**Safety belts offer safety in crashes**

Motor vehicle crashes claim almost 50,000 lives each year. Injuries number in the millions.

Most of these crashes need not be fatal or serious. Many injuries and deaths can be prevented by the regular use of safety belts.

A pamphlet from the American Medical Association points out that the most effective safety belt is the combination lap-shoulder harness, but even the lap alone will help keep you safe.

Making both ends meet requires no end of money these days.

than 3,000 lives annually, and that between 7,000 and 9,000 additional lives could be saved each year if safety belts were fully utilized.

The belt protects only if you buckle it. All too many motorists neglect to buckle up and utilize the protection that is readily available.

Most motor vehicle crashes occur in the home neighborhood at speeds under 40 miles per hour. At speeds under 40 seat belts have a remarkably good safety record.

Children need safety belts too. The arms of a parent or other adult are not strong enough to restrain and protect a small child, even in low speed crashes. If the parent is not wearing a belt, he or she may be thrown forward.

Children up to age 4 should ride in a specially designed infant carrier or child restraint that is secured by the safety belts already in the auto.

Under all circumstances, fasten your safety belts before the ignition is turned on, and keep them fastened whenever the vehicle is in motion. Drivers must demand that passengers buckle up.
