Blazes destroy two Thumb area homes

The combined loss in a house fire about 4 1/2 miles northeast of Cass City Thursday was estimated at more than \$200,000.

The blaze was one of two that

utilized decades ago on multi-level houses did not seal off one floor to the next, enabling flames from the basement — where the fire ignited — to quickly climb up through the walls to the attic.

The appearance of smoke from both the basement and attic "showed us, destroyed homes in the area last basically, they had fire going on week. No injuries were reported at throughout the house," added

Elkland Township fire fighters were dispatched to the Robert McLachlan residence, 5191 Moore Rd, at about noon Thursday. Fire Chief Glenn Guilds said his department arrived to find smoke coming out of both the basement and attic of the old 2-story farmhouse, located just north of Huron Line Road in Huron County's Grant Township.

Guilds said McLachlan and his wife escaped the residence unhurt after smelling smoke.

According to the fire chief, the couple's home had been remodeled, however, the construction techniques

Guilds, who noted fire fighters attempted to enter the structure three times, but were driven back by the heat and smoke.

Investigators said the fire started near a wood burner in the basement, although they could not determine a specific cause. The home was left somewhat intact

after fire fighters extinguished the flames, but the roof and floors were caving in, prompting Guilds to call in an excavator to level the remains. "It was a safety issue," he said, adding the cold temperatures caused a number of equipment headaches for fire crews.

Guilds estimated the loss at \$150,000 for the structure plus another \$70,000 for contents. The McLachlans are insured.

Cass City firemen remained at the scene for about 7 hours. They were assisted by the Elmwood Township-Gagetown, Oliver-Elkton, Owendale, Bad Axe and Bingham Township fire departments.

TOO LATE

Elkland Township firemen were called to another house fire early Friday morning, but arrived to find the ranch-style home southwest of the village had been burning for some time.

"It was completely on the ground, so it had been burning for a couple hours," Guilds said. A passerby reported the fire at 5800 River Rd., located about 2 1/2 miles west of Cemetery Road, at about 5 a.m.

Guilds reported the homeowner, Robert Mullin, was working at Michigan Sugar Co. when the blaze

Guilds said there was no way to determine the cause. "It burned so hot and fast and complete, we have no idea," added the fire chief, who estimated the loss at \$60,000 for the structure and \$25,000 for contents. Mullin was not insured.

Fire fighters, including assisting crews from the Elmwood Township-Gagetown and Kingston fire departments, remained at the scene for about four hours.

Local resident charged with embezzling from Millennium

Amber R. Hennessey, 26, Cass City, was charged in Tuscola County District Court with felony embezzlement of "money or personal property" totaling between \$20,000 and \$50,000 while serving as an agent or employee of Millennium Industries, 6285 Garfield Ave., Cass City.

She also faces a second felony count — embezzlement of \$1,000 to \$20,000 in "money or unemployment insurance benefits, or personal property", also from Millennium.

The first count carries a maximum prison term of 10 years, while the second count is punishable by up to 5 years behind bars.

Prosecutors allege the crimes took place over the course of 16 months, from April 2011 through August

The Cass City Police Department began its investigation into the allegations in October 2012, according to reports, which state plant officials claimed the thefts took place while Hennessey was employed as human resources manager at Millennium.

Officials allege Hennessey stole cash from various locations in the plant, improperly used corporate credit cards, and overpaid herself. The total amount involved was \$21,280, plus another \$4,344 in unemployment benefits, reports

Cass City Police Chief Craig Haynes lauded Sgt. James Freeman's work on what turned out to be a lengthy and complicated investigation. "(He) did an excellent job," Haynes said.

Several scholarships are awarded annually to Huron County's outstanding ingoing freshmen students from the Anthony L. Rapes Memorial Scholarship Fund. The scholarship is in honor of Tony Rapes, a longtime Extension agricultural agent in Huron County, with the first scholarships being awarded in 1981. In 2013 there were seven scholarships awarded.

HPV vaccinations can prevent cancer

Michigan Department of Community Health officials are reminding all women To their credit, they didn't get me any ordinary blender. They purchased one with a to stay current on their cervical cancer screening as a means to improve their health in 2014.

In 2010, 344 Michigan women were diagnosed with invasive cervical cancer, and in 2011, 121 Michigan women died from the disease.

Despite those numbers, health officials say cervical cancer is essentially preventable.

According to experts, roughly 70 percent of cervical cancer cases in this country could be prevented by the human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccination. Three doses of HPV vaccine are recommended for girls and boys at 11-12 years of age, but the vaccine can be given up through age

The HPV vaccine is safe, effective and produces better immunity when given at the recommended age. However, as of October 2013, only 30.1 percent of Call me crazy, but I decided to give it a try. females and 7.5 percent of males ages 13 to 17 had received the entire three-dose vaccine series, according to Michigan Care Improvement Registry data.

A simple, affordable and easy-to-administer screening test for cervical cancer has been widely available for 70 years. Still, more than half of cervical cancer deaths are seen in women who have really about LIFE either never had a Pap test, or have not had testing in more than five years. Along with a lack of screening, the most significant risk factor for cervical cancer is infection by the HPV. In fact, 99 percent of cervical cancers are caused by

Screening for cervical cancer is recommended to begin at age 21. Under the Affordable Care Act (ACA), women's preventative care — such as mammograms, screenings for cervical cancer, prenatal care, immunizations and other services — is covered.

Vaccines for Children (VFC), Medicaid, MI-Child and most health insurances pay for HPV vaccine.

If your child does not have health insurance, or does not have insurance that covers these vaccines, ask your health care provider or local health department about the VCF program, which provides no-or-low cost vaccines to eligible children ages 18 and younger.

My kids reacted with a one-word exclamation: "Smoothies!"




