In a lengthy session Tuesday night, George Vilican pre-sented a master plan for Cass City for consideration by the Cass City Planning Commission.

The bulky 110-page book covers every phase of the community as it is and as the planners expect it to be in the future and recommends changes to improve the village.

Vilican points out in his master plan that there is enough land area in the community for a popu-lation of some 5,000 persons and predicts that Cass City's population will be about 3,000 Pageant Out persons by 1980. Because of the area the vil- For One Year

All Crops Need **Trace Elements**

We are hearing a lot these days about trace elements, relates Don R. Kebler, and one begins to wonder if we need to add them to our

area soils. All crops do need and use trace elements in varying amounts and kinds. However, Michigan mineral soils, suitable for economic crop production, are generally endowed with sufficient well amounts of these elements.

With this in mind, it is generally found that the only trace elements needed for certain crops

in this area are manganese and boron. Deficiencies for these two elements do show up noticeably as Concluded from page one.

White Grub Damage **Found in Wheat**

White grub damage is being found in some Michigan wheat fields this fall, according to Alfred Ballweg, county extension director. However, as of this date none has been reported by Tuscola county farmers.

Leaves of damaged plants first turn yellow and later brown before they die. When these plants are pulled up, it is found that they have been eaten off below the

surface of the soil. Generally, several adjacent plants in a row will be attacked with skips of undamaged plants between damaged sections. Spotty

damage usually indicates a number of grubs at work. Control is not practical for white grubs in wheat at this time. Most of the damage has already been done. The grubs head down







where one might expect a high grub infestation, such as when wheat follows a grass sod in the Wheat may also yellow in the fall due to powdery mildew, said Ballweg. This disease forms spots of powdery material on the leaves during early stages of infection. Leaves later turn yellow and may die as the infection progresses.
