Navy Machinist's Mate 3rd Class Frederick J. Ondrajka, son of Mable Ondrajka of 5240 Risky Road, Gageton, has returned from a deployment in the Mediterranean.

He is a crewmember aboard the frigate USS Bowen, homeported in Charleston, S.C. While deployed, his ship operated as a unit of the U.S. 6th Fleet.

During the seven-month cruise, the Bowen participated in training exercises with the navies of Great Britain, Spain, Italy, Germany and Tunisia.

Several port visits were made in various Italian cities and in Spain, Toulon, France and Tunisia.

The Bowen is a 438 foot-long "Knox" class frigate with a crew of 283, equipped with guns, missiles and rockets. The ship normally carries a light helicopter for long range detection and attack of submarines.

### Stewardship week for soil celebrated

The Tuscola Soil Conservation District is joining in the nationwide celebration of Soil Stewardship Week, May 11-18, according to John Findlay, District Chairman.

Theme of this year's celebration is "The Judgment of Nature." Its focus is especially appropriate as the United States considers the current condition of its soil, water and related resources.

The loss of some 3 million acres of productive agricultural land each year through urbanization and other uses, the decline in productivity of topsoil as the result of destructive erosion, and continuing pollution of the nation's waters is serious cause for everyone's concern, Findlay said.

Participation in Soil Stewardship Week activities offers an opportunity to reflect on the nation's natural resource problems and consider actions to resolve them or reduce their impact.

The National Association of Conservation Districts has sponsored Soil Stewardship Week in the United States since 1955, in cooperation with the nation's nearly 3,000 soil and water conservation districts. Informative material and bulletin inserts were distributed to 24 churches in Tuscola county for this year's observance.
