# Area trophy hunter recalls past memories

Manuel Thies didn't know his severe asthma as a child would be a positive thing for his future.

Thies, 74, of Owendale, was not able to play any of the regular high school sports because of difficulty breathing, so the determined boy found himself in an activity that was easy on his lungs-hunting.

"That is what I live for," Thies said. Thies visited the Rawson Memorial District Library last Thursday and presented the animals he's hunted to a crowded room filled with curious children and their parents, among others. It was a full house.

Under black tarps were his hidden prizes, several animal heads and various items he has collected throughout the years.

Thies has been a hunter his entire life, and the tall, distinct man with a grandfatherly air, has the statues to prove it.

His trophy room, built 3 years ago, adjacent to his house, is a collection of his life, from the articles written about him to the awards he's won.

The animals in there, though, are the main attraction, covering the place from top to bottom, on pillars and walls, grazing the ceiling.

Regal in their frozen stare, hailing from places as far away as South Africa and New Caledonia, a tropical island off the coast of Australia, to

"You go to where they are living," Thies said of the animals. "And it doesn't take very long, you go to where these things are and you simply wait until you find them.'

In places such as Africa, Thies said one can find up to 100 animals in a day.

Yet, before Thies got into big-game hunting around the world, his one and only job began at Owen-Gage Public Schools in 1961, when he was a 22-year-old teacher.

Twenty-nine years later, Thies became the school's principal for 3 years and then became their superintendent for 7 years, retiring in 2000. His passion for hunting big game across the world soon followed, even though he was always a hunter.

"I've been hunting my whole life," Thies said. "My dad loved to fish and he wasn't much of a hunter and I loved to do both, but I haven't been hunting big game until probably from the 1990s (and) on.'

When Thies retired, he started traveling "because I had the time," he said.

Thies goes into his trophy room every day except on Sundays.

He sits in his big, comfy chair and remembers in detail his adventures.

"I come in here with my dog and I have a cup of cappuccino and I just sit and look at the animals," he said. "I remember where all the animals where taken and I remember special situations with these animals. They all have memories to me, every one

Patience may be a virtue- but when it comes to crops, patience can especially be a blessing.

From soybeans to sugar beets and everything in between, this year's crops have experienced weather delays that have slowed growth and affected some production along the way.

In early May, the increase in warmer temperatures permitted farmers to plant their crops and take advantage of the weather.

But according to Martin Nagelkirk, Sanilac County MSU Extension field crop educator who specializes in wheat, the widespread wet weather still affected the crops and caused their delay earlier this season.

Yet, progress is being made.

"The crops are making an effort and able conditions and their growth responding to warmer temperatures and that is very positive," Nagelkirk said.

Nagelkirk also said that corn and soybeans have been looking a bit the high rainfall received earlier.

"But they are definitely developing their roots and showing some above might have been overly wet, but ground growth," he said. "They are overall good." looking better some weeks ago than in May and early June."

With this current temperature, Nagelkirk said farmers are finishing up the planting and replanting, while still rebounding from this wet sea-

With dry beans in particular, Nagelkirk said they are looking very good because they were planted in

June when there were more favorreflects that, he said.

The alfalfa harvest has also had better yield and quality and looks better than row crops, he added.

"They are generally favored by rough and they cannot recover from rainfall and somewhat cooler conditions," Nagelkirk said. "Hay crops have done fairly, favored, some

Because wheat is just starting to be harvested now, a lot of attention has been turned to trying to get that harvested in a timely fashion, he said.

In the Saginaw Valley and Thumb area, wheat so far has been in pretty good shape, he added.

The trial that dominated national headlines, office gossip and many a person's brain time for months has reached its conclusion. The verdict was read over a week ago. The dust has settled, or at least it's settling. Casey Anthony is free to move on with her life. Why can't I?

The reason is obvious. I'm a mother.

There are some things a mother can't put aside. A lost child is one of them. When you become a mother (or a parent for that matter) all children become your children. One lost is one too many. Caylee Marie Anthony has been lost, and it seems we will never officially know what happened or who hurt her. For a mother, that is gut-wrenching.

Even though I tried not to pay attention, I watched the courtroom drama unfold. It drew me in and now the verdict won't let go. I'd turn it off in my head if I could, but I can't. Parenthood doesn't come equipped with a mute button.

First, my own confession: as a mother I mess up every day. I am not always patient: "Time for bed. Now." I raise my voice, "Put the fish back inside the aquarium!" I ignore the food groups, "Waffles for supper?" I stifle their athleticism and creativity, "Stop wrestling in the living room and quit squirting glue in your brother's shoes.'

Because of my many imperfections, I try not to judge. It is not my place. Still, despite (or in lieu of) the verdict, there are certain things I believe define what a mother is, and what she is not. It is a list steeped in common sense - something I believe our justice system could use more of. Here goes:

Mothers do not create nannies who do not exist. Mothers report their child missing as soon as they are aware that said child is missing, not 31 days later.

Real mothers work at real jobs, not make-believe ones. Mothers don't party like rock stars when their child is missing (or recently drowned, depending on which version you subscribe to).

Mothers do not blame their past as an excuse to hurt their children.

Mothers can't sleep at night knowing their child is lying in a garbage bag in a swamp.

Mothers do not lie to the police, repeatedly, about their missing child.

I am not making a conclusion about guilty or not guilty in the Casey Anthony case. (Why don't they call it the Caylee Anthony case, by the way?) Our court system did that for us. As a mother, however, I know beyond a

My dad, originator of these trivia pieces before his passing 2 years ago (July 16, 2009), often used restaurant reviews when he had trouble coming up with items to fill this space week after week. To my surprise, his 1-10 rating scale was well received by our subscribers.

Following his lead, I am going to use the same 1-10 scale to occasionally rate places I've visited, hoping to achieve a similar positive response from our readers. I am also going to add my own touch by testing your travel savvy by describing the area to see if you can come up with the location before it is reveled.

Here's my first offering: This weekend was a great time to be on the lake. The Haire family visited Michigan's 10th largest lake. This spot also claims to have the state's second largest campground in a state park. The park contains almost one mile of shoreline, which is a large spring-fed body of water known for its clarity and fishing potential. Can you name the northern Michigan lake that the Haires visited Saturday and Sunday?

If you guessed Higgins Lake, congrats. Considering the hot outdoor temperatures, the inland lake near Roscommon rated an 8.5 in my opinion.

*We respect that, and we hope that school officials will* be able to put the pieces back together now and get on with the business of educating children.

MDOT has posted bridge safety reports online since August 2007. State bridge information can be downloaded by route number and/or county, and are current as of May 31. Only highway bridges greater than 20 feet in length are included; ratings for pedestrian, railroad and locally owned bridges are not included. MDOT is updating bridge condition information on the web 4 times a year.

"MDOT works year-round to inspect highway bridges across Michigan and monitor their condition scores and sufficiency ranges,' said State Transportation Director Kirk T. Steudle. "We are delivering on our commitment to be open and transparent by regularly reporting on the condition of bridges and over-

passes."
