Special village meeting

Repairs to well focus of meeting Wednesday here

A special meeting is slated in Cass City tonight, where council members anticipate authorizing repairs to a community well. The expense to fix the village's number 3 well could exceed several thousand dollars.

Village Manager Peter Cristiano invites all interested residents to attend Wednesday's 6:30 p.m. meeting, where a presentation on the history of Cass City's 3 wells will be heard from Department of Public Works Supt. Gary

Barnes will tell those in attendance at the Municipal Building, 6506 Main Street, that the pump at the number 3 well is drawing too much amperage. Four companies received invitations to bid on its repairs, figured to run in the neighborhood of \$20,000.

Barnes asked that the sealed bids for the repairs to the well be broken down into separate categories including pulling the pump, inspection and evaluation, best and worst case repair scenarios, and setting the repaired pump back into the well, which is housed just north of the Cass City Little League baseball diamonds.

"Anyone with questions on how our wells work should come to the meeting," said Cristiano. "Cass City has 3 wells total, so when the repairs are made there won't be any disruption of service.

Prior to taking action on the repair of the well, Kate VanAuken, of Rawson Memorial District Library, will give a slide presentation of her visit to the Glen Space Center in Cleveland, Ohio. The production is geared towards launching a Shaw Space and Technology Center here at home.

"The school has dedicated 2 rooms in the middle school as an initial startup site," said Cristiano. "We've been speaking with Brewster Shaw, whom everyone knows as Cass City's astronaut, to help get the idea into action. There is work ahead to make this a reality, but we're confident something will come of this."

A.P. stands for advanced placement. The textbook used by Cass City's students is the same used at Michigan State University by the introduction to chemistry classes. Green believes, "A.P. Deadline for weather poster contest Feb. 15

To draw attention to the need for being prepared in the event of severe weather, the Michigan Committee for Severe Weather Awareness is sponsoring a Severe Weather Awareness Poster Contest. This contest is open to all students currently enrolled in fourth or fifth grades. The deadline to enter will be Wednesday, Feb. 15.

According to contest sponsors, posters must illustrate what individuals and families should do to prepare for Michigan severe weather such as tornadoes, floods, snow storms, severe cold, lightning and thunderstorms.

The first place winner will receive a \$200 U.S. Savings Bond; second place will be awarded a \$100 U.S. Savings Bond; third place will receive a \$75 U.S. Savings Bond; and honorable mention will be awarded a \$50 U.S.

Posters must be approximately 15" by 20" and submitted on quality poster or illustration board. The work must be original and may be in any media with the exception of pencil, chalk, charcoal or glitter. All posters will become the property of the sponsoring organization.





Post office a big mess

To say I'm disappointed with the services provided by the United States Post Office would be a colossal understatement.

And considering the phone calls that bombarded our office recently, our subscribers in Decker and Snover feel the exact same way.

The reasoning for our dismay is simple. Last week, for example, we delivered the Chronicles to our local post office for distribution before 1 p.m. on Wednesday (one day later than usual due to the New Year holiday). It took until Monday for those papers to reach the mailboxes of our friends to the east.

That's nearly a whole work-week to reach a destination less then 30 miles away. It wasn't the first time for excess delays in delivering the mail to that area. Is it any wonder snail mail seems headed towards extinc-

Now, let's be perfectly clear, I don't fault the employees at the local branch center. In fact, postmaster Charles Walkowiak and his staff have often gone the extra mile to supply the best service possible, and I certainly appreciate their efforts. Unfortunately, it's not enough to please paying customers.

Walkowiak explained the holdup in getting the mail to its destination in a timely manner lies partly with new postal regulations that went into effect in 2012.

First some background. There was a time, many years ago, that the parcels hauled into the Cass City Post Office, remained there until delivered locally.

Then, until the new rules recently kicked in, all mail entered at the Cass City post office was transfered to a dock in Saginaw, before making a return trip back to its original starting point and handed out by local carriers.

Starting last week, not only does all the mail at the Cass City branch make a trip to Saginaw, but those new regulations has some of the mail, including pieces addressed to Decker and Snover residents, making yet another stop - to a metroplex in Pontiac - before returning home for delivery.

Compounding matters, Walkowiak says plans are in the works to close the Saginaw facility, and government officials are looking into reducing the number of delivery days per week.

Even so, Walkowiak suggests the Chronicle makes drop shipments to neighboring post offices to have our papers delivered the next day.

That translates to instead of taking each week's printing to only Cass City, we would need to drive to each post office in Huron, Sanilac, and Tuscola counties with zip codes that start with numbers other than 486 and 487 to receive next day mail service.

Seems like a lot of extra work that we pay several thousand dollars yearly to have the post office do. But, none the less, starting with this week's printing that's our new strategy for timely delivery of your Cass City Chronicle.

Lt. Gov. Calley signs 20 new bills into law

corporate income tax scheduled to replace the unpopular and confusing Michigan Business Tax on Sunday. Jan. 1, Lt. Gov. Brian Calley recently signed 20 bills into law, including several pieces of cleanup legislation needed to clarify and properly implement the new, dramatically simplified tax.

