Eugene J. Lemanski, 44, manager of the Thumb Electric Co-operative power plants at Ubyly and Caro, died Sunday at his home in Ubyly of a self-inflicted gunshot wound.

He was born March 26, 1936, in Bingham township. Lemanski and Jeanette Shemka were married Aug. 29, 1959, at St. Mary's Catholic church, Parisville.

They lived in Warren until 1962, when they moved to Ubyly.

A Thumb Electric Co-operative employee since 1966, he had been manager of the Ubyly and Caro power plants since 1976. He also operated a hydraulic repair service in Ubyly since 1964.

Surviving are his wife; two daughters, Carol and Anne Lemanski, both of Ubyly; one son, Jerry Lemanski, Ubyly; his mother, Mrs. Delia Chisholm, Rose City; one sister, Mrs. Virginia Sager, Redford township; one brother, Roy Lemanski, Lake Orion, and his foster parents, Mr. and Mrs. Anthony Maurer, Ubyly.

Funeral services were held Wednesday morning at St. John's Catholic church, Ubyly. Father Julius Spleet officiated, with burial in the church cemetery.

A wake service was conducted Tuesday evening at Zinger Funeral Home, Ubyly.

## Beef recipes needed for annual cook-off

The Michigan Beef Industry Commission is looking for new ideas using beef chuck, round, rump, and brisket for its 1980 Michigan Beef Cook-Off.

Finalists in the contest will participate in cook-off competition at Michigan State University June 21.

Basic contest rules are:

- The dish must contain a minimum of 2 pounds beef, not to exceed 5 pounds beef.
- Cooking time should not exceed 4 hours.
- Recipes must be specific, no brand names included.
- Entrants must be 18 or over. Recipes should be typed or clearly printed and mailed to: Cook-Off; Michigan Beef Industry Commission; 122 S. Grand Avenue, Suite 201; Lansing 48933.
- Entry deadline is May 10. Be sure to include your name and complete mailing address.

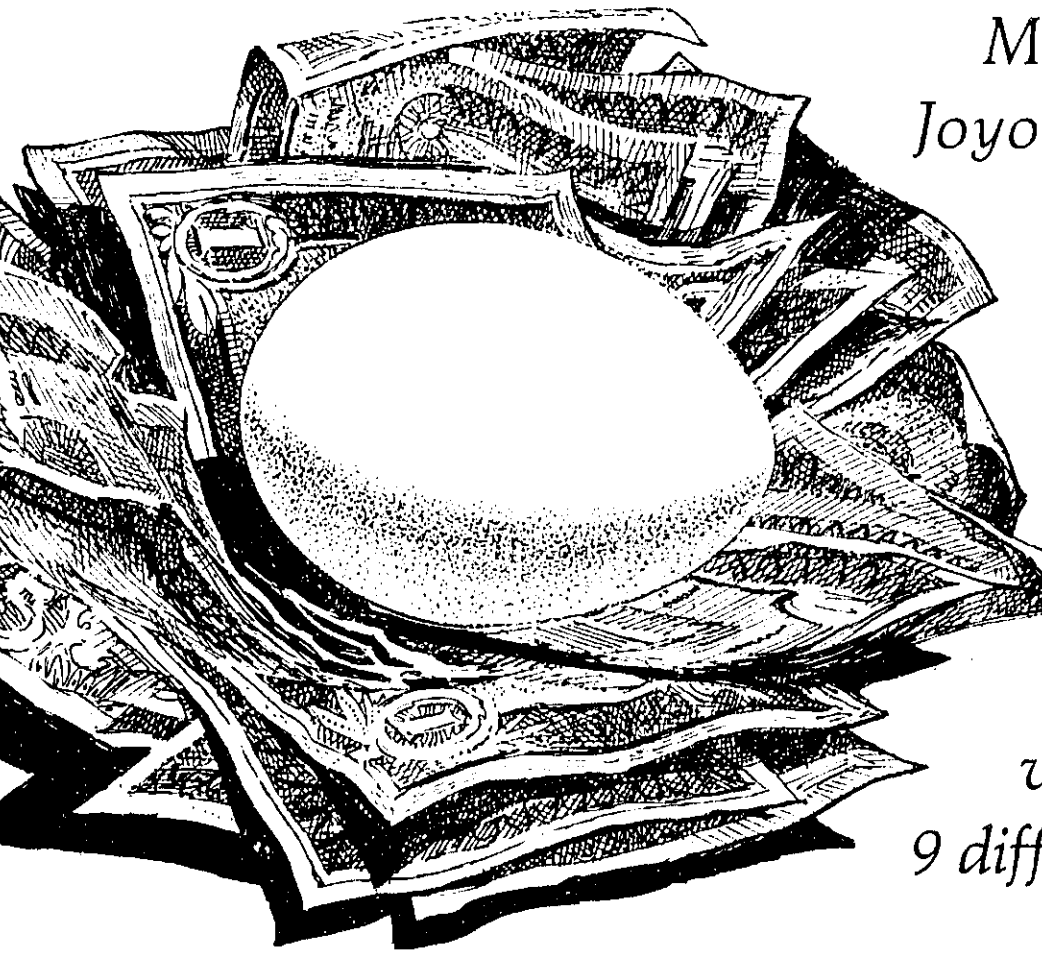
