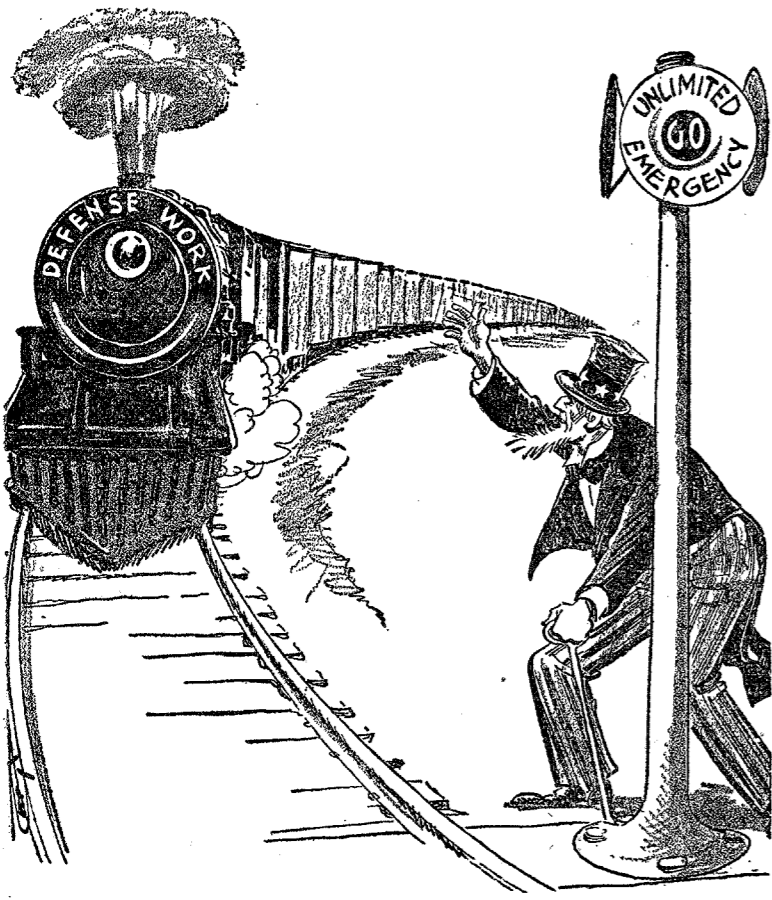


Right of Way

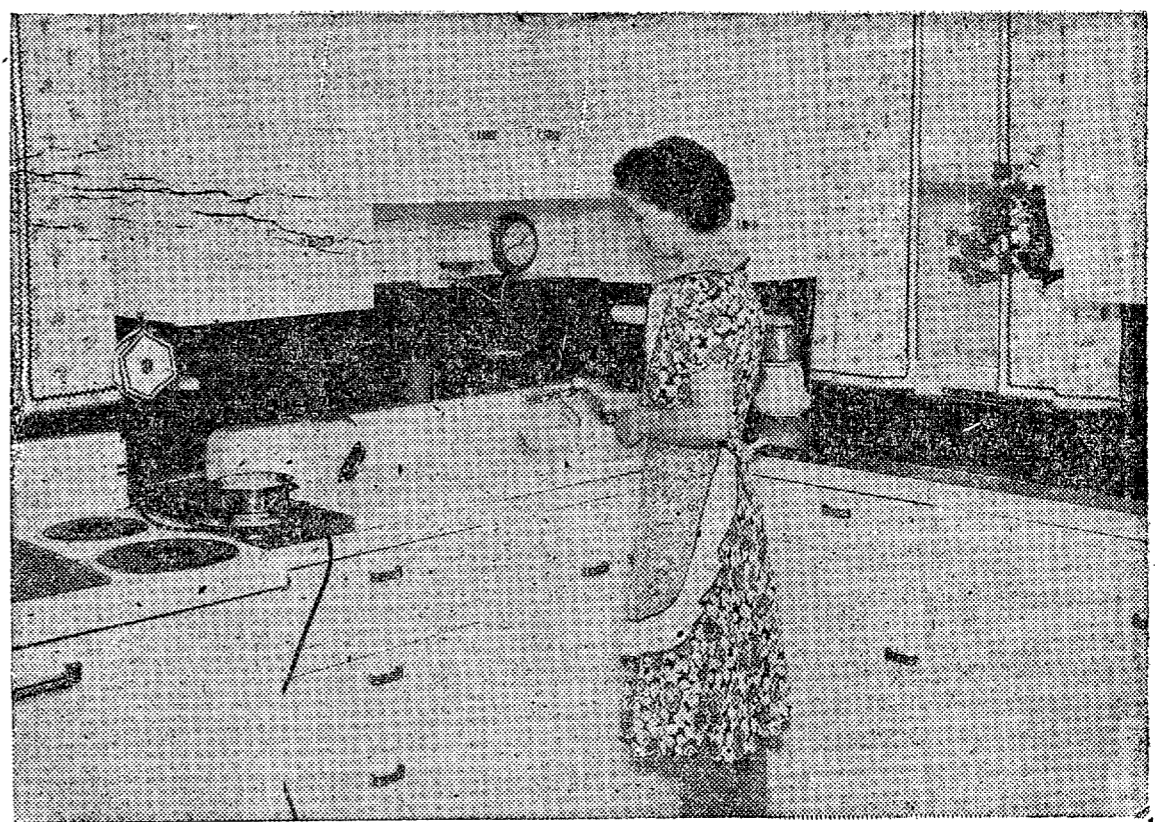