Most notable among the changes Calley signed is a provision that corrects an oversight that could have led to farmers losing their ability to claim the Homestead Property Tax credit. The remainder of the bills are cleanup bills are:

- Senate Bills 368 and 369, sponsored by state Sen. Jack Brandenburg, now Public Acts 304 and 305 of 2011;
- S.B. 653, also sponsored by Brandenburg, is now P.A. 306;
- S.B. 666, sponsored by state Sen. John Pappageorge, is now P.A. 307; • S.B. 673, sponsored by state Sen. Dave Robertson, is now P.A. 308; • S.B. 678, sponsored by state Sen.
- John Proos, is now P.A. 309; • S.B. 807, sponsored by state Sen. Dave Hildenbrand, is now P.A. 310; • House Bill 4940, sponsored by state Rep. Jud Gilbert, is now P.A.
- H.B. 4949, also sponsored by Gilbert, is now P.A. 312; and
- H.B. 4950, sponsored by state Rep. Lisa Lyons, is now P.A. 313.

Calley also signed legislation protecting income tax credits for residents currently living in Renaissance Zones through the length of each

Hildenbrand, and H.B. 5157, sponsored by state Rep. Holly Hughes, are now P.A.s 314 and 315.

"State Sen. Dave Hildenbrand and state Rep. Holly Hughes made a convincing argument about the need to retain this feature for residents who had made the commitment to help revitalize their communities by living and investing in established Renaissance Zones, and I am proud we were able to work together to make this happen," Calley said.

Calley also signed H.B.s 5066, mostly technical in nature. These 5067, 5068 and 5069, sponsored by state Rep. Jim Stamas. This package reclassifies the exemption for turbines powered by gas, steam, nuclear energy, coal or oil to maintain the intent of the industrial personal property exemptions and will save the School Aid Fund approximately \$75 million annually. H.B.s 5066-69 are now P.A.s 316-319.

• S.B. 725, sponsored by state Sen. John Moolenaar, ensures that livestock producers who are implementing a wildlife risk mitigation plan are not being penalized for taking prudent steps and can maintain their agricultural property exemptions. The bill is now P.A. 320.

Steve Lindberg, clarifies the conditions for which the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) may grant an easement for state-owned land, and requires the DNR to grant or deny a complete easement application within 90 days. The bill is now P.A. 323

Article V Section 26 of the Michigan Constitution gives authority to the lieutenant governor when the governor is outside the state.


SB 563 passes into law

Machinery used to install or implement soil and water conservation techniques is now exempt from the personal property tax after legislation sponsored by state Sen. Mike Green was signed into law by Gov. Rick Snyder. Senate Bill 563, now Public Act 290 of 2011, only exempts the machinery if the equipment is used for agriculture purposes.

"Equipment used for agriculture conservation efforts is now exempt from the personal property tax like all other farming equipment is, which will help promote soil and water conservation projects in the state," said Green (R-Mayville). "I thank Governor Snyder for his endorsement."

While reducing the tax burden on equipment owners, the impact on local government revenue will likely be negligible, according to the nonpartisan Senate Fiscal Agency.

SB 563 passed the Senate by a vote of 37-1 and the House by 103-5 and is supported by the Michigan Farm Bureau.





An amendment to the Animal Control Ordinance No. 115 of the Village of Gagetown, Michigan, regulating the keeping of animals, including dogs, in the Village of Gagetown and providing for the prohibition of certain activities and further providing for penalties on violation of the terms of the ordinance and repealing all prior ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance.

THE VILLAGE OF GAGETOWN HEREBY ORDAINS THE **FOLLOWING CHANGES:**

Section 4 (G) is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

G. No owner shall keep more than two (2) dogs in or about the premises of any single family dwelling except as otherwise set forth herein. Dogs born to a female dog kept within the provisions of this Ordinance may be kept on the premises with a female dog for a period of not more than six (6) months following the date of birth.

Section 4 (K) is added as follows:

Prior to November 11, 2011, an owner may have three (3) dogs in or about the premises of a single family dwelling upon obtaining a license from the Village for the keeping of a third dog. The license shall be issued at the discretion of the Village Council or any officer designated by the Village Council to grant licenses. The issuance is solely within the discretion of the Village and may be denied without cause. Licenses shall only be granted to an owner in a suitable location of the Village and having a proper residence to accommodate three (3) dogs. The license shall be renewable on an annual basis and the license shall be issued only upon the paying of a Twenty-Five (\$25) Dollar license fee. Village officials shall have the right to inspect any premises subject to a license issued under this provision and the owner obtaining a license pursuant to this provision must comply with all other provisions of the Animal Control Ordinance No. 115. Any failure to comply with the terms of Animal Control Ordinance No. 115 will result in the revocation of a license granted pursuant to this provision.

