Jobless rate up in June

The unemployment rate in Tuscola county rose slightly in June to 19.6 percent from the May figure of 19.4, according to the Michigan Employment Security Commission.

That rate is considerably higher than the state's June figure of 14.0.

The state figure for July rose slightly to 14.1 percent with the national figure also rising by .1 percentage point from 7.7 July figures for individ-

ual counties are not yet available. The county jobless figure for June is up 12 percent from this time last year.

In Huron county, unemployment rose from 16.2 percent to 16.5 percent, MESC

officials reported. That is up 8.3 percent from last year.

In Sanilac county the figure dropped, from 21.2 to 20.4. The June rate for 1979 was 10.4 percent.
