More money needed for roads,

2 townships slate millage votes

The county money, however, is contingent on the townships appropriating \$6,000 per mile, in addition to the \$4,000 previously ap-propriated, and the Road Commission paying the balance, expected to be \$10,000 per mile, for a total of \$30,000 per mile.

The Greenleaf Township Board, according to Clerk Clare Brown, has set aside \$50,000 in its 1980 budget for its share -- \$40,000 for the four miles mentioned, plus \$10,000, should it be decided elsewhere to also pave the mile of Germania south of Cass City Road.

Since the general fund budget totals only \$67,000, the \$50,000 for Germania, he said, "will cut it pretty thin.

As for whether the Road Commission board will appropriate its \$10,000 per mile, its engineer-manager, Greenleaf -- The Sanilac Jack Kineman, told the Chronicle Monday it will be


