Sebewaing bank low bidder

Low bidder on bonds for two Huron county drainage projects was Farmers and Merchants State Bank of Sebewaing, with a bid of 71/2 percent, according to Norman H. Schroeder, bank president. Three other banks bid.

The drainage projects are for the Frederick and Branches Drain No. 1 and 2, and the Morgan and Branches Drain, located in Bloomfield and Sigel town-ships, in east-central Huron county.

The projects, to be constructed by Stuart Nicol and Sons, Inc. of Cass City, and Michigan Culvert Company of Mason, will amount to \$134,104.

The bonds will be paid off, one-third each year, on April 15 of 1981, 1982 and 1983. The bonds and pledges of credit were approved by the Huron County Board of Commis-

-Provide your older infant with large, smooth, clean objects (pots, pans, etc.) to pick up and handle.

Dr. Dueweke said infants should be beginning to use their two eyes together by about age two months. Occasionally, a baby may "turn off" one eye at some strange angle for brief periods, while it concentrates on using and developing the other eye.

But if an infant two months of age or older does not show signs of using the two eyes together or the eyes appear to be continually crossed, parents should arrange for a thorough vision examination.

Doctors of optometry have special procedures to examine an infant's eyes and can -Give your baby time to also advise parents on the play on the floor and find many things they can do to opportunities for him or her help their baby learn to see.
