Canners with inaccurate gauges may not process food at a safe temperature, hence the need for the check, according to Extension Home Economist Peggy Houck.

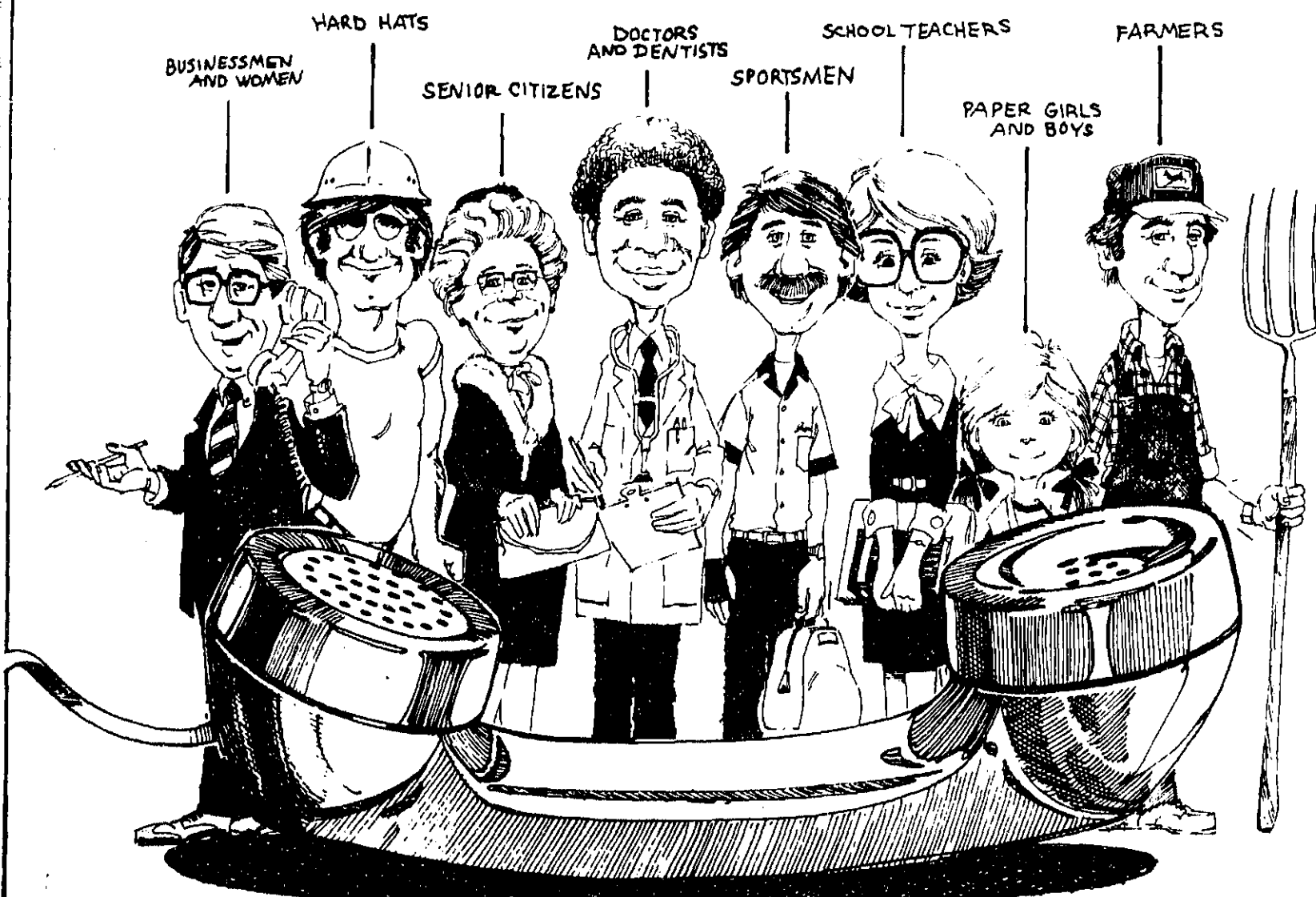
