





ergy, protein, calcium and phosphorus will increase as milk production increases.

Because appetite for dr feed also increases with milk production, rations with the proper concentration of nutrients for early lactation can be fed through the entire lactation. However, it is desirable to reduce the amounts of energy and protein in the last three or four months of lactation to save money and avoid overconditioning the cows.

Details of proper dair, cow feeding may be found in a variety of bulletins that are available at the MSU Cooperative Extension Service Office in Caro.
