

## Free boating, fishing maps available

Copies of a 32-page index listing 2,500 mapped lakes in Michigan are available free to fishermen and boaters from the Michigan United Conservation Clubs (MUCC).

Arranged by counties, the index pinpoints the locations of Michigan's best lakes for fishing and boating, indicates the size of each lake, and explains how to obtain

maps of each of the lakes. The maps themselves show lake depths, shoreline contours, bottom types, and other characteristics of each lake -- information that is helpful to fishermen and boaters and essential to fish management by the Department of Natural Resources, the agency that conducted the surveys on which the maps are based.

In addition to the lake maps listings, the index contains a chapter on "The Scientific Approach to Lake Fishing" and sections on topographic maps of Michigan and nautical charts of the Great Lakes and how to obtain them.

MUCC is a private, non-profit federation of sportsmen's and conservation clubs.

## AROUND THE FARM Dairy cow metabolism

Milk production in dairy cows imposes a heavy demand on the animals' metabolism.

If rapidly increasing milk production immediately after calving is combined with low feed consumption, the result is a significant drain of the cow's body fat, protein and calcium.

Dairymen must supply a ration that includes adequate concentrations of protein, fiber, calcium, phosphorus, magnesium and energy for high milk production.

A cow's grain ration should be increased by two pounds per day after lactation begins. Cows that are not fed additional grain protein may not utilize body fat efficiently and could develop ketosis.

Limiting calcium intake for about three weeks before calving has resulted in higher blood calcium and fewer cases of milk fever and retained placentas after calving. However, additional calcium in the ration following freshening allows rapid calcium absorption in the gut and offsets the drain of bone calcium as milk production increases.

Displaced abomasums often occur in older cows when they are suffering from calcium and fiber deficiencies shortly after calving. For high amounts of calcium, fiber and protein in the ration, good quality alf-

alfa hay normally helps to supply high amounts of calcium, fiber and protein in the ration to feed fresh cows.

Daily requirements for energy, protein, calcium and phosphorus will increase as milk production increases.

Because appetite for dry feed also increases with milk production, rations with the proper concentration of nutrients for early lactation can be fed through the entire lactation. However, it is desirable to reduce the amounts of energy and protein in the last three or four months of lactation to save money and avoid overconditioning the cows.

Details of proper dairy cow feeding may be found in a variety of bulletins that are available at the MSU Cooperative Extension Service Office in Caro.

## New books at the library

PRINCESS DAISY, by Judith Krantz (fiction). Marguerite Alexandrovna Valensky -- Princess Daisy -- lives in a world of royalty and wealth. Then the dream is over, a shocking secret surrounding her birth is revealed, and suddenly she is thrust into a new life. Daisy strives to protect her secret while she carves a career that finally crowns her a queen -- of a glamorous and highly competitive industry. CROOKED TREE, by Robert C. Wilson (fiction). The black bears of Crooked Tree State Park have suddenly, inexplicably, turned ferocious and begun a rampage of killing. ## Hendrian on duty in California

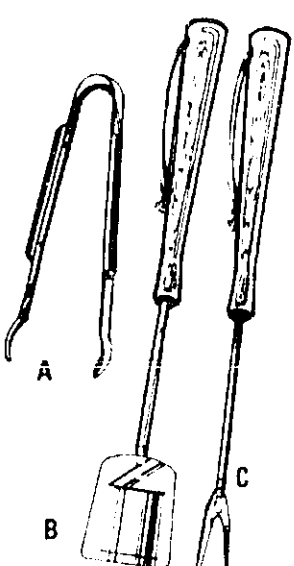
