### 2011 was a good (difficult) year

As we do every year, the Chronicle presents some of the top stories of the year, in no particular order, for our readers to enjoy.

m hock}$  waves rang throughout the Thumb and beyond in late March when details on the murder of an Owen-Gage freshman student started to break.

Tuscola County Sheriff's investigators say Cody Kalis, 17, of Unionville, intentionally ran over Zachary Harp, 16, of Caro, and dragged his body almost a block resulting in critical injuries.

Investigators say there was a party at a home located at Elizabeth Street in Gagetown and an altercation started between the victim and another subject, according to Tuscola County Undersheriff Glen Skrent.

Witnesses claim when another per-

Kalis, who fled the scene of the 4 a.m. incident, was later arraigned in Tuscola County District Court on 3 charges, including open murder, punishable by up to life in prison, if convicted.

#### AGRISCIENCE PROGRAM

It took less than a year, from planning to fundraising to construction, for school officials to hold a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the district's brand new Cass City Ag Learning Lab.

High school principal Chad Daniels was a driving force behind raising some \$80,000 to complete the 40foot by 64-foot barn.

The Cass City Board of Education pledged the first \$10,000 towards the project. That amount was later matched by Walther Farms and the Tuscola County Community Foundation.

The facility gets plenty of use. A whopping 155 students - roughly a third of the high school enrollment have signed up to attend one of teacher Ashlee Gibson's classes in 2011-12. She teaches 4 basic ag classes and one advanced ag class.

▶ Be a responsible host. Remind your guests to plan ahead and designate their sober driver. Make sure non-alcoholic beverages are available for drivers, anyone under the age of 21, and for those who do not wish to consume alcohol.

► Call a cab for anyone who does not have a sober driver. Post the telephone numbers for cab companies in your area where guests can easily see them.

► In 2009, 10,839 people were killed in alcohol-impaired driving crashes, accounting for nearly one-third (32%) of all traffic-related deaths in the United States.

#### **DRUG BUSTS**

The Sanilac County Drug Task Force's successful war against drug trafficking played a key role in the arrests of 29 Canadians during the probe of an international smuggling operation involving drugs being transferred across Lake Huron into the Thumb.

The charges allege the suspects were involved in the manufacture, trafficking and smuggling of Ecstasy, methamphetamine and marijuana into at least 5 Sanilac County shoreline entry points.

The Sanilac County Drug Task Force also delighted in the conviction of a third defendant in a major airport drug seizure in Sandusky back in 2009.

Law enforcement officers from several agencies participated in the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ year operation, which resulted in the seizure of some \$10 million worth of drugs – 300 pounds of Ecstasy pills acting board President Kathy

Sanilac County air strip.

Closer to home, Huron County Sheriff's deputies, acting on a tip last spring, seized 10 pounds of marijuana at an Elkton residence and some \$12,000 in cash at an Owendale home while executing separate drug search warrants.

#### **BOARD EXODUS**

The Owen-Gage Board of education hired Jim Wencel as the district's new superintendent during a special meeting in June, but trustees had to select a new board president when current Board President Terry Muntz abruptly resigned at the end of the special meeting, just after the former Bad Axe Schools superintendent was hired as the new part-time superintendent at Owen-Gage in a split vote, offering no explanation for his decision.

The board subsequently appointed Julie Good to replace Muntz. However, 3 more board members jumped ship in the following weeks. Submitting their resignations were

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

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
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
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
