Charmont rolls to regionals

The Charmont team was the winner Sunday of the 14-team Michigan Softball Association District 8 fast pitch tournament at the Cass City Recreation Park.

The Cass City team thus qualified for the regional tournament which starts Friday at Owosso, with the winner there going on to the state finals.

The tournament was conducted by the Cass City Jaycees.

Finishing second was the Lamplighter Restaurant team of Sebawaing, which lost to Charmont twice, losing in the championship game, 5-2.

The tournament winners started play Saturday morning with a 2-1 win over Coca-Cola of Port Huron, then a 5-0 victory over The Station of Cass City that afternoon and a 3-2 win over the Lamplighter in the evening.

The team defeated McGraw-Edison of Sandusky 2-1 Sunday morning, then won the title game against Lamplighter, 5-2.

Sebawaing beat Wolverine State Bank of Sandusky, then lost to Charmont, which meant it had to win three games Sunday to get into the finals. That it did by beating Thumb National Bank of Pigeon, The Station and McGraw-Edison.

Teams not already mentioned who participated in the double-elimination event, which started Friday evening were Liberty Lanes, Sandusky; Wolverine State Bank, Marlette; Osentoski Realty, Cass City; Sugar-

town Market, Sebawaing; Sanilac Dairy Farms, Sandusky, and Dingman Game Farm, Port Huron.