ALL OTHER PROVISIONS OF THE ANIMAL CONTROL ORDI-NANCE (Ordinance No. 115) SHALL REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND

Retail food prices decline slighty during fourth quarter of 2011

Retail food prices at the supermar- oat cereal, down 10 cents to \$3.07 ket declined slightly during the for a 9-ounce box. fourth quarter of 2011, according to the latest American Farm Bureau Federation (AFBF) Marketbasket

The informal survey shows the total cost of 16 food items that can be used to prepare one or more meals was \$49.23, down \$3.89 or about 7 percent compared to the third quarter of 2011. Of the 16 items surveyed, 14 decreased and two increased in average price compared to the prior quarter.

"Since about the last quarter of 2010, we have seen consistently higher prices quarter-to-quarter on a broad range of marketbasket items. "With this survey, that trend appears to have reversed," said AFBF senior economist John Anderson.

Compared to one year ago, the overall basket of food was up about 5 percent.

"While the marketbasket price was still higher year-over-year, the pullback from recent highs on most of the items in the basket suggests that food price inflation is slowing down substantially," said Anderson.

Farmer's share of food dollar

As retail grocery prices have increased gradually over time, the share of the average food dollar that America's farm families receive has dropped.

"In the mid-1970s, farmers received about one-third of consumer retail food expenditures for food eaten at age. Since then, that figure has decreased steadily and is now about 16 percent, according to the Agriculture Department's revised Food Dollar Series," Anderson said. Using the "food at home and away

from home" percentage across-theboard, the farmer's share of this quarter's \$49.23 marketbasket would be \$7.88.

Basket breakdown

Meat and dairy products accounted for about half of the quarter-to-quarter retail price decrease in the latest Marketbasket Survey. Sliced deli ham decreased 74 cents to \$4.69 per pound, shredded cheddar decreased 38 cents to \$4.32 per pound, bacon decreased 36 cents to \$4.05 per pound, sirloin tip roast dropped 13 cents to \$4.15 per pound, ground chuck dropped 10 cents to \$3.17 per pound, boneless chicken breasts decreased 9 cents to \$3.24 per pound and eggs dropped 6 cents to \$1.72 for one dozen.

Other items that decreased in price compared to the third quarter were Russet potatoes, down 68 cents to \$2.75 for a 5-pound bag; Red Delicious apples, down 43 cents to \$1.40 per pound; flour, down 34 cents to \$2.38 for a 5-pound bag; vegetable oil, down 25 cents to \$2.96 for a 32-ounce bottle; bagged salad, down 25 cents to \$2.48 for a 1-pound bag; orange juice, down 11 cents to \$3.17 for a half-gallon; and toasted

Items that increased in price compared to the third quarter were: whole milk, up 10 cents to \$3.76 per gallon; and bread, up 4 cents to \$1.92 for a 20-ounce loaf.

'With consumer confidence still a little shaky closing out the year, it appears that retailers are holding the line on food prices as much as possi-Anderson explained. "Stabilizing energy prices this past quarter also may have helped take some of the pressure off of processor and retailer margins."

Several items showing a decrease in retail price from quarter-to-quarter also showed year-to-year decreases. Compared to one year ago, bagged salad decreased 8 percent; bacon decreased 6 percent, and sliced deli ham and apples each declined 3 per-

Milk and egg trends

In tracking milk and egg trends for the fourth quarter of 2011, shoppers reported the average price for a halfgallon of regular whole milk was \$2.37, down 9 cents from the prior quarter. The average price for one gallon of regular whole milk was \$3.76, up 10 cents. Comparing perquart prices, the retail price for whole milk sold in gallon containers was about 25 percent lower compared to half-gallon containers, a typical volume discount long employed by retailers.

The average price for a half-gallon home and away from home, on aver- of rBST-free milk was \$3.34, down 6 cents from the last quarter, about 40 percent higher than the reported retail price for a half-gallon of regular milk (\$2.37).

The average price for a half-gallon of organic milk was \$3.91, up 20 cents compared to the prior quarter, about 51 percent higher than the reported retail price for a half-gallon of regular milk (\$2.37).

Compared to a year ago (fourth quarter of 2010), the retail price for regular milk in gallon containers was up about 11 percent, while regular milk in half-gallon containers rose 19 percent. The average retail price for rBST-free milk increased 12 percent compared to the prior year, while organic milk was up 9 percent. For the fourth quarter of 2011, the

average price for one dozen regular eggs was \$1.72, down 6 cents compared to the prior quarter. The average price for a dozen "cage-free" eggs was \$2.97, down 13 cents compared to the prior quarter but 75 percent higher than regular eggs. Compared to a year ago (fourth quarter of 2010), regular eggs increased 8 percent while "cage-free" eggs decreased 2 percent.

General background

The year-to-year direction of the Marketbasket Survey tracks with the federal government's Consumer Price Index report for food at home. According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Americans spend just under 10 percent of their disposable annual income on food, the lowest average of any country in the world.

AFBF, the nation's largest general farm organization, has been conductthe informal quarterly Marketbasket Survey of retail food price trends since 1989. A total of 53 shoppers in 18 states participated in the latest survey, conducted at the end of October/early November.




