have a real heart for senior ministry, (and) I enjoy music very much. Everyone in my family sang," she added, noting she enjoys singing during services, often with her daughter.

Barnett's positive outlook on her life and ministry defies a near-death experience she endured when she was a teenager.

"When I was 19 years old, I was hit by a drunk driver who was passing 6 cars on a blind hill. The gas tank ruptured and ignited, and I was pinned inside," she explained.

At the time, Barnett was living in California, where her husband was a U.S. marine stationed at Camp Pendleton.

Barnett said a lieutenant colonel and a lance corporal happened by the accident and worked to rescue her, with the corporal using his uniform to fan the flames away from her head while the colonel jumped onto the hood of her car, desperately trying to find a way to save her.

"They could not get me out," she said, adding the colonel, in desperation, finally smashed the windshield and was forced to break her legs in order to get her out from under the steering wheel.

Her extensive injuries — including third degree burns over 20 percent of her body, cuts and a concussion kept Barnett in intensive care for 4 months and in the hospital for anoth-

The burns cost Barnett an ear and left her with horrible scarring. "There were so many surgeries, my husband stopped counting after 50," she recalled. In all, the recovery process spanned 5 years.

Looking back, Barnett believes her accident was part of God's plan for her life. And her ministry, especially in terms of how it has helped her to relate to others in pain.

'God has used it," Barnett added. "I love to teach the Bible," she said. "It's just really opened up a way for

Savings awarded the grants to projects that will create and retain jobs, save energy and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

In the Thumb, municipalities in Tuscola, Huron and Sanilac counties, including Cass City, were awarded a combined \$489,990.

Jim McLoskey, executive director of the Tuscola County Economic Development Corporation (EDC), noted Tuscola County was the lead applicant in the Thumb for the federal dollars, but that the EDCs in Huron and Sanilac counties also played key roles in spearheading the

McLoskey said much of the credit for landing the grants goes to a Saginaw firm, AKT Peerless Environment and Energy, which donated its services in writing the grant application.

Cass City officials will be installing solar electronic panels on the roof of the municipal building. In all, 48, 215-watt solar panels will be utilized to offset electrical costs at the municipal building and, in the process,

reduce greenhouse gas production.

The solar panels are referred to as a "grid connection system", meaning they will utilize the electricity generated by the panels first and then supplement the rest of the needed power from the conventional utility company. Based on design estimates, the panels are expected to generate there will be a free dinner. 14,713 kWh per year.

'I know, over the course of the year, it (will save) several thousand dollars in electrical costs," said Sam Moore, who serves as the Cass City Parks and Recreation director, but whose job also includes community development projects in the village.

"Over the life of the panels — 20 to 30 years — you're supposed to see a 10-percent return on your investment, which isn't that much, but being we're not putting money into it, it's win-win. Plus, we're going green'," Moore added.

He estimated the monthly electrical service savings at the municipal building should add up to \$100 to \$300, depending on the time of year. Officials hope to complete the project by the end of the year.

and cash flows in 2013, but it also is one more way to implement a clean energy future," said John W. Rowe, Exelon chairman and CEO. "Whether harmful emissions are priced or regulated, our combined capacity of nearly 19,000 megawatts of zero-emission wind, solar, hydro, landfill gas and nuclear power remains a clear competitive advantage that will only become more valuable.'

Under the terms of the agreement, Exelon will acquire John Deere Renewables' 735 megawatts of installed, operating wind capacity enough to power 160,000 to 220,000 households — spread across 36 projects in 8 states, including Michigan. About 75 percent of the operating portfolio is already sold under longterm power purchase agreements.

As part of the acquisition, Exelon also has the opportunity to pursue 1,468 megawatts of new wind projects that are in various stages of development, including the 230 megawatts in advanced stages of

"We expect to see increasing demand for clean, efficient wind power at a national level and in the The wind farm was the first of its 29 states that already have a renewable energy standard," Rowe said.


"The acquisition gives Exelon a strong position in the wind generation business that adds diversity to our generation fleet and provides more options for future growth."

Exelon Corporation is one of the nation's largest electric utilities with more than \$17 billion in annual revenues. The company has one of the industry's largest portfolios of electricity generation capacity, with a nationwide reach and strong positions in the Midwest and Mid-Atlantic regions. Exelon distributes electricity to some 5.4 million customers in northern Illinois and southeastern Pennsylvania, and natural gas to about 486,000 customers in the Philadelphia area.

In the Thumb, the Michigan Wind 1 project consists of 46 GE 1.5 MW SLE turbines with a total capacity of 69 megawatts, producing enough electricity to power roughly 20,000 homes in Michigan.

The Harvest Wind Farm in the Elkton/Pigeon area, meanwhile, consists of 32 turbines, each capable of producing 1.65 megawatts of electricity. The combined power is enough to supply more than 15,000 Michigan homes with electricity. kind, on a commercial scale, to operate in Michigan.





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
