Pledges can be made to Tuscola

The Tuscola County United Way Board has announced a change in the designation policy for United Way pledges this year.

According to President Iris Tuckey, Tuscola residents who are employed in Saginaw county can now designate 50 percent of their pledged amount to Tuscola County United Way.

They cannot designate their pledges to local United Way organizations, such as the Elkland-Novesta United Way, but the new policy will still be of benefit locally, said Mrs. Tuckey, the outgoing president of the Elkland-Novesta fund drive.

She urges all Tuscola county residents employed in Saginaw county to ask for a special designation form when filling out their pledge card at their place of employment.

Saginaw County United Way was the last in Michigan to allow some of the funds it collects to be designated for other counties, Mrs. Tuckey said. Tuscola county residents employed in all other counties should also ask for the special designation form.

The Elkland-Novesta United Way fund drive starts Oct. 7. The United Way drive in Saginaw county starts a couple of weeks earlier.
