Bargainin session postponed

The scheduled negotiat session Friday between the Cass City Board Education and Tri-Cou. Bargaining Associa representing the teacher was postponed at the request of the board, according to one of the teacher negotiators.

No new date was set immediately.

The article in last week's Chronicle about the proposals offered by both sides said the school district paid the premium for Blue Cross-Blue Shield health insurance or the Michigan Education Association affiliated MESSA Super Med II plan.

Actually, the board paid the full BC-BS premium of the same amount for the MESSA plan. The latter has a higher premium, so teachers choosing that option paid the difference.

They are seeking to have MESSA as the sole coverage offered under the new contract, with the board paying the entire premium.

Default judgment granted against Cass City couple in Circuit Court

Circuit Judge Martin E. Clements Monday granted a default judgment in favor of Summerfield GMC against Alvin Werschky, of Cass City, doing business as Valley Transport, and his wife, Sue.

The judgment finds them liable for \$29,009, plus costs and interest after Jan. 4.

The Gary, Ind., firm filed

suit Oct. 3, 1979, claiming the Werschkys still owed it \$73,810 for two truck tractors they had leased in 1977.

Summerfield later repossessed the two trucks and sold them, with the proceeds being deducted from the amount the Werschkys owe, which now is \$29,009.

The Werschky trucking firm was operated from the

house of his mother-in-law on Garfield Street.

In criminal matters before Judge Clements:

James R. Stevens Jr., 19, of 6448 S. State Street, Vassar, stood mute to charges of altering a promissory note and breaking and entering an occupied dwelling.

Pleas of innocent were

entered and pretrial hearing on both charges scheduled Aug. 18. Bond was continued.

He is charged with cashing an altered promissory note June 21 for \$100, drawn on Peoples State Bank of Caro, and breaking into a house on Fremont Street in Caro the same day.

Francis Sheldon, 43, of 2162 Ohmer Road, Mayville,

pleaded guilty to a charge of receiving and concealing stolen property over \$100.

His plea was accepted and sentencing scheduled Sept. 15. Bond was continued.

He was charged with possession of a stolen Chevrolet van May 6 in Dayton township.

Thomas L. Fuller, 17, of 4925 Hess Road, Vassar,

stood mute to a charge of breaking and entering an occupied dwelling.

A plea of innocent was entered and pretrial hearing scheduled Aug. 18. Bond was continued.

He is charged with breaking into the Sargeant's Sand Co. office on Hess Road, Vassar, June 4.

Eugene Palmer, 28, of Saginaw, pleaded guilty to a charge of uttering and publishing a forged instrument.

His plea was accepted and sentencing scheduled Sept. 2. Bond was continued.

Over 250 in area sign up for draft

With the official registration period now ended, more than 250 young men from the area have registered for the draft.

The initial two-week sign-up period ended Friday but young men born in either 1960 or '61 can still register if they have not already done so. Registration is at the U.S. Post Office.

No warrant in accident

No warrants will be issued in connection with the death of James E. Fisher, who was killed July 16 as he rode his bicycle along Cass City Road east of M-53.

Sandusky county Assistant Prosecutor Bob Engle said the decision had been made following an investigation of the accident in which the 9-year-old apparently pulled in front of a car being driven by Kevin Lowry, Cass City.

"I believe that based on our investigation the driver was not at fault," Engle said.
