16 UPS drivers feted for safe road records

Sixteen area drivers have obtained a new safe driving record for the Michigan district of United Parcel Service (UPS).

Monday, UPS delivery drivers working out of Cass City surpassed 10,000 safe

driver days without having an avoidable accident. In reaching the record, the drivers have traveled over 1,350,000 miles on area roads, roughly equivalent to 54 trips around the world at the equator or 5½ trips to the moon.

The drivers, honored at a special ceremony held Tuesday morning at Charmont Lanes, are Chuck Wright, 13 years of safe driving; Francis Withey, 12; Jerry Nowaczyk, 10; Bob McIntosh, eight; John Ross, eight; Les Nicholas,

seven; Wally Hempton, five, and Harvey Francis, Willy Goodall, Bob Knowlton, Les Merchant, Ed Mitchell, Dave Smith, Rick VanVliet, Al Wallace and Otis Wright. In the course of their normal jobs, the Cass City UPS drivers travel about eight times as many miles a year as the average American driver, a company spokesman said.

It has taken 38 months, including 806 work days, for the 16 drivers to reach the record. On hand for the ceremony honoring the drivers were State Police Lt. Leo Sieting of the Bad Axe post, and Sgt. Newton Jerome, Safety and Traffic Division, Bay City post.

Also participating were UPS safety manager Gerry Carey, district manager Paul Zraggen, division manager Ed Genger and personnel manager Bill Keane.

Four persons were sentenced to jail terms in separate cases heard before Judge Norman Baguley in Tuscola County Circuit Court Monday in Caro.

Frank A. Mitchell, 20, Flint, was sentenced to serve from 7½ to 15 years in Jackson prison following his jury conviction of attempted armed robbery. He will receive credit for 95 days already served.

In his sentence order, Judge Baguley recommended Mitchell receive vocational training.

Mitchell was arrested in July, 1976, in Wells township.

Jerry Bland, 27, Caro, was ordered to serve from six to 10 years in Jackson prison following his guilty plea to charges of breaking and entering the Caro Glass Co. in January, 1976.

Bland will receive credit for 105 days already served in the Tuscola County Jail.

The court granted an appeal bond of \$20,000 and agreed to appoint an attorney

for Bland's appeal.

William Davis, 41, Mayville, was sentenced to serve from three to five years in Jackson prison after a circuit court jury found him guilty of a third DUI (driving under the influence of liquor) charge.

Davis will receive 50 days credit for time already served. Judge Baguley recommended he receive counseling for alcoholism.

Davis was arrested in Fremont township May 20, 1976.

Terry Lee Young, 20, Cass City, stood mute during his arraignment on charges of attempted breaking and entering at the Quaker Maid Dairy Store March 27.

An innocent plea was entered and pre-trial examination was set for May 31.

Young was also sentenced to continued probation plus six months in the county jail in connection with an earlier probation violation charge. He will receive credit for 37 days already served.

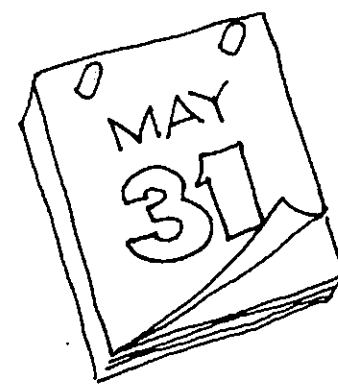

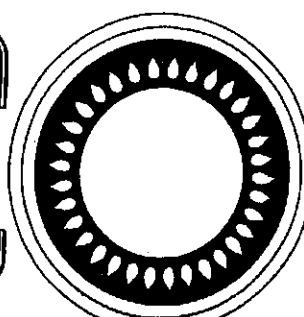

One-act musical, displays to highlight arts 'Evening'

An original one-act play, band and choir performances and an array of projects on display will go into this year's "Evening With the Arts," slated next Thursday, May 12, from 7:00-10:00 p.m. at Cass City High School.

This is the third presentation of its type in the past four years, but it's not just a carbon copy of past performances, according to Mrs. Jackie Zawilinski, coordinator for the event. One of the highlights of this year's program is a one-act musical, "A Cowboy's Work is Never Done", written and produced by Frances Kozan,

a sophomore. The show runs 25 minutes and includes seven songs which Miss Kozan admits she "borrowed" from other composers. But the script is all original and takes place in a 1950's malt shop.

Stars of the show are Rick Gould, who portrays "Cowboy Sam" and Sal Porritt as "Belle", the object of the cowpoke's affection. The 10-member cast also includes Lora Gutierrez, Brenda Herron, Cathy Hobart, Paul Kerbyson, Miss Kozan, Tim Tuckey, Janice Wentworth and Ann Whitaker.

This isn't the first play Miss Kozan has written, but it's the first one scheduled to play before a relatively large audience.

That's just one phase of the evening, according to Mrs. Zawilinski.

"There will be a foreign language drama presentation, concerts by the Cass City High School band and choir and displays from the industrial arts and creative arts students featured in the school's hallways.

"We're also featuring a writing contest," Mrs. Zawilinski said. "We have two divisions with three winners

in each. The categories are non-fiction, short story and poetry. We'll have a booklet made up for distribution that people attending can take with them."

She said judging will be handled by the English teachers at the school and awards will be presented to winners that evening.

Actually, there might not have been an "Evening With the Arts" this year if students hadn't pushed for it, Mrs. Zawilinski said. "Most of us had felt it was too much work and that there might not be a lot of interest in it," she said, "but a number of students felt disappointed that we were thinking of dropping it."

As a result, about 200 high school students will either have work displayed or be participating in some phase of the evening. And there hasn't been any lack of enthusiasm either, she says.

"It just seems to gain momentum each year," Mrs. Zawilinski said. "I think it's good because such an emphasis is placed on sports, we wanted to show the community that the kids are learning to do other things besides participate in sports."

Admission to "Evening With the Arts" is free.
