Cash strapped sheriff hoping millage passes

Simple economics has Tuscola County Sheriff Lee Teschendorf wondering what the future holds for his department.

What he does know for certain is that county voters can make a significant difference if they approve a new special millage designed to supplement sheriff's department revenues, which have taken a beating thanks to plummeting property values and the rising cost of doing busi-

Tuscola County officials are asking voters to approve a tax of .3 of a mill for 6 years during the Tuesday, Feb. 28, presidential primary election. If approved, the millage would be levied through the year 2017 for sheriff's department operations, including emergency management services

The millage would raise an estimated \$414,000 the first year and would cost the owner of an \$80,000 home about \$12 more annually.

"I realize asking the citizens for additional tax support is not popular, and I would not ask if it wasn't necessary, but the current millage can no longer support our public safety efforts," Teschendorf said in a letter sent out to township, village and city officials in the county.

values. "Increased expenses, coupled with the loss of revenue, is just killing us. We're getting hit on both

An existing .9 of a mill tax levied for sheriff's department operations, which voters have repeatedly renewed since 1988, raises roughly \$1.1 million a year. However, that road patrol millage is generating \$78,500 less today than it did just 2 years ago, according to the sheriff. "(That's) causing us to use the fund balance that we could carry over from year to year in the past to be spent on maintaining current services through the end of 2012," he noted. "At the end of the year we anticipate a balance of around

"The sheriff's office road patrol is currently costing approximately \$107,700 more to operate than the millage existing generates," Teschendorf continued.

He said rising expenses are due to a number of factors, including health insurance premiums for 15 deputies (up \$60,000) and liability costs (up \$6,000). "We have not replaced a deputy that retired in early 2011, and the current staffing can just cover 24-7 patrols," Teschendorf added.

Vassar man dies in crash

A Tuscola County man died in a one-car traffic crash early Friday morning in Arbela Township, Tuscola County Sheriff Lee Teschendorf reported. Investigators identified the victim as Vassar area resident Joshua Matzke,

According to Teschendorf, deputies responded at about 2:30 a.m. to Buell Road near Millington Road after a passerby saw a vehicle overturned in a water-filled ditch. The Millington-Arbela Fire Department and an MMR Ambulance crew also responded.

"Firemen and MMR personnel discovered one person in the vehicle. The deputies found that the vehicle had been northbound on Buell Road and gradually left the roadway, struck a mailbox and then went into the ditch and rolled over," Teschendorf said.

An autopsy was scheduled to be performed Saturday to determine the exact cause of death.

Man turns self in in bath salts theft

A suspect's apparent desperation for a new designer drug known as "bath salts" has Huron County Sheriff's deputies investigating a fourth break-in at a Bad Axe business since Christmas.

That suspect turned himself in last Wednesday, 2 days after the burglary targeting Maple Lane Discount, according to Huron County Sheriff Kelly J.

"After following leads and tips, our deputies located the suspect. A Bad Axe area man, accompanied by his attorney, cooperated in giving the statement as to what had occurred," Hanson said. "We have turned over our information to the Huron County Prosecutor's Office for determination of charges.

"This latest (break-in) occurred around 1 a.m. (Monday) and resulted in over \$200 of damage to a glass door and \$135 worth of bath salts being taken. One 250-milligram packet was recovered outside the business, Hanson said.

All 4 break-ins have at least one thing in common; the theft of bath salts. "The reference to 'bath salts' in these thefts is basically a street name. The illegal chemicals referred to ... are methylenedioxypyrovalerone and others," Hanson explained. "Normal department store-type bath salts do not contain these illegal ingredients. The illegal chemicals are believed to be purposely hidden in granular substances similar to bath salts and disguised in their packaging and marketing. Circumventing of the illegal chemicals appears to have taken place."

Not Twila Bardwell.

Bardwell was born Feb. 15, 1922 19 years before the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, which marked the United State's entry into World War II. Her birth year saw a number of notable historical events, including the first time insulin was used to treat diabetes, Joseph Stalin's appointment as the general secretary of the Central Committee of the Soviet Communist Party, the start of construction on Yankee Stadium in the Bronx, and dedication of the Lincoln Memorial in



At Christmas time our 2-4 year-olds were scheduled to sing a special song with motions at the end of the first worship service and the beginning of the second. A couple of the boys made it clear that this wasn't their favorite

When we went on the second time, one boy staged a sit-down strike right there on the platform. He later told his mother, who had practiced the song with him throughout the week, that he did it once and wasn't up for the sec-

A cute little 3-year-old girl had an itch attack during the performance and started scratching at her tights from the bottom up all through the song. We all know what she was going through; we just don't have the nerve to scratch that itch in public.

Then there was the precocious 3-year-old (going on 13) who had selected her chosen play pals for the day. When another girl came up and wanted to join them, she sternly said, "No! We don't want any fat girls playing with us." Man! I didn't think that attitude developed at least until the tween years. Furthermore, the rejected girl wasn't fat.

