





More Jobs Ahead For Rural Youth

Numerous Openings In Related Fields

Jobs in fields related to agriculture are multiplying rapidly, and many young people from farm areas are being drawn into these new positions, the U.S. Department of Agriculture reports.

On a national average there are now 168 young farm men to replace every 100 farmers who die or reach retirement age. As a result, almost 40 percent of boys now growing up on farms are expected to seek employment off the farm when they reach manhood.

Many new positions are available for these young men who leave the farm. For example, there will be two jobs waiting this year for almost every graduate in agriculture from our land-grant universities and colleges. Some 8,500 students are expected to graduate, and there are approximately 15,-



More and more jobs in fields related to agriculture are becoming available—jobs in which a "farm" background will be an outstanding asset.

000 job openings for them in fields related to agriculture. These include positions in teaching, research, extension, communications, conservation, farm services, and others.

Many jobs are available also for hose who don't have a college education. They include work in ndustry, trucking, artificial breeding, repair and servicing of farm machinery, fruit spraying, airplane dusting, and many other fields. The increase in off-farm employ-

ment opportunities has accompanied the national decrease in numbers of farms. There are about 1.6

million fewer commercial farms today than there were 25 years







Tell Best Nitrogen Application Per Acre for Beets

Best rate of application of supplementary nitrogen to sugar beets is 40 to 50 pounds per acre.

This recommendation resulted from research done by the Michigan State University soil science department in cooperation with the state's beet sugar industry. Rates of 80 to 100 pounds per

acre proved excessive and lowered the purity and sugar content of the beets, according to Don R. Kebler, assistant county agricultural agent. As a result, the extra sugar produced did not pay for the additional nitrogen. Also, processing costs go up with a decrease in per cent sucrose and purity.

High yields of sugar per acre are the goal in sugar beet grow ing. Increasing the root yields is not always desirable if sugar content and purity are unduly sacrificed.

Nitrogen sidedressings should not be applied later than at blocking and thinning time. Anhydrous ammonia, low-pressure and non-pressure solutions, ammonium nitrate, ammonium sulfate and urea are satisfactory forms to use.
