--Don't wait too long. Many people try to save money on medical bills by not seeing the doctor until they are seriously ill. This not only defeats the purpose of preventive medicine, the only sound way to preserve your health, but is more expensive in the long run.

-- Have regular checkups.

Not necessarily every year, but at regular intervals as your doctor suggests. -- Go to the doctor's office.

House calls are not only more expensive but less efficient. --Use the telephone. This not only saves money but

also often makes good medical sense. A family doctor who has examined you regularly can sometimes advise over the phone about minor health problems. --Follow your doctor's ad-

vice. If you refuse to follow the expert advice you solicit and pay for, you are throwing away your money. --Have good health insur-

ance. Buy as much as you can afford, but especially protect against the catastrophic expenses of serious -- Take allowable tax de-
