## Spotting children's vision problems

A child's behavior is often a clue to spotting undetected vision problems in need of prompt professional attention, says the president of the Michigan Optometric Association.

According to Dr. James M. Flynn, children do not know when they are not seeing as well as they should and they often develop ways of living with their vision problem. Alert parents can spot behavior symptoms that indicate a need for a thorough vision examination.

One such symptom is constantly sitting close to the television set. "All children will sit close some of the time but the child or teen-ager who always takes a close seat may be nearsighted," Dr. Flynn said.

Another symptom of nearsightedness is a preference for reading and other close work over outdoor or sports activities. A farsighted child may avoid near activity and have trouble with school work.

"Children with vision per-

ception or binocular coordination problems will likely have difficulty learning to read and, when older, reading to learn, even though they test out at average or above average intelligence," Dr. Flynn said.

Other symptoms of vision problems are frequent clumsiness, short attention span for the child's age, frequent blinking, complaints of nausea, dizziness or headaches after reading or doing other close work, poor eye-hand coordination for the child's age, scowling or squinting, watering eyes, a tendency to rub the eyes, a tense position when looking at objects far away or close up, covering one eye when reading, tilting the head to one side when doing close work, or holding a book close to the eyes or the head close to a book.

## Draft registration is necessary

Louis Walsh has a son, 16, who, if President Carter has his way, will be registering for the draft in two years.

What does he think of the President's proposal, made during Carter's State of the Union address to Congress last Wednesday?

"It bothers me, but I was in the service myself," Walsh said. "What are you going to do?"

"I think it (registration) is something that has to be done, the way things are going."

Walsh supported what is now being called the Carter Doctrine. The President explained in his speech that "an attempt by any outside force to gain control of the Persian Gulf region will be regarded as an assault on the vital interests of the United States . . . (and) . . . will be repelled by use of any means necessary, including military force."

"If they (Russia) keep on going the way they are," Walsh said, "they'll be over here invading us if we don't put a stop to it."

The dairy farmer does feel

the United States should encourage other countries to assist in repelling Soviet aggression in various ways. "There's no reason why we should do it all the time."

As for increased spending for the military, Walsh feels Carter doesn't have much choice. "We got to do that."

He and his wife, Rosalie have three children, Rodney, Rachel, 19, who is attending college, and Rebecca, 20, who lives in Fenton. The Walsh home is on Cumber Road, Ubyly.

The Human Development Commission (HDC) is in need of senior citizens (men and women) who are interested in becoming foster grandparents.

Foster grandparents work with children who have special needs in schools, special education programs or state institutions.

Each Foster Grandparent works four hours per day, five days per week. In return for their services, they receive a tax-free stipend, transportation allowance, annual physical examination, accident insurance, a smock, and support from the program staff.

To be eligible for the Foster Grandparent Program, persons must be 60 or older, low-income, and be physically able to serve. No educational requirements are involved.

Through the FGP, many grandparents report improved health and more enjoyment from life, according to HDC Executive Director Mary Ann Vandemark. They also have the opportunity to meet other Foster Grandparents and people in their communities while providing a very valuable and rewarding service.
