
New books at the library

Immunization clinics set in Sanilac

The Sanilac County Health Department will conduct its immunization and 25, at its office at 115 N. Elk Street, Sandusky.

Hours both days are 9:30-11:30 a.m. and 1:30-4 p.m. If possible, parents whose last name begins with A-M should attend the first day; N-Z the second day.

Protection against measles, rubella, mumps, whooping cough, diphtheria, tetanus and polio, plus tuberculin tests, will be offered.

Children three months of age and older can attend. A parent or guardian must accompany their children. Parents should bring a record of their children's previous immunizations.