I usually walk my dog, Shadow, at least once a day through the woods at the local park. During the summer, we stop at the fountain by the pavilion and get a drink. Pregnant? Smoke? Here's a helping hand

Administering a scolding or 2 about the dangers of smoking is nothing new for the Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH), but state health officials recently announced a new initiative that offers expectant mothers more than lip service.

Under the "New Year, New Baby, New You" program, the MDCH Michigan Tobacco Quitline is now offering free coaching for pregnant women who are uninsured or enrolled in Medicaid and want to quit using tobacco.

"Quitting tobacco is one of the most important things a woman can do for her health and the health of her child," said Olga Dazzo, director of the MDCH. "The expansion of support for expectant mothers to the Michigan Tobacco Quitline provides a vital service for the duration of the pregnancy and beyond."

We couldn't agree more.

The facts back up the importance of giving up cigarettes and staying smoke-free both during pregnancy and after the birth. Some of the immediate benefits of quitting include:

- •A lower chance of premature birth.
- A higher chance the baby will be healthy enough to go home the same time mom does.
- •Less upper respiratory and ear infections.
- •Long term, stopping tobacco use will lessen the chances for heart and lung disease, cancer and strokes significantly, as well as other related diseases (lung cancer kills more women than breast cancer in the United States).
- •Further, new smoke-free moms benefit by having more energy and being able to breathe easier.

The Michigan Tobacco Quitline pregnancy program provides ongoing support with up to 9 calls during pregnancy and after delivery. receive their own personal quit coach, who has received advanced training on helping pregnant women quit using tobacco. Other benefits include a \$5 or \$10 reward card for each completed phone appointment.

To be eligible, callers must enroll in cessation services with the Michigan Tobacco Quitline by calling 1-800-QUIT NOW. Callers must let the quitline representative know they are expecting to receive the free service.

The state's efforts to help citizens give up tobacco has already netted plenty of interest. In fact, the *quitline has recorded more than 67,000 calls since* it was launched in October 2003.

Just about any former smoker will tell you that giving up the habit is one of the most difficult things they've ever accomplished. But they'll also tell you it's more than worthwhile.

That goes double for expectant moms, whose decision to quit is the best gift they can give to their child and to themselves.



Old newspapers are blast from the past

I'm not much of a history buff, but I recently found myself fascinated by a discovery in my workroom — an old cardboard box full of keepsakes stored away for years.

Among the aged photos, high school band medals and patches, cards and old class photos, even my kindergarten class picture (before you think it, yes, they took them back then, although they were black and white), I found a small stack of issues of the Grand Rapids Press.

The late Jack Esau, a walking history lesson in his time if there ever was one, was the first person I thought of when I scanned the front pages dating back to 1945.

I'm not sure how I came to have them, but as a newspaper reporter, I was drawn to read those papers and wonder what it was like back then, when folks had to rely on news hawks and radio broadcasts for word about World War II.

I hope you enjoy these snippets as much as I did:

• A headline on the front page of the April 15 edition reads, "DOOM NEARS FOR BERLIN".

Paris — (AP) — The drums of doom were throbbing nearer Berlin Saturday night as massive Russian armies were reported on the move from the east towards Germany's symbol city and tank columns of the American First and Third armies slashed beyond Leipzig toward Hitler's battered capital.

Fleets of RAF heavy bombers were pounding Berlin and its western suburban town of Potsdam in possible softening up attacks ahead of Allied ground forces.

Europe was aflame with rumors of an impending decisive blow at the Reich capital as a vice of steel closed relentlessly upon it from east and

•A huge front page headline on an "extra" edition dated Aug. 14 proclaims, "JAPANESE CONCEDE DEFEAT, ACCEPT ALLIED TERMS'

Washington — (UP) — President Truman announced Tuesday night that the Japanese government had accepted the unconditional surrender terms without qualifications. The president also revealed he had named Gen. Douglas MacArthur the supreme commander to receive the Japanese surrender.

•A day later, under the headline "SURRENDER STOPS MOST FIR-ING, ENDS OFFENSIVES" is a smaller story announcing the end of gas rationing.

Washington — (UP) — OPA Wednesday announced immediate termination of the rationing of gasoline, canned fruits and vegetables, fuel oil and oil stoves.

Price Administrator Chester Bowles said meats, fats and oils, butter, sugar, shoes and tires would stay on the ration list "until military cutbacks and increased production brings civilian supplies more nearly in balance with civilian demand."

•Also in the Aug. 15 edition, the paper reports the sinking of a cruiser and the loss of 883 men.

Guam — (AP) — Two great explosions flashed out of its slim bow at 12 minutes past midnight. Flames streaked through shock-darkened passageways, searing the piled bodies of its crew into shapeless masses. Within 15 minutes, it plunged headfirst into the sea.

