The Hawks lifted the curtain on the 1980 grid season and literally demolished Standish-Sterling Central, 33-0, in near-perfect weather at Cass City Recreational

At least part of the answer will come this Friday when the Hawks face the Lakers in the first road game of the

The Lakers showed plenty of power by rolling over USA in their opener, 32-14. A shroud hangs over the game if a teacher strike in the community is not settled. That's because the coaches are withholding services. School officials say plans are complete to play the game with volunteer coaches to replace the regular striking

In recent years the Laker football squad has been tough for Cass City. Last year the Hawks suffered their worst defeat of the year at the hands of the Lakers,
