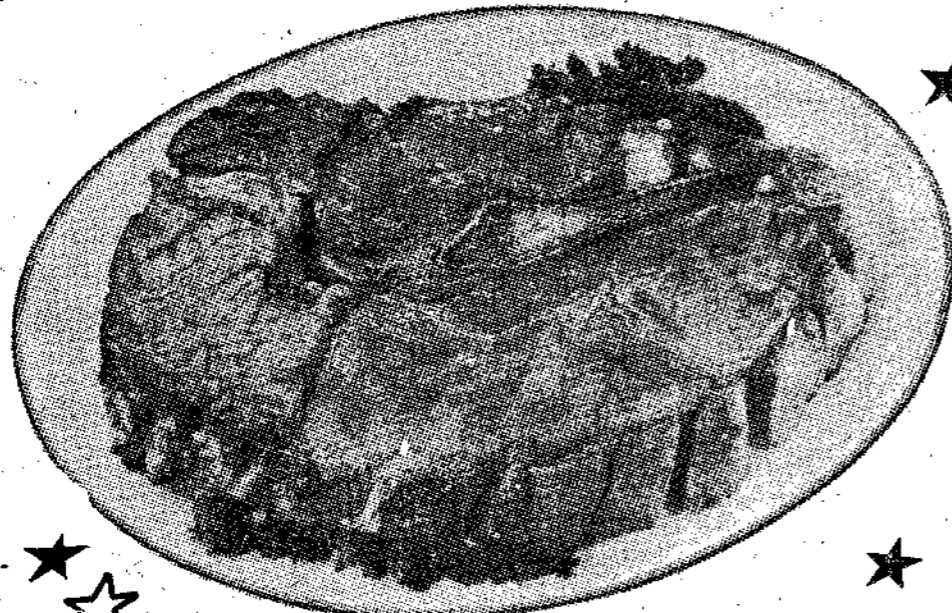

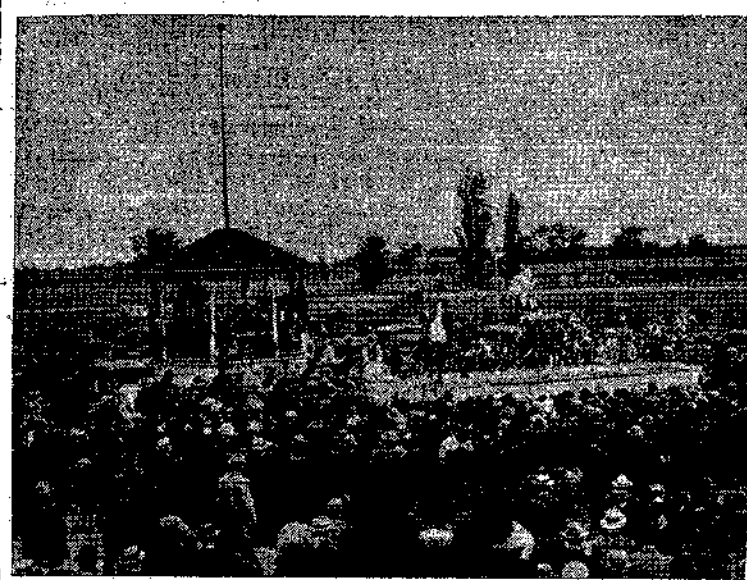
Wild Cats Were Shot In Cass City Area
