After a wedding trip to Pennsylvania, the couple is living in Salinas, Calif.

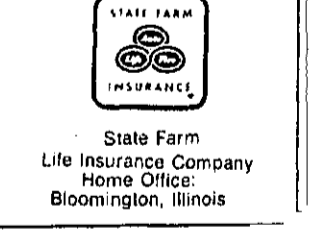