That was the end of the proud cruiser Indianapolis — torpedoed 450 miles off Leyte July 30 with 883 dead and missing after it had finished a record speed run from San Francisco to Guam to deliver the first atomic bomb to the B29s. It apparently fell prey to a Japanese submarine.



Veteran teacher marks 90th birthday

Back at home in the Thumb, Bardwell said education wasn't her first career choice.

"I grew up in the big town of Kingston," she joked, noting her mother ran a boarding house whose residents included a number of educators. "I wanted to be a beautician, but I had teachers and a superintendent and his wife living with me. They told my mom I shouldn't be a beautician. They didn't think it was a good field."

Still, teaching came naturally for Bardwell, who recalled playing "school" with her dolls and her friends as a youngster — she always played the role of the teacher.

As a young woman, she enrolled at Central Michigan University and 4 years later walked out with a 4-year degree in education. She began her teaching career in 1940 at the Miller School, a rural school west of Caro that served about 14 students in grades K-9 at the time.

Bardwell taught for a few years before taking off 15 years to raise 3 children. Following a consolidation of the Caro Schools, she returned to her career after being offered a fifth grade classroom. That arrangement lasted just one year, and she spent the next 43 years teaching third grade, including more than 41 years at Schall Elementary School in Caro.

"I liked it. Third graders were no problem. The parents at that time made sure they minded," she recalled. "They had to behave, but I never spanked them. If they were naughty, I'd have them stay in and put their heads down during part of

Over the years, Bardwell embraced many changes in school, including the introduction of computers, and she never considered switching

"I never even thought about it. I just thought, this is where I was supposed to be," she said.

Today, Bardwell resides at Northwood Meadows in Cass City, where she enjoys a number of activities, including weekly bingo and piano lessons.

Looking back, she figures 2,000 or more children — 3 generations worth — passed through her classrooms over the years. "I still see them (former students), and they know me, but I don't know them,' she said.

Although the faces may not be familiar these days, Bardwell indicated she never regretted making children and education the focus of what turned out to be a very success-

ful and lengthy career.

Her secret? "You've got to have discipline, you have to love it, you have to keep up with the times," she explained. "I loved it. I liked everything about it."



Teschendorf said the additional tax on next week's ballot would pay for the following:

- •\$9,000 to reinstate cuts in training/equipment, etc.
- •\$36,000 to pay for a half-time department computer specialist, position slated for elimination in

"This will leave a balance of \$42,000 from the anticipated revenue of \$414,000 that can be used for additional programs such as alcohol enforcement, reinstate (the) child safety seat project that has been eliminated, additional cost increases, and allow for some fund balance that can be saved for unforeseen or unexpected emergencies," Teschendorf explained.

"If the millage fails to pass," he added, "it will result in deputies being laid off in 2013, at which time the office may not be able to provide 24-hour public safety coverage to the citizens of Tuscola County.'

"Our office has been monitoring sales of bath salts throughout our county since these ingredients became illegal in August of last year. We have been submitting random samples of bath salts to the crime lab to determine whether the law from last year applies," Hanson said. 'Unfortunately, the results have shown that current products do not contain the specific illegal ingredi-

"Producers have been able to create other chemical ingredients that are not specifically prohibited by law. They have the same effect on the user, thus avoiding being illegal bath salts. Prices of these bath salts range from \$10 for a quarter ounce to \$250 for 10 ounces — obviously not the going rate for regular bath salts."

Hanson said his department has been running into bath salts use and their effects on a more regular basis since August.

"Just (recently), 2 people were incarcerated in our jail and were under the influence of bath salts consumption," he added. "These individuals were involved in physical altercations, which from our understanding commonly occurs among users of these substances. One individual became severely depressed, making the statement that because of his addiction, he had spent birthday money (set aside) for his child. We have been involved in 4 situations that involved individuals severely

involve violence as a form of getting a detoxification center."

Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH) officials reported a surge of emergency room visits across the state related to the recreational use of bath salts beginning in the fall of 2010, with at least one suspected death. Most of the users were young adults in their 20s and 30s.

The rising thefts and run-ins with users of bath salts has prompted Hanson to describe the drugs as a serious problem in the Thumb com-

"I am concerned about what an individual who is addicted to these so-called bath salts will do for their addiction," he said. "We have contacted Huron Medical Center and Huron Behavioral Health to learn that they have treated several individuals for severe physical and mental effects due to the ingestion of bath salts. Because these bath salts have the same effects as a person on a 'crack binge' or someone under the influence of methamphetamine, I am concerned that this problem...will continue to grow. Reports of teenagers experimenting with these salts have been coming in and parents need to be aware of this problem.'

Anyone with information related to any of the break-ins or use of bath salts is encouraged to call the Huron County Sheriff's Department at (989) 269-6500 during regular business hours, or central dispatch at (989) 269-6421 anytime. Residents affected by consumption of bath can also offer anonymous tips by salts. One individual who hadn't calling the sheriff's department's tip


