Sprays can hurt more than bugs

Are the bugs eating up your garden?

Most insects can be knocked out with sprays, powders and other poisons, but the unwary gardener himself sometimes can suffer from the effects of the bug spray.

The American Medical Association offers some tips on proper and safe use of insecticides.

Read the directions on the container carefully and follow them. The manufacturer spells out the proper usage and safety precautions.

If the directions call for rubber gloves, protective clothing, or goggles, leave this alone, unless you are an expert.

Store the insecticide in its original container, with original label, in a safe, locked compartment, away from children and pets.

Destroy empty containers immediately.

Avoid inhaling sprays and dusts. Stay out of freshly sprayed areas.

Do not smoke while spraying or dusting.

If chemicals spill on the skin, wash immediately and thoroughly.

Cover bird baths, dog dishes and fish ponds before spraying. Pour left-over spray down a drain or into the soil. Don't leave it around in pans or pails.

In case of accident, follow the directions on the container. If in doubt, call your physician.

High court cancels O-G hearing

A hearing before the Michigan Court of Appeals to decide which school district, Owen-Gage or Cass City, gets tax money from the Goslin parcel was cancelled Thursday, according to Ron Erickson.

He said the court did not tell him whether or not the appeal by Owen-Gage will be rescheduled. Nor did they give a reason for the cancellation.

"They just said it was cancelled. That's all they tell you," Erickson said.

Owen-Gage is appealing the October 1979 decision by Circuit Court Judge Martin E. Clements upholding Tuscola County Board's award of tax money from the Goslin land to Cass City.
