Concluded from page 1. and if these requests are granted, the inflated budget would be boosted \$13,000,000 more. The Democratic legislative policy, as apparently influenced by Governor Williams and his CIO labor advisors, follows the proposals of President Truman: More government spending, more taxation.

Republican legislative leaders are willing to adjust state appropriations to current needs, providing the increase is "reasonable." There is where the two parties cannot agree.

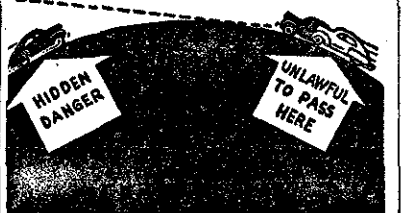
What should the legislature do about the prospective treasury deficit? Rep. John Espie, veteran chairman of the house ways and means committee, had indicated that he favors a general reduction in state appropriations but no decision on new taxes at this time.

Root of the financial trouble, of course, is the constitutional amendment twice upheld by the voters which earmarks a little more than 78 per cent of all sales tax revenues for local government. This leaves only 22 per cent for state needs.

A number of legislative bills have been introduced, and now are in process of legislative consideration, which would abolish state services outright.

Governor Williams has said repeatedly that the state government, for the most part, was efficiently run and that he saw no need to eliminate state services. He would retain them, amplify them to meet new needs, and then balance the budget by imposing new taxes.

The State Senate has reversed an old policy of secret session for confirmation of appointments by the governor. This change was span-

sored by Sen. Colin L. Smith (Big Rapids) who said newspaper correspondents should have access to senate debate instead of having to rely on second-hand reports of what had been said.

Now that the April election is out of the way, the legislature may be counted on to clear the decks fairly quickly of important bills. Weeks have been devoted to study of these measures. Only the voters' verdict on April 4 was needed to break the log jam.
