SHOCKER! Owen-Gage board President Muntz resigns after district hires chief

The Owen-Gage Board of Education hired Jim Wencel as the district's new part-time superintendent during a special meeting Monday night, but trustees will now have to select a new board president.

Board president Terry Muntz abruptly resigned at the end of the special session, offering no explanation for his decision.

The vote to hire Wencel, a retired Bad Axe Public Schools superintendent, was not unanimous.

Supporting the motion to offer Wencel a contract were Muntz along with board members Deb Quick, Loretta Schmidt, Dan Warack and Brenda Kretzschmer. Casting the dissenting votes were Michael Mandich and Kathy Champagne.

Board members spent much of the 30-minute special session voicing their opinions on who is the best candidate for the part-time superintendency.

Members of the audience also offered their input on Wencel, who interviewed for the position in May. Warack noted the board has had some disagreements in the decisionmaking process. He also asked for interim Supt. Bob Drury's opinion.

"I believe one candidate has the experience and knowledge to do what needs to be done," said Drury, whose nearly year-long tenure with

No free lunch? There is here

They say there's no such thing as a free lunch.

Well, Shari Bock will tell you a different story in Cass City, where she has spearheaded a number of programs geared towards providing local students with the nutrition they need to succeed in the classroom during the school year, and to remain healthy throughout the summer months.

Bock, who serves as food service director of the Cass City Public Schools, would never tell you this, but she's been a champion of sorts locally when it comes to making sure our youngest citizens have enough to *eat. Her latest efforts have included playing a key role* in establishing the Cass City BackPack Program, which provides area youngsters with supplemental meals over the weekends throughout the school year.

Bock is quick to share the credit with a host of others, but ask any Cass City School administrator and A life of crime? they will tell you Bock has been the sparkplug behind this success story.

Now, Bock is gearing up for a fourth year of providing free meals to children during the summer as part of the USDA Summer Food Service Program, a project that is federally funded — doesn't cost the local school district a penny. In fact, the program, known as "Let's Do Lunch!", has made some money that has been used to upgrade the school cafeteria.

In the process, the effort has delivered plenty.

This is how it works: nutritious meals are served at Cass City Middle School Monday through Friday, from 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. The program kicks off Monday, June 13, and will end Aug. 12. There are no income requirements, and any young person ages 18 or younger are welcome. Parents, too, if they're willing to volunteer some time to help out.

"Last year we averaged about 90 to 100 kids every day," said Bock, who noted the numbers included summer school students and youngsters participating in the Cass City Parks and Recreation Day Camp.

The numbers don't surprise Bock. After all, more than half of the Cass City School District's students that's some 550 kids — now qualify for free or reduced meals at school.

This year, the local district is partnering with the Human Development Commission (HDC) to provide free meals for children in the Caro area, too. The "Let's Do Lunch!" site in Caro will be at the HDC Generations building at 430 Montague Ave., with meals served Monday through Friday, from 11:15 a.m. to 12:45 a.m., beginning Monday, June 20.

"We care about the kids in our community and kids" outside our community," Bock said. "We want to help them all."

We tip our hats to Bock and Cass City School officials for their initiative. It's clear they understand the documented connection between a full belly and the ability to learn. Equally important, they are taking care of *"our" kids year-round, helping to ensure that they are* ready for another school year come fall.

State police: holiday death toll down a bit

Michigan State Police (MSP) officials have announced the results of preliminary reports that indicate 10 people lost their lives in 8 separate traffic crashes during the 2011 Memorial Day holiday weekend.

In comparison, 15 people died in traffic accidents during the same period last year.

Of the 10 fatalities, 2 of the victims were not wearing seatbelts. Alcohol was a known factor in 4 of the crashes.

"These numbers are preliminary and only reflect those fatalities reported to the MSP as of 9 a.m. (May 31), said Captain Harold J. Love, commander of the MSP Traffic Safety Division. "The preliminary numbers show a decrease in fatalities from this same holiday period last year. The MSP continues to urge motorists not to drink and drive, to always use proper restraints, and to drive safely."

The 2011 Memorial Day holiday weekend ran from 6 p.m. Friday, May 27, through midnight Monday, May 30.

100 YEARS Bay Shore Camp gearing up for a huge celebration

As summer draws nearer, Bay Shore Camp and Family Ministries in Sebewaing is gearing up for an entire season of celebrating its 100th year of Christian camping ministry.

Beginning in the late 1800s, Evangelical Christians in Huron and Tuscola counties made a practice of holding camp meetings for a week or 2 of old-fashioned revival and fellowship. These meetings were wellattended, and the highlight of summer for many evangelical families in town and on the farm.

Locations for these campouts varied each year and at the conclusion of each, there was always talk of how practical it would be to secure a permanent location. Such a place could also be used for other church district functions like young people's conventions, Sunday school conventions, pastors' retreats, church picnics, etc. Over time, small improvements could be added, eventually making living conditions a bit easier Celebration events will take place on

The following spring, Sebewaing's Driving Park and Fairgrounds gained their attention. Created for tourists, it was now defunct and for sale. Negotiations ensued and within a short time, there was a newly-formed Bay Shore Park Association, and it owned 32 acres on Saginaw Bay.

The story of how Bay Shore Camp developed from a horse-racing/fairgrounds park to the multi-faceted facility and ministry it is today could fill a book. In fact, that book is currently being written and will be available for purchase from the camp bookstore as of July 31, the first day of Bay Shore's official Centennial Celebration Week.
