





Thousands of refugee children, such as this one being fed by Sister Klara, Lutheran nurse in the Lobe Haus Children's home in Munich, ave been supplied with milk through the contributions of Ameri-can farmers to the Christian Rural Overseas Program (CROP), according to John D. Metzler, national chairman.

In the year ending June 1, CROP handled 75,668,581 pounds of farm commodities, valued at \$6,576,000. Included in this amount were 4,470,-000 pounds of milk. Shipments were

made to 22 foreign countries. "Since milk is desperately need-ed, we shall strive to obtain a larger quantity of it in the 1949 CROP cam-paign," Metzler said. "In many areas children over nine months still get no milk at all. Younger ones get one-fourth pint a day." CROP is sponsored nationally by Catholic Rural Life, Church World Service, and Lutheran World Relief.


